MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: SMN's "Heart & Soul" black oldies format has been retooled. It's now called "The Touch" and is more of a black AC, not specifically oldies oriented. Some affiliates may still refer to themselves as "Heart & Soul" on the air, though..."The Breeze," a new age satellite format syndicated by Progressive Music Network of Minneapolis, seems to have officially died. The network was on and off the air several times in January and by the middle of the month were "temporarily" distributing by tape while trying to find a new satellite uplink. PMN owners have now moved on to a new company, and most of The Breeze's 25 or so affiliates have moved on to new formats...

The FCC has issued a stern warning about technical standards and an upcoming wave of inspections of AM stations. An FCC field office sent a memo to GMs of AM stations that cited a recent survey of stations that found the following areas were particularly deficient:

Directional parameters	Out of tolerance at time of inspection 42%
Monitoring points	Grossly exceeded licensed values 38%
Operating power	Over or under licensed power 18%
Public inspection file	Entire file or portions missing 15%

Some stations could not even FIND their monitoring points - it had been so long since they'd been checked that in the interim houses, offices or parking lots had been built on top of them without the station knowing!



But Ralph really outdid himself with Vol. 28 #20 (the 9 February 1991 issue): it arrived at my address on WEDNESDAY, 6 February - three days BEFORE the publication date!! Anyway, the bulletin's looking very good. . . and by the way, I too noticed that some early 1991 issues still said "1990" on the masthead - it didn't seem important enough to comment on. (SURE, you did, hi!) (Gee, let's give this topic a rest, maybe?-EH.) The QSL reproductions are lots of fun -Pat Martin's Vietnam verie still blows me away. I have a few good ones I've been meaning to photocopy and send to Ralph. . .maybe I'll get around to it. Got back to the dials for the first time in a couple of weeks the evening of 19 February, and found extraordinary conditions toward Central America and the Caribbean. . .heard Belize 830 for the first time (I had them QSL'ed on their old 834 split years ago); ZDK 1100 was in like a ton of bricks, and I even had a tentative on Honduras 650! Details in Jim Hall's DXWW column. Haven't had an LA-DX night like this in over a year. Subtle change of subject: at a local flea market I found a whole stack of 1936-38 issues of "Stand By," the WLS listeners' magazine. This was WLS in its "National Barn Dance" days when they catered to the rural farm audience. . . the corny "HOWDY-FOLKS!" tone of most of the magazine is a bit hard to take. But I ended up buying one issue, 23 February 1937, because the WLS "personality" on the cover is Herb Morrison. Who? Well, his radio credits included stints at WIND 560 Gary, IN; WTMJ 620; KQV 1390 Pittsburgh; and 250kw English-language XER 735 (now XERF 1570) prior to his work at WLS. Rick Evans, Apt. 19, 5104 North Lovers Lane, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53225 It's the usual pre-anniversary issue blahs in reporting (I assume WDXF will be down as well), but I didn't want two weeks going out without EDXF in it. I was home for two days this week with a touch of the flu, so I did a little DX. On Wed. 2/20, I picked off two Wisc. stations I had never heard before, plus WPGC-1580 MD for a new state from Milw., number 30. On Saturday, 2/23, I got tired of listening to the war news on WOKY-920 and started tuning up the dial. hearing WAUR-930. Then it dawned on me that, with news-not music-on 920, it might be a good time to try 910 again. Result was WDOR-910 in Sturgeon Bay, Wisc. (Door County is what that area is called in Wisc. and known as) for my first catch here on 910. That just leaves 1260, 1280, and 1300 as empty pages in my logbook and I'm still trying with them, but with Milw. NSPers on 1250 and 1290, it's rough. I was talking with a local DXer this past week on the phone and mentioned to him that it's a little rough getting psyched up for DXing when this is my 5th DX location and much of what I heard has already been heard elsewhere. What I've done is run a separate log for each location but created a continuing log which counts each station heard only once but shows when it was first heard at each location. Some of the fun then comes from trying to fill in the blanks. Across five locations in 30 years I've heard 1577 different stations. Of those 1577, only 47 stations have been heard in all five locations, with just 3 more which have been heard in the other four spots but not in Milwaukee. These are WTIC-1080 CT, KSL-1160 UT, and WIP-610 PA. Needless to say, all are on my target list. 1080 is ruled at night by KRLD-TX, 610 gets essentially blocked by local 620, and I've never really tried for KSL. For interest's sake, the 47 stations heard in five locations (Kalamazoo, Mich., Gary, Ind, Philadelphia, Penn., Wisconsin Rapids, Wisc. and Milwaukee) are from 19 states and 2 Canadian provinces, with only 4 being on regional channels--the balance were all clears. 8 are from Ohio and 7 from Ill. The only Wisc. station is WOKY-920 which is the 10 station my clock radio is set for, hi! Six reports on hand for the anniversary issue. 73.






FIGURE 4: IMPEDANCE - TRANSFORMERS CARD (TA2) ASSEMBLY
