TRIVIA QUESTION OF THE MONTH

"Well, it's good to know you're reading carefully..." Bill Hardy notes that I omitted KGY-1240 from my list of Washington state three-letter calls AND graveyard three-letter calls in last month's answers. Oops. (Hey, most of Olympia can't remember they exist, either!) And Thomas White of Herndon VA pointed out not only KGY-1240, but our mutual local, WOL-1450, as missing graveyards. (On the other hand, I've visited KGY's current studios, but not WOL's. Which is to say I have no excuse for either, except for the temporary brain death.) Meanwhile, Thomas White also nailed St. Louis as being the most recent city with four three-letter calls: KSD-- still on FM; KWK-1380 - on FM til recently; WIL-1430 and WEW-770. And as soon as I noted how stable Iowa's six three-letter calls have been, we lose one - KSO-1460. Argh.

This month's moderately impossible question: Three town names - Clinton, Madison and Marion - have towns with AM stations licensed to them in ten states. One other town name has AM stations in eleven states. Name it, with the states. (Mischievous hint: think of trees.) Bonus question: only two town names have full power (1 kw+) AM stations licensed in different Canadian provinces. Name the names & provinces.

Birch has announced it will add continuous ratings measurement to another 50 markets, bringing its total to 160. For practical purposes, stations in towns of any size are now in continuous ratings periods...in the latest round of the FCC's Congress-inspired war on "indecent" broadcasts, three stations' morning shows, including WLUP-1000's Steve Dahl, have been cited for poisoning the minds of the public. These programs are generally so juvenile that between the stations and the FCC, it's hard to know who to root against. The FCC has also apparently scrapped the idea of a "safe hour" after which "indecent" material can be broadcast, ruling that stations must toe the ill-defined line 24 hours a day...while on the topic, WRIV-1390 Riverhead NY has applied to move its transmitter location - to the Riverhead Sewage Treatment Plant. Methinks our friends at Crystal Coast Communications are taking recent programming trends too literally.

Lots of miscellaneous Canada, some of it probably stale but here goes: CBC wants to move CBQ-800 Thunder Bay Ont. to FM...CBN-640 St. John's Nfld. is now talking programs part-time from CFGB-FM Goose Bay...CHRX-600 Vancouver B.C. is now IDing as "Cable stereo 90 dot 9, AM 600... CKST-800 Langley B.C. calls itself "Cable stereo 88.5" and "Coast Radio-Fresh Air." It has dropped SRN for a live AN show...CKWX-1130 Vancouver B.C. has also gone back to live ANs as "Real Country"...there's a new AN country satellite service, "Star Country." Known affiliates so far: CJET-630-Ont., CKDM-730-Man., CKLQ-880-Man., CKGY-1170-Alta., CJOC-1220-Alta. (& CJPR-1490 & CJEV-1340), and CISN-FM Edmonton. CKKS-FM Vancouver is now being relayed AN by CFVR-850, CJDC-890, CKGO-1240, CHWK-1270, CHPQ-1370, and CHUB-1570, all B.C. One more new Canadian satellite net - "Open House Party," and, inevitably, "Late Night Open House Party." Finally, your late-breaking LPRT news. The following LPRTs have moved to FM or gone off the air entirely: CBNF-740 Woody Point Nfld.; CBNJ-740 Port Saunders Nfld.; CBUC-860 Salmon Arm B.C.; CBXM-860 McBride B.C.; CBKJ-860 Gold River B.C.; CBDV-860 Pine Point N.W.T.; CBRI-1080 Christina Lake B.C.; CBEC-1090 Elliot Lake Ont.; CBQR-1160 Rankin Inlet N.W.T.; CBKD-1230 High Level Alta.; CBQK-1230 Faro Y.T.; CKBI-1350 Valemount B.C.; CKBI-1450 Hinton Alta.; CBDJ-1490 Hay River N.W.T.; CBAF-2-1550 Weymouth N.S...CFAK-1240 Atitokan Ont. has changed calls to CFOB-1...CJJC-920 Woodstock N.B. has had two new relays approved, but the CRTc has not bothered to release power or frequency info. They're at Plaster Rock and Perth-Andover, N.B...and, CFOK-1370 has had approved a twin at High Prairie, Alta., with 24 hours/week of programming from its own studio. Again, no hint of power or frequency.

Hmmm...Miscellaneous Canada sounds like another Ottawa bureaucracy, hi. Most of the Canadian info comes via John Oldfield, who complains the CRTc is getting even worse about releasing info - omitting calls, freqs, powers, patterns and other useful data. JO also notes he types w/two fingers and will be unable to pick his nose for another month. Oh, and thanks to Nigel Pimblett & Bill Hardy for info on the elusive CKBA-850.

It is, bar none, the best AM/FM radio reference I've ever seen. 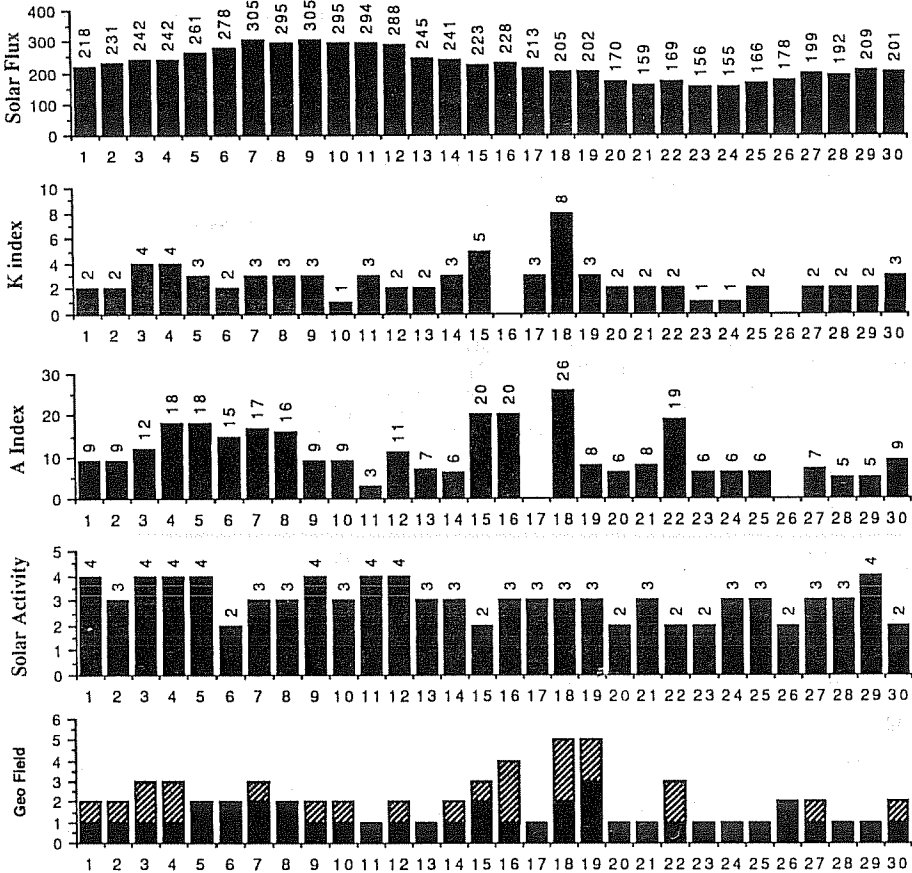

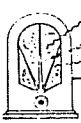

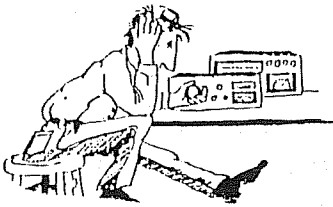

Perhaps the better conditions are changing my perception on this loop's performance (or I'm finally learning how to use it, hi). It was just so nice to have another DX'er to talk with - my wife's eyes glaze over pretty fast. 73.

NICK HALL-PATCH, 1538 AMPHION ST., VICTORIA, BC V8R 4Z6

In the middle of August, there was a most peculiar opening to Australia and N°. Up to 09 August, conditions had been generally dull, just a few carriers at dawn now and again. But on the morning of 09 August at 1230 UTC, I turned the radio on to hear a weak carrier on 1620. This is rather unusual when DX'ing at home using an unamplified loop. Carriers and weak audio were heard on about half the channels down to 1116 kHz, but nothing heard below this. The next morning showed fair audio on 1620 and 1629 with sub-audible hets and weaker audio underneath - all of it quite readable and never heard at this level before. It was like a door opening in the ionosphere. This time the action died out below 1300 kHz. Finally, the morning of 11 August was similar with some of the best audio on tentative 200 1575 and 3NE 1566 both with pop music. Some of the regular low band carriers like 1008, 837 and 756 etc. started to show up that morning as well. The next morning and following mornings were unfortunately back to normal. So, why did this opening occur? The sun was quite active during this period, as was the geomagnetic field. A sudden impulse to the field took place at 1830 UTC on 09 August and solar flares showed up on the 11th and 12th. A satellite proton event started at 1600 on 12 August which seems to correlate with the return of normally poor conditions. But I have no idea why conditions should have been so interesting on those 3 days, as there seemed to be no direct cause and effect between solar-terrestrial activity and DX conditions. Unfortunately, I had no foirm ID's on these stations, so I'm not able to send in a super list of loggings. This forum will have to suffice. There was no return of these conditions 27 days later; instead, some of the regular

Asiatics were finally starting to appear across the band. 73.

WADN, "Walden 1120" (Concord, Mass), is on with a format similar to that of an educational station. Music played is primarily acoustic folk (not unlike WCAS-740, circa mid-'70s). At night, PBS-style news/commentary programs prevail. News & special-feature programs from the CBC and BBC are included (so if you stumble across BBC World Service on 1120 around 2200 Eastern time, it's probably WADN rather than a Caribbean island station doing the relay). WADN's signal, as monitored from Billerica (10 miles NE)-and Belmont (10 miles SE) indicates about 1 kw of power: good days, but subject to slicing and dicing by WNEW-1130 slop on normal-skip (non-auroral) nights. I've yet to do a far-field (e.g., W. Yarmouth at 80-90 miles) check on this. I doubt that WADN packs sufficient punch to make it across the Atlantic, but one never knows. Otherness: to all of those who've written to me, replies will be out before long. I've been crunched with overtime work: this has resulted in a 3 (or more) month backlog in correspondence. Also, little DXing and project-building has been done. I apologize to those awaiting tapes, answers to DX questions, etc. Things have temporarily eased up a bit and I expect to be bombarding the post office before the next onslaught of overtime (not to mention Christmas-related activities) ties me in knots again. TA DXing, when attempted, has been lackluster. Big-gun Algerians, Spaniards, etc. (the southerly routes) are usually there, but northern paths (even BBC, Germans, Norway-1314) have been poor. Glad to see that George Hakiel managed to capitalize on the few good openings with his fine Russian receptions. Monday night (18 Sept) was "wicked" (Bostonian for "very") auroral with mucho Caribbean activity. (Wish I went to the Cape for this.) Cuba-830 was stronger than any US station beyond 30 miles. PJB-800's slop was croaking 50-mile-distant Providence on 790, and WGY-810 barely existed under LA QRM/PJB slop. Medium wave would be the primary emphasis with longwave and tropical bands DX as supplementary activities. 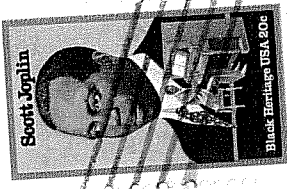
