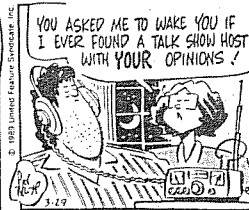
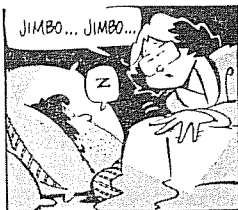

I had an interesting experience last week. I was talking here at my place with the state sales manager of my insurance company. He was looking thru the resume I was sending out last year when I was looking for a job. In the resume, I mentioned both of my main hobbies, and he stopped right at the mention of "long distance reception on the standard broadcast band" and said, "What does that mean?" I explained it in a few words, and he asked what kind of good catches I had made. I mentioned "casually" that when I lived in Gary, Indiana, I had heard Australia, Spain, England and Portugal. He seemed dutifully impressed, hi. It turned out that when he was young--perhaps 20 or 25 years ago--one of his relatives had had a shortwave/longwave radio he liked to listen to. I mentioned that it was strange to hear him mention longwave since it was basically European, not U.S. He said he enjoyed listening to the different stations he could pick up on it, but that over half of the stations were in languages he didn't understand. It set a good tone for a three hour visit with him. He never did comment on the newspaper collection, tho. I read Randy Seaver's Forum in the 3/18 WDXP with interest. Suggesting a merger between NRC and IRCA is not a new subject--it comes up every few years, almost on a regular schedule. As a current BoD member, I'm willing to listen to viewpoints on the subject, but I think something I passed on the BoD back in Nov., 1975 is still relevant and should be considered by everyone first. From my letter to the BoD dated Nov. 5, 1975: "On the question of merging with the NRC, which Ron Schatz brought up in a forum report a month ago, I understand that the idea is not feasible right now. Skip Dabelstein and I talked about the subject several times last year. According to Skip, and he is familiar with Colorado laws due to his work, IRCA, in order to merge, would have to go into court in Colorado and ask that the corporation be dissolved. To bring this dissolution about, we would have to sell all the publishing equipment and other assets of the club, then rebate the unfulfilled portions of the dues to each member...." As far as I know, nothing has changed on this situation. Thus, the question is apparently moot regarding a merger. We would just fold our tent and encourage the minority or our members to join NRC. One thing should be pointed out, however. The estimate is that IRCA has about 275-300 members, and the NRC 700 members. Of these, about 200 members belong to both clubs. The argument is always that we don't need two clubs because the majority of the IRCA members also belong to the NRC. Why not look at it from another perspective: 200 members are snalling out \$42 a year to belong to both clubs. They must feel a need for the information, friendship, etc. from both IRCA and the NRC. On the number of issues per year, the club's C&B-L (Article 11 of the By-Laws) specifies 34 issues per year "except in cases of emergencies. With the permission of the Board, the number of issues may be changed." I would take that to mean we could drop an issue or two one year, which we did back in the late 60's when the New Member Packet was first issued. All the members--even the "older" ones--got the NMP one year in place of an issue of DXM. I would hold that for a permanent reduction of the number of issues in DXM, the By-Laws have to be changed. If I'm still on the Board when the issue comes to it, I would have to vote with this in view. If we don't follow the C&B-L's on it, what is the sense in having them and in having club elections. I had a long talk with Mike Knitter, head of the NRC, last summer during the NRC convention here in Milwaukee. Paul Swearingen, editor of NRC's DX News and an IRCA member and Ernie Cooper were there for parts of the conversation. My feeling is that the NRC is a good club, with good stable leadership, but the type of leadership is such that I would feel a little nervous about it if it were the only DCB club. It's just a gut feeling, and I guess I'm saying that I would hate to see a "merger" go thru. Remember with the Daylight time going in now that most of Indiana, Arizona and Hawaii did not go ahead. All of Indiana now effectively is on CDT. Next bulletin is in two weeks. 73

Hi again! Two forums back-to-back. This could be habit forming. I thought I'd share some DX-related news with you this time, although none of it is about DX'ing I've done.

That doesn't mean that I haven't turned on the radio, but when I do, it seems as though conditions stink. (You got that one right, hi-RtH.) I haven't moved from my apartment in Princeton and I do recall the conditions were pretty good when I first moved here. Must be sunspot activity as I can't get anything but the locals these days.

The conditions must be pretty good for the European DX'ers trying to get North America as I've answered more reception reports from Finnish DX'ers hearing us in Lapland this winter than I have since I moved here. What has me stunned is the sound of our signal on the cassettes they send. They sound as if they were recorded next to the transmitter hut, and in reality our signal gets lost in terrain 10-15 miles from town. Ain't DX grand? (Yup, probably the same DX'ers that sent cassettes to me at KRED. They're also using Beverages and they're around the Arctic Circle - sort of helps, hi-RtH.)

The most DX'ing I've done this season was during the Canadian election. All but the local time zone TV stations were blacked out, so I fired up the PRG-7000 and tuned into Radio Canada International's election coverage. One of the many times DX has come in handy, hi.

A DX friend of mine in Sweden, Dick Gustavsson, has been pestering me for quite some time for DX tips, so I thought I'd send him a couple copies of an industry-related magazine I get. I wasn't sure how much of it was going to be of interest to him until he sent me a copy of his DX club's Swedish language DX bulletin called "Distance." In it were a number of articles culled from the magazines I sent him. It brought DX into a different perspective for me as I'm in North America, but for a Swedish or European DX'er, some of that stuff would certainly help with an ID or two. I'm glad I could help the Swedish DX'ers.

I have to apologize to those whom I owe letters. Ted Wendland in particular. Ted, I'll have some cassettes in the mail to you by the time you read this. I have no excuse for the delay. For what it's worth, I didn't forget about you. Also, hello to TRH, I hope all stations here confirmed your reports. And to Jø, your comment about CBU/CBRP going to FM made my day a few issues back in Kanadian Korner. I'll be glad when they're gone. It sure will be quiet with only one AM station on the whole dial locally, but great for DX, I hope. 3's de WGE.

Hello there! Soory for not making the deadline for the Anniversary issue but I was slowed up for about six weeks with a monster case of bronchitis. Also, we've been having rampant illness in our family. If it gets any worse, we expect to see a World Vision film crew on our doorstep, hi. (What's the 800 number, Glen?-hi-RtH.)

For a re-intro: I'm 49, married and have five children ages three months through 11 years. I've been DX'ing since the early '50's except for a hiatus in the '70s. My early DX'ing experience was in the Denver area where I heard things like Bermuda 1235 and KIKI 830 - both 250 watts - a few Aussies and New Zealanders, several Japanese and Chinese, and gobs of stations from Central and South America. These included CX28 1090 Uruguay, 2FY 660 British Guiana and 4VAB 1146 Haiti (with 400 watts). For about a year-and-a-half I lived in the Texas panhandle, logging Lisbon, Rome, BBC, plus 2RE 1560, 4RK plus many LA's.

Since 1963 I've lived in CA except for a move to FL in '76. One of the more interesting areas was Palm Springs where, due to low ground conductivity, it's possible to be looking at a station's tower lights and not be able to hear them! In Palm Desert at night, the whole band was a jumble of sky-wave signals and for some reason my most-logged state from there was FL!

Totals from Merced now stand at 464 stations, 34 countries and 31 states. I suppose the best catches from here are Senegal 765 and Sarawak 873.

I've been in the radio business since 1960 as announcer, Production Director, Music Director, Program Director and Chief Engineer; sometimes two or three of these simultaneously. Stations I've worked for include KOLR, KYUE, KIX7, KICM, KASK, KDES, KACY, KREC, KWXY, KGUY, KCMJ, KUDE, KAPX, WDI7, WTLN, KAMB and KSNN. (You sure you got everyone mentioned?-hi-RtH.)

Because half of these stations have either changed calls or gone dark, I'll leave it to you historians to sort out the locations, hi. A couple more hints - I started working for KWXV on their second day of operation, and I built KAPX (now KWVE).

Well, that's it for now, best of DX and 73. (Glen, half my co-workers have come down with one version or another of bronchitis over the last few months, hope you're feeling better-RtH.)

Someone reported hearing a tone on 1500 last year and they were correct. It was from a new transmitter site, one tower with 250 watts, near Sunland in Tujunga Wash. Commentator Nightingale dies

PARADISE VALLEY, Ariz. (AP) — Earl Nightingale, a gravel-voiced Chicago radio commentator who was a pioneer in producing motivational audiotapes, has died of complications following heart surgery. He was 68.

Nightingale died Saturday in Scottsdale Memorial Hospital.

In October 1988, Nightingale spoke at a benefit at the Rialto Theater to raise funds to fight gang crime in Joliet.

He was inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame in 1986. His broadcasting career began while he was in the Marines in World War II.

He was one of only 12 Marines to survive the attack on the USS Arizona in Pearl Harbor at the onset of the war.

After leaving the service, he joined radio station KTAR in Phoenix. Three years later he moved to CBS at WBBM in Chicago. One year later he formed his own company and began writing and broadcasting his daily talk show, "Our Changing World," on radio station WGN in Chicago.

He began syndication of it in 1949, and it still is carried in all 50 states and in a number of countries overseas.

Additionally, from 1950 to 1954, Nightingale was the radio voice of Sky King, a popular nationally broadcast adventure series.

Car radio, not FCC, may be the problem

Why does the radio signal for KEEN-AM (1370) impinge on other stations for 200 MHz on each side (of the radio dial) when you're driving a mile or more from the transmitter? Doesn't the FCC regulate anything anymore?

— E.L. Saratoga

It does, but the trouble probably is a function of your car radio, and the Federal Communications Commission does not regulate mobile radios, says Linda Summers, FCC public affairs specialist. Generally, the FCC requires radio stations to correct interference to a stationary television or radio within a 2½-mile radius of the transmitter. But Section 73.318 (b) of the Code of Federal Regulations, excludes mobile radios because of their mobile nature and the way they are made, Summers says. AM stations are particularly susceptible to interference. The problem, an overload of the receiver when it's so close to the transmitter, may vary from car radio to car radio, Summers says. If you experienced such interference on a stationary radio within 2½ miles of the transmitter, you could expect the radio station to respond to any complaints, Summers says. KEEN general manager Christopher Snell says he rarely receives complaints about interference and suggests that a new radio should solve the problem. You may want to find out if friends are experiencing the same trouble with their car radios, Summers says. Readers experiencing interference on their telephones, radios or televisions may call the FCC at (415) 556-7700 for appropriate FCC bulletins or information on how to file complaints.

Trans - Pacific

Australia - 2WEB Outback Radio - Burke, NSW is now on 585, ex-576 (Cushen/RNMN via BDXC via ARC) 7XS-837 Queenstown is ex-7QT. (FERC) New on 1125 kHz (previously clear) is 5MV with 5 kW, Murray Bridge, South Australia. "11-25 AM Stereo" is ex-1458 kHz and announcing prizes to those who phone from the most distant point (WC DX'ers, take note!) Also new on 1305 kHz (also previously clear) is a 2 kW ABC-3 outlet in Renmark, ex-1593 (call given as 5MV - perhaps some confusion with the new 1125 station) (Nederlands Media Network via Jim Hall)

China, PRC - Radio France Internationale is using 1296 kHz via xmtrs in Kunming, 1500-1700 with FF pgs to Vietnam. (Jim Hall)

New stations include Xuchang PBS, Henan prov.-1287v; Puqi PBS, Hubei prov.-1341; Taizhou PBS, Jiangsu prov.-1341; Qufu PBS, Shandong prov.-1341; Fuyang PBS, Anhui prov.-1494, and Xiaogan PBS, Hubei prov.-1568v. V. O. Jingling via Jiangsu PBS is on 702 only, no longer on 1314, 1602. Wuxi PBS-1223 has varied from 1232. Wuhan PBS-2 has been heard on 1107, but not on 1110. (Gima in ABI via FERC)

Indonesia - RDK-1200 Lebak on this freq. 0100-0800. RKIP-1612 Wonocolo new here, 0950-1600 (TH 2100). (Thaliep in SCDX via ARC)

New Zealand - Tauranga District Museum and Historic Village, c/o Tauranga City Council, will use 1368 kHz @ 900watts on Sundays 0900-1700 NZT (or Sat. 2100-0500 UTC) from May 2 until January 28, 1990. Radio for the Print disabled, Inc. - Box 360 - Levin 5500 will continue to use 1602 kHz/1kW 1855-2200 NZT 13 days a month until the end of June 1989. (NZDXT) A trial extension of Daylight Savings Time by a total of 5 weeks from Summer 1989-90 will commence on Sunday, October 8, 1989, and will run through to March 18, 1990. (Clark, NZDXT) The BCNZ will be restructured next year and become two state-owned enterprises, one for TV and one for radio. Additionally, RNZ will split into non-commercial National and Concert programs and a commercial service. (BDXC via ARC via ARC)

Philippines - The FEBC is raising funds for a new MW tx to replace the 90 kW tx of DXAS-702 kHz. The

new one will have at least 100 kW and become the second strongest in the country. (SCDX via ARC via FERC)

Taiwan - BCC Taipei 3 is on 1062, ex-1071. BCC Canghai 2 is a new relay station (Gima in ABI via FERC via ARC)

USSR - New jammers opened on 639 and 1560 kHz. (EBU via BE via ARC)

Trans-Atlantic

Cameroun - Bamenda-1152 uses 300 kW according to a QSL card. (ARC via MWN)

Cyprus - CBSK-1044 Limassol is ex-1584. (SCDX via MWN)

Finland - Vaasa-1242 has been off the air since the beginning of October. (OA in ARC)

Gibraltar - The station drifting to 1458.27 has been noted as far away as Madrid. (P-DX via MWN)

Iceland - Hofn-1400 closed last August when NATO radar was taken over by Icelandic authorities. (SCDX via MWN)

Ireland - Radio Star County is on 891, ex-927. KISS FM (County Monaghan) is now on 1170 and 1413. R. West-702's tx was completely gutted by fire on Nov. 12, 1988, according to Boynside Radio via SW. (MWN)

Italy - R. Benacus-1584.9 Verona closed down October 15 and will re-open in June, 1989. (P-DX via MWN) An unID RAI 2 has been heard on 693. RAI 2 Perugia is on 999 with 20 kW. [1296 New RAI 3 tx's are Taranto, 5 kw - Trento, 2 kW and La Spezia, 2 kW (retyped as in 2-11 mv eko -pls)] (EBU via P-DX via ARC) R. Speranza-1497, Modena also carries programmes from Vatican Radio. (PLV in P-DX)

Libya - Newly-opened stations are on 695, 775, and 1210 kHz, locations unknown. (EBU via BE via ARC)

Malta - Xandir Malta has reopened on 1480 after being off the air for several years; power is unknown. (EBU via BE)

Norway - Due to increasing mail, R. Norway no longer guarantees 100% QSL response. (stn info via BDXC via MWN)

Morocco - Laayoune-657 and Tangier 1-1116 have been taken out of service. (EBU via BE via ARC)

Portugal - RdP Antena 1-1287 Elvis is now on the air with 10 kW. (EBU via BE)

Spain - COPE-882 Málaga is ex-1134. COPE stations have started AM stereo as of the beginning of October (BDXC via MWN)

United Kingdom - All BBC local stations in SE England carry a common program 2200-2400 weekdays. BBC's Cumbria, Lancashire, Merseyside, and GMR carry a common program weekdays 1405-1600 and 1930-2400 and weekends 1930-2400.

(NP in BDXC)

A row has broken out over the use of the name "Radio 5". Radio Tele Luxembourg and RTTE, the Irish Broadcasting Organisation, are planning to use the name in the run up to launching the new daytime station "Radio Tara" which will be based in Ireland and broadcast to Britain beginning September, 1989. However, the BBC announced recently that it intends to start a new radio station in 1990 called "Radio 5", but this is disputed by RTL who said that the BBC had no more right to the title than anybody else. Radio 5 would be used only in the run up to launching the station before a new suitable name was chosen. (MWN) BBC Wiltshire Sound will begin testing soon on 1332/1368. (MWN)

"The airwaves will be swamped with new sounds as hundreds of radio stations are turned on by the 1990's. Three national commercial networks will challenge the monopoly of the BBC. Two of the networks will use MW channels now occupied by BBC Radio 1 and 3. The new stations, including hundreds of small community services, will now be able to tailor output to local audiences as they will not be bound by the old regulations, demanding a blend of entertainment and information/education. ('Today', Nov. 8, 1988, via BD via ARC)

BBC CWR, Warwickshire is due to open at the end of 1989. Planned frequencies are 1386 with 4 kW and 1413 with 4. (Ariel/DX-N via SDXL via ARC) BBC Hereford and Worcester was due to start official transmissions Jan. 31 on 819 from Hereford and 738 from Worcester. Local programmes 0600-1900 and regional until 2400. TX power may be less than planned 150 watts. (SW in MWC via ARC)

A merger may take place between Piccadilly Radio, BRMB Radio, and Mercia Sound. R. Nova International, the satellite-delivered radio service for independent radio, has ended. The three ILR subscribers were Northsound Radio, West Sound, and Severn sound. BBC, R. Newcastle is now relaying Radio 1 on both of its tx's instead of Radio 2 when its own programs are not transmitted. (MWC)

USSR - During his holiday in Odessa, KH visited a local radio office and got the following list of local tx's: 765 with Kiev-1 and VR-1, 50 kW; 1242 with Kiev-2, 30 kW; 1278 with VR-3, 50 kW; 1404 100 km north of Odessa with Kiev-2, 50 kW; 1566 with VR2 and Mayak, ? kW. Observations: 549 VR-2, unID location, but the strongest one of all local tx's. 1431 VR-5, unID location, good signal. FS of Radio Moscow starts at 1630 in Greek. (ARC)

Pan-American

Argentina - During the last three years, there has been an incredible boom of unofficial radio stations. Nowadays it is supposed that there are about 1,500 pirates in Argentinian. Most of these stations operate on FM, but some have also been heard on medium wave. (JA in ARC)

Bolivia - CP145-930 R. Metropolitana is (according to Reuters) active again as from Jan. 1. (Pampas DX via ARC)

Brazil - ZYL213-690 R. América ex 750 now uses 50/5 kW. ZYH...-710 Fundação Rainha da Paz is a new CP with a power of 50/5 kW. ZYL228-750 R. Mineira, ex 690, now uses 25/2.5 kW. ZYH705-800, R. MEC, now uses 50/600 kW. ZYK203-1300, R. Gazeta, now uses 50/10 kW. ZYK736-1330, R. Iguatemi, now uses 10/5 kW. ZYH...-1350, R. Cristal, has an increased CP to 50/2.5 kW. ZYK...-1370 Sistema São Paulo de Comunicações has an upgraded CP to 25/10 kW. (CRM in ARC) A new state has been formed, Tocantins, ex-territory of Goiás. State capital is Miraceme do Norte. (CRM in WRTH via ARC)

Chile - CC143-1435, R. Nacional de Chile, Rancagua, ex-1430, was heard in September by Daniel Camporini. (ARC)

Colombia - HJSB-870 Barranquilla has added CARACOL (Primera Cadena Radial Colombiana. (Jim Hall). A news source states that Colombian authorities along with agents of the U. S. DEA have linked ownership of the Colombian network Grupo Radial Colombiano - Bogotá (comprising over 20 MW affiliates per WRTH) as well as several other corporate and industrial entities to Latin American drug lords. A "sting" operation may very well put an end to the net and force affiliates to go independent to sign with other Colombian networks. (Jim Hall)

HJNZ-1440 R. 24 has been burnt down by an armed group. It seems that this station belonged to the Cartel de Cali narco group, and that the station was destroyed by a group of Cartel de Medellín (Colombia's greatest narco group), which is trying to penetrate further into the New York City market, which is traditionally controlled by the first group. (Pampas DX via ARC)

HJJW-1460 Bogotá (Nuevo Continente), currently 5 kW, 24 hours, plans an increase to 15 kW in '89. HJSQ-1580 Cartago (R. Rogledo) plans a change of freq. (not specified) in '89. (WRTH via Jim Hall)

Dominican Republic - Delete HICN-1120, R. Antillas, Sto. Domingo. (WRTH via ARC) HIOS-1260 Dajabon (R. Marien) will move to 1110 kHz. (Jim Hall)

Ecuador - HCGF1-1335, R. Sideral, is back on 1335, ex-1330. (Pampas DX via ARC)

Guyana - The GBC has renamed its two radio channels. Channel 1 (on 760) has become R. Roraima, and Channel 2 (on 560) has become the Voice of Guyana. R. Roraima will provide light entertainment programs for youth, while the Voice of Guyana will be more broad with documentaries, discussions, sports, pop music, and commentaries. (BDXC via ARC)

Mexico - XEVU-720 R. Alegria is ex-1350, identifying itself as "La Grande de Mazatlán".

XEBCCO-1210 R. Occidente is new with 50 kW. Key station is R. México on 1220 kHz.

Nicaragua - YNAOL/HTAOL-820 Managua (R. Ondas de Luz) will move to 620 kHz and increase power

to 25 kW. (WRTH via Jim Hall) YNW/HTW-920 Managua (R. Mundial) will increase to 10 kW from 1 kW. (Jim Hall)

Paraguay - ZP11-1200 R. Cáritas has been ordered by ANTELCO to cut its power from 10 to 3 kW, which would limit coverage to a radius of some 50 kW. This church-owned station is overtly critical of the government. (UKVK via ARC)

Perú - OXB2P-1010, R. San Francisco, has been inactive since June. (Pampas DX via ARC)

Puerto Rico - WENA-1330 Penuelas (La Buena del Sur) will move to Yauco with 2 kW fulltime. (WRTH via Jim Hall)

St. Helena - "R. St. Helena-1548 broadcasts 1900-2230 daily. They have two very old Marconi tx's, built in 1943/4, which are conversions from communications tx's. Their 450-watt signal has a radius of approx. 500 km. They currently use two studios, one built in 1967 and one opened on the 20th anniversary of the stn. at Christmas, 1987. They have a permanent staff of four and 30 of programmes are bought from the BBC Transcription service. Local news can be heard daily at 2010, repeated at 2210. There are no weather forecasts since they are in the middle of nowhere. Country music is the most popular; Top 40 is out because of the inherent delay in importing the records on the one ship that calls every six weeks. This island's inhabitants listen mainly to the BBC for sports and news." (RNMN via BDXC via ARC)

Uruguay - CX154-1540 R. Olimar, is again on the air, as of Jan. 19. (CRM in ARC)

Venezuela - YVFO-670 R. Primera is ex 1350 with 10 kW since January. YV...-800 R. Guadalupana, which was to start up in July, was heard on 1540 on Jan. 25 announcing 25 kW. YVTC-1500 R. Politécnico is inactive. (The Radio News, via ARC)

YVOR-1180 R. Maturín is on this freq. and not on 1130. The move to 1130 was a printing error in the folder supplied by R. Rumbos. (JSR in ARC)
YVRT-990 Caracas (R. Tropical) plans a power

increase from 20 kW to 50 kW. YVQY-1030 Guanare (R. Onda) plans a power increase from 15 kW to 30 kW as well as adding an SW parallel. (WRTH via Jim Hall)

YV...-800 Coro (R. Guadalupana) will apparently replace YVTB Maracaibo (R. Éxitos) which is reported off. (But see above hearing on 1540 -pls) YVPW-1240 Paraguana Falcon (LV de Venezuela) is reportedly nearing startup with 1000 kW day and 500 kW night (apparently ND) and will air EE, SS, and FF as well as Papiamento cultural pgms. This outlet has stirred controversy between the Venezuelan government and the U. S. State Department, so negotiations, if any, may delay this even further. (Jim Hall)

International Waters

Caroline-558 has English programmes daily at 0500-2400. The 819 tx has Dutch 0400-1800 followed by Viewpoint, religious programmes of varying duration. (A-UK in MWC)

Aruts Sheva (Channel Seven), an offshore Israel pirate station, has been heard testing on 918 with Hebrew songs from 0700-2200. (MWC) The station identified itself as "The Voice of the Gazelle" (Hebrew: Kol Hatzvi). The ship is anchored outside Israeli territorial waters to the north of Tel Aviv. (Kol Israel, via ARC) Programming is REL and sked is Su-Th 0500-1900, Fr 0500-1300, and Sa 1700-2200. (Podchebnik in SCDX via ARC)

Sealand - Things are going on with the use of the former wartime fort off the east coast of England. Reports indicated that AM and FM txs have been ordered to be installed. On the other hand, the DTI says that the moment broadcasting begins from the fort, they would close it down. (ARC)

Laser 558 - Heavy fines have been imposed by Canterbury Crown Court on people involved with the operation of this former offshore radio station. (ARC)

A HISTORY OF IDAHO AM RADIO

An incomplete history of Idaho AM radio would be a more appropriate title for this article as there is some station information missing. In compiling such a report we run into four main problems:

1. Since it has been almost 70 years since the first licensed stations came on the air most of the people who were involved with them are now gone.
2. The FCC was not formed until the mid 1920s (then as the Federal Radio Commission) & there are incomplete or missing records on many of the pioneer broadcasters. A few years back the FCC office in Portland OR sent me a list of stations supposedly on the air in the early 1920s. As far as I could tell only a couple of those stations survived so I suspect there could be many pioneer broadcasters long forgotten. The list was from the memory of one of the Portland FCC officials and may not be complete or accurate. Unfortunately the list is currently packed away (I am planning a move in the near future) & was not

available for this article but once it is located I hope to review it for further research.

3. In the early 1920s several federal agencies issued broadcast licenses and those records are also few and far between. In fact many of the original stations evolved from amateur stations so their actual broadcast histories may go farther back than their listed sign on dates.

4. Most of the pioneer broadcasters have been sold a multitude of times since their first sign on & they no longer have complete or accurate information available on their own station history.

This list was prepared from information I first collected in the early 1970s when I researched the history of Idaho TV broadcasting & from information I collected directly from the stations for the IDAHO BROADCASTING GUIDE. The stations are listed in rough order of sign on date & also includes dates (when known) of call letter changes. A few stations, noted by a '*' preceding the call letters, have additional information following the list.

A major component missing are the numerous frequency changes of the earlier stations. I know from reviewing older copies of the IDAHO STATESMAN both KFXD & KIDO changed frequencies several times over the past 50 years. Forming a complete history of these changes would be an interesting project I may work on at a later date.

Specific dates for some changes in both call letters and frequencies are also missing from the mid 1970s to early 1980s as I did not start keeping complete records until I published the first IDAHO BROADCASTING GUIDE in 1984.

KIDO-First on the air as KFAU in May 1922, owned by Boise High School. Was sold to the Davidson Family (who moved from Eugene OR) in 1928. They owned the station until 1959 when they decided to make KIDO-TV their primary business. KIDO-TV then became KTUV. It has been told in early accounts of KFAU, the reason for the station being sold was the school district could no longer afford to keep replacing the final tubes that were always burning out. KFAU may have been one of the first educational broadcasters in the country.

KFXD-put on the air by Frank Hurt in Logan UT in 1922 (BROADCASTING YEARBOOK says May 20, 1920 but former KFXD management said 1922). He moved the station to Jerome ID in 1925 and later to Nampa in 1927. I have found some listings to show the Nampa move occurred in 1930 but I now believe 1927 is the correct year.

KID-former frequencies were 1320 & 1350

KUNI-was on 1240 with 1kw until the mid 1970s when it moved to 1080 with 10kw day, 1kw night.

KBOI-was first on 950, moved to 670 on May 9, 1968 with 50kw day and 25kw night. Went to 50kw night Feb. 16, 1981. KDSH became KBOI in 1955 when the owners transferred the city of license of KBOI-TV from Meridian to Boise. KBOI-TV became KBCI in 1975 when both stations were sold to separate owners.

KACH-changed calls to KACH from KPST sometime in the late 1970s.

KSPT-my original listing for first sign on date was 1944 but BROADCASTING YEARBOOK shows 1949.

KRXK-station told me their first sign on was in 1954 but BROADCASTING YEARBOOK lists Jan. 1951.

KIZN-was originally on 740, moved to 730 in Dec. 1984

KOZE and KLER (both owned by 4-K Radio) swapped frequencies in the late 1970s.

KBRU-went off the air with sister FM KFIS 100.1 in the summer of 1986. In 1988 both stations were sold and KFIS came back on the air. The new owners said they planned to have KBRU on the air later in the year. At this writing there has been no indication the station has returned.

KSPD-was off the air from 1972 to 1978. It could be argued the 1978 to present broadcast operations are actually a different station from those of 1959-1972. BROADCASTING YEARBOOK lists the first sign on date for KEST as 1959 but the original owners said the station came on the air in April of 1961. I do seem to remember the station being on the air before 1961.

KBGN-was originally on 910, changed to 1060 in the late 1970s.

KKIC-as KAIN moved to 950 from 1010 in 1968 when KBOI moved to 670. In the early 1980s it was sold to the owners of KKIC FM, 101.7. KKIC was off the air from 1984 to May 1987. The station was also licensed to Meridian from the early 1980s until 1988 when relicensed to Boise.

KZID-station may be coming back on the air under new management. It has been reported prospective owners have been looking the station over.

KLIT-owner, Mary Lake Communications (FM KIYS 92.3) may have dropped plans for the station.

KACY/KORI-station (with sister FM, KQPD 100.1, also off the air in 1986) was sold in either 1986 or 1987 to Owyhee Broadcasters Inc. The original offices and studios no longer exist. The call letters KORI were approved for both stations in 1987. As of this date no progress has made on getting KORI (AM or FM) on the air. I checked with the Payette Chamber of Commerce in 1988 and they said there had been no sign of Owyhee Broadcasters Inc. in the area.
