 - 700 KSUR CA, Soledad 12/12 0147-0205 poor under XEGD, KFAM with class. music, KSUR-FM ID on the hour followed by what may have been a very short newscast. New. (TRH-CA)
+12/16 0957 in weak but clear, male saying "Here is the KSUR news," also weather for Monterey area. ID'd "KSUR-FM 99.5," into classical music on hour. (RT-CA)
+12/16 1600 noticed now giving dual legal IDs on both AM & FM, no separate ID on 700, i.e. "This is Monterey County's most powerful radio station, 50,000 watt KSUR-FM, Greenfield-Monterey at 99.5 and KSUR-AM, Soledad, at 700 kHz, the concert stations." (JH-CA)
 - 750 KXL OR, Portland 12/12 0205 up briefly with promo for Tom Bodett's "The End of the Road." Quite rare here, freq. usually belongs to KAMA, KOAL. Still need a reception report. (TRH-CA)
 - 780 WBBM IL, Chicago 12/13 0620 exceptionally good signal through KROW this morning with financial news & IDs. (TRH-CA)
 - 840 WHAS KY, Louisville 12/13 0625 armchair copy this morning (just like the good old days, hi). Occasional interference from presumed KWPN & an UNID Spanish station. (TRH-CA)
 - KIKN TX, Pharr 12/12 0500 faded up over WHAS with "all your True Country favorites are on KIKN AM stereo 840 Pharr Texas," into music. Good signal. (RT-CA)
 - 930 KRKY CO, Grandby 12/12 1446 good with Jingle Bells, ID. Daytime logging. New, #849. (CK-CO)
 - 960 KLAD OR, Klamath Falls 12/11 2055-2105 strong on top with C&W music, finally had SID at 2102 "9-60, KLAD," (no legal), then apparently went to night pattern (late too!) at 2105, totally disappeared revealing only KABL. New. (JH-CA)
 - 990 KIXA CA, Pittsburg this local has new calls, ex-KKIS, but why? // 92.1 KKIS-FM and lots of Kiss FM IDs, only heard a quick KKIS-FM Walnut Creek and KIXA 990 Pittsburg ID on hour (not an exact quote). (RT-CA)

 - 1040 WHO IA, Des Moines 12/11 2005-2010 mostly poor with weak signal and noise. On peaks heard WHO ID & weather, into talk show with a congressman as guest. Not heard here in ages! (JH-CA)

- 1110 (KFAB) NE, Omaha 12/11 0224-0233 off RS with OC. ID mentioned "routine maintenance," back to RS at 0233. (CK-CO)
- 1200 CKDA BC, Victoria MM 12/11 0315 poor at first, but better after WOAI s/off. MOR music, Entertainment Guide feature, local ads including one for a photo lab. Still haven't made a reception report since they moved to 1200. (TRH-CA)
- CHMG AB, St. Albert MM 12/11 0315-0400 poor, mixing badly with CKDA. Oldies, Canadian weather read by a woman, local ads & promos. Slogan sounded like "Classic Gold," SBN News on the hour. New. (TRH-CA)
- 1230 ?KWG? CA, Stockton 12/17 0230 faded in with recent & current AdCon songs by Joe Jackson, Cher, Surface, Jody Watley, and faded out. Mushy by 0246 when possible ad string came on. No ID heard, not even before someone played the SSE at 0257! Fair to very poor; EZL & OLD stations also heard on 1230 in the mess. (5P-HI)
- 1240 ?KSAC? CA, Sacramento 12/15 0400 suspect them with class. music, no ID anywhere near the top of the hour. Still need a report. (TRH-CA)
- (KSON) CA, San Diego Fr 12/15 0355 totally off. This station takes 1 or 2 SP's a year, always on a Friday morning. KSWA on top with CBS news and Unistar oldies. (TRH-CA)
- KALY NM, Albuquerque 12/15 0405 quite good with bilingual ID then back to Spanish music. (TRH-CA)
- 1300 KDOV OR, Phoenix 12/14 1940-1942 poor-fair with ad for local restaurant, barely heard ID in ad, then on top with ID "4,41 here at K-Dove." Into relig. music. Lost to KMPS. Last heard in 1/86 as KHUG. (JH-CA1)
- 1310 KDIA CA, Oakland 12/6 0642 male DJ talking with woman on phone, mentioned "on KDIA," then Christmas song by Raydio; into funk song, then faded out. Returned with end of Chaka Khan tune; Miracles' "Shop Around." First time heard on this side of the Ko'olau mountain range at home. Very poor. (5P-HI)
- 1380 (KLNI) HI, Pearl City 12/20 per phone call to Hawaii Public Radio GM Cliff Eblen, KLNI will be on in about two months. When HPR bought the station (to relay new FMer KIPO 89.3) the xmtr was turned on, and it blew up! A new XMTR is being shipped & they plan to be all-news after initial shakedown. (5P-HI)
- 1400 KVOP TX, Plainview 12/8 0318 good with ID "The Voice of the rolling plains, KVOP," into C&W music. New. (CK-CO)
- 1420 (KCCN) HI, Honolulu 12/5 0605 noted off this morning (and for mornings of 12/6 & 12/7). Station says engineers were installing equipment for its new simulcasting FM'er KCCN 100.3. Also off for three nights were KSSK-590, KGU-760, KIKI-830, KWAI-1080 & KNDI-1270; all six (presumably) are on two towers located a half-mile apart in the Papalama district of Honolulu. (5P-HI)
- 1460 (KULA) HI, Honolulu-Kailua 12/20 per call to PD of sister station KRTR 96.3, KULA is waiting still for approval from the FCC to start testing. It better be soon, already it's advertising a live broadcast simulcast from a Waikiki hotel on New Year's Eve in the paper! KULA plans on just simulcasting; KRTR already has several translators on all the islands. (5P-HI)

On Dec. 9, 1989, I logged my 2500th mediumwave radio station after 19 years of DXing! Station #2500 was, appropriately, WSBI-1210 in Static, Tennessee, heard at 0700 EST with s/on. A week earlier, I was able to log an almost-unbelievable five stations in a single day, setting up the big event. I hadn't heard five stations in a single day since 1980. Before sunrise on 12/2, I logged KBLK-1550 and KDKO-1510, and then heard WHJM and WSAF, both on 1180, signing on within a minute of each other. WOPA-1200 has been heard testing frequently, especially in the late afternoon hours, with a variety of music, but they still aren't "on the air". On 11/30, I thought they were on to stay, playing music for more than an hour, but they left the air shortly after 1800, leaving a strong WOAI. Interestingly (to me, at least) the temperature in San Antonio at that time was only four degrees warmer than here in Chicago. In other local news, WMNN-1570 changed back to WBEE, with big band and jazz mx, and Rockford Lightning CBA basketball on 11/29. I forgot to mention in my last Forum that I heard TIS station WNAV542 on 530 in Eveleth, Minn., during my recent trip up that way. The transmitter is at the Anchor Lake information center on Highway 53, with Iron Trail travel information. Speaking of TIS stations, you can set one up on your own if you want. Write to Information Station Specialists, P. O. Box 51, Zeeland, Michigan 49464 for information or call 616-772-2300. They had an ad in the program from the Experimental Aviation Association convention in Oshkosh last summer. Maybe you could set up a TIS station to handle parking or traffic at your next get-together. On CBK, I heard an address for the National Radio Guide for CBC programs, call 1-800-663-0354 in Vancouver for more information. 73.
