A key portion of the R. Marti bill provides compensation for U.S. BCN stations (particularly in Florida) which suffer Cuban interference. This compensation, to be administered by the FCC, will in part pay for enhanced facilities. According to the 9/1 Radio World, some of those stations which expect to receive compensations appear to be perfectly innocent victims of "the war" (e.g., WINZ-940 Hollywood and WKAT-1360 Miami Beach). Others however (although he doesn't mention it) have long broadcast to the Cuban community both in and beyond Florida. These include WCMQ (which moved to 1210 kHz late this summer) and WQBA. The latter on 1140 kHz (formerly WMIE) was not only involved in the Bay of Pigs adventure but, according to November's The Shortwave Guide, still has its CP pending for a Spanish language SWBC station. All of this means that the R. Marti bill provides quasi clandestine government funds for privately controlled anti-Castro broadcasts. And ultimately I can't help but believe this is somehow related to that N/S antenna array on Sugar Loaf Key. Best.

To make it more interesting, I borrowed Chuck Hutton's phasing unit, which is quite a bit more sophisticated than mine, and got some interesting results. It was fun to be able to, on 1020, completely phaseout KDKA and listen free-and-clear to KBCQ, or on 1030, knock-out WBZ in favor of KTWO, and the new WXSS in Memphis. On 1000, I could eliminate WCFL and listen to KTOK, and on 1130, after phasing KWKH, I heard WSJP. This latter station had an unusual slogan: "Jackson Country". I couldn't figure out what they were referring to, as looking at the trusty atlas, there doesn't seem to be anything geographically near there called "Jackson". Once again this past weekend, I heard WAMB, which is listed as being on 1170, on 1160 kHz. So far, after checking "Broadcasting Info" and "AM Switch", I can't find any mention of them applying or receiving a grant to switch to 1160. I sent a tentative report to them, but hasn't been answered so far. I wonder if someone in or around Nashville could check this out...I'd be interested to know, hi! Alabama's WTAK must give up nights to radio up North

HUNTSVILLE, Ala.

If a federal bureaucrat were listening to WTAK at 5:15 a.m., what he would hear would be enough to fry his eggs — before they're cracked.

The silver toned-voice of WTAK announcer Mike Sweeney bids northeast Alabama a sincere good morning and gives Uncle Sam's Federal Communications Commission the ol' what-for. The reason? WTAK can't broadcast all night.

"We're forced to vacate our frequency during the hours of darkness because of the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, a law much older than the oldies we play. A law much older than most of us, matter of fact," intones Sweeney.

"We're forced to leave the air at night so that powerful stations up North can beam news and information to what they consider an ignorant, ill-informed Southland."

If that's not enough to curdle the cream in the bureaucrat's coffee, there's more.

By now, strains of "Dixie" have crept into the background, being suddenly replaced by the count-down of a space shuttle launch, a reference to the Marshall Space Flight Center on the outskirts of Huntsville.

"Despite our contributions to the space program and our high-tech economy," beams the voice of Sweeney, "the Continental Congress" doesn't realize that we in the South would rather do it (provide news and information) ourselves."

It's all part of an effort, said WTAK manager David Driscoll, to protest the FCC's requirements that the 10,000-watt Huntsville station — and some 2,300 others like it across the nation — vacate the airways between sunset and sunrise in favor of powerful Northern stations.

The WTAK protest has to do with FCC regulations promulgated several decades ago, which sanctioned several 50,000-watt, "clear channel" stations, whose broadcasts can be heard in nearly every region of the nation.

The rules meant that at night, any local stations that disturbed the more powerful stations' signals had to go off the air.

"After sunset, atmospheric conditions are such that radio signals drift, and can distort other radio signals," Driscoll explained.

Local stations that do not interfere with the broadcasts of the clear channels usually are allowed to remain on the air around the clock.

But WTAK is on the same frequency as the clear-channel WCFL in Chicago. "Since we interfere with their signal after sunset, we have to go off the air," said Driscoll. "But, heck, nobody in Huntsville can pick up WCFL anyway."

However, FCC official Henry Straube in Washington said that while he sympathizes with Driscoll, "these stations knew what the conditions were when they applied for a license. The clear channel stations provide a

valuable service to rural areas of this country, which otherwise might not have radio reception. The regulations protect the clear channel signals."

But Driscoll, on the other hand, said the FCC regulations are too rigid. "The FCC is killing the daytime stations," he said. "They have made it extremely difficult for us to compete with the local 24-hour-a-day stations."

Around Christmas time, for instance, when sunset in Alabama is at 4:30 p.m. Central Standard Time, WTAK must cease broadcasting. "That's the biggest selling time of the year, when retailers are clamoring for advertising time. Going off the air at 4:30 means that we lose a bulk of our listeners — those who are driving home from work."

A daytime station also does not have the prestige of a full-time station, said Driscoll. "That image is all important in this business," he said. "You lose listeners if you don't have it."

Since the hours of sunrise and sunset change constantly, WTAK also has to change its sign on and sign off times accordingly. The station, said Driscoll, wanted a way to emphasize to its listeners that having to leave the air at different times in the afternoon was not the station's idea, but something forced on them by the bureaucrats in Washington.

"We're required by the FCC only to give our call letters, our location and frequency when we sign on and sign off," said Driscoll.

But the FCC, he said, didn't say anything about waging on-the-air war at what the station management considers highly antiquated regulations.

"So, we got one of our announcers, Mike Sweeney, who is a genius at production, to come up with a new sign on and sign off, which would let our listeners know that we really didn't want to leave the air," said Driscoll.

The result is two of the station's greatest hits. "We're getting requests for tapes of our sign on and sign off from all over the country," Driscoll said.

In the "sign off" at 7:15 p.m. sunset time in April in Huntsville, Sweeney says: "And now, in compliance with regulations from those wonderful people who gave us prohibition, the Susan B. Anthony dollar, the Bay of Pigs and an additional five-cents gasoline tax, WTAK is forced to discontinue broadcasting until dawn tomorrow."

Superimposed on Sweeney's rich, deep, mellow radio voice is something akin to Gomer Pyle's "goll-holl-lee." That, said Driscoll, tongue-in-cheek, represents those ignorant, uninformed Southerners that the powerful Northern stations are trying to inform.

Clear channel stations, by virtue of their larger audience, can sell more advertising and swing more weight in the broadcast world, said Driscoll. "They don't want to give up what they have," he said.

His station, he added, could request the FCC to assign it another frequency, one that would not be in the way of a clear channel station. "But the cost of doing that is nearly prohibitive," he said.

The station also could take the case to court, but, according to Driscoll, several other stations already have gone that route without success.

The FCC, however, has relented somewhat. It gave permission to WTAK and several other daytime stations across the nation last fall to stay on the air a few additional minutes, with reduced power, after sunset.

Johnathan David of the FCC said that even with just a few watts of power, a radio station can do a good job of serving a station's community, although not outlying areas.

But all WTAK was granted, said Driscoll, was 15 minutes extra with power reduced to anywhere between 77 and 139 watts. "Compared to the 10,000 watts we have daily, that was nothing. Heck, I could get on the station's roof with a loudspeaker, and my voice would carry farther than that amount of power."

"So, we chose not to accept it. It just wasn't worth it."

WTAK radio needs change of frequency

STONE MOUNTAIN — Southerners have been done a disservice by David Driscoll, manager of Huntsville, Ala.'s WTAK radio, as reported by Charles Seabrook in (the April 1) Journal-Constitution.

His implication that his station is forced off the air at night by government regulations so that powerful Northern stations can educate an "ignorant, ill-informed South" is ludicrous and self-serving.

How does Mr. Driscoll account for Atlanta's own WSB? Or Nashville's WSM? Or New Orleans' WWL? Or Louisville's WHAS? Or Richmond's WRVA? Or Fort Worth's WBAP? All of these are Southern clear-channel stations that share the same status as the object of his wrath, WCFL in Chicago, and all of them require that Northern stations sign off their frequencies at night.

Allowing the 2,300 daytime stations to go full time would not necessarily result in improved service for communities, or better ratings for those stations. One thing that would result is increased interference in many areas and the further degradation of an embattled medium — AM radio.

One solution for Mr. Driscoll and WTAK is to relocate to a more favorable frequency. However, for the majority of struggling AM stations, the answer may be in upgrading and improving their programming so that people will want to listen.

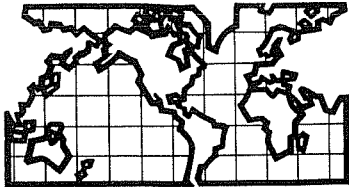

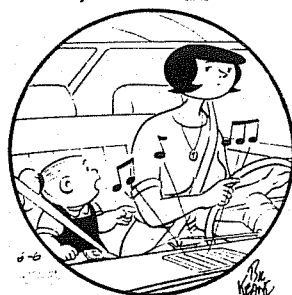

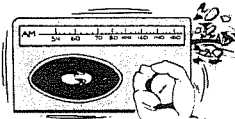
