**Networks:** ABC has signed Paul Harvey, host of the four most popular shows in network radio today to a seven-year extension of his recently-expired ten-year contract. ABC will pay Harvey \$25 million to continue his broadcasts until June 30, 1993, at which time Harvey will be 75. (BC)  
Cadena Radio Centro is a new, full-format Spanish network originating in both Irving TX and Mexico City, to begin operations in November or December (BC).  
New to National Public Radio in January will be "Performance Today," a 2-hour weekday-morning program of classical music and arts features, fed at 0800 ET (BC).  
UPI's Spanish radio network has changed names from Nuestras Noticias to UPI Radio Noticias. (BC)

**Syndication:** "Reflections on the Black Experience" is a one-minute daily feature on black history. (BC)

**Tentative sale:** Westinghouse (Group W) and General Electric (NBC) are rumored to be considering merging their radio stations and the NBC Radio Networks (including The Source and Talknet) into a new joint venture company. The only conflict in the \$400 million deal is that either Group W's WINS 1010 or GE's WNBC 660 New York would have to be sold. Since WINS is a higher-frequency directional station, expect it to be the one to go. (BC and Monti)

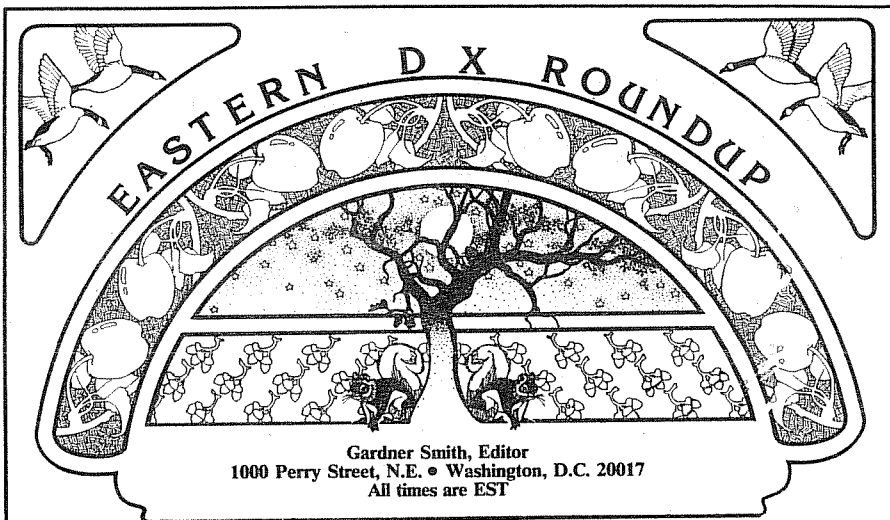

Time for a forum. First off, thank you everyone who voted for me for the TVA. It was totally unexpected and I deeply appreciate it!

I've spent the last few days trying to clear up some old DX-related stuff and have found out the following information: KRCC 1400 Indio, California is now KUNA "R. Cañon," with SS format and still 24 hours NSF. KMAV 1570 Riverside, California is changing calls to KPRO on 01 November. You all know that KDIF 1440 Riverside, California (ex-KPRO) is back on the air, "La Diferencia" slogans and SS format. Called KDAL 1230 Price, Utah and discovered some conflicting information with information published in WDXR — that KDAL won't be moving to 750 for "quite a while yet," as FCC is still considering their application, though it was reported in WDXF that they were to move to 750 on 06 October. Called CKRD 850 Red Deer, Alberta and found out they've decided to not move to 700 for "a while yet." Called the station back in June and they gave me a September 1, 1986 date to make the move. It goes to show you that stations sometimes have a tendency to 'look ahead too fast' when it comes to CP's. Sometimes it's just a matter of money, or the application gets put in the circular file at the FCC. (Or in the case of CKRD, CRTG-RtH), or for some other reason.

KSAH 720 Universal City, Texas hopes to come on the air 01 November 1986 with 5000/1000, "R. Festival" slogans, so may be SS format. KVDZ 1090 Laredo, Texas hopes to move to 890 on 01 January 1987. Also, KSKD 600 Redding, California is now KHTE, slogan "Classic Hits. KHTE." format seems to be oldies-type. (Which is why I reported AT40 at new time/day under old calls. I recognized AT40 and didn't wait for ID. Strong signal here RW. ves. 60s, '70s oldies.—RtH).

I'm still looking for KELL 830 Tucson. Where are they putting their power? It would seem logical they should send their power towards Phoenix, but they apparently don't and they have to protect XEVO 830 because they were there first!

Looking forward to this coming MM's KLCV 930 DX Test. FLCY is my most-wanted Montana station. Anyone know if their night CP is on?

RtH, I agree with you that "Of Special Interest" is the most important part of the Monitor, because that's where I get a good portion of my new DX from. My primary source is the "For the Record" section of Broadcasting Magazine, and my secondary source is the "M Street Journal" which I get weekly. With all three of these sources, I can usually keep up on 99.9% of the changes going on, which nowadays come fast and furious sometimes. This by the way will sometimes allow you to get a station that may be covered up on the original frequency and is an interesting method of seeking out the DX. Sorry to hear that you do not have much time to do the column. Maybe the hour we are getting back shortly will resolve your time problem, hi. Seriously, I hope you manage to find a way that will allow you to stay on EDXR. To Gardner Smith, WARD-1550 is not really a new station but instead WPTS which moved from 1540 and changed call letters. Haven't heard from you lately Smitty. Tied to your RX? hi. Been hearing an ad for a local auto dealer which is using cuts from the President's news conferences to make it sound as if the US President is promoting the auto dealership. Thought it was illegal to use the president's voice in such ads. (Since John is the only reporter this week, let's finish off his old Forum reports. This one is from May--rce) Memorial Day 1986 provided me with a new catch as I was able to hear the 0600 sign on of WBZE-1030 from Indian Head, Md. The station tells in the sign on that it serves the Eastern seaboard and often ID's as "Stereo 1030". WBZE comes in well in spite of WBZ from Boston, Mass. WBZE plays three to four records of Christian rock and will then provide a short message of inspiration and an ID. There are no ads and so far no ministers preaching or requesting money. The station had its share of problems with a carrier that would cut on and off and would sometimes give a reduced power. On top of this, at times the audio would cut on and off, especially toward the sign off. The announcer prior to leaving the air at 2015 said that they would be working to resolve the problems. While listening to the Caribbean Beacon on 1610 last night, I decided since it was a holiday, I'd see if any of the pirates were operating and sure enough, on 1622 I was able to pick up a rapid talking DJ playing "I'm a Wanderer". # A LOOK AT RADIO REBELDE

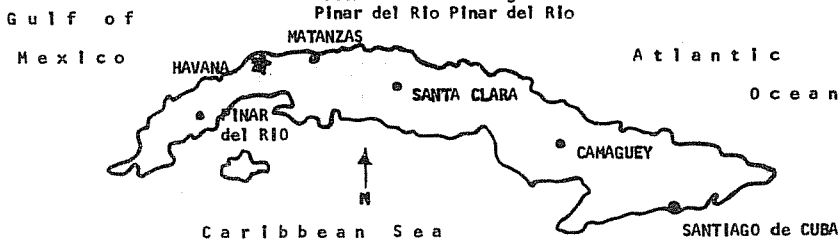
- OCTOBER 1986 -

The following article is composed from observations published in IRCA DX Monitor columns DX Worldwide - West / DX Worldwide - East, current WRTH information, and the current FCC Cuban Standard Broadcast list indicating calculated values of all Cuban stations known to be active on mediumwave. In this article a current analysis of the Cuban Radio Rebelde outlets will be offered, including frequency, locations with FCC coordinates, calculated output power in watts, and information on QSLing the Rebelde network. Hopefully, in the future, similar articles concerning other major Cuban networks will be published. Regretfully, the actual computer-generated listing published by the FCC cannot be reprinted outright in DXM.

Information herein is as accurate as possible compared with the FCC's listing dated September 11, 1986. Provisions of the Radio Broadcasting to Cuba Act, Public Law 98-111, require the FCC to promulgate Rules. In furtherance of the objectives of this Act, the FCC publishes the listing and updates it on an "as amended" basis. The list is published for the purpose of determining the existence and level of interference (QRM) to United States AM radio broadcast stations for the purposes outlined in Part I, Subpart M of the Commission's Rules. Cuban stations are presumed to be operating at the location and power entered on their list according to the FCC Field Operations Bureau. Corrections/amplifications should be directed to the DXW+E editor.

Geographically, Cuba is the largest and westernmost of the West Indies and lies at the entrance to the Gulf of Mexico. The south coast is washed by the Caribbean Sea, the north coast by the Atlantic, and in the east the Windward Channel separates Cuba from Haiti. Havana is the capital, and the island country is divided into six provinces:

Through the time of revolutionary Fidel Castro, an extensive program of vilification against the United States, as well as expropriation of US landholdings, banks, and industrial concerns ultimately led to the breaking of diplomatic relations by the US government (Jan., 1961), and that year Castro openly declared his allegiance with the Communist camp. Thereafter followed such activities as the CIA's Bay of Pigs debacle and buttressing of Cuba's military power by the USSR. Castro has remained in firm control throughout, and to this day US/Cuban relations are still at a lowpoint in time. Through the use of mediumwave, EE propaganda and completely unnecessary super-powered transmitters were directed to the United States from time to time. At present, there are no EE language transmissions (except for possibly 1160), but there are still high-powered transmitters and occasional jamming of US stations. For the most part, the QRM originates from many Radio Rebelde outlets located mainly on the lower portion of the BCB. These are the concern of this article.



Quite a variety of programming has been heard on the Rebelde network. In Cuba, the cadena would likely appeal to audiences of almost all ages because of the wide range of musics played. The most common format seems to be Cuban/Latin American pop, T40, and contemporary vocals, but US pop, T40, jazz, and even rock and roll have also been heard at one time or another on Radio Rebelde. In the morning hours call-in phone programs have been heard as well. All stations run parallel each other and seem to be 24 hour 7 days as advertised on the QSL card they offer. The fact that they are all parallel (//) makes them easy to ID when DXing Latin America. In the northeast, when conditions are suitable, it is not uncommon to find several of the outlets dominating their respective frequencies at a given time. Even if you cannot sort out more than one Rebelde outlet when DXing, a shortwave tropical band outlet on 5025 kHz is also parallel and makes IDing a mediumwave signal generally very easy. While the following list is as accurate as possible as of the date at the beginning of the article, changes are likely to occur as Cuba continues to shuffle frequencies to accommodate interference to United States AM stations. Any developments will probably be reported to DXMW-W or DXMW-E. The reader is advised to consult these columns from time to time to keep abreast of conditions.

A final note of interest: Although the FCC's Cuban list seems definitely accurate, there are no listings for any Rebelde off-frequency drifters or jammers (there are several - consult worldwide columns). It is assumed that they are unmentioned because their appearances are incidental and are usually absent from the occupied split-frequencies as quickly as they appear. The variable Rebelde outlet on 704w, however, seems to be semi-permanent and was likely on at the time the Field Operations Bureau took the survey; it is unlisted. There are notations, however, where values (freq., power, location) are undetermined or are of less than satisfactory confidence if listed. These notations will be posted here where applicable:

There are a few frequencies the FCC lists that are not listed as Cuban in '86 WRTH. Since the FCC does not list network slogans on their listings, it is impossible to tell what net these are from without hearing them. Additions go to DXNW-E.

Several reports that Radio Rebelde does not QSL led this author to attempt getting a verification. Sperate English and Spanish requests were sent to Radio Rebelde at Apdo: 6277 Habana 6, Habana, CUBA, and QSL's, colorful decals, and a personally typewritten v/l were in turn received within three to four months. I always recommend return postage when writing to mediumwave stations, but since Radio Rebelde is probably financed through the Government of Cuba (and allowed to blatantly interfere with US broadcasting almost certainly suggests political angles) rp was not included in either report. Unfortunately, though, it seems to be hopeless to get them to actually verify a certain reported frequency at a certain time - there are no indications on either of the QSL cards or the letter received. A similar report in Spanish inquiring about the 704w jammer was probably discarded - we have received no word on it. The following is a sampling of cards, letters, etc from the Radio Rebelde network:


