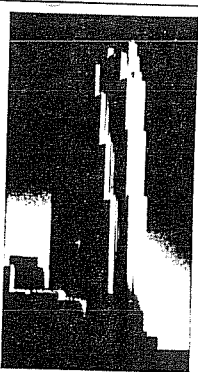

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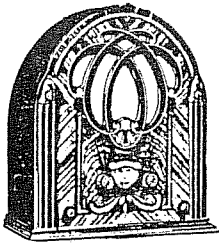

- 680 WCTT KY, Corbin 10-14 0700 Fair on top of clutter w/ man reading ads on "Trading Post" program. "The one you depend on for nx, WCTT Corbin," into NBC nx. (GH)
- 710 UNID Cuba? 10-14 0645 Sounded like man said "Radio National" in SS. Anyone know who this Latin is that's almost always there in the evening. There's a 50 kW FL stn listed for this channel. What's their format? (GH-PA) (Could be a Cuban jammer or WAQI, which is SS. Check the article on pp. 14-15 in the Jan. 18, 1986 issue. It may be of some help. Readers? -TK)
- 720 CHTN NC, Charlottetown 10-13 2250 Fair, long fades in WGN null, w/ wx "2 in Charlottetown." Elton John song, nx, IDs. (GH-PA)
- 790 WWAZ RI, Providence 10-13 2135 Fair in fades w/ "AM stereo 790 ways" and "Radio the way you remember it." MOYL mx. Loud at one point, no WTAR pest. (GH-PA)
- 820 WOSU OH, Columbus 10-3 1930 Vgood w/ no sign of WBAP. "Bluegrass Ramble" program. List of companies supporting program at 1958, into s/off annmct. Anncr said they were licensed to Ohio State U., and invited listeners to tune to WOSU-FM for continued programming. (JDS-AL)
- 850 WRAP VA, Norfolk 10-11 1905 Fair, mixing w/ WJAC. DJ said "Oldie but goodie show on WRAP." Some motown also. (GH-PA)
- 850 WRMR OH, Cleveland 10-5 2004 Vstrong w/ light rock mx, many IDs "More mx, more memories. AM stereo 850 WRMR" and "850 WRMR. Easy-going favorites and no elevator mx." (JDS-AL)

- 920 WPTX MD, Lexington Park 10-13 2045 Poor to vpoor in jumble w/ "Southern Maryland's biggest hits." T40 format, many FM 98 IDs. Calls may have changed. (GH-PA) (It's possible. Lexington Park has a FM station on 97.7 FM, which is WMDM. -TK)
- 930 WMGR GA, Bainbridge 9-30 2024 Fair w/ local spots, Braves baseball. (JDS-AL)
- 940 WINZ FL, Miami 10-12 0258 Vstrong w/ Talknet. Lengthy IDs at 0259, "94 News Wins" and "WINZ Miami/ Ft. Lauderdale." CBS nx at 0300. (JDS-AL)
- 940 WINZ 10-12 1958 Fair, no Canadian. YL talking about hurricane in wx. CBS nx at 2000, call in program w/ Jay Michaels instead of usual Talknet. At 2055 a strange squeaking noise started on 950 and splashed 940. Lasted 20 mins, and loudest w/ loop to south. (Jammer? -TK) An exciting catch. (GH-PA)
- 940 WKYK NC, Burnsville 9-26 2000 Unusually strong w/ local ads, Appalachian State vs. Wake Forest football. (JDS-AL)
- 940 WMIX IL, Mt. Vernon 10-12 1916 Good w/ ads for Tyler Motors. ID simply as "WMIX." (JDS-AL)
- 950 KPRC TX, Houston 10-5 0230 Vgood w/ Talknet and local anncr requesting listeners to write to Talknet in care of the stn. Address given differs from NRC log. PO Box 2222; Houston, TX; 77252. (JDS-AL)
- 950 WBJW FL, Orlando 10-11 1955 Fair w/ "Service of Nationwide Communication" by man, then into "American T40" w/ Casey Casem. Into mess, back at 2232 w/ "You're listening to T40 on B 105." Spot for Southern Bell. (GH-PA)
- 950 WBJW 10-11 2050 Vgood w/ "American T40." ID as "WBJW AM & FM" and "BJ 105." FM simulcast? (JDS-AL)
- 950 WSPA SC, Spartanburg 10-15 2135 Fair to poor, fade, w/ "AM 950 WSPA" by man. MOYL from a review of 1940, Tommy Dorsey. No WWJ/ WPEN. Weak SS also. (GH-PA)
- 970 WKLS GA, Atlanta 9-27 2021 Good, peaking o/ WAVG w/ rock mx. Evidently FM simulcast, w/ "96 Rock" IDs. (JDS-AL)
- 980 WWRC MD, Silver Springs 10-3 0107 Promo for Redskin report, Honda ad, into Talknet, IDs as "980 WRC." (JDS-AL)
- 1000 KTOK OK, Oklahoma City 10-5 0203 Weak but stable w/ WLUP taking what looks like will be a regular SP. Heard w/ ABC nx, promo for Sooners football, ID as "The flagship stn of Oklahoma football, AM 10 KTOK." Into Larry King. (JDS-AL)
- 1030 KCTA TX, Corpus Christi 10-16 0705 Local nx of Texas w/ fair sig. "Good morning. You're listening to 50,000 watt 1030 KCTA." Said they were unable to get AP nx at this time. Man said he would play song for girl trapped in Midland, TX. Faded, KDKA splash. Back at 0712, poor, w/ soft relig mx. WBZE on at 0715, no WBZ. Clear for 6 or 7 mins. I went ape! (GH-PA)
- 1030 KFAY AR, Fayetteville 10-12 2010 Strong w/ frquent spots, IDs, contest annmnt w/ phone number given as 521-5329. (JDS-AL)
- 1030 KKJC MO, Blue Springs 9-28 0225 Weak u/ WBZ w/ stn promo. Heard "...mid-mornings on KKJC," into Steve Winwood song. Happy w/ this one. (JDS-AL)

- 1120 WKQW PA, Oil City 10-8 1920 O/u KMOX, w/ pop mx, local spots, IDs. (DLR-KY)
- 1130 KWKH LA, Shreveport 10-13 1940 Fade up to Fair, C&W mx. Man said "It's 42 at Radio Ranch, KWKH," into Dwight Yoakam song. Many IDs. (GH-PA)
- 1130 WCXI MI, Detroit 10-17 0134 Weak, but no sign of KWKH. Hockey scores, wx, "AM 1130 WCXI" IDs, C&W mx. (JDS-AL)

Navajo radio station in Arizona fills air with hope for nation

WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. — When the sun goes down, KTNN, a unique multilanguage radio station in Window Rock becomes an evening star heard round the world.

It represents what some have called the Third World within the United States.

After sundown, KTNN is clear as a bell in Utah County. It's been picked up by a U.S. Navy submarine cruising on the surface of the Pacific Ocean.

Picked up in China, it gave fits to those who tried to determine what language was being spoken.

KTNN, a powerful 50,000-watt station that broadcasts on 660 AM, is owned by the Navajo Nation, located in the four-corners area of

Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico and Utah.

It broadcasts in Navajo, Zuni, Apache and English. Mostly a country-Western music station, it also attacks news and issues with the professionalism of big-city radio stations.

Those who operate KTNN see their tasks at the station as more than a job.

They are Indians, and they see the year-old station as a beacon to their people.

"Since we have been on the air, many people have come up to me and said KTNN has made the Navajo Nation seem so small," says KTNN program manager Selena Manychildren.

That's not easy.

The 24,347-square-mile reservation covers parts of New Mexico, Arizona and Utah, and is roughly the size of West Virginia.

It was called the "Third World at Home," in a *Los Angeles Times* newspaper editorial earlier this year.

That portrayal may be right on the mark. Navajos are the biggest Indian tribe in the U.S., and their reservation is a vast poverty belt within a short flight of the posh Sun Belt skyscrapers of Albuquerque, Salt Lake City, Phoenix and Denver.

Thousands of Navajo homes lack such basics as running water and electricity.

There have been other mornings previous to the listed dates when TP carriers were logged, but they were on the same frequencies. Contributor comments follow. We also have some comments from Bill Harms on Robert Wien's southern Austria bandscan. Where's everyone else?

TRANS - P A C I F I C D X

- 702 unID, 1108 10/27 : Fr-fr carrier. Tuned in 10/27 @1100 (6:00am E. Daylight Savings Time). I have a feeling carrier strengths this particular morning were better from 1000 to 1100. Also 1042 10/28 weak, stronger by 1116 and still detectable by 1139. (Hall-PIT)
- 738 ~~***~~AUSTRALIA, Assumed 2NR. Carrier only heard bearing exactly 270 degrees. Best of the low frequency "TP's". 774 and 756 next best. Other carriers heard less constantly on 837 and 828. Best carrier on 738 was 1030-1042 on 10/6 when a quite substantial carrier was tantalizingly close to producing audio. (Moore-MA)
- +unID, 1108 10/27 : Only poor/fair this morning, but again 1027 10/28 fair-v. good and almost to an audio level briefly, but was slightly fadey. Stop prevented any useable audio from surfacing. This was the best strength TP carrier on morning of 10/28. (Hall-PIT)
- 747 unID, 1108 10/27 : Fr/pr, somewhat fadey - definately there this morn. Also 1036 10/28 weak but audible until 1129 and into LSR. (Hall-PIT)
- 756 unID, 1103 10/27 : Mostly fair (carrier-only of course) -- a bit better than 774 at times. If this gets any stronger I think it will give some audio, as will 738, when the right morning comes. (Hall-PIT) Also 10/28 1028-1138+.
- 765 unID, 1043 10/28 : Don't think this was a TP (Haiti still on 765?), but a carrier was detectable here from 1043a til 1126 (and was a bit better by 1126) which is after dawn in Haiti's Caribbean. (Hall-PIT)
- 774 ~~***~~AUSTRALIA, Assumed 3LO. Produced a carrier quite consistently through Sept. and early Oct. Could never pull out any audio, however. Many bearings have been right on 270 deg. (Moore-MA)
- +unID, 1102 10/27 : Fr/pr carrier, slightly fadey. Also 10/28, but didn't show that morning til after 1100 (others were in well before 1100 on 10/28) and gradually gained strength until 1129 and LSR. (Hall-PIT)
- 837 unID, 1032 10/28 : V. poor at best, but definately there. 1206/1503 not noted at all this morning. (Hall-PIT)
- 1206 unID, 1111 10/27 : Wondering if this was TP -- weak against stronger 1205-Cayman. Will keep looking. (Hall-PIT)
- 1503 unID, 1122 10/27 : Was suprised to find a carrier here when other TP carriers were heard. Was poor at best, but definat. Occ slight fade-ups of Anguilla-1505 het (fading into daylight there). Stayed in longest of all on 10/27, til at least 1140 - killed by LSS thereafter. High-lat. cx the previous evening were briefly good (i.e. Saudi-1521). This morning it seemed cx favored more of normal to just slightly AU-like. Will keep after this, and others. (Hall-PIT)
- 1620~~***~~AUSTRALIA, Assume this is the group of print handicapped stations. Obviously two or more stations here with about 1 Hz SAH prominent. Noted same mornings as 1629 but usually not as good. Best tape so far 10/12 1036-1038 with man speaking but not quite readable. Probably could have had readable audio on 10/14 but spent almost all my time on 1629. (Moore-MA) (Very impressive, Ray. I have gotten very tentative traces of what may have been carriers on 1620 and 1629 but I won't report any of them until I'm certain. Actually, I do not think mine were TP as of yet, but I certainly won't give up trying. ed)
- 1629~~***~~AUSTRALIA, Believe 2RPH Sydney. Taped from 1032-1100 10/14. Peaked 1044-1047. At one point a woman said, "please contact the print handicapped officer, Mrs. Jennifer Dante" and later gave an address of "25 (or 45?) Waverly Road, 2145". A call to the Australian embassy placed the 2145 postal code in the western suburbs of Sydney. At 1047 a man said, "It's now 4:30" and then "This is Radio Four." Perhaps a rebroadcast of BBC's Radio Four? (Pat Martin?? ed) This station noted every morning 10/11 thru 10/15 with at least traces of audio. There are always two stations on this channel producing a 4-5 Hz SAH. On 10/14 a woman was heard speaking under 2RPH 1038-1042. Probably 3RPH in Melbourne which is also listed here. DF not possible on these freq's since I can't get decent nulls this high. (Moore-MA) (XLNT report, Ray - I'm looking forward to further reporting from you! By the way, welcome to DXWW-E. ed)

TP COMMENTS:

■(Moore-MA): "Concentration has mostly been on the low end of the band with particular emphasis on 774 kHz. Carriers first noted on 9/14 and they gradually grew stronger thru the first week of October. Since October 10 the low frequency TP's have been NIL. (They picked back up here near the end of the month. ed) All tolled I got carriers ranging from the weakest detectable bfo to decent ones on the verge of audio on all except five mornings between 9/5 and 10/10. The high end of the band has been a different story. On 10/11 because cx were so poor on the low end I started tuning the high end and eventually got up to 1620 and 1629 kHz. I was very suprised to find decent carriers exactly on those freq's. Needless to say I was very thrilled to get 2RPH." Ray goes on to say that he has a number of Aussies verified from the 50's, but this was the first on tape. His best Aussie verie is from 2GF on 1210 when they were running 350 watts. Ray says that according to his observations, most anyone in the US can pick up 2RPH when cx are right, si I should be getting a "flood of reports on them"'. (I hope some other DXers have been or will try, Ray. ed)

■(Hall-PIT): I will keep trying when possible for these TP's. I'm afraid audio from a TP here would be rather difficult, however. New England (as I was told by Tom Farmerie a year or two ago) seems much better in terms of domestics/locals et al. splashing up the band. I'm certain of the TP origin of most of these, but I still have no dependably accurate DF/looping equipment to get bearings.

 657 Yes, the Italian synchros. It's difficult to pick out any one of them. They are normally in parallel.
 702 Yes, probably the Czech stn - they are regular here.
 720 This guy is likely Radio Free Europe, which happens to be my closest local stn!
 756 Yes, this is likely to be Deutschlandfunk.
 828 This could be Hannover indeed, or the other West German (SWF) in Freiburg.
 855 This one has me baffled. I have not heard an Italian here yet.
 882 This could be the Yugo as Jim indicated.
 909 This is indeed most likely to be BBC. Their synchros. do produce a ripple effect.
 954/963 I think that Robert heard Bulgaria here. I've hrd these two guys in // several times. 954 is a new frequency; this has been rpted elsewhere.
 1044 Yes, this is E. Germany - Radio DDR-1. They are the channel dominants here. Synchro. programming.
 1071 I would agree that this is likely to be Czechoslovakia.
 1080 My guess would be Poland for this one.
 1107 AFN - Munich is a very good possibility here, but except for a few local breakaway annts the AFN stns are in // the hour that Robert was listening. Only AFN Berlin has a separate pgm. I would be interested in knowing what Robert heard during the breakaway annt times; they're always right before the top of the hour and occ at other times. I have been able to ID all the AFN local stns underneath my semi-local AFN during these breakaway annt times.
 1116 This is probably Berliner Rundfunk, location unk in DDR. Hrd here after RAI signs off.

- 1134 Yugoslavia is so strong here that I have not been able to hear much of anything else. I don't know who would broadcast in EE here.
- 1143 My educated guess for FF here would be Algeria. I don't know who else it would be. Another remote possibility would be R. Moscow in FF.
- 1152 I have no idea who the German would be. This might be a typo. R. Moscow World Svce bc's from Kaliningrad on 1143; the only EE lang. stn's I have heard here have been the UK stn's.
- 1161 SS on this freq. has me baffled. The 87 WRTH does not list SS here. However, anything is possible. Normally France and Bulgaria are the strong stn's here.
- 1206 This is probably Poland. They are the dominant here after France signa off.
- 1215 This is likley Albania w/external svce.
- 1224 Bulgaria has an external sce here that is easily hrd.
- 1260 I have no idea who the Itlaian here is. Maybe it is an unlisted local stn just over the border from Austria where Robert wsa. The dominant here is Poland.
- 1278 I don't know. France is the usual dominant w/Ireland in 2nd place.
- 1305 Belgium is the frequently hrd FF lang stn here.
- 1323 The listed xmtr site for R. Moscow World Svce is Leipzig, DDR, which is not too far from here.
- 1341 My guess for EE hree would be Northern Ireland. They're the only EE lang stn that I have heard on the freq.
- 1377 Is this a typo? R. Moscow World Svce via Kaliningrad is hrd on 1386. I usually hear France on 1377 until they s/off, leaving a wide open chan. (Prob. typo. ed)
- 1386 See above for 1377. Iran is a great catch! I haven't hrd them on 1386 yet.
- 1395 I would agree that this is Albania, w/R. Tirana external svce. However, RCE stations in Spain are here too. Hrd after Tirana s/off.
- 1449 The Italian that Robert lists for 1458 could be RAI on here.
- 1458 Albania is dominant on this channel, w/their external svce, when they're on. Otherwise I hear the UK stn's.
- 1485 The Italian here is likely to be the RAI synchros. The EE here could be the AFN synchros. This chan is one of the European GY channels.
- 1494 My guess would be the French synchros. w/the Reseau Ondes Moyennes service.
- 1503 Yes, Poland should be here.
- 1512 Belgium is the dominant here until they sign off. After they s/off this channel turns to a jumble of weak signals.
- 1521 Yes, this is likely to be Czechoslovakia.
- 1593 I would agree 100% about Robert's assessment of the signal strength for WDR. They are the strongest signal on the band here at night, and this is including my semi-locals.

■(Harms-FRG): I found Robert's bandscan to be interesting. It's very difficult to ID stations here. I have been listening for over a year and I am still finding that I am unable to ID every station I hear. The fact that Robert was able to ID such a high percentage of the stn's he heard shows that he did a good job. (Sure did. ed). Also, the band in S. Austria where Robert was DXing appears to be pretty much the same as here in Bavaria.....

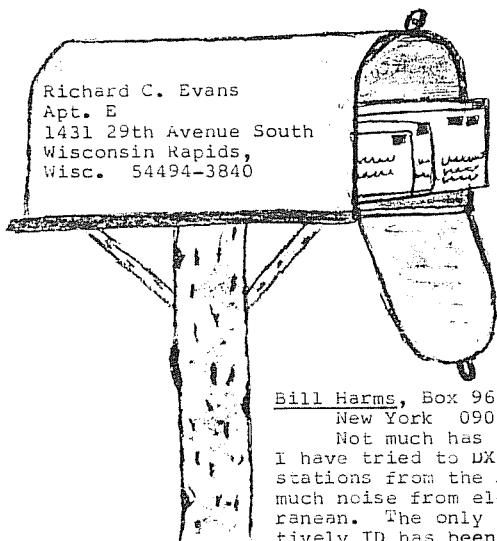

So, if the weather holds up, I can make my last New York winter a veritable DX-fest. The electronics here in the shack haven't been holding up too well as of late. Every once in a while while DXing a station whose program is so enjoyable will be heard that we'll just sit back and listen and stop DXing. The other night (MM 10/12) I found another AM that captured my interest for the duration of the morning with their fine program - it's a Cuban (!) this time, in the form of R. Enciclopedia-1560, lkw from Ciogo de Avila. Listened for over 3 hours to some great US/LA lite jazz & instrumentals and SS facts during WQXR's regular MM SP, until SR fadeout and QXR's regular MM SP, until SR fadeout and QXR's s/on later that morning, and the soft-spoken young lady hosting the pgm made it a most pleasant change contrasted to the almost hostile HJ or YVE. Their signal on the LA mini-Bev's was so good at times I just left them on as background mx while I typed *XWW-E (typing at 0400? Yes, but we're all nightowls, aren't we?) Ernest Cooper, in your 1/12/85 EDXR forum you suggested that Smith's SS on 1560 with FZL may have been WRJS, San Juan, Puerto Rico (listed as WRSJ in 87 WRTH) (and the new NRC Log--rce) rather than Cuba. That's interesting, and may very well have been P.R. as the Cuban of then (per 84 and 85 WRTHs) was on the apparently now defunct R. Musical Avilena network. Does anyone know what type of music R. Musical Avilena carried? Their format was similar to the now 1560 Cuban R. Enciclopedia per 84/85 WRTH's -- continuous mx & TC's, but I'm not sure Avilena's mx format was EZL too (prob. was, though). Anyway, Ernest, you mentioned QXR's SP left a Mexican & Colombian along with WRJS. Who was/is WRJS/WRSJ's format, Ernie? I haven't caught the XE or HJ yet, but the CM and occasionally the YV (around 0300) squeak in. Ernie, I'm surprised the Cuban (as of the then date of your forum) do sn't make it to Provincetown - have you logged them yet? When I heard this R. Enciclopedia the other morning I realized that I'd heard this program before..but this was my first log of the Enciclopedia network. Not so, as after paging a year's worth of DAM's for the DAW-E columns, I found that the LA on 1281 heard last September and thereafter (unID and presumed Cuban) must have certainly been CMDS-1280, R. Enciclopedia in Cardenas off-freq. (and the FCC Cuban Standard Broadcast List indicates a value of less than satisfactory confidence on their measurement of one of the 1280 Cubans, which was probably the wayward CMDS). Matt Stutterheim heard this too last Sept., and Smith confirmed it as of Cuban origin. Funny how it can sometimes take years to assemble enough information in order to ID an unID. Now if I can just ID about fifty more.....73

Across the Columbia on the Long Beach Peninsula where dad had a pastorate (Long Beach/Illwaco) from '69 to retirement in '77, tow truck businesses had a field day in summer. Long Beach is called that thanks to a 32-mile driveable hard-pack sand beach and tourists wouldn't consult tide tables and tow trucks were constantly pulling tourists out of high tide, hi.
