COMING SOON - THE 1986 WRTH. The 40th edition of the World Radio TV Handbook is now being published and will be available sometime in the next couple of months. As always, it will contain listings of frequencies, times, schedules, etc for medium and shortwave stations all over the world. It will also have a number of special features articles. Gilfer Associates, P.O. Box 239, Park Ridge, NJ 07656 is now taking orders at \$15.95 plus shipping (\$1.50 first book, 50¢ each additional book), \$4.00 off the regular price of \$19.95. NEW BOOK. We've received a press release on a new book called Radio Receiver - Chance or Choice, by Rainier Lichte. The book is a review of "a large number" of receivers, all measured under the same operating conditions by the same individual, a radio engineer. It discusses the advantages and disadvantages of all receivers tested, including both new and used types, portable and table model, etc. It's 256 pages long in a 6"x9" format, and costs \$18.50. It sounds like an interesting and useful book. We'd love to see a review of it in these pages.

Details of a treaty on AM broadcasting between the US and Mexico may take a little longer than anticipated to work out. The building where the negotiations were being held, and where the official data base of Mexican AM stations was stored, collapsed during the recent earthquake. If the data base has been lost, it'll be a while 'til it can be patched together again. The US Federal Communications Commission has volunteered to help out. The treaty has already been agreed upon in principle. (Broadcasting)

Networks: With ABC news commentator Paul Harvey's contract up for negotiation soon and with Cap Cities, known for cutting the fat out of its budgets, taking over ABC, rumor has it Harvey won't be renewed. Since four of his shows are the most listened to programs on network radio in the USA, rumor has it Harvey may wish to start his own network. (Monti) NBC's Bowl game schedule: Liberty Bowl Fri 12/27 2000 ET from Memphis, Gator Bowl Mon 12/30 2000 ET from Jacksonville, Fiesta Bowl Wed 1/1 1330 ET from Tempe AZ, Rose Bowl Wed 1/1 1700 from Pasadena and the Orange Bowl Wed 1/1 2000 ET from Miami. NBC has also changed the format of its weekend "News on the Hour" to include one minute of sports beginning at :04:30 past the hour for the 0600 through 1100 ET newscasts on weekends only (NBC).

Otherness: The ratings flap that was just beginning in Tulsa OK last month has come to a head. KELI 1430 placed ads in newspapers offering bribes to Arbitron ratings survey participants to mail in their listener's diaries with KELI filled in throughout. KELI did this to prove that Arbitron's system of taking ratings is too easily corrupted. Apparently, more than 70 diaries came in, considerably reducing the size of the Tulsa market sample that Arbitron needed to take accurate ratings. KELI does not subscribe to Arbitron's service. Arbitron is suing them for \$60 million on a variety of charges (and for wrecking the Tulsa fall ratings book). KELI has ceased the ad campaign. The whole radio station is probably worth around a million dollars. (Monti, from several sources)

In this forum, I'd like to start with a brief reintroduction: I'm 32, married (happily, for the past six years) to Linda, a proud dad to Kevin (1½ years) and work as the head of the engineering dept. at Vistawall Architectural Products. I've been a CEB DXer since about 1969 during high school days, and a member of IRCA since 1977. I also belong to NRC as well, and handle reprint orders for them. My unofficial totals at the start of this new DX season are about 1624/1242. I DX with a trusty HQ-150 and several semi-beverage antennas hooked into a phasing unit. Actually, this arrangement is pretty rudimentary; the antennas can only very loosely be called "beverages" as they are essentially wires tossed over trees out in the woods behind our house that sort of amble around in the desired directions--namely, W and NW. They are proof that the "woods-variety" of beverages do not function like a true beverage should. Still, however, they do work okay, and quite a bit of good DX has come down them. The phasing unit is only the most basic unit, built by Chuck Hutton. This is far better than my original arrangement that I started DXing with way back when--a Realistic DX-120 rx. I got a most interesting letter the other day: it was from the wife of the PD at WCLD-1490 Cleveland, Miss. Apparently, her husband had recently found a followup report that I mailed to them back in 4/84 for a 1/84 reception. She said that she was the type of person who thought such things should be answered, so she sort of verified my reception of WCLD! I say "sort of" because all she could say was that yes, the individual that I heard was working there at that time, and that they were having transmitter problems back then, causing them to stay on full power for a few days, so that was probably them. I was really touched by her thoughtfulness, and wrote her a thank-you note. If only there were more people like her either in or married to broadcasting personnel!! There is a P.S. to this little story: I received a v/pp from WCLD for that same reception in 8/84 from the G.M.! Oh well, it's the thought that counts, right guys? Anyway, I'm looking forward to my ninth season of DXing as a member of IRCA and hope everyone logs all kinds of good stuff. 73's till next time.

Recent events: I got to exchange ideas with a number of DXers at the NRC Convention in R.I. The convention organizers (Craig Healy et al) are to be commended for making the convention a success, despite the weather and other problems. *** WKOX Framingham, Mass is now on 1200 kHz - daytime only (so far) and apparently still 1 kw. WLIB-1190 is now easily heard here days; it's actually stronger than 50 kw WNEW-1130. WKOX's slop now buries the weak WCAU-1210 groundwave; when WKOX goes 50 kw, it will probably become difficult to get WLIB groundwave here. *** Hurricane Gloria hit Massachusetts on 27 Sept. No serious damage here in Billerica: the biggest inconvenience was the loss of electrical power for 3 days. At my folks' house in W. Yarmouth, a large black-locust tree on the property line came crashing down; luckily, it fell away from the house. All of my antenna systems survived. The storm had numerous effects on local broadcasting, mostly related to power outages. WEZE-1260 was off the air for 4 days after the storm (WMMR heard days (weak) and CIHI/WNDR noted at night). WCAS-740 was off for a while, leaving WGSM o/CBL. WMRE-1510 jumped on & off for a few days. In WMRE's absence, WNLC could be heard days; a jumble including a stiff (Saudi?) het noted at sunset; and CJRS well o/WLAC at night. WKOX-1200 lost one of its new towers to be used for the night-time directional array; the tower fell across the studio building, cutting it in half! Fortunately, only one employee suffered minor scratches. WDLW-1330 has only one tower at its South St. (Waltham, Mass.) site; I'm not sure if the other 2 towers were removed because of storm damage or for some other reason. WDLW is running flea-power at night: its formerly loud signal now suffers substantial WNYM (NYC) QRM on strong-skip nights in Billerica. I'm not sure if anyone else has mentioned in the bulletin that WAMK-1410 (Brocton, Mass.) has been off the air for quite a while now (since mid-summer of earlier). ***

WNTN-1550 has been doing schizophrenic flip-flops between Black-oriented dance programming & Irish shows. WLYN-1360 seems to be slowly losing signal strength. The new religious station in NY state on 760 (the call eludes me at the moment) is audible here during the day at weak level, over even-weaker WJR. *** I wish Kaz was still in Maine so we could read about the rare Africans. *** Newsflash (3 Oct.): WKOZ-1200 now on at night. Daytime signal is stronger than before (5 kw or more); night signal is weak (1 kw or less). *** 73 and good DX.

Perhaps a review of first year at new QTH as to GY DX would be of interest: I guess we all know that NSP'ers abound thereon here in the Pacific Northwest and I suppose in most areas, but here's what I've logged: 1230 - 7 in Idaho, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia, all through local KWYZ; 1240-6 in Oregon, Washington and British Columbia with no dominant AN'er here (KGY may be such, not sure); 1340-13 in California, Montana, Oregon, Washington, Alberta and British Columbia with KOTY most frequently heard apparently NSP; 1400-12 in Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia with CKRP and KPRL sometimes pests; 1450-12 in Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia with no dominant AN'er although I believe KJUN may be NSP; 1490-13 in California, Montana, Oregon, Washington, Alberta, and British Columbia with KENE apparently a new addition to NSP'ers. There's certainly nothing worth calling DX in there; just numbers fattening, which causes me to ponder on value of spending so much recording/monitoring time on those channels, but I'm a GY chaser from way back and I hate to abandon these frequencies. GY DX is done mostly with the little Airline 3980 with R. West Shotgun antenna, as the bigger radios just pull in too much on these frequencies to allow anything to emerge on top. I usually try to monitor mornings on which western f/cs are listed, such as 1st or 2nd Sunday on 1230, 3rd Monday on 1340, etc., but without much success as to listed f/cs.

HELP. Ladies, when you call a radio station for any reason, please take the time to ascertain correct mailing address, then list same in DXR as soon as possible; Evansville and Casper, Wyoming post offices have returned packages because of outdated addresses. There have been others, such as Medford which twice returned mail for same reason. Talk about "service;" I can see no reason for this other than laziness. Phone calls would be cheaper, but generally I'm not in a position to make long distance calls, so help along this line wherever possible would indeed be appreciated. (Don't you know Roy, the more raises they get in postage, the service correspondingly declines, hi-RTH.) 73.

It's been a long time since I've sent in a forum, but here goes. First bit of news is that I'm moving (it'll probably be done by the time you read this) to Pleasanton, about 15 miles east of Hayward. My new location is vastly superior for DX; the Hayward location has been a source of noise and interference more than hearing good long distant DX.

The DX'pedition Doug Nyholm wrote in about in a previous issue went off as planned; good to see Neil Kazaross again, who brought his phasing unit along. Even though conditions weren't the best we ever experienced (it just about fizzled around 0300 PLT), we did get some really good reception of the Australian RPH stations on 1620 and 1629, as well as an amazing reception of Fiji 810 under KGO! (Good going-Rth.) Details sent to Pat Martin.

In the local radio scene: KXLR is carrying more and more BBC programming all the time. They even carry Letterbox and a phone-in interview show on Sunday mornings. Hasn't helped their ratings much, however. Latest Arbitron places KXLR at 0.4, which is dismal even compared to the old KOIT. James Gabbert, owner of KT20 (ex-owner of K-101) was quoted in the Oakland Tribune as saying of the Windham-Hill soft jazz format: "That station makes KPFA look like a rocker." Speaking of Gabbert, he is presently negotiating to buy KOFY 1050 San Mateo. His earlier plans to buy KMAX 1100 fell through, but he's determined to get back into radio. Apparently he's hoping to get a full time license for the station with a directional night antenna. He also feels that he can get around the station combination restrictions because he has a UHF station and he's part Hispanic. (I can hear you gagging, Ric, hi!) (Neeee-ow, hi-RTH.) Here's some of the other AM ratings: KSrO 2.9, (up from 2.1), KPFC 1.5 (down from 1.9), KNBR 3.7 (up from 2.2), KABL AM/FM combo 6.2 (down from 6.6), KLOK 1.1 (their FM has 1.9) and for those of you interested in the fate of new KKCY FM, it's got a 0.4 share (compare that to

Anybody notice that KIQI 1010 is now fulltime? They're announcing 24 hour service in stereo (in SS, of course), but they don't say what system they're using. Also, the word is out that KDIA 1310 should be reincarnated by year-end. (Checked and found weak KIQI mixing with CBR with latter dominant. Wonder what power? Murphy's Law of DX was broken this morning (15 October) with KIQI peaking way atop CBR for a very clear ID and both SS and the legal EE. Other than that, 245 miles north of their transmitter, they're a lightweight.

Roy, remember the days when GY DX on a MM really paid off? Was less than 20 years ago. Remember hearing ET's from up to 1,000 miles away, the Midwest sometimes heard and the Rocky Mountains heard on a regular basis? I Believe Bob Foxworth even wrote an article on how to DX GY channels by backing off on the RF gain and/or using a longwire instead of a loop. Now with many GY's using 1 kw fulltime it's getting real interesting. 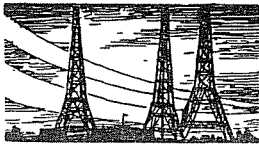

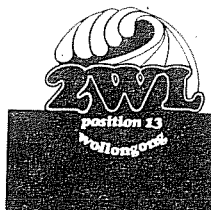

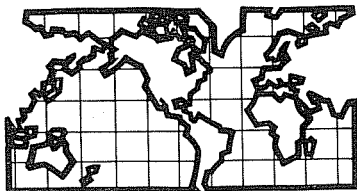

A main station is the key station in the region in which it is located and it can have up to several stations that are subordinate to it. The main stations have administrative responsibility toward and provide some programming for their subordinate stations.

Stations listed without call letters either use no call or the call letters of their main station.

PROGRAM: 1=Radio One; 2=Radio Two; SE=Social Education Broadcast (for Korean speaking people in the region outside of the Republic of Korea); RK=Radio Korea. Virtually all of the stations broadcast Social Education programs after 1600 UTC.

IDENTIFICATION: Radio One - "Yŏginŭn Cha-il Radio-immida"; Radio Two - "Yŏginŭn Cha-i Radio-immida"; Radio Seoul - "Yŏginŭn Radio Sŏ-ur-immida"; Social Education Broadcast - "Yŏginŭn Taehan Minguk Sŏ-ur-esŏ Pona-e Dirinŭn Sahoe Kyo-yuk Pangsong-immida".

VERIFICATIONS: As a matter of policy KBS does not normally verify reception reports for domestic broadcasts. Radio Korea will send their usual QSL card for reports of their programs that are broadcast via domestic stations when they are sent to the respective language service to the address above. (Reports for the Radio Korea Japanese language broadcast via HLKB-891 or HLQB-1449 can be sent either directly to Pusan or to the Japanese Language Section at Radio Korea in Seoul.) Some DXers have been successful in obtaining verifications directly from the main provincial stations, usually in the form of a QSL letter.

If This Fails, Try Smashing the Bug With the Flat End of the Radio

A Canadian radio station thinks it has found a chemical-free, odorless antidote to the summertime pest.

For its cottage-country listeners north of Montreal, CIME-FM of Ste. Therese, Quebec, is broadcasting "anti-mosquito" frequencies for 1½ hours starting at 11 a.m., and 3¼ hours starting at 4:30 p.m.

These buzz-like transmissions are supposed to imitate the high-pitched sound of male mosquitoes flapping their wings. The sound is broadcast simultaneously with regular music programming. The reasoning? Only females bite, and only after they've mated. The theory is that the bloodthirsty females will be repelled by the sound of males flying around, and leave the area.

Sitting by the Swamp

Gaetan Charbot, CIME's station manager, says some listeners were convinced after the first anti-mosquito broadcasts last week. According to Mr. Charbot, one listener called to say he sat near a swamp with his radio; he was left alone by hordes of mosquitoes. He tried it again without the radio and was bitten to bits. Another caller asked the station to broadcast the frequencies all day long.

But scientists are skeptical. The theory

"is possible, but highly unlikely," says David Lewis, an entomologist who specializes in mosquitoes at Montreal's McGill University. Art Borkent, a research scientist studying bugs in Canada's agriculture department, observes that male mosquitoes attract the female species during mating season, but there's no evidence to show they repel the females afterwards. "I'm not a mosquito expert," he says, "but it won't work."

Voice of the Lizard

CIME-FM's anti-mosquito frequencies were modeled on those broadcast by Voice of the Lizard, a Paris radio station. But while Paris is plagued by only a few varieties of mosquitoes, Canada boasts 44 varieties. So the Canadian station worked with a forestry specialist to reproduce a range of wing-flapping frequencies.

There's more work to be done. The station, which also broadcasts subliminal-relaxation messages in the evening and subliminal-energizing messages in the morning, is working to reduce the noise level of its mosquito-wing reproduction: Mr. Charbot admits that some listeners phoned to complain that they couldn't enjoy the music over the background buzzing.

And he hopes to develop another sound-repellant in time for black fly season.
