AM stereo note: Harris has changed the frequency of its AM stereo system's pilot tone from 55 Hz to 25 Hz. This makes it compatible with the Motorola-only stereo receivers which are flooding the auto market and which may yet become the industry standard. Both new and existing Harris stations are affected. (BC)

Cuban interference change: FCC has removed the \$250,000 per station cap on the amount that may be paid to a US station to buy and install equipment (i.e., a bigger transmitter) with which to fight Cuban AM interference. The program of station payments is part of the planning for Radio Marti, the Reagan administration's "News of Cuba" program which will operate out of the VOA site at Marathon Key FL on 1180 kHz and which may cause Cuba to retaliate by interfering with US stations. (BC)

Let's see how valuable a major market FM license is dept.: KIFM 98.1 San Diego CA lost its license earlier this year. The FCC has since received 51 applications to operate a new station there.

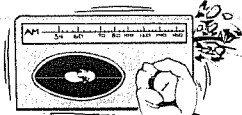

Since the new season is upon us, a review of what we can and can't use might be in order. No loggings of carriers without modulation (A0), no cordless phones, no pirate stations, and nothing above 1800 kHz except harmonics of BC stations. Anything else is fair game.

A few loggings of mine, and that's it! Come on folks, things are happening!

- 1613 GUATEMALA Rabinal 0200-0201 8/5 "RAB" fair.
- 1637 ??? 0131, 0134 8/5 "S340" and dash,good.
- 1721 ??? 0418-0425 8/16 "USA" beacon (how patriotic!) good. Also 0337-0340 on 8/18.
- 1783 ??? 0430-0432 8/16 30 pip/minute stations back. Two noted here and both seem to go silent for the summer.

I recently put an antenna up at my work location in Providence. It's a 22 foot vertical on top of a tower and building totalling 85 feet in height. This is by far the best antenna I've ever used at this location. It picks up much less noise than either the 100 foot longwire or 2 foot loop previously used. I guess getting the antenna above the noise and away from things that absorb the signal really helps. The difference was much more than I expected to find. Anyone else use a similar setup?

That's it for now. Please listen and report. The best conditions have been early in the season the past couple of years. Don't miss it!

IRCA TOLEDO CONVENTION REVIEW

The Toledo IRCA convention was to officially begin at 12 noon on August 17th but the night before found several people already in the area. Some early arrivals took tours of the area, got checked in at the Sheraton Westgate or stayed with or visited the convention hosts. By noon Friday some dozen members were on hand and took in the available tours of WTOL-TV, WQWA/WIOT-FM and WSPD/WIQR-FM as well as taking in some of the sights of downtown Toledo. Those that were on the tours gave the Channel 11 tour outstanding marks. It was an hour long effort led by WTOL's Promotion Director Steve Israel. Hardly a room in the new Ch.11 building escaped view and comment. London Mitchell, News Director of WQWA (good friend of host Gary Siegel) led the tour of his station and their FM WIOT. Lon was able to provide interesting insights into the Toledo radio scene inspite of being a bit limited by a busy work day. It was onto WSPD where Terri Sexton, Public Affairs Director, was hostess for the group and in turn introduced two engineers to us who conducted in depth tours lasting 45 minutes. Most of the tour goers tho' opted to catch dinner or return to the inn to relax and gab afterward.

A contingent of seven took advantage of the opportunity to see the World Famous Toledo Mud Hens baseball team in action in Maumee versus the Tidewater Tides, both of the International League. For tour host Gary Siegel it was a chance for his local favorites to gain a measure of revenge from Paul Mount's Tides (Mets affiliate) after the Virginians embarrassed the Hens 12-1 upon a visit of his in 1983. This time it was Toledo an 8-4 winner with Paul being the only vocal supporter of the Tides which endeared him to the local fandom. Ernie Cooper also a Mets fan leaned toward the Tides but showing the wisdom of age chose not to be as vocal about it, hi! Also on hand were John Clemmer, Bob Walker, John Kokinda and Tim Noonan. John Clemmer demonstrated his amazing luck at coming close to hitting on lucky numbers in programs again. (A feat he first showed during a hockey game in Indianapolis this year. Did you ever hear of that lottery in Illinois John?)

Saturday arrived too early for some but those early risers accompanied host and WTCL (the Convention station) producer Fred Vobbe on a tour of his employers facilities in Monroe and Royal Oak Township, Michigan to scout out the operations of WHND/WMJC-FM and the Starlink Satellite facility. The tour was very comprehensive and received much favorable comment. Those left behind were treated to the programming of Fred's production genius in the form of Stereo 83 AM WTCL-Where Toledo Conventioneers Listened! The five watt carrier current station featured several DXer oriented programs which featured contributions from the likes of John Bowker, Bob Walker, Ernest Cooper among others. Art Vuolo, Jr. also treated the attendees with samples of his video tape DJ shows which were also well produced and highly entertaining.

While enjoying the audio and video services several DXers were seen in the hospitality room swapping bumper stickers and assorted goodies in advance of the evening activities. The banquet attended by nearly 30 of us featured a tasty main course of Chicken Kiev. After filling those ever present DX stomachs convention host Fred Vobbe delivered a talk on the current status of the broadcast industry, its effects on the DXer and what the future will hold for us due to deregulation, breakdown of the clears and raised night power on the locals. Fred also gave a fine demonstration of AM stereo and discussed its prospects of public acceptance. He also entertained questions from the audience but provided little help in answering the tough Frank Merrill DX Kwiz which followed the business meeting.

The business meeting conducted by IRCA President Phil Bytheway and Secretary Rich Segalas centered on the need for a dues increase to \$20 a year in part to some current cash flow shortages, weak publication sales in some areas and the threatened postal rate increase for sometime in 1985. Msrs. Bytheway and Segalas also pointed out that the current membership rate was still available till 9/1/84 and could be extended for three years. Bids were also opened for hosting the 1985 IRCA gathering. An early entry is Seaside, Oregon.

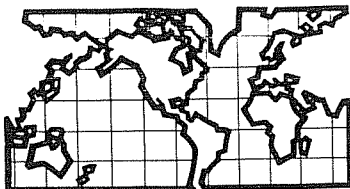

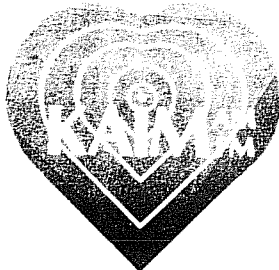

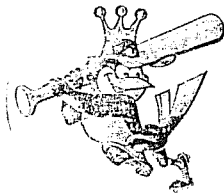
