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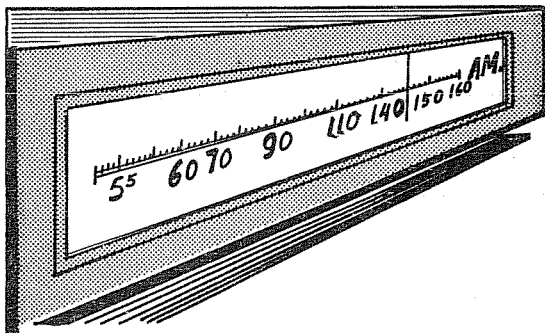

**OWNERSHIP RULE CHANGES PROPOSED:** The FCC has finally officially proposed several changes in the rules governing AM (and other) radio station ownership.

■ Companies would be able to own up to 24 radio stations regardless of band. The old rule was 12 AM's and 12 FM's. If this goes through, expect many two-band owners to dump their AM stations onto the market so they can buy more FM's.

■ Owners could also own radio and television stations in the same market. That's also not currently allowed except in grandfathered cases. Capital Cities/ABC and General Electric/NBC have been allowed to keep their radio stations in markets where they own TV's for 18 months after each of their sales. In effect, that 18 months is being extended to "forever."

■ Rules prohibiting ownership of AM stations whose 0.5 millivolt per meter contours overlap might be loosened to 1 or 5 millivolts per meter overlap. (MSJ and Monti)

## Odds and Ends

Roy Millar has sent in the following bit of information on the synchronized transmitters, KGNW-1150 had applied for before they moved to 820 kHz. KGNW had applied for low powered synchros in Everett and Tacoma, about 40 miles north and south of Seattle, respectively, which would have operated on 1150.

"As far as the 1150 synchronized transmitters, at the time of transfer, we had only applied for daytime experimentation with synchronization. That had not been approved. That all has passed into the hands of KEZX, the new owner of our former 1150 kHz transmitter. The FCC turned down our fulltime application for synchronized transmitters due to their interpretation of skywave interference to co-channel stations here in the northwest. We decided to go for daytime only at first, with the thought of keeping "one foot in the door" in the event they would change that protection rule. However, as I said, all that is now in the hands of the new owners of 1150, KEZX here in Seattle."

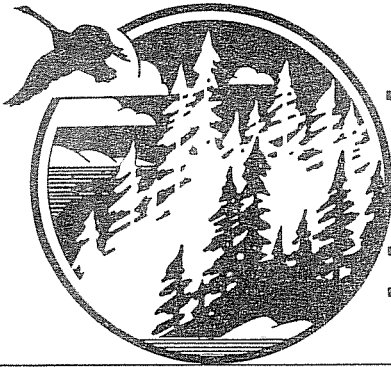

- CBU BC, Vancouver 12/31 0350 fair with KHEY with OMs playing songs and comedy recordings about New Year's. XETRA off. (TRH-CA)

I have completely changed my lifestyle lately. I ruptured a disc in my back, and have been lying in bed, face up, for almost two months, praying that I can avoid surgery. So far everything is progressing nicely. I've gained back a lot of movement and flexibility. There was a time I could not even put on my socks! I've had a lot of time to DX, and I've noticed a great deal of change in the band. All sorts of daytimers are now jamming many frequencies. The immediate benefits are a lot of new catches, but in the long run, the more interesting deep DX is going to be a rarity or a memory. I recently obtained a Delco car radio out of a '80 Chevy Citation that "didn't work well". I connected it to a 6 foot piece of wire and a good ground system, tuned the antenna and such, and came up with a broadcast DX machine. I hear the powerful split s, like R.Paradise, but it is too broad to bring in audio from some of the very loud hets I hear on it. Too much domestic reception. I discovered an interesting way to cure off-speed problems in old cassette machines. I find the voltage source to the motor, after the switching mechanisms, so that the motor does not run continually, and I use the cheap Radio Shack voltage regulator (LM317T) to adjust for the right speed. This will only work when the motor uses a voltage lower than the original source (i.e., 9 volt motor from a 12 volt source), or if the speed the cassettes are being recorded are too fast (tape sounds slow in an on-speed player). Another hint: I do a lot of traveling and I find that regular stranded #20 wire breaks after many spoolings out of hotel windows or whatever. I am now using a long length of rubber coated "test lead" wire with much improved results. The added flexibility helps a lot. It seems WMRE-1510 Boston will be changing formats this Wednesday, January 14, and might go dark for awhile. The current owners went bankrupt and transferred ownership in a distress sale. I just happened to hear the station in passing, and noticed all the talk show hosts bemoaning that the format was going to go simulcast music with WSSH-99.5 Lowell, MA. A lot of callers talked about the good old days of WMEX, the top 40 powerhouse on 1510, and how things got screwed up when they changed antenna sites to go fulltime. It seems the station went bankrupt because the landowner of their transmitter site wanted to redevelop the property and asked the station to sign a 25 year lease at a rumoured million dollars a year! Anyway, 1510 might be less cluttered for awhile. WMRE put a very strong signal into my area, but the DJs were all smirking that no one could hear them at night. I should have called! Finally, many members have been indiscriminately interchanging the words "Censorship" and "editing" in their recent thoughts. They should understand the great difference in their meaning. For example, Gardner Smith is a wonderful editor. Also, American Public Radio Network, from Minnesota, is now downlinking and rebroadcasting the BBC World Service for their affiliates, in full studio quality. Don't mistake these new domestic rebroadcasts for something else! 73s and good DX de KZ.

Hooray for Gardner Smith! In the 1/10 DXM, the intrepid EDXR editor has taken what I consider a sane and reasonable approach to the DX Roundup content issue. In light of the changing MW scene, his "Thoughts" provide an equitable solution to what has become a raging controversy. Along these same lines, I must take issue with Ernest Cooper's Forum in that same DXM on a number of points: first, he is correct when he notes that semi-locals are not DX. Looking back over my 1985 contributions to EDXR, I inadvertently reported some stations which, I now know, are semi-locals; but I was new to daytime DXing then and I contributed what I then thought was DX, given my QTH and my equipment. My point is: if you make the contribution criteria too tight, you will strangle the club, because no one wants to be a member of a club which makes it too difficult to participate. Second, I disagree with the notion that too much info appears in the Roundups. When I hear the d.j.'s name/sponsor on a given frequency, I continue to sit on it for the ID; if I don't hear the ID for some reason a "t" goes next to the call in my log. In my opinion, if someone doesn't wait for the ID, he's cheating - but, since when is it the responsibility of the club or DXR editors to--in effect--"babysit" these cheaters by withholding info. from the rest of us? Third, and finally, I see nothing wrong with "ham" abbreviations. In my 20 years as a radio hobbyist, certain terms (QRM, QSL, QSO, QTH) have been standard "radio lingo" understood by most hobbyists in every aspect of the hobby - even MW DXing. 73.

Lots of news so I'll start with the holiday activity. The white rose city of York, PA got a thorn when the New York Wire Co. announced that after playing Christmas carols for over 50 years, it was unable to do so anymore because the steam generating system was too old and it would cost \$20,000 to repair it. Angry citizens protested with cat calls and shouts. It could have gotten worse but radio station WOYK-1350 came to the rescue and announced they had a tape of the steam whistles playing Christmas carols and promised to air it at midnight on Christmas eve. For anyone who has heard these steam whistles... it is indeed a treat. There was another pirate broadcast by WHOT-1622.5 on New Year's eve. They had a show which featured live interviews at Time Square during the dropping of the ball. They aired the countdown several times during the broadcast which continued into the new year. Records such as Twist & Shout and She was just 17 were aired along with ads for an airline and a movie. They gave the WX and a series of jingles. At 0100 they claimed to be doing a remote broadcast from Chicago. We may not be hearing this station for long as the FCC is hot (no pun intended) on their trail. I woke up at 0300 on the 10th of Jan. so I could listen to the special Ray Briem Show devoted to those in radio. It was an excellent show and featured Bob Grove from Grove Enterprize which publishes Monitoring Times. Bob remarked over the air that he could not find a station on his dial presenting the program. Such things happens when the FCC breaks up the clear channels. On Jan. 12th at 1720, there was a joint broadcast by WWWE-1100 from Cleveland, Ohio and KIMN-950 from Denver, CO. The DJ at WWWE paid off his football bet in the Broncos-Browns game by calling the other station and playing the Denver Broncos fight song over the 50,000 watt Cleveland station. The Cbc is airing a series of programs telling about the plight of public broadcasting in England, Canada and the United States. It is not a pretty story. Much of the information is taken from the Peacock Report which goes into detail. It was interesting to note that those in England pay an average of 33¢ a day for a receiver license while those in Canada pay \$5 per year. A new stereo station may be added to your list. It is KYW-1060, the all news station from Philadelphia, PA. They have been giving announcements for the past several weeks listing the advantages of AM stereo. Those of you who heard the Martin Luther King Day celebration aired nationwide at 1230 on the holiday were listening to programming produced by the flagship KYW. The broadcast from Independence Hall entitled "Living In A Dream" included the ringing of the bell... one time for each letter in the word liberty. I am hearing test tones on top of WBSM-780 often around 2100-2200 weekdays. Can anyone suggest what station is testing here? 73. Flash... Just received a letter from the FCC telling me that the Cuban I heard on 1160 kHz on the night of Dec. 2, 1986 was operating at the full 300,000 watts when they carried the special celebration broadcast of Castro coming to power. Earlier, another FCC official reported that the station was operating at 75,000 watts.

Greetings from sunny Winnipeg. I spent the holidays in cloudy Tornot and managed to get in some DX. Michael Routenberg, Michael Bolitho and I went on another DX'pedition to Walliamsford, Ontario, near Owen Sound. 45 new BCB and 42 new SW stations were added to my logs, including Mauritius on 4855.3. I arrived on Monday, 23 December and started with a 600-foot antenna to the east. Sunset brought in a lot of good stuff from the west, such as 680 CJOB. Later on in the evening France and Germany showed up on LW. The LW proved to be much better the next day when Paul put out 2,000 feet of wire (unterminated) to the southwest. We also had a longwire aimed southeast. Unfortunately, it seemed to do little more than enhance the Clear channel stations from New York, Philadelphia and Boston. The southwest wire, on the other hand, has great potential. 660 KSKY was doing a number on WNEC, Perhaps next time we can catch KTNN at sunset. Wyoming (KWTO) was audible under WBZ on this wire. I don't recall hearing KTWO in Onatario since 1976. Results of what was heard should have appeared in EDXR and DXWW-E by now. 73 and good DX.

I would like to know how many of you out there in DX-land have actually heard AM stereo on a true AM stereo receiver? Second, how many of you have taken the time to compare the various AM stereo systems to see which one is the best sounding? And last, what do you really think of AM stereo if you've heard it before? I've said it before and will say it again, AM stereo is the best thing to happen to AM radio in many decades. The only reason it's not taken off before and I'll say it again, AM stereo hasn't taken over as well as it should have is that the receiver manufacturers have refused to get off their behinds and make AM stereo receivers available to the general public. I've gone into a few of the larger stereo stores in San Diego and asked to see their AM stereo receivers and have been told by all of them that there's no such thing as AM stereo. Some have also said it's impossible to broadcast the AM band in stereo. They were really flabbergasted when I showed them my Sony SRFA100 AM stereo receiver. I agree that the Sony SRFA100 AM stereo receiver is only a small portable receiver and by itself doesn't do justice to the sound with its two three-inch speakers. However, at home I run it through my stereo amplifier that has a 12-band equalizer attached to it. The sound is good when the controls on the equalizer are set to a neutral position and even better when they're adjusted to bring out certain frequencies. I can almost make it rival a good FM stereo station. Recently (last August) my wife and I purchased a new car. It was a Volvo 740. For those of you not familiar, it's considered Volvo's luxury car and is supposed to be one of the best cars on the market today. Would you believe that with all the sophisticated power equipment and one of the best receivers available in the world, the radio cannot receive AM stereo? Certainly a car that costs \$26K should have AM stereo receivers. Yes, I know an AM stereo car receiver is available in some GM cars, but the receiver in the Volvo 740 is standard equipment and there's no other one available or no other one that will even fit the opening in the dashboard. I very strongly urge you to listen to AM stereo if you can and then urge your local stations to try it and even the manufacturers to start promoting it. Look at Australia as an example. They've decided to abandon AM all together. The US and Canada may not be far behind. What will then happen to our hobby? (Leave it wide open for TA DX. . .yeah team, hi-Rth) BCE DX'ers unite before it's too late and AM and our hobby.

For those of you who don't have an AM stereo receiver or worse yet an AM stereo station within range, I'll repeat an offer I've made many times in these pages: If you'll send me a C-60 cassette of good quality (There goes my finest cassettes from Chicken Shack, hi-Rth), along with return postage for your cassette, I'll record two different AM stereo stations for you. Known AM stereo stations in my area that come in well and

strong are: KFI, XETRA, KFMB, KABC, KNX, KCBC, KSON. There may be others that I'm not aware of at this time. Let me know which of the two you'd like to hear. The best sounding ones are KFI, KFMB and KSON. The postage for a cassette tape within the US (or from US to Canada First Class is only 37¢. For other countries check the postage rates and be sure to send mint US stamps to cover the postage rates for airmail. Canadians, it's OK to send Canadian stamps.

One other suggestion for receiving AM stereo that will work if you have an AM stereo station that uses the Kahn system of AM stereo but do not have an AM station receiver is to take to good sounding AM receivers, preferably the same make and model and tune both exactly on the frequency on which the station broadcasts. Now place one receiver on the right side of the room and tune it slightly higher in frequency. Place the other receiver on the left side of the room and tune it slightly lower in frequency. You may be able to hear the AM stereo broadcast. However, this method doesn't work as good as if you had a true AM stereo receiver as you must hit the exact frequency the signals are being broadcast on and this is difficult., to say the least. A true AM stereo receiver is built to do just that. Don't attempt this method with any of the other three AM stereo systems as it won't work. By the way (and I don't mean you Phil, hi), the Sony SRFA 100 can receive all four stereo systems.

73 and good DX to all BCB DX'ers while it may last, if it's not too late to save our hobby.

Again, thank you everyone who voted me for the TVA, was most appreciated. My string of good MM's has run out to four now, pulling in CBJ 1580 Chicoutimi, Quebec last MM with KLIV 1590 off and even got a tentative on KOHN 1590 Grand Forks, NM with Larry King way undernaeth KOGO. Prior MM netted my first newie of 1987 with CJRE 1229 Boissevain, Manitoba mixing with WSLM Salem, Indiana. My favorite frequency for DX is now 1220, similar to what 1470 is in the Pacific Northwest and KDFC isn't 24 hrs. NSP anymore. KRPN 1550 Salt Lake City may again be KRGO, will check that out. KDPC's signal here at night is good, but easily nullable to get XEB/CJOC. On the other hand, KOFY's signal here at night is very bad and mixes with XED at night here. However, KOFY's signal during the day is very good, and I really like the station (I listen to them frequently, only less than KWSS (FM). KOFY's format is much better than KYA's, and I think James Gabbert has done wonders with the station.

KBBI 890 is now a very easy choice for Alaska, easily comes in here almost equal to WLS right after KDXU s/off MM at 11 PM PLT, and just as easy as Indiana is with WSLM.

Going back to 1220, I'm still trying to log those southern-accented stations under WSLM on SRS MM's, they may turn out to be something real exotic like a 1 kw station from Alabama or Georgia. Sounds like the shades of the '60s, hi.

One thing I've noticed is fewer and fewer Clear Channel stations (at least in the western US) coming on the air, not like the explosion last year. Also, the FCC has just put a freeze on new applications for daytimers only. I envision a day when all AM stations in the US will operate at night, or at least have that option. But that's still a long way down the road. 73.

## Contras' AM Radio Station Begins Operating

Los Angeles Times, January 19, 1987, via Father Jack Pejza

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP)—A new, clandestine radio station operated by Nicaraguan *contras* can be picked up by AM radios in Managua, the capital, and elsewhere in Nicaragua.

The 50,000-watt Radio Liberation, which went on the air last week, was designed to broadcast music, news, commentary, sports and other programs from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.

It replaces the 15 de Septiembre station, which broadcast for about three years on a much weaker signal.

Listeners in Managua said the new signal comes in fairly clear and can be heard around the 1520-kilohertz frequency.

About 85 miles northeast of Managua, the signal came in clearly on a car radio.

Rebel leader Alfonso Robelo said in Costa Rica last week that Radio Liberation "is going to break the blockade the Sandinistas have on information to the Nicaraguan people."

The left-wing Sandinista government controls all the radio and television stations and newspapers in the country.

Robelo refused to say where the Radio Liberation transmitter is, but he insisted it is not in Costa Rica. U.S. officials have been quoted as saying it is in nearby El Salvador, where a leftist guerrilla movement is fighting to oust the

U.S.-backed government.

The Nicaraguan *contras* have refused to identify the source or quantity of "private donations" that they say are financing the radio station. They have insisted that the money has not come from the \$100 million in aid to the *contras* that Congress approved last year.

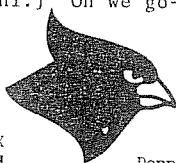
The station is being operated under the name of the United Nicaraguan Opposition, the *contras'* umbrella organization.

During the guerrilla war that toppled dictator Anastasio Somoza in 1979, the Sandinistas used the clandestine Radio Sandino to rally support for their cause.

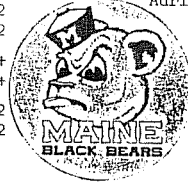
