**RADIO OWNERSHIP LIMITS MAY CHANGE:** The FCC's Mass Media Bureau is considering changing the rules which allow one entity in the US to own up to 12 AM and 12 FM radio stations. It's possible that the new rule might allow up to 24 radio stations to a customer, considering AM and FM to be part of one aural service. If that happens, expect the sales of many marginally-profitable AM stations by owners who want to make space to add FM's to their portfolios. (BC and Monti)

**AM STEREO UPDATE:** Press Broadcasting, owner of WJLK 1310 Asbury Park NJ, has petitioned the FCC to receive receiver manufacturers to make radios capable of receiving both the Motorola C-QUAM and Kahn Independent Sideband AM stereo systems. Press says that the marketplace has selected two AM stereo systems and that now it's time for the Commission to assure that they both are received. (BC and Monti) In related developments, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration, a part of the US Department of Commerce, is surveying all US AM stations on their AM stereo intentions. NTIA is intending to coax the market into an AM stereo standard by publishing the results of the survey widely, especially if one system comes out far more popular than the other. The reason NTIA can get away with this is that it's a government agency. If a private group tried to set a standard this way, it might be subject to prosecution under the antitrust laws. (BC, and Monti)

A new Airwaves Radio Network of Nahant MA is scheduling as its first offering "Classics 'til Dawn," an overnight classical music service featuring "pop classics" which often find their ways into film soundtracks and Broadway shows. (BC) New from AP Radio is "Flashback," a 30-second nostalgia feature. (BC) New to National Public Radio this fall will be a national, 60-minute, daily version of the WHYY-FM Philadelphia program "Fresh Air." The show features reviews of films, records, books and television shows and should debut in April. (BC) Another satellite network has been announced, North America One, from Kayla Satellite Broadcasting Network, Richmond, WI. It'll feature country music and talk programming intended for small and medium market stations. First station to sign up: WTMB 1460 Tomah WI. (BC) Sheridan Broadcasting Network is offering "Lou Rawls' Parade of Stars Telethon" benefitting the United Negro College Fund on 12/27. Sheridan will also offer a 60-minute special "King: Celebration of the Man and his Dream," fed on both 1/18 (King's Birthday) and 1/19 (his holiday). (BC) Infocom Broadcast Services is offering "Yea You Can," a 90-second, daily feature telling how to cope with life's little problems, hosted by Ruth Stafford Peale, wife of Dr. Norman Vincent Peale. (BC)

**Syndication:** New from The Programming Consultants is "Rockin' Oldies," a taped format. The company is also offering "The Presley Years," a 13-hour special for airing in 1987. (BC) Melcor Broadcasting is syndicating a 5-minute daily series called "A Moment of Music History" featuring big band and jazz artists of the past hosted by Marty Wilson of WNEW 1130 NY. (BC) MJI Broadcasting is offering a 1-hour weekly "Classic Cuts," featuring rock artists of the past and their classic hits. (BC) "The Campbell Playhouse," which ran on CBS Radio from 1938 to 1940, will return in syndication, still sponsored by Campbell Soup, this month. Twenty six of the original 55 episodes are expected to begin the series revival. (BC) Charles Michaleson, Inc., is offering "The Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy Show" old-time radio program beginning in 1987. (BC)

**Others:** Charles Z. Wick, Director of the United States Information Agency, has proposed that the Soviet Union and the US swap access to each other's medium wave bands. In practice, that might mean that the US would be allowed to broadcast on medium wave, possibly from transmitters inside the USSR, to Soviet citizens. In return, the Soviet Union could reach American citizens on medium wave. That might turn out to be difficult since the Soviets could not own transmitters inside the US, since that's a violation of the "no aliens in the broadcasting business in the US" law. However, the USSR could be given a (relatively) clear channel to allow AM broadcasts into the US from Cuba. Or one or more US radio networks could be coaxed (Westwood One's Mutual network has reportedly expressed interest) by the Reagan Administration into donating air time to the Soviets.

American officials have cautioned the Soviets that it would be the USSR's job, not the Administration's, to get individual broadcasters to carry the Soviet network feeds. They also warned that, in a competitive marketplace, American listeners might find what would amount to Radio Moscow programming on AM to be incredibly boring and distasteful, causing them to set their radio dials elsewhere. As part of the deal, the USSR might stop jamming Voice of America (but not Radio Free Europe or Radio Liberty) shortwave broadcasts into the Soviet Union. Critics of the Reagan Administration say that this looks like another one of those deals in which we trade a loss of something of value to US citizens to get another country to stop doing something that is illegal anyway. They also say that this idea sounds like one the Soviets thought up because the US already has access to Soviet citizens via shortwave (where many own shortwave receivers) while few Americans own shortwave receivers, much less listen to Radio Moscow on them. (BC and Monti)

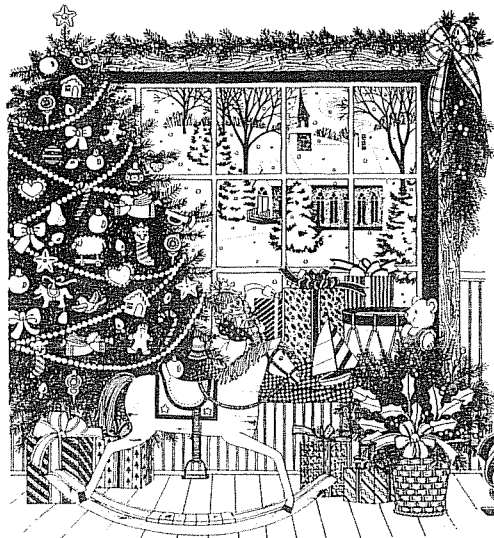

WNYC Listener's Guide, unknown date

## From The Director Mary Perot Nichols

**S**pring has officially arrived and, as members of my staff are fond of reminding me, this heralds the start of a new baseball season. Although I can't claim to be a baseball fan myself, I always root for the home team.

Lately, I've been rooting very enthusiastically for the WNYC home team which did us proud in the on-air membership drive last month. We turn to our home team of listeners twice during each twelve-month season for the support which keeps the nation's oldest public radio station on the air. I'd like to thank all of you who demonstrated your belief in the value of WNYC AM & FM by joining our team. A special note of thanks goes out to the folks at *Bogie's Boys* who donated breakfast food for our hungry volunteers during the membership drive.

Now I have some especially good news for WNYC-AM listeners. The FCC has granted WNYC AM's application to move to an 820kHz frequency! This is a momentous decision which will put an end to a legal battle that has lasted for more than forty years and has severely limited WNYC AM's broadcast hours.

WNYC made its broadcast debut on July 8, 1924 on 570kHz. On November 11, 1928 as part of a nationwide frequency reallocation plan, the Federal Radio Commission ruled that WNYC would share its frequency with WMCA. In reaction to the limitations that this time share policy imposed on both stations, WNYC AM was moved to 810kHz and finally to 830kHz in March of 1941.

Since moving from 570kHz, WNYC has faced restrictions resulting from the fact that it has been broadcasting on the same wave length as WCCO in Minneapolis, Minnesota. WCCO is a Class I or Clear Chan-

nel station and is, therefore, the dominant station on the frequency. This meant that WNYC AM was prohibited from broadcasting between the hours of sunset to sunrise in Minneapolis, when it would cause interference with WCCO's broadcasts. However, beginning in 1943, the Federal Communications Commission granted WNYC-AM Special Service Authorizations (SSA), allowing the station to operate for additional evening hours. The SSA, which was originally granted because of WNYC's contributions to the war effort, and then extended because the station was rendering a valuable public service, was finally rescinded effective June 24, 1985 by the court of appeals. Since that time, WNYC AM broadcast time has been limited to the hours between sunrise and sunset, Minneapolis time.

After more than four years of litigation, the FCC has determined that WNYC AM will be allowed to move to the 820 frequency, where it will not only have unlimited broadcast rights but will also have a considerably stronger signal.

Although we've won the battle for a permanent, full time frequency, implementation will not take place overnight. It will take between one and two years to construct a new transmitter/antenna site in New Jersey in order to broadcast over the new frequency. Once we begin broadcasting on 820AM, our on-air hours will increase as we acquire the funds to program the additional hours. Naturally, we are beginning to develop ideas for how best to program those hours.

I am very happy to be able to share this good news with the home team. With your support, you continue to help New York public radio thrive!

JAMAICA, unID city 0100+ 11/24 : Finally IDed with the help of Ron receiving it in Florida and "rebroadcasting" it by phone - since he uses SPRINT what he received there was sent to me via satellite, therefore arriving a split second after I actually was receiving it with the R71. Program was religious-sounding, or heavily soul-oriented, with black gospel-like songs and organs. Later, after hanging up with Ron, a "JBC" mention was heard, as well as "This is ??? (for) Radio One..." by man. I also IDed tentatively the Floridan in Gainesville with this "satellite DXing" here on 850.

- 1360 CUBA, Rodolpho Ramirez Esquivel CMHW : Cadena Agramonte //910/1370/1380 w/Cuban mx programs. Occ topping empty channel - semi-local WIXZ gone completely, maybe off. 0550.
- 1370 CUBA, Nuevitas CMHX 0600 11/23 : Fr-pr but //910/1360/1380. Prob. 5kW here - mixing evenly with domestics.
- 1380 CUBA, Jaronu CMHY 0555 11/22 : Good/very good //Cadena Agramonte stations. Topping channel at times w/Cuban pops.
- 1505 ANGUILLA, The Valley 0029 11/21 : Fr-pr with Lionel Ritchie.
- 1520 COLOMBIA, Barranquilla HJLQ 0408 11/20 : "Minuto, desde Barranquilla..." and pop Colombian standards. Some periodic cutting out of (audio or carrier) - technical problems here? Large Saudi=1521 het at the time.
- \*\*1570\*\* TURKS & CAICOS, unID loc. 0110+ 11/24 : Per phone tip from Ron Terotto of DX South Florida. Possibly first night of operation - announcements to the effect of "now on the air..." etc. Name in use is "Atlantic Beacon"; Ron mentions this is supposedly a sister for widely heard Caribbean Beacon, or just a "spinoff" since programming from the 50kW xmr is religon. Several mentions of "15-70 on your dial..." so probably neither 540 or 1070 hit the air per '86 WRTH information. Hymnal music and greetings to "you on the Island of Jamaica", as well as phone #(305) 484-1570 and address asking for reports from the United States : Atlantic Beacon, P.O. Box 5321, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, 33310. Ment "BCing from the beautiful Turks and Caicos Islands, West Indies". For awhile Ron transmitted it to me by phone and I couldn't get it, but after some beverages were on line they were there weak at first, and slowly peaked up to excellent levels for an hour or so. Should be a good shot for this rare country for much of the eastern US. Also announced Radio Bible Hour "every day M-F at 9:30am, and every night M-F 8:30 til 9:00"(should be Eastern as Turks & Caicos should be with GMT-5 now).

All loggings this week are from the editor. Thanks to Werner Funkenhauser in Ontario and Ron Terotto in Florida for their calls and information. While talking to Ron he exhibited several Cuban outlets dominating the freq's there - and I thought it was bad here! Good DX...

The fantastic Radio Rebelde has apparently opened another SW parallel besides 5025 - now also on 5000 kHz as well. I heard them there 11/28 and 11/29 under WWV while syncing my shack clocks. What will they do next? Good to hear from William Wyllie this week - where's everyone at? Hope to hear from you soon. Times are UTC:

Four topics which might be of interest. (1) KOFY 1050. Jim Gabbert is at it again. He has bought this station and converted it to oldies. In the meantime, taking advantage of KOFY's limited signal and operation, KSFO 560 is now oldies. KOFY is 1kw-D to LSS, after which it's supposed to operate with 19 watts. Various times in October I left the office in time to catch the power drop. Down here by the World Trade Center and in particular under the Embarcadero Freeway, KOFY is creamed; after the power drop, XED is dominant. At higher elevations, say like in Pacific Heights, KOFY holds its own. On Sunday, 09 November, it didn't drop power and was quite strong all the way home. I talked to the announcer and he said they had indeed dropped power. No way. The following Monday, it dropped again.

(2) KDFC 1220. On 18 November at 6:58 PM PST, I was on the way home and heard KDFC try to drop power. It went down in the mud, and then came back as strong as it was before. There were two more attempts to drop power. I talked to GM Ed Davis 19 November and he said they were having relay problems. KDFC is supposed to operate with 147 watts at night. It isn't supposed to cover San Francisco, but it does cover San Jose, and he's happy with that. KDFC's signal is worse in San Francisco than KOFY's purported 19 watts. What can I say?

(3) Warbling. I referred to it briefly about six months ago and am amazed no other Bay Area DX'er has mentioned it. There's electronic warbling on 580-640-650-990-1030-1050 here in the Bay Area. I haven't found a single place where it comes in on all frequencies at the same time. It's been heard as far north as Novato. The loudest I've ever heard it was on 1030 kHz 06 and 07 November on I-580 in the area of Hayward where road construction is taking place. I've heard it on top of KOFY under the Embarcadero Freeway and on top of KMJ 580 and KKIS 990 at other locations. It seemed to start when KIQI went fulltime. However, it's loudest near the KFAQ transmitter in Hayward, and I remember talking with former KFAQ CE Roger Roberts a few years back regarding its parasitic emissions. Am I hearing things? I can't believe the Commission hasn't observed this after a year-and-a-half. (Pete, I can. They're so deregulated by the current Administration, that anything goes seems to be their attitude. We at KRED got them up to Eureka to check on another station that was peak modulating as high as 190%. Result: "Nothing we can do."-Rth.)

(4) Fresno (no, no, not the TV show). I did note KEAP 980, KLIP 1220 and KHOT 1250 on with credible signals about 6:30 PM PST while driving here 06 November, operating with reduced power until two hours after LSS (the stations, no me). They have to be operating under a screwy set of rules; KLIP has to sign-off, but KDFC doesn't. In the meantime, I'm hearing "1050-AM" with BED after 9 PM PST, with Murphy's law prevailing (up during music, down during talk). Could be CKAL, but can't tell and hope it turns out to be an ex-daytimer. (Can't be CKAL as they're CRW-Rth.)

In the dreadful audio department, KHYV 970 takes the cake with absolutely no bass response (classical). KXTC 790 is nearly as grim with its BBD format. Both are uncomfortably listenable.

Some further remarks inspired by Gene Martin's comments on his first reception of the season of JOIB 747 Japan. Auroral conditions may be the only factor to prevent Japan-Denver reception once there's a darkness path between the two locations, but Japan-Victoria reception (or lack of it) seems to be another thing altogether. Reception here of Japan and Asia peaked 13 October, then disappeared with the minor storm at 1200 UTC on that date. Asiatics didn't return in strength until 17 October. Then they were varying at strength until the 03 November storm. However, since then, even though the A-indices have been similar to much of October, most east Asians have disappeared and even the big JJ stations have been at greatly reduced strength when there at all. For example, there were only a few DU carriers on 14 November between 1400 and 1500 UTC, yet the previous week had seen A-indices above 10 only once, and that was a value of 15; there was little difference or increase in geomagnetic activity on



either the 14th or 15th. I don't know if this is the mid-winter anomaly already, but WWV certainly hasn't reported much geomagnetic activity in that period. In general, I find that Asians as well as others suffer from poor conditions mid-November though mid-February in spite of whether conditions are auroral. I usually listen around sunrise, and perhaps TP conditions are better when these stations fade in around 0900 UTC or earlier, but I don't recall it being so.

For those interested in propagation, Mike Bird of Radio Australia gives a rundown of the past week's solar and geomagnetic events on two SWL programs, and gives a forecast for the following week as well. He is heard at the end of R. Netherlands Media Network program which starts at 0250 and 0550 UTC every Friday on 6165 kHz and on Radio Australia's Talkback program starting at 1240 and 1710 UTC on 9580 kHz. There are other times and channels for both programs, but this is a medium wave bulletin I'm writing in. R. Netherland is the most reliably heard this moment. 73 de NHP.

Good group of contributors this week. Still have plenty of room for others. Good hearing from you again, Paul. DX'wise, the PRG took a vacation this week, so a couple of observations and comments about local radio happenings.

Biggest news: Dr. Don Rose and KFRC are history. After 13 years and 2,987 shows, KFRC's new management in effect canned him just before Thanksgiving. His contract was supposed to run out at end of the year and not be renewed, but after his morning show, they simply handed him his check and walking papers. The former #1 Bay Area DJ, highest paid and an audience of thousands, not even given a chance to say good bye to his loyal fans. Management wasn't talking, but suspect he was too expensive for the new KFRC, and not right for the Magic 61 format. Was rumored his annual salary was around \$150K.

Now then, this made news at KRAK, a country station, the Sacramento Bee and other media sources. Although different markets, KFRC and KRAK have listeners in both markets and had done remotes in each other's market. So, on 26 November, KRAK's morning man, #1 Medium market DJ of '82 (Billboard), Joey Mitchell have several tongue lashings about the events, heavily criticizing KFRC's management. Joey has a guy who phones and does voice impressions of politicians, sports figures, movie stars, and his "boss" Mr. Ed Feebles. (Sort of a Caspar Milktoast type, hi) who was agreeing with Joey's comments. Joey raved about Dr. Don and Feebles started getting interested, especially when Joey mentioned hundreds of thousands in his audience. At that point Mr. Feebles says: "Wonder if he'll do country?" Joey: I hate your guts Mr. Feebles, and hangs up! Too bad, and really unprofessional of KFRC. I've fired off a letter for what good it'll do to KFRC's GM.

Second item: so Riverbank will join with the others duplicating the clear with paid religion. With AM in trouble, and the market so competitive, paid broadcasting avoids the sales staff hitting every merchant in the market trying to sell airtime, especially at a new station. It's good return on the investment. This is a generality, but for example: Sell 30 minute blocks at \$50 a shot (yes, I know rates vary throughout the day), and run 24 hours. That's \$1,200 daily or \$36K monthly. Now pay a kid \$4 an hour to be a tape jockey, four shifts at six hours, that's \$96 daily or \$2,880 monthly. True, costs for maintenance, PG&E, supplies, and for an engineer, have a CE on a consulting basis (sorry Glen, hi), and you've got yourself one nifty operation, and a sure-fire way to make headway in an era where AM radio is really suffering, both monetarily and in the ratings. But of course that's what it's all about in the broadcast biz. . . \$\$\$.

Well, that's it this week. Looks like a drought year for us. That's weird after having the worst flooding ever last year. Trees are finally shedding leaves around here, only a month late. Best of DX to all and hope your Thanksgiving was tremendous. 73 de RtH. .
