





Reports from members living east of the Mississippi River Deadlines: Saturdays

Mike Hardester, P. O. Box 8159, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina 28542 Greetings! This will be a short Forum report. Because of the situation in the Middle East, I'll be working extended hours for an indefinite period, including Saturdays. Consequently, DXing has come to a halt, and corresoindence will also come to a (virtual) halt. With (maybe) 1 day a week to accomplish personal matters, it may take a "bit" of time for me to respond to letters. Hope y'all have a good Very 73 and Best of DX de Mike! DX season!

Gary Siegel, 2728 - 106th Street, Toledo, Ohio 43611 Hello all. Hope everyone by now is taking full advantage of the great conditions on the dial. I would have to say these are the best 3-4 weeks since Dec.'87 when the TA's were coming in. One of my best catches which I featured in the Roundup has to be KRWB-1410 MN that was in alone at excellent levels for about 25 mins on $11/15 \ 1\frac{1}{2}-2$ hrs after local sunrise. Before they surfaced WLSH in PA had the channel, so how quickly things can change, next day it was WIZM in WI's turn to take 1410. These post sunrise donut-like receptions can be exciting ... this time of the year it would be wise to keep open ears to this kind of propagation, especially on regionals that otherwise may be crowded. The post sunrise period clears the dial selectively as the nighttime terminator moves west. I had unns. KBRF-1250 & KWYR-1260 on 11/15 & 11/16 respectively as examples. Both showed in the 0830-0900 time period. One other item of interest here is the dual channel operation of WNZK MI soon to take place methinkgs. They were operating on 680 days from 10/22 to 11/16 but may still do more daytime operating here to get the pattern set for their soon-to-be nighttime operation there. When they do go on 680 nights it will be adios to a good channel. WNZK on 680 was every bit as strong as on 690. Considering all, they could in my opinion have 680 full-time and not really hurt anybody, nearest 680's are CFTR Ont & WCAW WV. I've seen some talk about WKZN-870 Maine as a prime target try from that state but I'm here to suggest that WSKW-1160 might be an even better possibility. I've had these guys a few times in the early PM hours after local sunset giving WJJD all they could handle when conditions have favored the NE. Check for this guy when the FF Canadians are showing in large numbers. Of course I'm still going to try for WKZN-870 hi, but so far only WHCU has shown in both the AM/PM SRS SSS skip periods. Karl Zuk, your All News 930 you had back in Sept. was DEFINITELY WZNN Rochester, NH, they smeared semi-local WEOL for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ weeks in mid-Sept.--must have been on day pattern to crush WEOL in such a fashion. Also had much wanted WJAC-850 PA doing same to WRMR/KOA back then w/ oldies & even Sun. nite classical music pgm. Sorry couldn't make the IRCA/MT confab in Oct. but had to cancel Vac. to cover shifts for ill dispatcher at Sylv. City PD, no choice in this. Maybe next year, hope all had a good time, would have liked to caught Knoxville. AM total is now 2993...3000 looming close! Hope all had nice Thanksgiving. 73s. The Role of Program Content in the Strength of the AM DX Hobby

The program content of AM radio (versus FM and TV) has much to do with its slide in popularity with the general public. Because one element of DXing is enjoyment of program material, one can justifiably expect that programming which the general public has decided is less competitive with other electromagnetic media would be less attractive to DXers as well. Admittedly, DX enthusiasm isn't what it used to be in many guarters. AM programming, domestic or foreign, isn't as much fun to listen to. Satellite-delivered programs - more often talk than music - dominate the dial, reducing regional variety and the aspect of radio as a window to local cultural "quirks": styles of speech, music, and humor reflecting the work, play, politics, religion, and foods of a given region. The Top 40 jocks that made AM great in the '60s have long since gone to FM. Some good local music and talk programs show up on Caribbean stations at times, but generally the "fun factor" of AM listening has diminished. With less-engaging program fare, it's not entirely surprising that AM DXing's stature has diminished as well. AM DXers are more likely to enter the hobby nowadays as an adjunct to SWLing or scanning; formerly, AM DXers came in directly from the program-listening population at large. This population represented a larger and more culturally diverse pool of potential DX talent from which to draw. The large body of DXers who, back around 1963 and before, enjoyed the program content as much as racking up impressive totals, is largely gone- either to other interests or to the Great Receiver in the Sky. Today's DXer is more "clinical" about the hobby - probably more astute about circuitry / antennae / propagation, most likely using equipment and accessories far superior to the early-'60s norm, and possibly using superior DX strategies and better time-usage to maximize loggings. But the QRM's worse than 30 years ago and the programming is more boring. The Monday morning silent periods are gone and so is the backwoods station doing live hillbilly music from some local yokel's barn. Interference-free nationwide clear channels are a fleeting memory. QSL's don't flow as freely as they once did because fewer radio professionals understand the hobby. AM DXing in 1990 is getting to be more of a numbers game, a relentless hunt with less emotional gratification: not unlike logging longwave beacons that have "zip" for programming content. I still have hope for a renaissance of AM programming that will give newfound enjoyment to DXer and casual listener alike. New formats and "narrowcasting" concepts are constantly surfacing, most are then discarded as quickly as they arose. AM's low fidelity and its noise-susceptibility problems don't help. Maybe someone will come up with the "Right Thing" for AM, or then again, the band may become as much of a relic as the vinyl LP record in this age of CD's. If the latter happens, the AM DX hobby will likely diminish to a small group of hard-core zealots who are apt to be considered eccentric (some would say "nerdy") by unsympathetic outsiders. Programming, after all, does drive interest in the hobby, and for our sakes, it had better improve.
