

FREQUENCY CHECK LIST (Proposal 16.1.17). I withheld a recommendation on the Frequency Check List editor. The column continues with a narrow margin of two "yes," one "no," and four abstentions! Ralph wondered if the list, which appeared only once in the past two years, should be dropped. It's obvious that there are not nearly as many frequency checks today as 20 years ago when the list ran as much as 12 pages. Our options include continuing the list, finding a new editor who can take a more active role in writing to monitoring companies, dropping it as an official column but printing any f/c info we find, or dropping the list altogether. What do you members think?

SAMPLE BULLETINS (Proposal 16.1.27). While promoting IRCA, I noticed that IRCA charged \$1 for a sample bulletin, but NRC only asks for a first-class stamp (29¢). Ralph and I agree that IRCA can easily afford to send samples for a 29¢ stamp. That should make sample bulletins more attractive to prospective members.

1994 CONVENTION. We are awaiting the bid of southern California for the 1994 IRCA convention, dates to be announced. Bid deadline is Nov. 30. If the bid arrives on time it will be sent to the Board in December. We should have full details around Christmas time.

The next Board action will be convention site approval. Watch for the next President's Report after Jan. 1st. 73 and good DX. --Bill.

DX here this week continues to be somewhat on the slow side. I did log a few Chinese stations, including the same on Bruce Portzer logged a few weeks ago. Not too many Chinese stations have been logged in recent years, so any logged are good ones. Hi. Also received a QSL this week from one that has been out for about 3 years!! I was quite surprised when I went to the mailbox a few days ago and opened up a QSL letter from Radio Superior-Machala, Ecuador! I guess most will answer if you bug them enough.hi. Also the TA CX seem to be continuing for John Bryant. So we will start off with that.

TRANS-ATLANTIC DX ROUNDUP

John writes "I experienced another European opening on the UTC morning on 3 November. Like all previous European openings here (Stillwater,OK) signals on most stations peaked in the 20 minutes prior to dawn at the presumed transmitter site. The exceptions to this were the Spanish Synchros on 855//585//774 and 1134, presumed Yougoslavia. These showed long prior to the dawn, especially 855 and 1134. The presumed Yugoslavian stayed for about 30 minutes past dawn in Zadar, as well. The Spanish stations faded out exactly at the right time."

- 765 <u>Carrier</u> noted here at 0500, peaks at 0520, gone at 0530. A perfect pattern for the Russian at Petropavolsk! Looped North. too, 11/3.
- 765 O.R.T. SENEGAL-Strongcarrier on at 0557, Interval signal at 0558 S/N announcement at 0559, Time pips and talk by male in FF at 0600 Low modulation on 11/3. (Bryant-OK)
- 855 <u>SPAIN</u>, RNE 1-synchros //585 and probable //774. Audio in SS from 0500 on 855, appears later on 585 and 774...All fade just before 0630. Signals poor but language recognizable on 11/3. (Bryant-OK)
- 1134 t <u>YUGOSLAVIA</u>, (presumed)-Zadar-first noted at 0420 as het. Strongest at 0500 with traces of audio. Gone at 0535-perfect pattern for Zadar. on 11/3. (Bryant-OK)
- 1215 <u>Carrier</u>, here peaked at 0500 (Tirana dawn) then gone until reappeared at 0533, which would be perfect for dawn in Estonia, on 11/3 (Bryant-OK)
- 1544 t LA VOZ DE SAHARA (presumed)-carrier here very strong from first noted 0648, until fade out at 0700. Strength and final fade closely matched Senegal, but not a trace of audio 11/3 (Bryant-OK)

John Bryant also logged some Pan American stuff, and I'll include that with the others. A great report John (PM).






