CONVENTION HOST WANTED

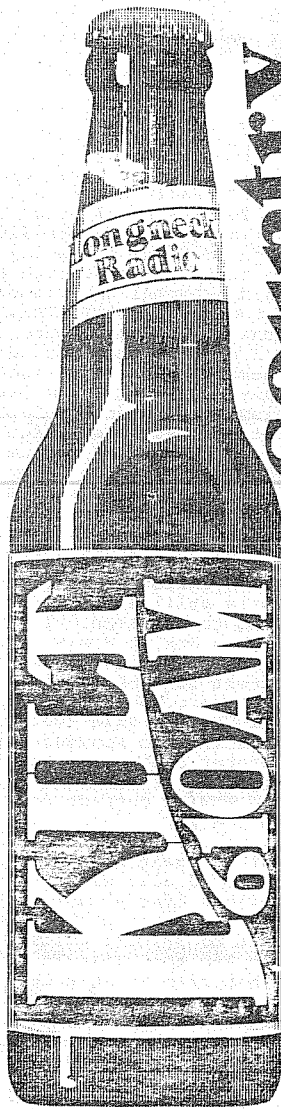

I have been reading with great interest the recent comments made in the DXM about the medium wave band here in Europe. Gene Martin's Forum in DXM Vol. 24 No. 33 has prompted me to relate to you some of my perceptions, from someone at the actual scene. First of all, I haven't perceived any real difference between the station density here and my previous QTH in Utah. Of course, the station density is much greater in Maryland, where we moved from last year. So it would be difficult to compare the station density between here and the States: it just depends on where you are DXing from. Obviously, in the case of DXers from the East Coast or some of the larger urban centers elsewhere, the band here in Europe would appear to be relatively clear by comparison. As far as the amount of modulation that stations use here goes, my perceptions are basically the same as what has been stated by others in previous forums. That is, the level of modulation in most cases is lower here compared to that in the States. However in all fairness, I really don't have any strong locals that would cause problems here. There are only four stations that I could classify as semi-local or local (Radio Free Europe-720, BRF-801, APN-1107, and VOA-1197). And none of these stations cause any real problem with side channel interference because they are far enough away. In fact I have found I have more problems with side channel interference from stations like the Yugoslav on 1134 than from the above four. This corresponds pretty closely to my experiences in Utah where I had maybe 6 or 8 local or semi-locals to contend with, and only 2 or 3 of them caused any significant problem. Also I think that the band here in Bavaria is much different from other places in Europe. I have heard many complaints from DXers in Great Britain, who were complaining about problems with over-modulation from their locals. So as you can see it is strictly a matter of perception. Having said all that, I do wholeheartedly agree that the medium wave band in the States is messed up, but as I have indicated before in my previous forums, DXing here in Europe has its own kind of problems, such as NSP pests, superpowered stations from virtually every country in this part of the world, and the always obnoxious, unnullable synchros. I hope that you find this account of my experiences to be interesting. Auf wiederseh'n von Bayern. Bill.

Anyone who is still waiting for a verie from WMBI-1110 or WMBI-FM-90.1 should be getting theirs soon. I visited Chicago on August 3-6 to watch the Blue Jays vs. White Sox at Comiskey Park. While in the Land of Lincoln I dropped in at WMBI's studios to see if I could get a hand-delivered verie - I had sent a report to WMBI on March 31 and had yet to receive a verie. I met with James Wagner, WBKAS, Assistant Technical Director (and verie signer) at WMBI/WMBI-FM. He said that he had sent out a verie to me on July 29, and sure enough a v/q and schedule were waiting for me when I got back from Chicago. Mr. Wagner apologized for the delay and said he was beginning to clear out the backlog of reports. He was waiting for new QSL cards to be printed, showing WMBI's current network of 11 stations and a satellite network, but since new cards hadn't been printed he decided to go with verie letters instead of QSL cards. He showed me old reception reports still on file. I saw reports sent by other ODXA and IRCA members and even my 1980 report to WMBI-FM. I also had a very nice tour of WMBI's studios at 820 North LaSalle. This "verie" interesting visit to WMBI makes up for the lack of stickers and other promo items I got from other Chicago stations. I made the rounds of several Chicago stations on the Michigan Avenue strip between the Loop and the Water Tower but all I got were a couple of buttons and a coverage map from WFYR, a Cubs sticker and schedule from WGN, WLS/Pepsi bumper stickers and Z-95 (WYTZ-FM) survey charts. I also got a Z-95 (WLS's FM) T-shirt for \$4. When I last visited Chicago in 1985 (on the way to the ANARC Convention in Milwaukee) I came away with a stack of WLUP bumper stickers an inch high, dozens of WLS and WMET stickers, stickers and a frisbee from WBBM-FM (B-96), note paper, a canvas tote bag and a coffee mug from WAIT, and even an autographed post card of Larry Lujack. I second Ernest Cooper's enthusiastic comments on the FM band activity lately. In a matter of one hour on 7/3, I logged KZZY-103.5, Devils Lake, ND and KFBO-97.9 Cheyenne, WY. KZZY was coming in stronger than a couple of locals here! What was really strange was the armchair copy for almost 3 hours! Also, about 2 weeks later, heard CKFM-99.9, Toronto, Canada (they're the FM sister to CFRB & CFRX-shortwave). There have been some decent openings to the Midwest so far this summer, with several new loggings from Iowa, Texas (if you can consider this midwest) (I call it southwest--rce), Oklahoma, and Missouri. On to something else - should any IRCA members hear any of the stations here in Huntsville, I would be glad to walk through a report for them. Here in the Rocket City, we have WKDT-730, WPAK-1000 (which has an outrageous signoff announcement!), WIXC-1140, WBHP-1230, WFIX-1450, WAAY-1550 (which has succumbed to the "Talknet" craze), and WEUP-1600. Greetings: I am sure you all heard about the 9+ inches of rain that flooded the NW side of Chicago on 8/13. I was hoping that the floods would have knocked out one or two of the 50kw power houses (WBBM, WGN, WMAQ). They all have transmitter sites NW of the City, but no luck. We are located about 40 miles south of the hardest hit areas and got about 2" of rain. Did note WLUP-1000 (x-WCFL) off the air MM 8/10. S/on was at 0455 CDT. They did have a Tuesday morning SP until a few months ago. Also noted local WBYG-930 Sandwich, Ill. off the air several times this summer. Once on Monday 4/27 and again on Friday 7/10. Also noted with terrible sounding audio on 6/30. The 60hz hum was stronger than the audio all night long. They should have either shut down or been forced off by complaints. They are fully automated so the engineer fixed the problem in the morning. The 7/10 SP was preceded by a terrific electrical storm that passed thru on 7/9 that knocked out power to most of Will County. Joliet's only 24hr AM station, WJOL-1340, was knocked off and returned at reduced power from a gas generator. From 8/4 to 8/7 I took my family down to Springfield, Ill. and St. Louis, Mo. We visited the sights, Capitol building, Arch, etc. On the return trip we crossed the mighty Mississippi on a rickety ferry boat north of St. Charles, Mo. On the way to the ferry, we passed KIRL-1480 towers at the junction of Highway "B" and Highway 94, just a couple of miles south of the River. Also on the return trip, we spotted a weather radio at the I-55 rest stop just north of Springfield. Per the sign at the rest stop, the frequency should have been 1200 kHz. Heard only a weak carrier on the car radio with no audio. This little trip was my vacation for the summer, so no chance for the convention in Peoria. Maybe next year! This is my first letter to Eastern DX Forum so some introduction is in order. I've been a radio nut since I was about 5 years old (I'm now 42) and have DX'ed SW and BC for over 10 years. I work with a Sony 2010 + a Palomar loop and shotgun loop. Long Island just had some pirate excitement with a Honduran registered freighter (the "Sarah" anchored 5 miles off the coast of Long Beach and broadcasting as RNI (Radio New York International). They utilize a "Free Speech Format" and play lot's of Rock 'N' Roll from the 60's. On 7/25 the Coast Guard and FCC boarded the vessel and cited them for broadcasting without a license. They were back on the air the next day but on 7/28 they were re-boarded by the Coast Guard and placed under arrest, with the station shut down. 1050 used to be WHN with country format; I hope everyone is coping with the heat and having a good summer. 73. (Ray, welcome to EDXF, and keep reporting. I was thru Rosedale last June on the Southern Parkway, while we were going from Long Island back to Penn.--rce)

919-524-5004. Local WCOM-1340 and WSFL-1380 remain silent. Both went off on/about 3/15. The fate of either is unknown. On my R-F gulch theme of FDXF of ed. 789, I found out that local WNFC-FM-107.9 (Green-ville) also has its transmitter radiator on the 1780-ft Grifton tower. So that's WNCT-TV-9, WITN-TV-7, and their respective PMS, WNFC-FM and WDLX-93.3 (100 kw, the latter two) kicking and cussing, bellowing and blasting away 2½ miles away from Chuckie-Poo's humble hovel. Now ain't I clever! That reminds me of a story (are you awake, rce?), adreding from my notorious and infamous past: After getting out of the Navy in Oct., '72, I returned to the Philippines, to set up a business in Leonor's (my bride of 19 years) hometown of Sorsogon, Sorsogon (near the southern-most tip of the island of Luzon). To clarify: the family stayed behind in the Philippines during my last year in the Navy 1971-72. Anyway, I arrived at our apartment in Sorsogon late 11/5/72 PM. After kissing and hello'ing the wife and young' uns, I brought my trusted GR-78 (Heath) out of its hding place and dialed around the SE Asia MW dial. Exhaustion (jet-lag) cut short my banascan, but not before I noted a bodacious signal from local DZMS-1250 (now 1251), blasting off my size 7½ socks. The morning light the next day revealed why: our apartment was 300 feet away from DZMS's tower! Aarrgh! In a serious vein, I've come to an awareness through the past few years here and abroad, that one reason for the apparent decline in reception of splits from TP, TA, or even Latin America, is the tremendous barrage of sideband interference from immediate adjacent-channel (plus/minus 5-10 kHz), and second adjacent-channel stations. Those who have compared the situation here in N.A. with that in Europe tell us the sideband interference problem is on at least an order of magnitude less there than here. My personal experience in Asia is that the sideband interference problem there is less severe than here, but worse than in Europe. Japanese commercial BC stations are not afraid to shovel the coal to the modulators, but they are concerned with modulation quality (lack of distortion, intermodulation, flat band pass). Likewise, JO commercials are not jam-packed, stuffed in, shoe-horned on top, under, next to, and between one another as they are in US/Canada. So that is another reason for the relative lack of sideband interference there, and especially in Europe. Finally, today (7/27), I tuned my Panasonic RF-2800 around the FM band for the first time. I can see immediately that this is no place to try to DX FM with a mediocre FM receiver as the RF-2800 is a mass of mush and muck between stations. Anyway, no serious DX (FM, or AM for that matter) is contemplated from here, as this (VOA Greenville relay) is only an interim duty station until I get orders elsewhere. If I were to be here permanently, then I could invest much more time in elaborate facilities (e.g., a permanent beverage antenna). That's enough for this EDXF. Behave yourself in Wisconsin, Rick! 73 de Charlie.

Nothing has been happening when it comes to DX this time of the year, but I did notice that reception improved several days following the two recent earthquakes. There is a lot of interesting programming available on the AM so the summer months will not be wasted. WFAN, ex-WHN, is now full time sports and have even managed to get a nationwide plug about their new format during a game carried on the first night of their change over... July 1st. A number of talk shows supplement the games. WBAL's Jones & west show even gave this station a plug. Speaking of WBAL, on June 6th they devoted air time from 0900 - 1700 to cover the topic of child abuse. Experts and spokesmaen were available to take calls from listeners about the subject. WBAL does an excellent job in serving its listeners with issues of current interest and other public service items. On June 19th a special phone-in show covered the state of New York with 55,000 watts of power! WGY-810 from Albany (six--rce) and WGR-550 from Buffalo patched their audio in a simulcast using a theme of state government as a topic of discussion. The experiment worked using dual IDs but switching to locals for ads. Going over the correspondence file at WPHB-1260 shows a lot of interesting reception reports from as many as 40 states including California. Many of the distant reports came at a time during the 1972 flood when the station stayed on the air at night with its 5000 watts of power. Today the station will often go off the air whenever a severe thunderstorm hits the area. An attempt is under way in many areas to form radio monitoring groups to report violations of obscenity to the FCC. Since many of the stations are challenging the obscenity rule, I doubt this will have much of an impact but the law may be tested. It is interesting to note that the Porn Commission released a report stating that reading porn is harmful and often leads to criminal acts. With this in mind and realizing the thousands of exhibits the Attorney General and his panel examined to determine their findings, perhaps the Attorney General and his panel should be locked up to protect the public. How can that material be bad for the public yet not bad for those who examined it? My point is that the obscenity rule is

censorship and censorship of any kind is bad and more harmful than any effects that might be realized from what the public is supposed to be "protected" from.

With the cooling weather of late August seems to have come better reception on the radio. Every time I turn on the radio, I get stations I never really expected to hear again. I'm now up to 94 heard from 23 states and 2 provinces. After years of hearing CHML-900 trying to be the dominant station on the east coast, it was a shock to hear them so weak out here. Also a surprise were the regulars from Iowa and the Quad Cities such as WKBF-1270, KSTT-1170, KRNT-1350, KSO-1460, and KWLO-1330. The best frequency here so far is 1320 with 4 stations heard on it, including local WFMR in Wisc. Rapids. I guess I'm sitting on 1320 late at night because I remember not worrying about 1440 in Lansdale, Pa. when I lived over there until WNPV switched from being a daytimer to fulltime status. Totals from the Philadelphia area were 246 heard from 32 states and 4 provinces. I never made an effort there for any foreign stations, and so I heard only 1 foreign country, PJB-800. Frank Merrill was here on 8/5 for a good visit. He brought in his GE Superadio--the first time I think I've seen one in action--and we used it to pick up my first Minnesota logging. Since then, I've "managed" to hear WCCO-830. Overtime is starting to pick up at work (great since our 15% pay cut just kicked in on 8/27), so I'll probably be staying up later at night every night. What's my goals for the end of the year? Probably 250 heard and 25 or 30 varies in by the end of this year. No reports out yet, as I'm still learning what's regular here, but a couple I know aren't normal. such as WJCH-1270 or KIOA-940, I wasn't able to hold long enough for a report. WBYG-930 bombed in here the first AM. I listened and I figured it would be a LPC every AM. Haven't heard it since, hi. Also others I haven't heard yet I would have expected are WSAI-1360 and WFPD-1370. Also a surprise on AM is the lack of the talk shows I expected to be all over the dial. More common here day and MMS have been C&W music, which, of course, doesn't bother me much. Gotta run. Next deadline here is 9/11 then 9/25 followed by every Friday until March. Don't forget to report to CDXR. 73.

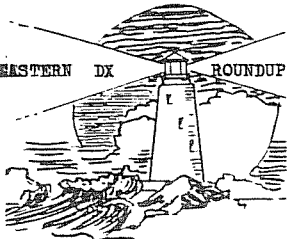

Eastern DX Roundup, like a beacon in the darkness. Groping in the fog? Looking for the meaning of life, your purpose, your calling? Well, here it is; EDXR. The answer to all your problems.

EDXR is coming to you live from sunny Long Island, home of Radio New York International. Unless you have recently returned from the Australian outback, you have probably heard about RNI. It seems that, thanks to a 17,000 pound anchor, they are located on an old Honduran freighter named "The Sarah" in international waters three miles off Jones Beach. Frequencies included 1620 kHz, 103.1 MHz, 190 kHz, and 6240 kHz. Unfortunately, the FCC and Coast Guard boarded the ship, shut it down, and arrested its operators. The station received considerable press coverage, including front-page stories in Newsday for two days, and articles in the Daily News (thanks to Karen Grace of Brooklyn for submitting the article).

In other news, Charlie Taylor of Grifton, NC writes in to clarify an earlier logging. He says, "Regarding Gary Heisey's logging of WCXN-1170, that is indeed Claremont: "North Carolina's Christian Connection." Many thanks, Charlie.

Finally, Robert Ritchey writes in with information concerning volume 24. He says, "... concerning Gary Heisey's ... UNID GA station on 1120 kHz on 5/12 was WQXM Gordon, GA, with 10 kW days. His 1130 kHz Brazil, IN station was probably WSDM. I heard them briefly on 12/8/86 and the ID sounded like WSDM to me. All along the watchtower

Although interference to AM stations hasn't increased since Radio Marti went on air, U.S. treads carefully in establishing new AMs, fearing Cubans could still retaliate

U.S. problems with Cuban-caused interference to American AM stations have not received much publicity in recent months. Indeed, FCC monitors have not found that the inauguration of Radio Marti and its broadcasts to Cuba in May 1985 has been followed by an increase in the interference that American stations, particularly in the Southeast, have suffered for years. Such retaliation had been feared in some quarters. But State Department officials remain sensitive to the possibility that the Castro government will introduce new AM stations to interfere with American outlets.

Richard Shrum, of the State Department's Bureau of International Communications and Information Policy, discussed the government's uneasiness regarding the matter at an NAB session last week. He said the department was working with the FCC on a small number of applications for AM stations in the Southeast, mostly Florida. The aim is to accommodate them without causing what Shrum described as an "overreaction" from Cuba.

The problem stems in part from the fact that Cuba walked out of the meeting of western hemisphere countries in Rio de Janeiro, in 1981 on developing a new plan for AM radio, without signing the final agreement. As a result, Shrum said, the Rio agreement

does not apply to U.S. relations with Cuba as it does to U.S. relations with other countries in the hemisphere. Instead, U.S.-Cuban relations are governed by a broader provision in the International Telecommunication Union agreement to which both countries adhere.

"Our job is to work with the FCC to license the maximum number of AM stations," Shrum said. "But we operate under the ITU agreement, and we are aware of the danger. Cuba could operate a lot more stations than it does. We don't want Cuba to overreact and cause interference to the U.S."

Shrum also reported that the Rio agreement could be sent to the Senate for ratification within the next few months. He said "the ratification package" is circulating among affected government agencies and would be submitted to the White House for its consideration "in the next three or four weeks."

Shrum's appearance at the NAB reflected an awareness of the broadcasting industry's growing stake in international relations. And Shrum indicated the interest can go the other way. "It will be important for the State Department to work more closely with the NAB," he said. He expressed specific concern about the elimination of research laboratories, like CBS's, which have been lost in one of the economy moves that have engulfed the company. The elimination of the CBS Labs, Shrum said, "took away five individuals" he had sent to CCRB [International Radio Consultative Committee] meetings in the government's behalf. □

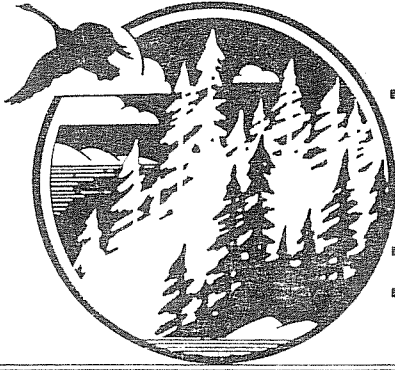
