Greetings once again from "Hog Heaven" as the Redskins are in the playoffs again this year, hoping to repeat last year's Super Bowl performance. (I'm rooting for the Detroit Lions!--rce) I spent a week in the Fla-Ala area traveling via Amtrak and Trailways. With the NRC Convention in Enfield, Conn. during the Labor Day weekend and an overnight stop in Birmingham, Ala, the "Pittsburgh of the South". At the start of the trip, I now have slept in all 50 states. After Birmingham, I spent two nights in Pensacola, Fla where I had a pleasant visit with Gerry Thomas; tnx to him for a tour of the Naval Air Station where he works (home of the famed Blue Angels, whom I saw from my office building in southern Md. as they were gearing up for Armed Forces Day at nearby Andrews AFB) and of his DX Shack, capping off with a surf meal at a bayfront restaurant downtown. I bought a Realistic Portavision 12-660 set for \$45. This rig has four bands (AM, FM, and two TV bands; chs 2-6 and chs 7-13). It is used mainly for regular listening, especially to TV newscasts and occasionally FB games. It is about the same size as the TRF. I did some CCB DXing on the 12-660 and bagged a couple of newies, although it is not that great for such DX-ing. It has the sensitivity but is not as selective as the TRF (12-655) or the ICF-S5W. This means that splatter is harder to get rid of on the 12-660 than on the 12-655. A case in point is trying to hear WJNX-1600 during lunch break at work. I can hear it on the 12-655 but not on the 12-660 due to the heavy WPGC slop. DX is picking up now with nine additions to the log, three within a week. From November thru March, I do my SSS DXing before dinner which I usually get around 1900. Rich, about your Forum where you said you listened to my oldies on the way south, it was too good to last. By this, I mean those rare doo-wop or rockabilly songs which my "main man" (as my favorite oldies DJ on WOL-1450, Raymond Woods says), Dick Lillard used to play every 15 minutes or 20 songs during a five hour show. The powers-that-be on WXTR nixed those rare oldies, which I was really heavy into, so Dick left the station; he is the foremost expert on rock, from doo-wop to chainsaw. It has been a very enjoyable busy summer and fall here. Hilites had to include my sister's wedding in July and my vacation in August to Calif. I went west w/fellow IRCAN Gary Siegel and local TV DXer Marv Shults; the trip was great. Out 24 day, 6800 mile extravaganza took us to the Tetons/Yellowstone, Salt Lake City, S. Lake Tahoe, San Francisco, L.A., San Diego, Vegas and the Grand Canyon. Did a lot of radio related stuff including visiting with several IRCANs--R. Segals, D. Kaskey and D. Erickson. One of the 1st things I noticed was the different dominant stations on the clear channels once you get out into western Nebraska. Hearing KCB, KNX, KTWO and KREX as regulars is new to this Midwestern DXer. Also the relatively clear channels really amazed me--there aren't nearly the stns or congestion of the midwest. And a lot of areas are real to being white areas--the Yellowstone area, northern Nevada and eastern Arizona come to mind. One really depends on the clear channels for decent radio in these areas. The Tetons/Yellowstone were btfl; had a great time in SF w/Segalas and Kaskey. LA was nice although I prefer the San Diego area. Vegas was fun to see once and the Grand Canyon is just unbelievable. Spectacular comes as close a word as I can think of to describe it. Heard a ton of radio. Listened to about 5 AM Top 40's to whole trip; very few AM rockers anymore. The stns heard were good though--KING-1560 Council Bluffs;; KRSE-1060, KPRC-610 and XETRA-690. KPRC w/Jackson Armstrong nites is a riot; the "mighty 690" is also great stuff. Best C&W stns included KCKC-1350, KCBO-1170, KSON-1240, KVEG-1410, KPLG-930 and KRAK-1140. KEEN-1370 was disappointing; KLAC-570 was better than I thought. Had nice visits at several stns including KSID Sidney, Neb., KAFF/KPLG Flagstaff and KID Idaho Falls. We got into KID at 3 minutes to 6pm, right before the local news went on. Try to do that in N.Y. or Chicago! Really an enjoyable trip. Locally, WQUA is now WPRZ-1230 w/rock oldies; presentation is sorta boring; news net remains ABC/E. Hate to see WCPL in Chicago go religious; (I'm looking forward to it--rce) talk about a stn that has gone downhill. Semi-local WKEL-1450 has new owners and is now C&W after 1100 CST; news now ABC Direction. And WVEL-1140 Pekin is now mostly religious.... (continued next issue)

It's been quite a while since I sent in a Forum. I'd like to once again thank the membership for electing me to the BGD. Life here in this small coastal southern Maine town is so different from life in Los Angeles it's like a culture shock. However, we're getting used to most of the minor inconveniences. It's very relaxing and quiet here--at least until summer when this place will be overrun by about 50,000 tourists and summer residents. From my QTH in the woods outside of town, I'll never know the difference--unless I try to drive into town. DX here is even better than I had imagined!! My QTH in Ogunquit is the eastern DXers parallel of Pat Martin's Seaside, Ore. DX paradise. Cx here have been at least somewhat Auroral since the ginning of October. High latitude TA's have been missing most nights--nothing like the awesome Cx heard from across the pond Sept. 6-15. African reception has been very good at times with Angola and Nigeria both heard. Some of the tougher high-banders like Gabon and Ivory Coast have also made occasional appearances. Several Canary Island stations are quite common. Spain, Portugal, Morocco, Algeria, and Libya are good on the non-severely Auroral nights. Also, that 1 kw Azores-1566 is really potent at times. They really get out--but are only about 2500 miles away. LA DX is also outstanding here--especially for those LA's east of 180 degrees. When it's rather Auroral, LA's usually obliterate the domestics on the low end of the band. Venezuelans are exceptionally good and are often local--like on channels like 550, 640, 670, 710, 750, 760, 830 in auroral cx. Brazilians have been heard on about 15 frequencies and the night of Oct. 21 was amazing in that a good dozen Brazilians were in carrying a soccer game in PP between Paraguay and Uruguay--see DXNW-E's for DX details. Much of the DX is made possible because of greatly reduced QRN from Cubans as compared to my previous coastal QTH in Narragansett, R.I. There are also considerably fewer locals and semi-locals here than in R.I. I also never did much DX from a good coastal spot during any month but summer months due to school and the fact that the Narragansett QTH is a summer home. LA Cx are fine in the summer but clearly better in the fall with reduced QRN. The main rx here is the ICOM-R70. It was modified to allow the tighter SSB filter to be used for AM reception. I would recommend that anyone with a R70 have this relatively simple modification done to their rx. The difference in split receptions with the tighter filter is often great. I also have a somewhat ailing R390A which is presently in R.I. but will be brought up here in the near future. (continued next issue.)

A little bit of bad weather up here in November made radio listening more interesting. On Saturday night, 19 November, winds exceeding 60 mph toppled one of the two towers local KXRO 1320 uses for its nighttime DA. They managed to stay on the air that night using 1 kw non-directional and ditto the next night. On Monday, 21 November, they notified the FCC of their situation and the FCC in turn notified them that they would have to reduce nighttime power or else leave the air altogether to protect CHQM Vancouver. KXRO became a "daytimer for a day," going off at 4:45 PM local time Monday, re-turning at 7:15 AM Tuesday.

Their replacement tower arrived on Tuesday, but it took a week to install. At 4:45 PM that day they left the air for about 45 minutes to retune the night mode for operation at reduced power nondirectional. For the next ten days the chief engineer had to come in and retune the rig at 7:15 AM for 5 kw day power and again at 4:45 PM for reduced night power. This required KXRO to leave the air for about 60 seconds each time.

Another windstorm on Thanksgiving Day caused widespread power outages around western Washington, raising havoc with turkey dinners for thousands of people. After a couple of momentary outages, KXRO lost power for good at 10:45 AM and didn't have power restored until 7 PM! In fact, at 11:15 AM two of our three AM stations and all three of our FM's were off the air. This combined with a midday skip into Montana that supplied KOFI 1180 loud at Montana noon, KSEN 1150 under KSPL, KERR 750 under KXL and an obvious KJJR 880 through KIXI but no ID. I was trying for much-wanted KENU 1330 with 1320 open, but I got Spokane instead. Unfortunately turkey dinner was waiting in Olympia so we couldn't stay and DX.

Did Nancy log her much-wanted KHIT 1320 Walla Walla during all this? You'll have to wait for next time to find out. 73 and Happy Holidays to all.

# DXING IN ALASKA

by Hurley Parkhurst, Nenana, Alaska

(Note: This summary of AM broadcast band loggings from Sept. 14, 1982, to Oct. 31, 1983, was compiled by Hurley Parkhurst, and was edited and typed by Bill Hardy.)

I use a Dodge car radio, model 56MX operated from a 12-volt battery. My present antenna (for the winter season) is a 108-foot longwire, 20 feet high at both ends, running ESE from the house. I feed it via 5 feet of down-lead to a Miller #9002 coil, then to the antenna jack of the car radio. I tune the trimmer for maximum sensitivity on each station. This seems to be a very sensitive set-up.

Previously I had used antennas ranging from 5 to 170 feet long, but the areas I receive signals from seem to remain essentially the same: Eastern U.S. and Canada (Ont.-NY-PA-CT), western U.S. and Canada (CA-OR-WA-BC-Alta), Pacific Rim (Japan-New Zealand-Australia), and Hawaii.

Despite a lot of high power "clear channel" stations being in the Midwest U.S., I've only picked up WHO-1040 Des Moines from that area.

The best DXing time up here seems to be after sunset until the Northern Lights brighten up, around 9 p.m. local time in the fall and winter. Then the high end of the broadcast band goes dead, and finally by 11 p.m. or so, the entire band is dead except for a few Alaskans. There are a few good DX nights in winter when everything comes rolling in.

My total would be a lot higher than 210 ID's if I could figure out who the Oriental-sounding stations are. They come in best past midnight local time. Also a few Russian-sounding stations too. The Russian mainland is only 600 miles away, closer than Alaska's state capital at Juneau. My farthest in-state DX is "NBS"-890, Navy Broadcasting System, Detachment 21 at Adak, about 1400 miles from Nenana. You see, in-state DX in Alaska is as far as lower-48 DX is for the whole country.

Nenana is in the Alaskan Interior, some 45 miles southwest of Fairbanks, not far south of the Arctic Circle at 64½°N latitude, 149°W longitude. Since it is 45 miles to the nearest radio stations (five in the Fairbanks area), I don't have many blocked-out channels, but TVI is a problem. Everyone in Alaska has TV and watches it a lot, hence a lot of weak signals are buried under horizontal oscillator harmonics.

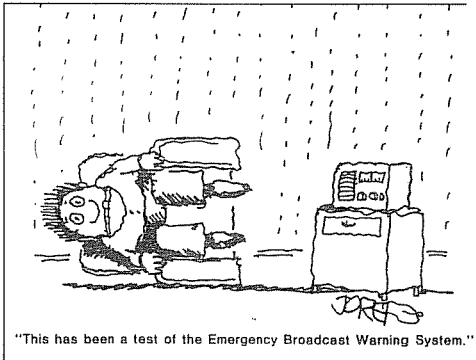

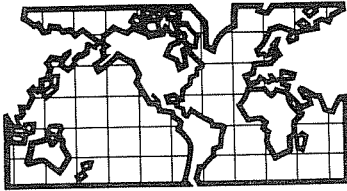

# Money trouble? Get on radio and talk it out

A 29-year-old former teacher in Colorado Springs, Colo., wants to know the best way to arrange a loan from his parents so he can go back to college to study electronics. A public relations man, 30, from Eau Claire, Wis., with creditors hounding him for \$5,000, wonders about declaring bankruptcy. A tattoo artist from Youngstown, Ohio, wants advice on opening his own studio.

This is the world of radio call-in money shows.

Move over, sex therapists and political pundits. In response to increasing consumer confusion about complex financial choices, radio shows dispensing advice are growing in numbers and popularity.

The questions above were posed recently by Bruce Williams during his three-hour syndicated call-in show, carried five nights a week on about 150 radio stations.

"Most people don't know where to turn for help on putting their kids through college, getting a business, or affording a house," says Maurice Tunick,

executive producer of NBC's *Talknet*, which syndicates the show. "Bruce's role is that of the smart uncle in the family."

Meet Uncle Know-It-All — the straight-talking, self-made entrepreneur. His expertise is culled from successes and flops in ventures like wholesaling flowers, building houses, owning a gas station, running a private school and camp, leasing cars and being mayor of a town in central New Jersey.

Williams, 51, seasons his advice and opinions with common sense and sarcasm:

☐ "You should be fitted for one of those white jackets with arms that tie up in the back," he tells the caller contemplating bankruptcy. He tells him to get out of debt by moonlighting.

☐ "Don't ask your parents for help. 'You're old enough to stand on your own hind legs,'" he lectures the former teacher.

☐ He tells a salesman who asks about the propriety of soliciting clients for his own business while working for another company that he's "morally bankrupt" to even consider it.

☐ Listeners love it. The number of stations airing Williams' show has grown from 23 to 150

in less than two years, and most say their audiences have increased substantially during Williams' time period. Williams received get-well mail from 30,000 fans after he was hurt in a plane crash last year.

"Our educational system teaches people how to make a living, but most of us, including highly paid professionals, are babes in the woods on how to spend it," says Jim Barry, president of an investment firm and host of a weekly radio show on WGSS, Miami.

"I could be on 48 hours a day and still not run out of questions to answer," says Bob Rofetsky, former banker, lawyer and author, who hosts a weekly show on KABC in Los Angeles.

No one questions the need for or popularity of money call-in shows, on which listeners can ask anything from how to launder \$50,000 in stolen cash to how to choose the best investment for an Individual Retirement Account. But keeping quality high is difficult. After all, talk-show hosts are fast-ball hitters, and once in a while some caller throws a curve.

"Often hosts have a limited area of expertise, but they don't always stick to the areas they know most about," says John Ferguson, president of an

investment firm and host of a weekly public radio show on WAMU in Washington, D.C.

"There's no question that some answers are emotional or general, not well-thought-out," says Bill Bresnan, who spent 18 years in the brokerage business before joining WABC in New York as a talk-show host.

Juggling the often competing demands of good radio and good advice isn't easy. "You have to be careful not to give flippant answers, because people will do what you tell them to do," says Paul Bresnan, author and economist who has a show on San Francisco's WCO.

The host-experts generally agree that the most important qualification is empathy. "To the person calling in, his problem is the most important thing in the world," Barry says.

Even Williams, who lambastes callers, says his abrasive style is meant to be constructive. "I'd rather be harsh and hurt someone's feelings when they are at home than have them walk into some executive's office and be humiliated," he says. "And if it's too late to help the caller, maybe his mistake will prevent one or two of the guys listening from doing the same stupid thing."
