- 1190 CFSL SK, Weyburn 10/28 1848 fair in CKDA splat with talk by man, C&W music into BN news on the hour. (EH-WA)
- 1210 KEBR CA, Rocklin 10/6 2030 "You're listening to KEBR, Rocklin, California," then deep fade, not to return today. (GK-OR)

Greetings! DX has begun to pick up nicely after a summer in the doldrums. For example, both scheduled tests to date have been heard, and with so many tantalizing programs upcoming, it should be a great DX season. WLUX-1550 made it through severe interference from WRHC/Coral Gables and another SS (probably a Cuban) with tones, code ID's and one faint voice ID. WFAW-940 made it through on the strength of several code ID's only during the first half of the test. Other DX of late worth mentioning is an excellent copy taken on CHIN-1540 on the morning of 10/15 with French programming except that the announcer did occasionally break into English. Probably the best catch so far was WHCU-870 snared just before their 1930 power/pattern change in the null of WWL with a nice strong signal. WHCU aired a promo mentioning being "Newsradio" and "News 24-hours a day", however, they were playing music when I was listening! The only verie received here since spring was from WADX-1420 Trenton, GA; a nice v/l for a 10/89 report. This verie was a result of a recent sojourn into the north GA mountains when I visited the station. The operations manager, a young woman, was quite surprised when she listened to my tape, and said she had never even thought there was such an endeavor as "DXing". I came away empty-handed, however, as she was unsure and wanted to check with the GM before issuing a letter. It came, a week later, for a year-old reception report! Well, it looks like Atlanta is about to be subjected to yet another wasted AM frequency: yes, the 830 spot licensed to Smyrna is about to become ANOTHER religious station! Just what a metropolitan area that already has about 15 such outlets needs more of/ I only hope there will be some kind of shake-out of these stations in the near future, as most of them are borderline operations anyway. Looking forward to a great DX season, and hope to be checking in here often...73's for now.

The BCB-DX season is finally underway. This year, I'll celebrate 20 years in the hobby! I also expect that this will be my last "active" season of mediumwave DXing, meaning that I probably won't send reception reports, make up target lists, update logs, and get up real early in the morning after this year, hi. But you never know. I'll always be interested in radio, but the mediumwave band has changed so much it's difficult to devote a lot of time to DXing when there are so many other interests to pursue. The news on the AM band isn't all bad, though. The clear channel breakup has produced some interesting catches. The best of these was WKZN-870 in Gorham, Maine, which was heard several days in a row at sunrise in late September. I've only heard one other Maine, and that was almost nine years ago! During a driving vacation to the Outer Banks of North Carolina a few months ago, I heard a half-dozen radio stations on the East Coast broadcast the audio portion of local television news broadcasts. Is this a trend nationwide? I don't recall any stations here in the Middle West doing that. In October, I took another trip to San Francisco and spent a few days in the wilds of Nevada exploring the backroads and some of the ghost towns. During the day, the band was almost completely dead in such places as the Big Smokey Valley in Central Nevada with weak signals from KBOI-670, KFAM-700 and KDWN-720 heard on the rental car radio. At night, most frequencies were very live since there are few locals in Nevada. Nothing east of Nebraska was heard, however. In the early 1980s, I heard many of the Eastern and Mid-western clears while in Las Vegas, but I think this would be much more difficult today. 73.

The article says part of the reason AM radio is having problems is because of younger audiences who prefer FM stereo, but there's also pressure from national chains, who buy little local radio time. The Department of Transportation utilizes Highway Advisory Radio to inform the public of unusual traffic conditions. In the San Ysidro area hazardous conditions can occur involving pedestrian traffic on the roadway. The Highway Advisory Radio broadcasts a message to the motoring public informing them to use extra caution.

The Department of Transportation operates 15 permanent and 11 mobile Highway Advisory Radios throughout the State. They can be an effective tool when used for traffic management. The information we broadcast pertains to many different traffic conditions including land slides, fires, chemical spills, chain requirements, construction activities, traffic delays, and alternate routes. These Highway Advisory Radios operate on 530 KHZ and 1610 KHZ on the AM dial.

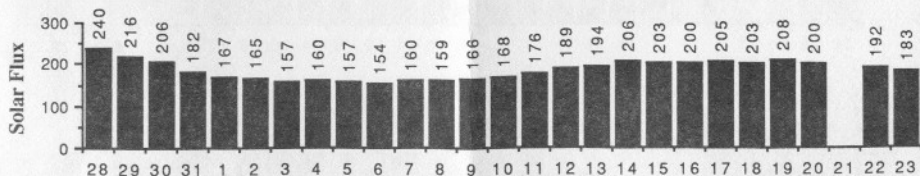
Geomagnetic Indices

The Geomagnetic Field plot is of the largest value if it is given as a range (e.g. quiet to active = active).

I missed the broadcast on 9/21. There was a minor storm on 8/30, and no major storms. A major flare occurred on 9/17. There were no Satellite Proton Events or Polar Cap Absorptions. Looks like the low time for solar flux has moved from day 19 to day 10. Not sure what that means but it is probably going to mess up my 12 month average a bit. Day 10 for the remainder of the year is 10/3, 10/30, 11/26 and 12/23. pb
