A TRIP TO YOSEMITE

The week of April 26-30, I spent 4 days in Yosemite National Park, located 150 miles east of my home QTH of San Jose. The unique topography of the park proved interesting in its effect on radio signals. The Yosemite Valley is surrounded by 2000-3000' high cliffs on all sides except for the opening to the west. Nighttime DX proved very interesting, as most stations to the east of me seemed to be much weaker than normally heard in San Jose, again due to the topography of the valley. The receiver I used was my good old handy GE Superradio. At night, there was some minor interference from the lights surrounding our cabin which was located in Curry Village (if anyone knows where that is!). The following daytime bandscan was made the afternoon of April 29, at about 2 PM. Signal strength was subjectively judged, based on my prior experience with such things. The results of the bandscan were very interesting. ally no stations to the east were present, but the valley topography acted almost like a parabolic dish, 'sucking' in the stations to the north, west and south. I was pleasantly surprised to hear my local KNTA-1430, and especially to hear KTOB-1490 Petaluma, but I was surprised not to hear KNEW-910 Oakland. KTHO-590 South Lake Tahoe, a regular here in San Jose, was nowhere to be found in Yosemite. The mixes of stations heard also proved to be interesting, especially 1590 with KLIV and KXEM. The only Sacramento signal not present was KSAC-1240. KTNS-1090 Oakhurst did not put out a good signal at all, as I well know, and noone heard their DX test, though I don't think it was ever on! Neither the listed Yosemite TIS stations on 530 or 1610 were noted anywhere while in the park, day or night, so they may both be silent.

Hello again, everyone. DX? What's that? My wife decided to move my desk, computer, receivers, etc. out of the living room, and unfortunately there are no antennas at this end of the house. Some of you may recall that I had a pair of large loops built into the walls, but that was in a room that was since needed for a bedroom. I've been using about 20 feet of wire for an antenna, but it picks up a lot of noise, so nothing much has been heard. Perhaps I need a Great Little Loop or something similar. I spent a hectic several days in Las Vegas at the NAB convention -- even more so this year because I wasn't just a tire-kicker but I had \$90,000 to spend on a transmitter site project. I missed the hassle with President Reagan because I had an engineering meeting to attend and couldn't hang around -- I has inadvertently been sitting at a table reserved for the NAB Board, only 20 feet from the head table and the podium, so I would have literally had a front-row seat. On the flight over, Delta's information card specifically said that radios may not be operated while on board aircraft; that radios may radiate signals which interfere with communications equipment and navigation aids. Strangely, it said that computers can be used on aircraft, and everybody knows what noise generators those are. Note that a receiver's local oscillator generates a REAL SIGNAL and if it is on the desired frequency, there is nothing that can be done to eliminate it. See FR 91.19 for the complete text of the federal regulations. The Los Angeles chapter of the Society of Broadcast Engineers is supporting George Yazell's "Noise-Free Radio" (narrow-band FM on medium-wave), so it may be possible that one or more L.A. area stations will be transmitting an NfR signal is the near future. Also, the Sprague/Allegro noise eliminator chip employed in the Denon AMAX radio seems to be very effective -- I would like to see if Drake or somebody would put it in a communications-grade receiver. Or am I just dreaming, hi? 73, y'alls.

"SOS: Save Our Station That was the message a group of people were marching to on Monday, Feb. 17 in from of KMPC-710 owner Gene Autry's house to protest the station's impending change from nostalgia to all-sports (local and ESPN). The group held placards that read, "No sweat, all music," and "Where will we hear Natalie Cole, Frank Sinatra, Harry Connick, Jr.?" However, after several decades of playing musical standards from the '30's, '40's, and '50's, the format officially ended at 4:55 pm PDT on Friday, April 24, 1992. For the final two days, the station had assembled past and present personalities ("DJ's") for a special farewell salute. Some of those included Gary Owens, Wink Martindale, Johnny Magnus, and (Honorary Hollywood Mayor) Johnny Grant. KMPC's FM station, KLIT-101.9 ("K-Lite"), took out ads in the newspapers which read, "Trade Base Hits for Music Hits. KMPC has changed its tune to All Sports. Which is great news if you love sports. But if you're more into Streisand, Diamond and Midler, try K-LITE 101.9. Southern California's Softest Station." A columnist for my local newspaper, the Daily Breeze, wrote, "Well, KMPC may be about to commit radio suicide by dropping its successful nostalgia programming ... The musical portion of KMPC's broadcast day earned solid 3.0 ratings (ironically, it was the current sports programming that didn't do as well) -- higher than almost all Los Angeles AM stations, and even most FM stations. Sure the format attracts older demographics, but remember -- with kids grown up and the house paid off -- they're the one with the money." He also had the following interesting comment: "Where will all the current KMPC personalities go? Robert W. Morgan will stay, but if Programmer Chuck Southcott has his way, the others will follow him to another local radio station that picks him up and the format. Nothing definite yet, but I'll keep you informed." ... And so will II 73 de SMM.

Well, it's the end of April and all the snow is gone and we hope it stays that way. It seems to be quite a long winter but it was a good DX season here in Winnipeg and at Valhalla Beach. New countries such as Belize, Jamaica and New Zealand made the DX most pleasurable even at -20 C. I have at last finished my latest project - a four foot box loop. It tunes from 510-1700 Khz and has quite deep nulls. In fact in the first few days of use I managed three new stations including long sought after Belize on 830. Nulling WCCO is no mean feat up here. I can also use all frequencies even the adjacent channels next to out locals. CKCK and WTMJ are becoming pests on 620 when only a month ago they were DX. By using the S meter on my IRC-70 I can create a null that will register between 20 and 40 Db. I'm not sure if that is great or not but is does the trick for me. By the way this loop is an enlarged version of my three-foot Don Moman designed loop. It is passive in nature and therefore used no amplification. Also the thing I really like is the fact that the loop, stand, and rotating /tilting device combined has only five screws and two bolts. This simple but very effective design I feel contributes a large amount to why the loop works so well. With almost no metal involved the loop maintains an excellent pattern and that translates into more signal to the radio. If it works well I may have to consider a five foot version but that will mean a major re-do of the radio room so it will fit. As for now I intend to use the four foot version to its max. Next is a PLAM board for the ICR-70. This will be a big boost to my DX. Any members with a R-70 or R-71 who want to boost their rig's performance the PLAM board is the way to go. I used one at Valhalla beach on Larry Shewchuck's R-70 and was amazed at the way it worked. Further reports on the PLAM (Phased Locked AM) in the future after I give it a go. 73 Shawn

[4/29] Definition of a DXer: Someone who can see an Oregon license plate "NSP 190" as I do each day when I take my son to school, and think, "Gee, I think KEX-1190 is no longer NSP." Today I saw a license plate "CLX" and thought of Colfax-1450. When a DXer hears of earthquakes in California, he thinks of stations staying on late with emergency broadcasts. We didn't plan to try for any Palm Springs stations after the April 22 quake there. But for the April 25-26 quakes in Humboldt County, I decided to give it a shot. Several stations from that area are regulars here. such as KRED-1480 and KATA-1340. I was up about 2 a.m. on Sunday morning. As it happened, a strong aftershock hit about 75 minutes before I tuned in. Nothing on 1480 but KYOS Merced. 1340 devoid of KATA. I thought Fortuna on 1090, in the heart of the affected area, might be on with emergency info, but they were reportedly without power. No sign of KINS-980, which is often strong on day mode (5kw nondirectional) till they switch to their night 500w-DA. By 2:10 I had settled on telephone talk from KGO-810 San Francisco. They had many callers from Humboldt County, and a few said none of their local stations had been on the air. One complained that they couldn't get San Francisco is the daytime, so KGO's coverage was a "godsend" at night. KGO even had "traffic reports" about Humboldt County roads affected by the guake, along with Bay Area reports. At 3:05, a KGO reporter was live on the scene at the big fire that burned down the mall at Scotia. I stayed with KGO for most of 1-1/2 hours. KGO is certainly not DX here - my mom listens to them almost nightly, as do other Grays Harborites - but their coverage was fascinating. KGO was invaluable during San Francisco's big 1989 quake, and they have proved their value as a Class I station

serving their vast skywave coverage area at night. And the Humboldt County stations could learn that an emergency generator, plus a commitment to strong local coverage, might be a worthwhile investment. 73 and good DX.

Very entertaining interviews with former KMPC announcers and other staffers; played tapes of humorous moments including Gary Owens going into uncontrollable laughter while reading a live spot for Preparation H. New all-sports format began at 2000. Slogan is "Sportsradio 710, the Only Game in Town*. XEKAM-950 in Tijuana has been billing themselves as "consumer business radio for all of Southern California". Seems to hire people no one else wants: Ex-PD of local KTMS (fired when station found out he'd hidden the fact he'd done jail time for bad checks) and ex-military technology reporter/consultant for KNX (fired when station found out some of the educational accomplishments listed on his resume were lies) are two examples. Most shows are either so bizarre or so amateurish no one else will run them. Runs no local spots, just spots appearing on occasional network feeds. Maybe they finally ran out of money. See Steve Mittman's WDXF of 3-8-92 for a description of earlier 1992 troubles for this station.

Took AJ in tow and visited the Louisville Free Public Library stations - WFPK-91.9/ WFPL-89.3. Run very well and nice facilities but still threatened with budget axe. Took some pix, which I sent to Pppular Communications. Heard the Salvation Army's 15 minute "Wonderful Words of Life" (WWOL) program and wrote asking for a station list. They sent a copy of the Spring '92 WWOL newsletter containing a rather long AM/FM/SW radio log which has been forwarded to Bill Hardy. Spanish version of WWOL "Maravillosas Palabras de Vida", will be available in near future for release to Spanish language broadcasters in the U.S. Jeff Leonard, Program Director of WZ107/WWKY-790 gave me a tour 4/21 of the stations on Fourth Ave. in Louisville. That is the old WAKY facilities and a mere shadow of the former operation. The front studio is now FM, going full blast, but the AM taking talk off the satellites with a guy plugging in local stuff now and then. Another Another studio producing commercials and a one-man news desk. One stand-by and the rest used for storage. Rather small staff now. WAKY (AM only) employed 30-35 people in its heyday. EZ/WKY probably a good example of the lean and mean radio stations of today. Glad I saw it and took Also took pix of the WTMT-620 building on Broadway. some pix.

WCEG-1530 (Middleborough, MA) is now on the air. It uses the slogan "Cool 1530 Stereo". Format is oldies during the day with a block of news at 1700 drivetime. Signal here is mediocre at best (approximately 60 miles away) - carrier level is about the same as

that of WPEP-1570 and about 10 db weaker than WSAR-1480 from the same general area. That would place WCEG's power at 1 kW or less. Bad slop from extremely-strong local WSSH-1510 makes WCEG unsuitable for entertainment listening here. I'm not sure about night operation as skip - usually WDJZ (CT), so metimes WCKY (OH) / Vatican - starts rolling in up to an hour pefore sunset. WKBR-1250 (Manchester, NH) has gone off the air once again; I'm not sure how long this will be the case. During the day, WARE (MA) cominates 1250 o/ WMTR (NJ). WNNW-1110 (Salem, NM) has been noted at increased strength. This incicates that their directional array - meant to throw a null to the south - is out of whack. They easily override Providence most days; it used to be an even mix here. To other subjects -- I'd like to obtain Radio Shack and Lafayette annual catalogues and interim sales flyers from the 1960 to 1966 period. In those days, both stores featured a full array of ham rigs and communications receivers. Also, I'm interested in Boston/Providence/Worcester/NYC Top 40 radio show tapes from that period. For those of you with IBM-compatible personal computers, I'd like to exchange DX-related software, text files (e.g., DX articles), and data bases (e.g., station lists, loggings, DXer name / address lists, music lists). Jean, Bruce, and Tom are now phasing-unit equipped; also, Jean has a DX-440/ MWT-2/RTL-lA set-up for after-work coastal TA DXpeditioning of the type I used to do in the late '70s / early '80s when I worked near the Boston waterfront. DXING WITH A WINNING GAMEPLAN By Leonard Hyde

This series of articles will detail several ways that a DXer can improve his (or her) DXing methods, and increase the odds of hearing an elusive station in that yet unheard state.

After reading RC Watt's recent Forum, I started to dash off this information to him in a letter, but then realized that many others in the club could benefit from my experience. Don't get me wrong — I am far from being an expert on Beverage antennas — in fact, this year was the first time I had used one. Yet, I have had such a happy experience using a somewhat unorthodox approach, I feel I should share it.

My approach to the Beverage was dictated by a number of factors. At Ballard, I had to get the antenna in before the next morning because it was stretched across a neighbor's hay field, including his access road. Up in the woods, where I now go "Beveraging," I cannot have a permanent installation for obvious reasons.

I had an old roll of electric fence wire, about 800' feet long. One evening, I decided to try just laying it out on the ground to the southwest. I grounded it at the far end with a long screwdriver, pushed down into the moist soil. A real professional installation, right?

 \bar{I} was absolutely astounded at the antenna's performance. My radio dial was covered with stations from Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, and later that night, Mexico. On another evening, with the antenna more to the south, Cuba was dominant, and I logged South American stations for the first time.

I have had similar good DXing up in the woods with the antenna to the SSE, and the NNE. I recently bought a new roll of wire, so as to have the full 1725' length. I have only tried it once to date, and cx were very mediocre that night. Yet, I logged several 250 watt daytime only stations in Northern Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania, and later that night, the band was full of TA hets.

Therefore, don't let the lack of a place for a permanent Beverage installation, or your age, or time constraints, cheat you out of Beverage DXing. Using my modified approach, anyone can probaly try it. You haven't LIVED until you've DXed on a Beverage - I can say that with gusto!

First of all, you need the wire. The wire I use is sold locally at a True Value hardware for \$10.39 for a 1/4 mile roll. It is marked as .042 gauge electric fence wire (STRONGER than 17 gauge, it claims.) The wire comes on a plastic spool, with a metal payout bail.

You are going to need another spool, about twice the size of the original, because there is no way you are going to get all that wire back on the original spool. I was fortunate to find an old metal spool that once held half a mile of fence wire. When wound up, my 1/4 mile fills it nicely.

Adapt the windup spool as shown in the diagram. It will make winding up the wire much easier.

You will need a place to lay out the wire. A campsite is good, provided you have enough space in the desired direction. The wire can be laid out through the trees — it will be slightly harder to reel in. A field or pasture is great. If you take the wire up as soon as you are finished, even the notorious "Beverage Eaters" will probably not bother it. Of course, if you have ample time both to lay out and pick up the wire, or do not have to take it up for a while, it may be affixed to trees or fence posts using inexpensive plastic electric fence insulators every 75 feet or so. Just replace the nails provided with bugle head screws, and you can easily install and remove the insulators from whatever you have them installed on. (This wire will stretch considerably if left hanging for very long without supports every 10 feet or so — a 100 foot run that I had up in the air was dragging the ground in the middle after a month.)

Be aware that raising the wire up off the ground will make it susceptible to lightning. Take the appropriate precautions.


Use standard Beverage coupling techniques to hook up to the radio. I simply bring the "hot" end right to the radio, eliminating the need for a leadin. This wire DOES NOT solder, so any connections you make will have to be by alligator clips or screw terminals.

When taking up the wire, NEVER reel it in while walking along it's length. Before you have gone 200 feet, you will have a hopeless tangle. The wire is quite stiff, and tends to spiral as you reel it. Therefore, stand in one place, and reel the wire in like a fishing line. This way, the kinks will work themselves out as you reel. (Don't forget to unhook it at the terminated end first, hi.)

For the first several hundred feet, you probably will not be strong enough to reel the wire in this way. (I'm not!) I simply walk backward about 10 to 15' feet, holding the reel tightly so as to pull the wire, and then reel in the slack that was just pulled up. After a while, the wire will have less resistance to pulling, and you can reel it in normally.

This technique especially lends itself to camping trips and beach expeditions. Of course, a copper wire Beverage installed 20' above ground in the clear, and properly terminated with a good electrical ground will work better. Yet, this system will FAR outperform any loop antenna. It can make Beverage DXing possible for nearly anyone, with a minimum of outlay and effort. I urge anyone who has not experienced Beverage DXing yet to try it.
