Tim Hall saved the day this week. Not too much DX these days here or other places it seems. Received a post card this week from Paul Ormandy-New Zealand. More New Zealand MW stations are leaving MW for FM. 1XA-1476 should now be on FM. Also 1XG-1251-Radio Rhema will be 24 hours. 2ZF has moved from 1539 to 1584. 4ZB-1044 and 4XO-1206 will also go to FM on July 1, 1990. 3XA-1260 will probably go about the same time. It wish a bunch of U.S. stations would do that! We can dream can't we? Anyway on with the column.

PAN-AMERICAN DX ROUNDUP

- 680 MEXICO, UNID 2/25 1315 XE station, possible "La F-0" mention, so may have been needed XEFO. (TRH-CA)
- 740 MEXICO, UNID 3/4 1150 XE anthem and GMT -6 TCs between huge KCBS TTs. Possibly new XEVAV Puerto Vallarta "Radio Vallarta", which we believe is our "Radio Bayapas" UNID from a few months ago on same antenna. SE wire is aimed at Puerto Vallarta. (TRH-CA2)
- MEXICO, UNID 3/4 1200 XE anthem. See above log. (TRH-CA2)
- 780 MEXICO, Autlan XELD 3/4 1159 XE anthem and s/on with "Radio Costa" slogan. Almost caught me off guard--they were a few minutes early this morning. Finally caught this one, XE #177. (TRH-CA2)
- MEXICO, UNID 2/25 1202 XE anthem very weak, man mentioned Jalisco. Almost certainly XELD, which Neil Kazaross has recently logged from the beverage site at LSS. (TRH-CA)
- 810 MEXICO, UNID 3/4 1105 XE anthem. (TRH-CA2)
- MEXICO, UNID 3/4 1202 XE anthem and s/on. Possible "Radio Alegria" slogan, this seems to be XERSV now signing on an hour earlier than before. (TRH-CA2)
- MEXICO, Rio Grande XEZC 3/4 1209 HUGE signal obliterating KGO with XE anthem and sign-on. Several IDs, also mentioned 1KW power. Slogan is now "Radio Felicidad" change your logs. New XE #178. (TRH-CA2)
- 820 MEXICO, Santa Barbara XESB 2/25 1241 now uses "Radio Sensacion" slogan. Only patriotic songs heard, so unsure of format. Note s/on is now earlier than listed 1300. (TRH-CA)
- 840 UNID, 3/4 0327 weak SS talk w/ u/KVEG on East wire. Noted again at 1030, 1130, 1230 rechecks. (TRH-CA2)
- 870 MEXICO, UNID 3/4 0932 man giving list of affiliates to some sort of "Radio Hacil" (or phonetically similar) AN network program. See XEDM-1580 log below. (TRH-CA2)
- 880 MEXICO, Los Mochis XEPNK 2/25 1305 XE anthem, male DJ mentioned 5KW and juvenut format (SS teen CHR), and slogans "Canal 88" and "La Joven", also "La Superestacion". (TRH-CA)
- 950 MEXICO, Tijuana XEKAM 2/25 0400. Was off the air most of this week before returning with new SS CHR format (some U.S. hits mixed in, all anmts in SS). New slogans are "Radio 95 de California" and "El 95 del Cuadrante de tu radio." (TRH-CA)
- MEXICO, Hermosillo XEPB 2/25 0418. Huge signal, now with "Radio Amor" slogan, romantic mx format and 10 KW. Anmths implied they may be co-owned with XEFA-950. ID "Con diez mil watts de potencia efectiva y alta fidelidad en AM, XEPB Radio Amor transmite desde el corazon del Estado de Sonora." Thx to Neil Kazaross for the phone tip about power/format change. (TRH-CA)
- 990 MEXICO, Cuauhtemoc XEER 3/4 "Radio Formula" now signs off around 0600. Noted OC afterwards tonight. (TRH-CA2)
- 1000 MEXICO, Cd. Juarez XEFV 3/4 "La Rancherita del Aire" now signs off around 0600. Change your logs. (TRH-CA2)
- 1080 tCUBA?, 3/4 0620-0900 Vy good at times on East wire with male and female ancrs, vy distinctive time check tones (the same two notes made by a cuckoo bird or a doorbeel) and it was repeated three times. Cuba would be most likely, CMCU logged here sometime back.
- 1120 MEXICO, Mexicali-XEMX 2/25 0447 faded up nicely at times (TRH-CA2) with live remote of a ballroom dance contest at "Salon Mexicali" WRTH-90 lists them as XEMIJ, but we seem to be hearing XEMX. (TRH-CA)
- 1140 MEXICO, Monterrey-XEMR 3/4 1000 poor but faded up on top of channel briefly for ID. New XE #176. (TRH-CA2) continued bottom of Front Page

I realize one of my suggestions - merge IRCA with NRC - was very unrealistic and I'm sorry I ever mentioned it. At that time, I was unaware of the changes that were about to take place in IRCA's publishing responsibilities. I would like to belatedly thank the Seattle publishing crew for their efforts over a long period. Likewise, I appreciate Ralph Sanserino and Don Erickson for their efforts. I think the bulletins look great, the print is dark and readable and the trivia has been greatly reduced in the interest of economy. I think the club membership and leadership needs to consider one of the changes I suggested - fewer but larger bulletins to reduce the workload and increase the reference value of the bulletins. What is the purpose of DX columns? To me, it's to use as a reference when I need to find what's new on the MW band, what others heard and when, to identify an elusive station or call change.
