Almanac Report

Sunspot Status

The 11 year sunspot cycle is gearing up for its peak in December 1989, & researchers predict it will be one of the most violent in 250 years.

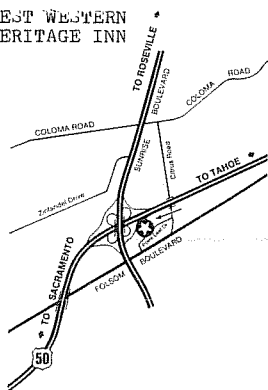
According to researchers at NOAA, the intensity of sunspot activity is expected to increase between now and December. Already, they report, the average number of flareups (51.3 per month over a 13 month period) is greater than that observed in a similar period in 1957 (40.7), the previously strongest sunspot cycle ever recorded.

NOAA researchers predict that the present cycle will peak at 100 to 200 sunspots/month. Massive magnetic storms on the sun, which have played havoc with radio communications and electric power transmission, are expected to continue throughout the period. (Six meter club of Chicago, via *Worldradio* magazine, it looks like conditions will get worse before it gets better. This helps explain why foreign DX has been so poor this season.)

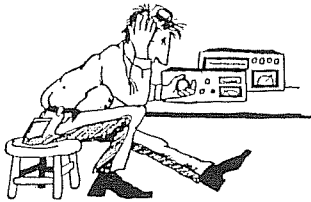

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: The sale price of WOR 710 NY - a station whose owners (RKO) had been involved in license litigation for nearly 25 years - was \$25.5 million. Yep, AM radio must be pretty well dead...one of its would-be killers, FCC Chairman Dennis Patrick, has announced his resignation after six years of trying to dismantle technical regulations and legislate morality. No word yet on a nominee to replace him.

Speaking of the FCC...the Commission has announced its willingness to waive cross-ownership rules that currently prohibit one owner from having AM, FM and TV stations in the same market. Three companies have applied for waivers thus far: Capital Cities-ABC (WABC-770, KABC-790, WLS-890, KGO-810); Taft/Great American Television & Radio Co. (WKRC-550, WbAP-610); and Fisher Broadcasting (KOMO-1000). Net effect, if waivers are granted, is probably that the companies won't have to sell the AM parts of their combo operations (which, being the least valuable, have generally been the ones spun off). The FCC has also tightened up the process for competing new station applications, so that one licensee cannot buy off competing apps for exorbitant sums of \$\$ and so apps competing with existing stations can't assume they'll inherit the old station's transmitter sites.

The FCC has also adopted the National Radio Systems Committee (NRSC) emission limitation (aka NRSC-2), effective June 20, 1990. Until June 20, 1994, stations adhering the NRSC-1 audio pre-emphasis limits will be presumed to comply with NRSC-2 unless there's evidence otherwise.

Another new satellite format: Drake-Chenault, a taped formats company, and Cable TV giant Jones Intercable have a new, joint-venture live satellite country format; they also have two more AC formats in the works.

On April 10th, I received a v/l from CKSL-1410, London, Ontario. The report was mailed on May 13, 1964. That's almost 1800 days +/- in the form v/l. The chief engineer was very apologetic for the long delay. He explained the major events that have occurred at CKSL since that time. This is now my record for the longest time for a verification. I am amazed that someone kept track all this time. There was no date in the v/l. The CE included a signed QSL card with the date blank. He said just fill it in yourself. As for the sunspots and auroras this spring, I had visual sightings of the sunspots at sunset on March 13th. I was able to view the sun thru heavy haze just before sunset. Could see several spots on the sun's disc at about the 4 o'clock position. A week later, they were not visible. While on the subject of sightings... I spotted the towers of AM station WAUR-930, Aurora/Sandwich, Ill. from my backyard. The towers are 15 miles away and only visible at night. Can see the upper 1/3 of the north and south towers of the four tower set. These two towers have beacons on top. These are the only AM towers visible around here. The towers of the two Joliet stations are on the east side of the city on the east edge of the river valley. They are obscured by buildings. You may wonder how one can see that far. It is very easy here. The land is flat as a pancake. Between here and the WAUR site are a few farm buildings and trees. The only DX here was a try at the MRC special test from WCFS-1260. Tried on Mh 4/10 but heard nothing. Heard weak TF'er on Mh 4/17 at 0208. I don't know if it was WCFS or not. A tentative report is in the mail. 73's.

I meant to mention it a couple of weeks ago in the last column. I spotted an article in the Racine paper about a call-in contest that local WKIL-106.1 (sister station to WOKY-920) held on 4/13. They gave \$10,000 to the 106th caller to the station. It wound up tying up Wisconsin Bell's phone lines for close to an hour, and delayed dial tones for up to 15 seconds when a person picked up their phone. Wisconsin Bell was very upset because they say people assume their phones are out of order if they have to wait that long for a dial tone and it could create problems in the event of an emergency. (Wisc. Bell normally provides a dial tone within three seconds.) Apparently, the program director at the station had bragged to his co-workers that he would blow out Milwaukee's phone system with a phone-in contest, but "I never expected it to happen in reality, never in my wildest dreams." Wisc. Bell says if he tries it again, it can cut off the radio station's phone service. The winner tried about 20 times before getting thru as the 106th caller. The big news here on a personal level is that I'm changing jobs again. This time, tho, I don't have to move, unlike the last two changes, hi. I'm back in the trucking business again, as a rate clerk for Advance Transportation here in Milwaukee, starting 5/1/69. It'll be evening work again. thank goodness. Gotta run. 73.

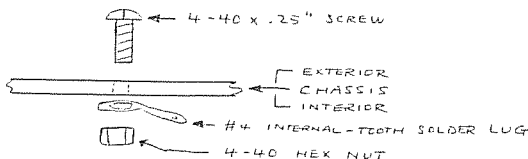
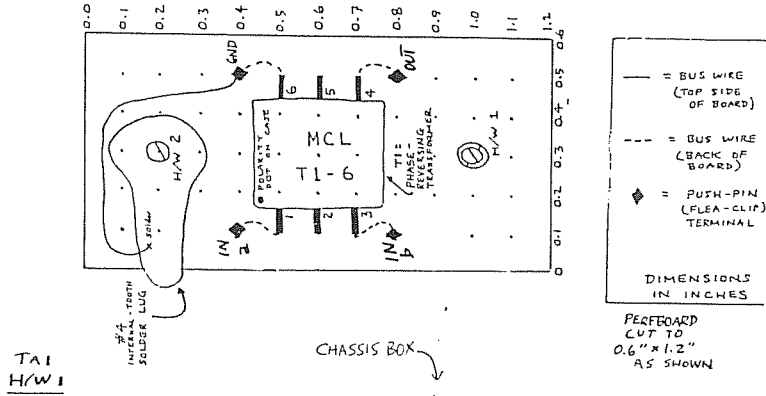
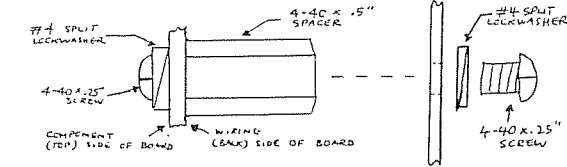


FIGURE 2 : TAI PHASE-REVERSING TRANSFORMER ASSEMBLY

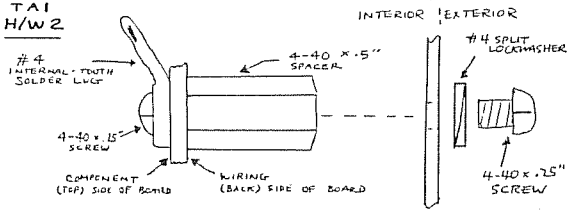
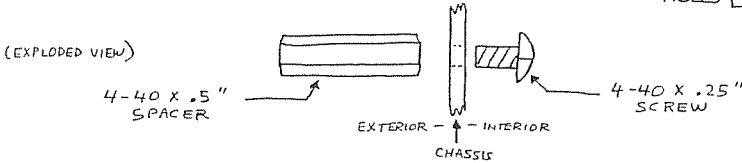
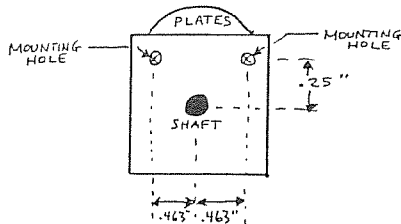


FIGURE 3 : VARIABLE CAPACITOR/VERNIER KNOB MOUNTING

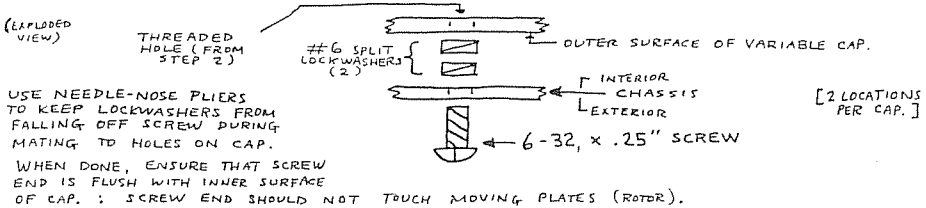
RICH TOEBE

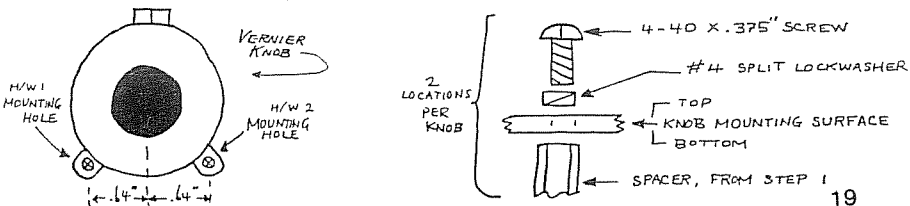
ROBERT WIEN
