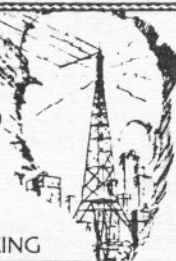

## ANARC UPDATE

Richard Eckman, 9 Still Harbor Ct., Hampton, VA 23669

Much has happened recently with regard to the future of ANARC. The results of the ballot held in late October/early November were reported by interim coordinator Sheldon Harvey early last month. The bottom line is that a substantial majority of club representatives would like to see ANARC continue as a viable entity. The vote was less clear with respect to whether Sheldon should assume the post of executive secretary. As you may recall, the ANARC constitution requires that the exec. secretary may not be an officer of a member club. Sheldon is, of course, president of CIDX. My response to the situation, as communicated to Sheldon, is that the constitution should be followed in this situation. The ANARC executive council must decide whether to initiate a process to amend the constitution to allow Sheldon to assume this office. An alternative is that David Synder, currently ANARC Computer Information Committee chairman, has expressed interest in the post. I don't know of David's previous work for the organization so I am not in a position to judge his qualifications for the executive secretary office.

Among other matters brought up by Sheldon were:

1. The 1991 Leningrad Hamvention: Sheldon is leading a group of US radio enthusiasts to this meeting in August. A package tour is being offered by a Canadian organization which Sheldon is affiliated with. I am reluctant to ask IRCA to publish the meeting invitation as I don't think that we should necessarily be sponsoring an event with an organization that we really don't know much about. 2. ANARC meeting: Sheldon has scheduled a meeting of ANARC during the Winter SWL Festival in Kulpville, PA from March 22-24. I will not be attending this meeting and if there are any club members that intend on going, please let me know. We would like to have a representative at this meeting as some important ANARC issues are to be discussed there.

I R A N S - A I L A N T I C D X (Eckman-VA) unless noted

- 693 ENGLAND, Droitwich 2125 1/6 : Fr w/m in EE.
- 756 GERMANY, Braunschweig 0426-0524 : Xlnt w/GG 'loompah'-style mx. Outstanding signal strength, probably part of the same 'pipeline' as the 1062kHz reception. Weaker by 0446 but still in beyond 0524, 1/13/91.
- 882 ENGLAND, Washford 2124 1/6 : V Gd w/light mx. Nx in EE at 2200 at fr level.
- 1062 DENMARK, Kalundborg 0403-0521 1/13 : Xlnt signal w/f in Danish w/nx (a ment of Kuwait) fol/by vocal mx 0405. Incredible signal strength totally destroying KYW-1060. Must have been a pipeline effect to this area of Europe this morning. Much weaker by 0440. (Good logging, Rich. ed)
- 1107 EGYPT/unID, Batra 0241 1/2 : Fr w/AA mx o/another stn. Also same stn's 0122-0340 1/13 : Fr/gd w/AA mx, potent slow SAH indicating second stn, pos w/SS audio.
- 1134 YUGOSLAVIA, Zagreb 0234-0425 1/13 : Gd w/rock mx, light vocal mx. Much better around 0400+ but no positive ID.
- 1179 SWEDEN, Soelvesborg 2049 1/6 : Pr carrier. Better at 2138 w/f ancr appeared to be //6065kHz.
- 1332 tITALY, Rome 2157 1/6 : Man in unID lang at fr level. (I've had same here in outstanding cx but too much sideband activity to pull audio, even w/phased xtals on SP600. ed)
- 1375 ST. PIERRE, 1930 1/1 : Weak carrier noted, later at 2108 quite gd w/mx. Earliest fade in ever noted on this one. Also 2104 1/6 outstanding signal w/ sporting event (prob. soccer) by man in FF. Carrier on 1377, likely France, fr w/mx at 2111.
- 1386 U.S.S.R., Kaliningrad 0237-0400 1/13 : Gd w/TT 0255, apparent s/on 0300 w/ man in RR. Xlnt 0359 w/Moscow IS.
- 1521 SUADI ARABIA, Duba 0236 1/13 : Gd w/AA chants. Also 0247 1/2 xlnt w/OC. AA mx 0256, prob s/on per WRTH. Also xlnt 2046-2142 1/6 w/AA chants/mx.
- 1530 VATICAN, 2130-2145 1/6 : Fr u/semi-local from NC, IS then man in unID lang, mx interlude. Noted IS repeated twice 2145 still under domestics.
- 1539 GERMANY, Mainflingen 0238 1/2 : Fr w/opera mx but no positive ID. Noted signal on 1593 at same time, likely from WDR.
- 1566 TUNISIA, Sfax 2114 1/6 : Xlnt signal w/AA mx.
- 1611 VATICAN, Vatican City 0623 1/11 : Using ECSS(USB) on ICOM, pr w/man in unID lang w/rigs sermon of sorts. (Hall-PA)

- 525 unID, 0530 1/3 : Z-L-S noted; not in any of my ref's- new Bahamian.
- 530 COSTA RICA, Cartago 0522 1/3 : R. Rumbo at pr/fr level w/SS ballads.
- 570 tMEXICO, Monterrey XEJB 1145 1/2 : Probably the one w/Mexican mx, New Year's greetings, but no local ID's. Started strong, faded badly by 1200. (Stewart)
- 792v CUBA, Radio Progreso still here nightly hetting 790. Signs off w/NA at 0600. (This is very interesting, Gerry. Is there still a Reloj in operation here or did it turn over to Progreso. And an apology to Bill Townshend in re. his

- recent (last issue?) report of Cuban mx on this freq. -- Bill, I would now suppose your logging is a valid Cuban after all. ed)
- 840 unID, 0507 1/7 : SS stn in domestic jumble; horse race fanfares-yeh, I know, not much to go on...may not be worth running! (Stewart-MO) (No, it is worth running (the tip, that is) as I don't know of mayn LA's that I've heard w/a horse race. Perhaps a Mexican or the ubiquitous Cuban? ed)
- 850 JAMAICA, Savanna-la-Mar 0540 1/3 : R. One at fr level w/female psychologist counselling callers. (Thomas-FL) all unless noted
- 885 unID, 0335 12/27/90 : Poor carrier, no audio. Montserrat? (Gerry, a possibility, I presume, w/an OC after their nightly sign-off of the old-days, that is to say, as a regular operation before they were blown off the air by Hurricane Hugo; they used to go off nightly at 0200. Perhaps they have rebuilt whatever was damaged (the tower is most likely) and changed the effectiveness (of perhaps the ground system), or are just on a reduced power? All this is speculative and I'd be interested if anyone can provide solid details. ed)
- 1060 tMEXICO, Mexico City XEEP 0532 1/7 : Possibly the one w/SS talk, folk-style Mexican badlads (not the "slick" XE pop one usually hears); mixing w/KYW & WNOE; fr/pr w/horrible XEG-1050 slop. XE Nat'l Anthem at 0601 but too much XEG slop to hear if they IDed before or after NA. (Stewart-MO) (As DXer's luck goes, Randy, I can attest to the fact that for the hundred or so stations I've tuned into while DXing that have been signing off with a NA, NONE of them ever had the decency to throw in just ONE more ID after the NA. ed)
- 1255 unID, 1103 1/4 : SS male shouting unintelligible ID, then LA mx. (A Honduran Gerry? I've certainly missed your tips in the column, especially when I've been able to hear some rare LA split-frequencies. I hope, as well as others I'm sure, that you will be able to report more regularly if possible. ed)
- 1360 unID, 0400+ nightly : FF here nightly this time, sometimes at gd level. Either Haiti or WKAT, Miami; suspect latter.
- 1565 tDOMINICAN REPUBLIC, Santo Domingo 1000 1/4 : R. Amanecer presumed the one w/weak SS here.
- 1610 unID, Anguilla paused betw rlg's pgm's long enough for me to finally get some info on the unID under. This is the "Causeway Information Radio System", a TIS tape loop w/traffic info. No call sign or QTH but suspect the Courtney Campbell Causeway linking Tampa and Clearwater down in Central FL. This at 0454 1/4.
- 1620 unID, 0500 1/4 : "S-B-T" marker here - any ideas? (No, but interesting. ed)
- 1630 \*\*CUBA, After several weeks of trying, finally got a decent ID in on this guy. This is R. Surco per readable 0500 1/8 ID and s/off w/NA. Mostly soft LA mx, occ Air Supply-like EE tunes; ray gun sounds at ID. ID on 1/8 seemed to say frequency was "1160 kHz" and on the air Mon-thru-Fri (of course there's no R. Surco listed for 1160 kHz). Signal varies from nil to almost fair. (I'm glad to see some evidence of a Cuban on this frequency. ed)
- 1660 unID, Don't know who this is. V weak SS audible here on quiet nights but can't raise enough audio for ID. Audible only on SE mini-Beverage. Will keep trying.

Had a good trip with Gary Parton, going first to Palmdale area, stopping by KUTY 1470 and getting stickers and a map of Antelope Valley. Was going to show him the transmitter out on 70th St. E. but we were limited on time. Drove east on Hwy. 138 into Victorville, mostly listening to KJQI 540 on car radio. (Speaking of "voting," I hope all of you sent in your nominations to Albert Lobel.) I also look forward to the upcoming loop/preamp article. WRTH for \$14.95? DX Radio Supply's \$15.95 pre-publication price was the best I'd seen. WRTH-91's Cuban MW listings are confusing - vast differences between the listings under "Cuba" and what's in the "Central America" section in the back. But of course, keeping station lists truly "current" is an impossible task. I've been disappointed occasionally by out-of-date references in certain IRCA & NRC reprints, though luckily most of the articles deal with propagation and other theoretical aspects of MW and are "evergreen." These articles constitute a unique reference tool about the hobby and the science of MW DX'ing, with ideas, techniques, etc. ignored and/or misunderstood by the typically SW-and-scanner-oriented press. (I was pleased to see Karl Zuk's article on Pat Martin & foreign MW DX in Monitoring Times - but why was IRCA never mentioned?) But some construction articles mention part numbers etc. that are no longer valid; some station listings are outdated too, including (especially?) the ones in the New Member Packet - at least the one I received when I joined in 1989. I realize various articles are regularly updated, but what do we do about the rest? This is something for both IRCA and NRC members to ponder. By the way, the IRCA Reprint List indicates that NRC members can order at the IRCA member price - can anyone tell me if NRC reciprocates? (This has now ended both ways-BH.) One more tidbit before I shut up: in reviewing my DXM's for the 1990 calendar year, I counted contributions from 83 members (and even some non-members), thus contradicting the oft-held assertion that "the same few DX'ers' tips appear issue after issue." The one carrying "Best of King" on 1560 to 0200 when it signs off turns out to be WPAD-KY. WFXA-1550-GA was logged on just an AM-FM ID at an oddball time one morning before the start of the Bush-Hussein War, and it got me a verie. Since the war started, the CBC EE network stations are running AN with mostly music, but news frequently. CBT-540 and CBN-640 are included, for those still seeking Newfoundland.
