MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: The FCC has yanked the license of WRPZ-1440, Paris KY, which has been off the air since late 1987. In its revocation, the FCC pointedly noted that stations off the air for more than 12-18 months could now expect to lose their licenses. If enforced, that could prevent many dozens of now-silent AM stations from ever returning.

Thanks Neil Kazaross for this tip. Was trying for XEYO, which supposedly came on the air late last year. New, XE #200! (TRH-CA2) (Good going on your 200th XE.PM)
- 580 MEXICO, Cd. Obregon-XEHO 9/1 1107 "Radio Centro" here now, ex 910, with uptempo Nortena mx, slogans, and call-letter IDs. New XE #198 (TRH-CA2)
+Also noted here ex-910 w/R. Centro and call ID w/KMJ at 1107 on 9/1. (KAZ-CA1)
- 650 MEXICO, Los Mochis XETNT 9/1 0758 ID, "Radio 65" slogan, 1KW mention. Incredible pest here and at home. (TRH-CA2)
- 680 MEXICO, UNID 9/1 0619 UNID on SE wire w/patriotic speeches about serving in the military. Unneeded XELG most likely. (TRH)
- 740 MEXICO, UNID 9/1 0644 UNID SS way under KCBS (TRH-CA2)
MEXICO, UNID 9/8 0216-0405 Definitely a new station here. Uptempo mx at times good u/KCBS, always fades for IDs (which are frequent). Calls are XEQN or XEQM?, no clue as to its location. Any help on this? (TRH-CA2)

+Also noted here ex 1010, announcing 5KW w/La Rancherita ID's. Very good o/phased local KFMB at 0756 9/1 s/off.(KAZ-CA1)
- 780 MEXICO, UNID 9/8 0220-0300 Fair at times u/KROW w/Inst mx and male ancr. Possible Autlan mention suggests Unneeded XELD.(TRH)
- 820 MEXICO, UNID 9/1 0930 Mariachi mx GMT-6 TCs. (TRH-CA2)

 +Also noted here on SE bev. 0530 GMT-6 TC at 0533 9/1 and Chihuahua ment at 0536. S/off at 0600. Poss. Cd. Cuauatemoc as format and s/off time fit info in CIRT book. XEDY off at the time. (KAZ-CA1)
 MEXICO, Cd. Morelos-XEDY 9/1 1203 Good w/sign on after XE anthem. Schedule for "Radio Gallo" is from is 1300-0500 Winter, 1200-0400 Summer. Format still ranchera. (TRH-CA2)
- 1100 UNID, 9/8 0243 Talk by man u/KFAX, mx seemed to be Mexican, not Colombian. (TRH-CA2)
- 1120 MEXICO, Mexicali XEMX 9/1-0656 fair with s/off anmts. Schedule is 1400-0800 Winter, 1300-0700 Summer (BC Norte observes DST along w/California). (TRH-CA2)

- 603 AUSTRALIA, Charleville-4CH 9/12 1440 UTC same program as 4QL, 4QR, 4QN. Vy poor slop de KSSK. (5P-HI)

- 711 AUSTRALIA, 4QW/7NT? 1330 9/4 Pop mx, fair signal //4920. Normally I'd guess 4QW and direct rather than delayed // points to this, but BP was hearing Tasmania on 585 and 864 this morning. (NHP-BC) (Both have been heard here, 7NT more often but that was several yrs ago. PM)

- 738 AUSTRALIA, Grafton-2NR 1322 9/4 "Band on the Run" fair in splat //747 (NHP-BC)
- 783 UNID, 1336 9/4 Poor w/pops which seemed //2285, but I was taping only 783. Then 2485 played "California Dreaming" but by this time 783 was too murky to pick out this song. There was another station there with pops which didn't seem to be NZ, whatever was there was real DX! 8AL will have to wait for that great future session when I will also finally log my tentative 8DR-657 from some years ago. (NHP-BC) (Keep trying it is out there. 8DR was caught here back in the early 80s.PM)

- 1080 t HAWAII, Honolulu-KWAI-1221 8/26. Man in accented EE mentioning Hawaii then woman mentioning "live on K-1 oh 8", then brief Hawaiian? talk by woman, fair but mostly u/KWJJ. Does KWAI use the K-108 slogan? (NHP-BC) (Yep, you got KWAI allright. Pops in here occasionally too.PM)
- 1224 t MARSHALL ISLANDS, Kwajalein-AFRS 1324 8/26. NBC nx mentioned by woman in American EE. Fair, but lots of static, and another signal underneath. (NHP-BC)
- 1440 JAPAN, Sapporo-JOWF, 9/6 1419, End of current Prince song, Ad string, ments of Sapporo, Hakodate, porr local QRM/QRN. This is new for me. (5P-HI)
- 1494 t MICRONESIA, Yap, Colonia-WSZA 1317 8/26. Almost oriental singing but stronger on 270 degree wire, which along with apparent island cx may point to this. Fair, but no ID. Still there at 1340 w/weird tribal mx, PNG not listed at this time, and there was nothing on the // freq. on 2410. (NHP-BC)
- 1575 AUSTRALIA, Woolongong-200 1252 9/4. Good signal w/rr mx and "2-double O" ID by man, so this hasn't moved yet. (NHP-BC)

Howdy folks, My workload is finally calming down a bit (although only for two weeks), and I'm using the time to finish up the new Mexican list. I've just received an excellent directory from La Camara de la Industria de Radio y Television in Mexico City. This directory contains (and in some cases corrects) most of the recent frequency moves we've been reporting, and offers clues on where some of the new clear channels came from (for example, XEXXX 840 is apparently ex-XEQJ and ex-1400, 1560). It's also helping me figure out which stations are probably silent. About three dozen CPs for new stations are listed as well. Speaking of XE stations, I noticed several typos in the Mexican listings in the 11 August DXM, DXWW-II. XEWR is 1110, not 1100; XEGD R. Novedades is ex-1400 not 1440' R. Geny is 760 not 750. XEIH "Nueva Dimension en Radio" is 770 not 760; XEMCM 1030 is Los Michis not Chihuahua (I'm now pretty sure the calls on this station are XEMPM, which would make it ex-1240 and ex-XEREY, XEIF; schedlue, network and address all match; XEHES 1040 is "La Poderosa" not "La Podera." Other notes: XETAR 870 is ex-880 (moved years ago but never made into WRTH); XEOBS 1070 "R. Mexicana" is ex-1370. Local news: Ratings-starved XETRA 690 has boosted its sports-talk emphasis and has even added ARN's "Sports Final. which already airs in this market on KCEO 1000. XEKAM 950 remains silent (5 months now), as does WNAG556 530 (just over a month). KNEC996 530 has changed calls to WNSB415; tape loop remains unchanged. Wasn't July 1st the day the FCC's new slop standards were to go into affect? If so, you can't tell it from my locals. KCBA 1170, KPRZ 1210, KSON 1240 and even KPOP 1360 are putting out the widest, sloppiest signals I've ever heard from them. And of course, KLLQ 600 still murders the stations 20 kHz on other side of them, even at a distance of 25 miles! I've noticed cleaner signals from some of the out-of-town stations, but that doesn't help much when just about everyone is NSP. That's about it for now. Hope the DX improves. Look for a new Mexican List coming to a goodie factory near you. 73 de TRH.

I plan to check the receiver for leaky capacitors, weak tubes, realign it, etc., try DX'ing with the legendary HQ-180A and add it to my communication receiver collection. Unfortunately my partial repro of a 180 manual doesn't include the module. Could someone loan me A MANUAL OR AT LEAST A SCHEMATIC SO I can repro it? Also, I would like to talk with someone about HQ-180s in general. I remember there was someone at the swap meet who had plenty of interesting comments. Unfortunately, he continually told everybody what a super deal the receiver was while I attempted to bargain with the seller. (Don't you just hate that, Jim?-RTH.) I ignored him until I made the purchase. My second question involves a VHF/UHF receiver. I've used home brew converters and cheapo scanners without much success. Although I really should prepare a more formal paper about my findings, I hope this forum will suffice and maybe lead to more experimentation by other members. I have been operating very low power transmitters at the top and bottom of the broadcast band. I have discovered some amazing things in the process. I constructed a couple of what QST would call "penny-whistles" -- milliwatt transmitters that I have operated at 1625 kHz and 530 kHz. What I have learned about antennas and propagation has become increasingly interesting. The bottom of the band, at 530 kHz, should be called "ater radio". There seems to be a local area that my signals will cover fairly well, within a few blocks. I will then lose the signal completely. I drive to a local reservoir and as I approach the signals come up from nowhere and if I park on a bridge across any body of water the copy is solid within about a 20 mile radius! Water seems to be the way that ground-wave gets released. As for antennas, I have tried many different ideas. Anyone who tells you that a 100 foot piece of wire, horizon-

tally strung or sloped, is not directional on our band is sorely mistaken. I have found that these antennae are extremely directional, almost like a multi-tower array. I have one wire strung in my backyard to a tree almost due south of it. Using it to transmit, my signals are extraordinarily directional to the opposite direction, north. Reception is equally directional. Using that wire, and a loading coil, I have logged half a dozen Canadian stations with a simple crystal radio. I cannot stress what a difference tuning an antenna with a loading coil can make at these frequencies. I cannot do without one! When I switch to my vertical, an old ham radio antenna that I salvaged from a junk bin at work, about 30 feet high, maybe 40 feet total radiating length, the pattern is nearly omni-directional and much more efficient. It will not put a signal into the north as well as the wire though. Putting a top hat on such an antenna seems to make a slight difference, but not remarkable. Attempts at center loading the vertical didn't prove fruitful. Bottom loading seems to work better. I am also suspicious about power lines. Although not terribly scientific in approach, it seems that the large telco, cable TV, and power cables that hang from utility poles create a trap for medium wave signals. I live in a residential area near the Hudson River. These cables create a tangled spider's web around my village. The moment I get outside the cables the entire band's field strength comes up dramatically. Even better, if I get in the clear, and near water, the results are awesome. I am ever so jealous of George Hakiel's QTH. As I have mentioned before, my vertical antenna seems to be a good defense against noise. Most man-made noise, unless it is in very close proximity, is radiated by power lines that are horizontal. My vertical seems to null them quite well. Its angle of radiation seems to be nice and low too. With a very short whip and loading coil I am getting reception as good as a 300 foot loop of wire strung around my property horizontally in a circle, with a much lower noise floor. My daytime range seems to be at least 200 miles for almost any station, regardless of power, that is somewhat "in the clear", without co-channel interference. 50 kw clears are receivable up to and sometimes surpassing 1000 miles during daytime conditions. I use a very common Realistic DX-160 fitted with two crystal filters and a coupling loop antenna connection to the built-in ferrite loop instead of the supplied connections. Just think what I could achieve with a R-390! I would appreciate hearing from other IRCans who have experimented in this realm. I realize that these findings support very basic theory of propagation, but to see them displayed in a practical situation is fascinating, and fuel for more experimentation. 73 KZ

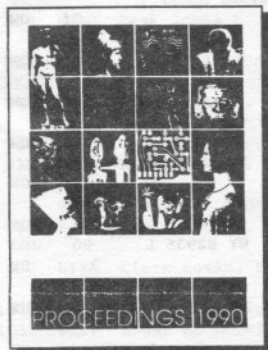
