I've been back from Korea for two weeks now. Since I've been back, I've done a little DXing. The one thing I've noticed about this location over my previous location in Laurel is that groundwave signals are much poorer here compared to Laurel. As a result, skywave signals are able to cut thru the locals much easier. Even WTOB-1500 and WCAO-600 are bothered with QRM here, whereas nothing was audible under them in Laurel. All locals are readily nullable here. Gardiner Smith, I've been trying to track you down. I couldn't find your phone number with Directory Assistance. I would like to chew the rag with you. My number is (301) 498-1324 and is local from D.C. Please call. I have to go. Chil-Ship-sahn. Ahnnyoung!!

In late October, I started using a Radio west loop with an NRD-515 rx. I have DXed almost every possible time and would like to comment on ECB DXing in Mississippi. During the day new "clear" stations such as WMSO-640, KMTL-760, WJMW-770, WXSS-1030 and WKKE-1180 are proof of the clear channel breakdown. Religious format is most popular with WJMW C&W and WXSS trying Adult Contemporary days, R&B nights and religious on Sunday. Sunset seems to be one of the best times for me to DX because of NSP QRM on both MM and SM now. Most stations audible on MM aren't distant or difficult enough to be considered "DX". I tried ER's from WNRK-1260 and WQPM-1300 with 1260 all WNDE and KGEX. WKXI dominated the "herd" on 1300 with a TT audible but it was impossible to tell if it was WQPM or another daytimer. WCCO and CBW were in so it may have been WQPM. WRVA's SM SP leaves a SS "graveyard" with no trace of CKXL, KGEM or KRAK on 1140. WCOA--Fla recently dropped DX potential on 1370 to a new low with NSP programming. This channel had been open for many years on MM with KXLF-Mont., KEEN-Calif., and CPOK-Alberta, some good catches. (Drool, drool, hi--rce) Cuban QRM is a problem on the lower channels with only strong regionals from Memphis, Atlanta, St. Louis, Dallas, etc. coming through. Now for the good part. Most of the new "clears" reduce power and use DA's at night so I can DX on 640, 1030 and 1180, after power/pattern changes. WJMW beams right towards me at night but uses only 250 watts so I hear C&W under WABC or phone calls under WJMW (hi). KOB is tougher but possible at SRS with WJMW. WXSS is almost "DX" at night with KBSM-Mo, KHOG-Ark. and sometimes KTWO-Wyo. over it. I was concerned about their night power and pattern because of KTWO and WBZ. WXSS, Memphis, Tenn., started on Nov. 9 using 1000 U2 (ND days and DA nights) but will increase to 50000/1000 U2 as soon as a part for their 50 kw transmitter comes in. Of course, WJMW and WXSS are NSP. KMTL-760 is now 10000-D and announces that it covers Ark. and parts of four other states. WKKE-1180 is now religious and IS's as "Key-1180" after trying MYL in 1982 and C&W in '83. Makes me wonder what WYAI-890 Ridgeland will try when they get on the air if WLS allows it (hi). Some of my better DX catches will be appearing in CDXR. Senegal-765 is a semi-regular now but no legal ID yet. Heard them strong on Thransgiving //--4890 Sw. Also heard radio Free Grenada on 535, thanks to David Reitz who mentioned it to me. Does anyone know their power? WATH '83 lists them as 1-kw, no listing in '84 WATH. 73's from Mississippi.

I received a package full of goodies from KUAT for a reception report I sent them. I heard them on 24 November and received my reply on 03 December. They sent a QSL, sticker, history of the station and a program guide. They also returned the SASE I sent them. The only other Arizonan I have verified is KOY.

I want to thank Gary Larson for the package of goodies he sent me. I plan on sending a package out to him as soon as I get the time to go to the post office and find an appropriate size envelope.

When I travel I like to visit stations. When I was in high school I got to visit Los Angeles and toured KPCC which was in the basement of a church. I was wondering if it was still there. (Of course. Calls stand for Pasadena Presbyterian Church-RtH.)

My parents own 31 acres in Mt. Enterprise, Texas. At the moment the only thing on the land is a lot of trees. I was wondering whether any members would like to go there sometime for a DX'pedition.

I find radio propagation interesting. I live in southeast Dallas and there are some AM stations I can't hear very well. However, when I go to a friend's house in Oakcliff I hear these stations on a regular basis. I wouldn't think that there should be that much difference in reception of stations in the same city. I find it also interesting because I use the same receiver for my reception in both places. 73.

Logged from new QRA reached total of 218 at end of November, including an even 100 midday loggings. 03 December saw a nice S-SE midday opening with Wyoming and Colorado added to states/provinces logged between 1000 and 1400 PST to make a total of 12 such. Veries have turned to slow side with only recent being CKRP 1400 thanks to WGE.

As an experiment I've moved my various loops away from outside walls as outside walls are constructed with a chicken wire net under stucco; just possibly this was making my nulling efforts of little avail. Said loops include a new Sanserino as well as SM-1, SM-2 and unamplified diamonds. The new SL gave me good nulls on KMAS 1030 and KFAX 1100 to log the above mentioned new midday states.

Appreciated the leads on Uniden CR-2021 sales; only problem is that all three sources were out with no more to come; phoned each same day received DXM. Oh well, maybe RS will have a sale.

By the way, an excellent Radio Shack product is the Micronta Programmable Timer 63-887; gives six completely flexible on-off cycles to work with, and will control two separate circuits, although only to a total of six cycles. A typical run was my set-up with the Grundig on 1340 kHz this morning (04 December, a Tuesday) at 0513-0532, 0557-0607, 0657-0707, 0727-0737, 0757-0807 and 0857-0907. Intermatic has a similar timer, series ET700 which has many more on-off cycles available as well as an automatically recharge.

In closing, an update on GY veries: 1230 (57), 1240 (52), 1340 (61), 1400 (63), 1450 (64) and 1490 (46). Sorry to see increase in nighttime power for these; can't help but make GY mess even worse. 73.

Regarding the Broadcast Auxiliary Station KPF 941, Part 74 of the FCC Rules doesn't have a category with that description. But because KPF 941 is on 1622, a frequency allocated for Group A Remote Pickup stations (the others being 1606 and 1646). I assume that is what it is. However, Section 74.432 (a) says, "A license for a remote pickup broadcast station will be issued only to the licensee of an AM, FM, noncommercial FM, television, or international broadcast station, or to an eligible network entity." I agree with Mr. Zuk, it ain't legal. (When recently did the FCC worry about legalities? The "new" FCC is a joke, hi-RtH.)

Really wild conditions lately with an Alaskan opening 27 November (UTC); KFQD 750 and KCBF 820 atop KXL and WBAP respectively. And this afternoon (28 November) about 1430 PLT an opening into Momanland. .err, Calgary, with previously unheard CFAC 960 bombing KABL, CHQR 810 under KGO and CFFR a powerhouse on 660. Heard new CKGB 750 on 26 November. CP was for 730. Took me a bit of looking to find note of that because I don't keep records on those details.

Got a kick out of hearing KHOG 1030 Farmington, Arkansas, during a day-time DX session around 1755 EST. What a name. Should be in Iowa near KCOB or near Sparta, Wisconsin-WCOW.

Received the new NRC log and miss the old, smaller format. Too much clutter on my desk already.

Anyone looking for an expensive toy. .get a Marantz PMD 220 mono recorder. Delux, with audio filtering the source monitoring. Really cleans up the signal on my R70. Sharpens it a lot so that I listen out of the recorder more than the R70 which sounds muddy in comparison.

Heard JBC 700 on one of those good auroral condition nights. My 14th country on BCB. Noted the Australian with 34 states. .I've only logged 37. Geesh.

I did heard Belize on new 830 in surprising null of WCCO. On those good southerly nights, almost all non-local channels had Spanish somewhere in the clutter.

John Wilkins, WOW is still on 590 here in Iowa. Was your 600 log a typo? (I was wondering about that, hi-RtH.) Plus, how much of a problem is WLW for you on 700? I get decent nulls periodically but they're too narrow for any freedom to work the south. I thought I heard R. Sucre, Ecuador one night, but I'll believe it when I get a longer tape segment with more ID info. I've logged TGHR, TICN, HJXC and JBC. Call me collect if you get an opening to Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru or Panama.

Glen, hope the 6500W arrived OK. Sorry I couldn't visit more when you called.

Finally met the IRCAn most responsible for my move to the Big Island and selection of my home in Hawaiian Paradise Park, my correspondent Chuck Boehnke. He and his wife, Ginny, had a DX session with me here 26 November from 1800 HST until the juice ran out around 2100. Current stormy, rainy weather affecting all the islands' windward sides has made solar charging of the batteries difficult. (It's always raining in Hilo, hi-RtH.)

Sometimes when DX'ers visit there's no DX, but this time we were in luck; my much wanted fourth Canadian province appeared and it wasn't Manitoba, not Ontario, but desirable PQ in the form of CBJ 1580, giving KDAY a run for its money; KDAY was weakened on the Beverage and not a sign of XEDM or KNIX. In solidly 1835 to 1910. With WBE also in, there were clear signs of that northerly arc also reported by Harley Parkhurst in Alaska, who gets WTIC and the whole east coast, but little from the midwest. However, WLS was also in well. I think I have a chance for WTIC if I can get KWAI off the air. And will my next Canadian province be CBA 1070? With KNX weakened on the Beverage, it's a possibility.

Two frustrations were a BC GY on 1400 (there are four possibilities); we were getting plenty of copy on its lengthy newscast at 2000 to 2010 HST when pest KBCH took over; and a TT'er with steady 1000 Hz tone from 2000 on 1580, also heard 25 November. John Arhtur tells me WLLM Patchogue, New York tests its 10 kw often at this time, and time-wise (after midnight EST, but not in MST or PST) it would have been right. What say, easterners? Is WLLM testing a lot these days? Does it ID?

Speaking of TT's, I heard KCJB 910 North Dakota with its scheduled FC, but it appeared to come on late (2010, not 2005 HST as per Joe Fela's list) and stay on until 2030 or possibly 2034. Mixed with KNEW and one other.

Canadians have been good lately, and Europe too, but I won't say much on

Europe here because I've written an article and submitted it to DXM.

Our main problem in the islands is splash and mixing products from locals, with those engineered by one particular firm always in evidence.

While here, Chuck modified my ICOM IC-R71A so that the preamp doesn't automatically cut off at 1600 kHz. Now, it boosts MW signals at the higher end but gradually tapers off toward LW. Unlike the R-1000, it has no internal mixing products and overload, but until I get more solar panels and batteries or a run of sunny days, the Trio will remain my main receiver. . .also because I like it. Aloha.

Hello all and finally I've gotten around to contributing to these pages with the latest in DX from Alaska.

Aside from the usual Seattle, Vancouver and Victoria "pests," stations from Hawaii are popping up all over the dial in surprisingly strong signals. Only five Hawaiians are left to show up. In fact, at night there is a regular battle of the bands on the air. Semi-local KHAR 590 Anchorage is in regular battle with Honolulu's KSSK 590 "K-59." These two usually fade in and out, over and under each other. Another battleground has started at 650 where Anchorage's KYAK and Honolulu's KORL usually struggle for the frequency as WOYL and CWM slug it out.

Usually the strongest Hawaiian is Maui's KNUI 900 which is frequently at local levels, and as strong as the west coast "Clear Channel" stations such as KIRO 710 and KGO 810.

Most Alaskans are now being heard during the early AM hours, with almost all stations in western Alaska coming in right through noon-time now. Missing so far are KYUK 580 due to local KVOK 560 splatter and KBRW 680 which I doubt I'll ever hear due to it being so far north. All Fairbanks and Anchorage stations accounted for except KGHX 1300.

Even during long summer days regular groundwave reception included KLAM 1450 Cordova at 300 miles with only 250 watts; KVAK Valdez 1230, also surprisingly strong for 250 miles. (But virtually all water path with no competition - see my forum-Rth.) Just recently started picking up ArRN 50-watt repeater established on 1490 at the Seward Armed Forces Recreation site.

Occasionally Seward's KXRA 950 gets through, but local AFRN 960 splatter blocks it out. Speaking of which, the local AFRN 50-watt repeater on base at Kodiak should be shifting to FM soon. KGTL 620 Homer to establish a repeater on 102.3 FM here in Kodiak. The third Alaskan AM to repeat itself via FM. (KBRW Barrow repeats on FM at Point Hope and KBYR Anchorage repeats via FM at Prudhoe Bay.)

That's it for now. I'm trying to get some DU DX, but with an electrically noisy furnace, and CATV interference, sometimes my Superadio is a little too sensitive. Oh well, got to keep warm, and my upstairs landlord likes TV, and I love my waterfront location; I shouldn't complain. Take care and 73.

Anyone know if KGBU 1250 Florence, Oregon is on the air yet? (Nope-Rth.) Ditto KRKX 1010 Milwaukie, Oregon? KROR 1360 Myrtle Creek, Oregon just granted KRGL, don't know if it's in effect, as I still need KROR thanks to a local on 1370 which shall remain nameless. (Call change in effect, and very hard to hear here thanks to a local on 1340 which shall remain nameless, hi-Rth.)

Read an article in the Radiophiles bulletin where KHQM 1480 Spanish Fork, Utah, is now owned by the Hari Krishnas! (In Utah?-Rth.) That explains all that chanting I hear on this station when it comes in at SRS.

Because I'm the new f/c list editor, I would appreciate any info any US/Canadian DX'ers can furnish me on f/c's in their region.

Great column this week. Thanks all for your contributions; I really enjoy seeing forums from the far corners of WDXP-land. What you might consider to be run-of-the-mill DX, is real DX for others of us, so keep them cards and letters coming.

Fritz, no problem with the hand-written forum. I know what you mean about the office typewriter. Ya see, I'm a PK (Presbyterian) and I often wondered how dad made sense with his hand-scrawled notes on Saturday night, but somehow it always came off great on Sunday, hi!

Rod, I lived in Sitka, Alaska from '65-'68, then in an Indian village, 40 miles northwest of Ft. Yukon for another year. Kodiak is at the same latitude (more or less) as Sitka, albeit, 600 miles west of Sitka, but all waterpath. At that time there were only 14 stations in the entire state. I had evening shift at now defunct KSEW 1400. I had nightly phone calls from Kodiak, to the point where we picked up two advertisers from Kodiak and I ended up giving two weather forecasts, one for southeast Alaska and the other for Kodiak! But it was a rare occasion when I heard Anchorage, and even rarer, Fairbanks. Like you mention, Seattle, Vancouver and Victoria are nightly pests. It wasn't until I went to Venetie that I really had super DX. Although I still remember the summer of '67 from Sitka that starting around 0400 PLT that the DU's started rolling in. In fact, I logged over 100 DU's that summer!

But the most interesting was when I lived in Venetie. No electricity, so I DX'ed on a battery powered Trans-Oceanic. That's how I indirectly met Richard Wood. KIKI 830 Honolulu had a talk show in the evening. A caller read something about Alaska natives and was totally incorrect. I wrote a lengthy letter to Johnny Walker, the host at KIKI (remember this Richard?) and then heard my letter a few days later being read on the show. Richard Wood then called and basically answered my letter, asked me questions and that began a regular correspondence with KIKI. I would ask questions about DX, the letter would be read, and Richard Wood would call with a response.

While I'm traveling down memory road, before CFRN 1260 went AN/NSP, KYA was the only station on 1260, and it was KYA that introduced "underground rock" to the world with DJ Russ "The Moose" Syracuse.

DX? Well, you might call it that. Noted WLS on 08 December with a '60s level, I mean 30 db over S/9. Also, same morning WHAS was mixing with someone else and it didn't sound Spanish. Then, same date, at 0200 PST heard, "Your number one country music station. It's -30 in downtown Edmonton." This was on 790. Is Camrose giving Edmonton weather? Never did get a clear ID.

Aside from that, no real DX from this QTH. My neighbors have gotten all 40 channels from CATV, so now I'm listening to NSP TVI. Let's see, where did I put those coax cutters?-hi. See y'all in 7 and Merry Christmas to all de Rth. .

Anyway, they can supply any reasonable length and gauge, at least 5000 feet for #18 wire, from their supplier, by request. Their number is toll-free: 1-800-431-1048, or in New York State 914-592-7100. Yonkers oddity KPF-941 was written up in the December 15 edition of Billboard. They seem to have been licensed, but praying they could get away with a loophole in the law so they could broadcast instead of "relay" as intended by the Broadcast Auxillary Service described by the FCC. The operator of KPF-941 owns a bonafide station in Maine, and that's how he managed to beg a permit. Finally, New York City radio had a tragic loss in the death of WNYC DJ Marty Wayne on 12-2. He has been on NYC's only AM NPR outlet for years, and was most known for his show "Senior Edition" for senior citizens. It won't be the same without him. Forgive my flakey typing! ## Yonkers Native Weiner Comes Home on AM Band

**NEW YORK** When Allan H. Weiner left his hometown of Yonkers, N.Y., to pursue a radio engineering career which took him to Presque Isle, Me., where he purchased WOZI-FM four years ago, he vowed he'd find a way to put a station on the air serving Yonkers. Last month he did.

Weiner, who also owns Monticello, Me.'s WOZW-AM, had exhausted every means of finding an open frequency for Yonkers, since its location, just north of the Bronx, was already cluttered with New York City signals, when he happened upon an FCC regulation which in essence said that a licensee could apply for an auxiliary station. Weiner, obviously a licensee with two properties

under his belt, did just that. Asking for 100 watts full-time at 1622 AM, he promptly received the go-ahead.

What Weiner had found was a loophole. The regulations didn't specify where the auxiliary station had to be located in relation to the main facility, nor what the licensee could do with it. Theoretically, Weiner could take to the air selling time and running commercial programming, but that was never the intent.

"There is enough commercialism there already," notes Weiner, sounding much different from the entrepreneur operating in Maine. "We honestly wanted to give something to the community, the area we grew up in. We signed on Nov. 7 with an all-volunteer staff, financed totally out of pocket."

The studios are located on the land of a longtime friend and associate of Weiner's, John Paul Ferrara. And the 100 watts, while producing a city grade signal over Yonkers

by day, reaches as far as Canada at night. Calls have been received from Detroit to Baltimore as the outlet's clear channel status (by default, since no one else is operating at 1622) can be heard for hundreds of miles after sunset.

Most auxiliary stations are used to relay programming back to the station from a remote location. Some are used as dispatches for mobile units, but, notes Weiner, they can be used for anything. Not that the FCC hasn't noticed.

"After our third day of operation a field officer called us up saying he'd had a report from Belfast, Me. that we were operating out of Yonkers [the phone number and location are stressed on the air]. He was curious as to what we were about. We told him we were a licensed auxiliary station, gave him all the information he asked for, and that was it. We haven't heard anything since."

Describing KPF 941 as "free-form with a rock 'n' roll base," Weiner says, "Listeners have been calling saying it reminds them of what they were hearing on FM in the mid '60s"—a far cry from Weiner's conservative country simulcast on WOZW/WOZI. ROLLYE BORNSTEIN

## KDIA reborn as KFYI news station

Radio station KDIA is no more.

As scheduled, KFYI quietly took its place late Monday night, ending one era and beginning another.

KFYI, 1310 on the AM dial, became heir to popular rhythm and blues KDIA.

For the past two weeks, KDIA played taped music and operated with a skeletal staff.

According to KFYI owner Adam Clayton Powell III, much of KDIA's staff has joined the

24-hours-a-day, seven-days-a-week, all news station.

Half of the sales staff was hired by KFYI. Powell said, and news personalities Aleta Carpenter and Roy West, formerly of KDIA, now are employed by the news station.

Powell Communications (West) Inc. bought KDIA five months ago and quickly got permission from the Federal Communications Commission to change its call letters to KFYI, or "for your information."

News updates will be aired three times an hour, sports and

business twice an hour; traffic six times an hour during peak times and three times the rest of the day; and weather will be reported six times an hour.

Special news and community service reports will be aired twice daily. "This week for example, Powell said, there will be series on holiday charities and on drugs."

KFYI was to debut in late October, but construction problems at the company's new headquarters, on Swan Way near the Oakland International Airport, caused the delay.

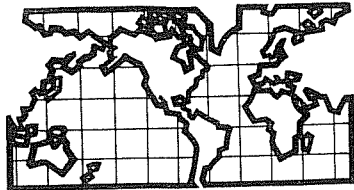

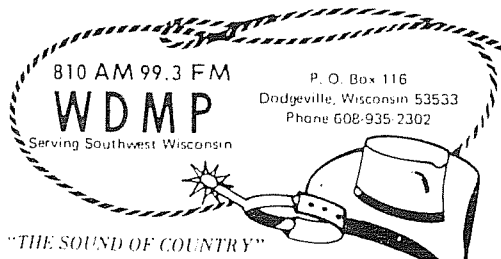
