### THE STORY ON WDGR-1210

For those of you who have been wondering about WDGR-1210 in Dahlenega, GA beginning full time operation on 1210, here's some information from Glenn Hauser. On October 14, WDGR was astounded to receive fulltime authorization from the FCC, rather than critical hours and post sunset authorization as expected. They waited until October 17 to call the FCC, who confirmed that the authorization was correct, so they went fulltime on that date, 0530-2300 ELT with 10 kw days, and 2.5 kw nights, nondirectional day and night, even though it's only about 600 miles from WCAU. They plan to go 24 hours as soon as overnight staff can be hired. It's "like ordering a Chevy and getting a Cadillac", as Glenn put it. Glenn also sent in the following revised schedule for his "World of Radio" program on WRNO (shortwave): Saturday: 0530 on 6185 kHz; Sunday: 0230 on 6045 kHz and 1400 on 9715 kHz. All times UTC.

It's Forum-time again! I've been having some fun with my new beverage antennas that were erected with the help of Chuck Hutton, of "Hutton Beverage Service" (hi). One runs due west at a length of about 1500', the other approx. NNW at around 1800'. Presently, neither is fully terminated and grounded, but even so, some interesting DX has turned up. It's quite interesting to switch between the two on any given freq. and note the differences! It is almost like rotating a giant loop as the directionality is very noticeable. One example that comes to mind is on 820 kHz in the evenings...the west one gives a solid WBAP, yet on the NNW wire, WBAP is completely absent in favor of WOSU/WAIT. Ideally, it would be nice to have them in as many directions as possible, with a master switching unit, and ultimately, a phasing unit! Drool, drool! Actually, I can go south from this location as well, and I would also like to go due NW. By the way, I would like to address those who think the KRVN Atlanta-postmarked veries might be "bogus"--I know personally the gentleman who lives here and who has been, and still is, the "SK Correspondent" for this station. Since the last time I wrote, the band has been crazy here in the Southeast Michigan area! Last Friday (10/28/83), while driving home from work WFRB was blowing thru WHND. What was unusual was I was just 10 miles south of Honeyradio's transmitter site! When I got home the band was hot with all kinds of stations that I haven't heard in years. Talk about a change, and to think that just about 3 months ago I was complaining about nothing coming in! Speaking of WHND, the FCC sent us a letter giving us the details about post sunset operations. This is the first of the Daytimer proposals to go thru the house allowing operation until 1800 during short months. It will benefit us in Nov., Dec., and Jan. only. We will be operating at 62.424 watts, which is not that bad considering that our normal PSA is 67.00 watts and some stations got cut back real far (i.e., WSDS 500 watts to 15 watts, and WGSM 25,000 watts to 44 watts). I wonder what the figures will look like if/when the 2 hour extensions are granted!?! On the DX side, WDGR has been in almost nightly, KFJZ, KOA, and a host of others have been logged. The CRTC has denied CKLW's proposed format switch to FM, bringing CKJY and MOXL to the 800 side. The story I got from another Windsor broadcaster was that the switch would not be in the best interest of the Canadian people! In the chess game of big market radio, it's now CK's turn to move. ## Radio wars: The U.S. vs. Cuba

In the wake of President Reagan's bold move against the Cuban presence on Grenada, relations between the United States and Cuba might seem to be dangerously low. But they could go even lower if the administration goes through with its plans to open a war of words against Cuba next year on Radio Marti, a Spanish-language propaganda broadcast to Cuba.

One major side effect of the establishment of Radio Marti, approved by Congress and President Reagan last month, may be disruption of normal radio broadcasting in the U.S. and the subsequent loss of millions of dollars in advertising. Stations as far away from Cuba as CBS-owned KNX-AM in Los Angeles could suffer interference from the retaliatory tactics Castro has threatened to use if and when Radio Marti signs on.

The idea originated with anti-Castro Cuban exiles, staunch supporters of Reagan in 1980. International security adviser Richard Allen in 1981 endorsed the station as a way to "tell the truth to the Cuban people about their government's domestic mismanagement and its promotion of subversion and international terrorism in this hemisphere and elsewhere."

After a protracted battle, the Reagan camp won approval from Congress of a watered-down version of the Radio Marti proposal, which provides for a Cuban Service within the Voice of America, using an existing AM-band transmitter used by VOA in the Florida Keys. Up to 14 hours of material a day could be beamed to Cuba, at a cost of \$14 million in fiscal 1984 and \$11 million in fiscal 1985. (This compares to the VOA's entire budget of \$44 million, and the \$9 million shortfall that nearly bank-

rupted National Public Radio.) Another \$5 million is earmarked for compensating commercial broadcasters if Cuba retaliates with high-powered transmissions of its own, which could disrupt AM radio throughout much of the U.S., particularly at night. A confidential State Department report in 1982, obtained through the Freedom of Information Act, estimated that 20 percent of all American AM radio stations could be adversely affected.

Some have suggested that the Reagan administration would welcome such a confrontation. Sen. Claiborne Pell, D-R.I., cited comments last year by unidentified administration officials that deliberate interference by Cuban transmitters would constitute an act of war, justifying U.S. military strikes against them. "Radio Marti," Pell concluded, "appears destined to

prevent rather than coexist with normal diplomatic relations."

The National Association of Broadcasters opposed the Radio Marti plan at first, but gave in when certain concessions were made and congressional approval seemed certain. An NAB representative told a congressional hearing this year that stations in the Southeast are already losing up to \$80 million a year in advertising revenue due to Cuban interference with U.S. AM outlets. If Radio Marti signs on, Cuban officials have said they will halt talks under way to resolve the current complaints. "There will be a radio war across the Florida straits," warned a Cuban spokesman last year.

The most persuasive argument against Radio Marti, however, may be its redundancy. Cuban exiles already operate several anti-Castro radio stations in the Caribbean, and the Voice of America broad-

casts hours of Spanish-language programming to the region every day. The close proximity of the U.S. also puts Cubans within easy reach of mainstream AM, FM and even TV stations in the Southeast. "Half the stations received in Cuba are American, including the Voice of America," says Wayne Smith, former chief of the U.S. Interests Section in Havana.

Bill Thomas, manager/program director of WEFT-FM in Champaign, Ill., was one of a group of U.S. broadcasters invited to visit Cuba last June. "We found American radio easily receivable all over this island," Thomas reports, "including Spanish-language stations run by Cuban exiles. The Cubans said Radio Marti would interfere with their radio and that it insults them by appropriating the name of their national hero. They say they will respond with English broadcasts to the U.S. that will interfere with a lot of stations." When Cuba tested one of its high-powered transmitters last year, interference was reported by stations from Wyoming to New York.

There is no reason to believe that the Cuban people are likely to be swayed by Radio Marti than by existing broadcasting from democratic countries. In fact, there is a precedent for Radio Marti. In the early 1960s, the CIA backed Radio Swan, a station run by Cuban exiles from a small Caribbean island. It was no more effective than its successor would be today.

The service runs the added risk of tainting the generally favorable overseas reputation of the Voice of America, which is chartered to be an unbiased and accurate reporter of news. The VOA was chartered "to be a 'window on American society,'" points out Yale Newman, a former VOA staffer who now directs the State Department's office for Cuban broadcasting. "It is not supposed to be a window on Cuban society or to concentrate on news of any one country."

The result, as one Texas congressman put it, may be "an electronic Bay of Pigs." ■

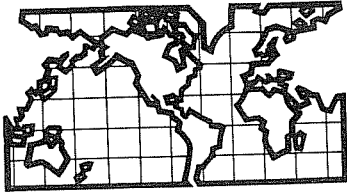
