A new TIS station has gone on the air in New York City, and is being heard widely throughout the eastern part of the United States. WNZE 748 is owned and operated by The Roosevelt Island Operating Corporation, on Roosevelt Island, located in the East River directly adjacent to the 59th Street Bridge. The island lies between the east side of Manhattan and the Borough of Queens. The station operates on 1620 kHz with six watts using a 42 foot tower and a very efficient ground system mounted in the moist earth along a riverbank in the middle of the island. Verification letters can be addressed to Mr. Barry Chasetz, Roosevelt Island Operating Corporation, 591 Main Street, Roosevelt Island, New York 10044. Mr. Chasetz welcomes all QSL requests; and explained that the station's purpose is twofold: To provide information advisories for visitors to the island; and to inform residents about public transportation problems and in the event of emergencies. Roosevelt Island can be accessed by an unusual tram gondola that lifts riders from the island to the Manhattan side of the 59th Street Bridge providing picturesque visits to all. - Karl Zuk

Corrections and additions to previous columns: My 770 unID last week (2-26 DXM) has not been ID'ed as of yet, and note that the ID from QRMIing WWCN-N. Ft. Meyers, FL was "WWCN 7-70", of course, and not 7-30 as the typo says. In the prior column, re. my unID on 880, the TC's were one hour ahead, not behind as I inadvertently typed. It is not a Mexican, and further monitoring of 880 (with the automated tape system) has produced much the same as in the original report: successive SS salsa-like MoR exitos (hits) w/male DJ that occ talks over mx, occ female ancr, many TC's and "Ocho Ochenta" ID's, is NOT the Cuban Progreso which has been heard mixing numerous times. In fact, I now doubt the Puerto Rican and suspect one of the newer Venezuelans, although the last time a YV was reported here it was the dominant R. Mundial. Can anyone ID this? By the way, the Cuban Radio Progreso net has had a music program called "Ritmo!" for many years now which has been heard often lately. Plentiful rumba-style vocals and "Ritmo!" shouts (complete with heavily rolled 'r') by host, frequently a deep-voiced SS male, distinguish the program. This can help identify these cubanos, but be careful not to mistake the 'ritmo' mentions for another stations' slogans (i.e. a Panamanian R. Ritmo). 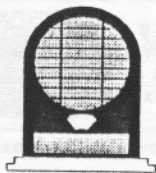

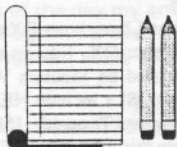

Address on card is P.O. Box 200, Grand Turk, Turks & Caicos Islands, B.W.I. Didn't hear any of the Up-All-Night DX tests of 2/20, but did catch the taped relay of 2AP, Samoa via Radio Korea at 0643. Got a report mailed out, in the afternoon. Letter from Jerry Baker, Engineer at Caribbean Radio Lighthouse-1165 on Antigua, says station is operated by Baptist International Missions, Inc. of Chattanooga, TN. Further, "We use a CCA 10,000D (10kw) transmitter and a 320 (907.5 m) shunt-fed, omni-directional antenna, located remotely from the studio site and linked by an FM transmitter." Nice picture postcard of the station enclosed. Began 9/7/75. Was pleased to get a QSL letter from CKX-1150 for their IRCA DX test last December. Excellent performance out of a Sony portable. Steve Gabrielse of Voice of Life Radio-740, Dominica, wrote that he had spent two years in the US Army at Fort Knox and attended the University of Louisville a couple evenings weekly, while there. Small world! 73 from Col. DX.

All February I kept telling myself I would send in a Forum report for the Anniversary issue- and what happened? The deadline date came and went, and I am two days late in getting this written. I go back to 1932 in this great hobby, with my first-ever verification coming from WFIW-940, Hopkinsville, KY. My second? WEXL-1310 Royal Oak, MI, then a 50

watter which was considered a pest by Eastern DXers as they had a sked of 0800-0400! In the thirties, what we now call an ANER was then called a "channel hog!" I can recall one early Sunday morning when there were only three stations audible on the entire band! And two of them were on the same frequency! WEDC-1210, later 1240, became an AN, but they were very kind to DXers, as time after time they would sign off to allow a 1210/1240 DX program to have clear air! By 0100, virtually every EST station had left the air for the night, allowing CSTs to come sailing in, and they'd be gone at 0100 CST. After 0200, it was a cinch to hear Pacific coast stations on the East Coast, because the directional antenna had not yet been invented, and most frequencies were wide open! And, Pacific DXers had a clear shot at EST sign-ons, when a few EST stations came on at 0600. In New York, the earliest to sign on were old WEAJ-660, and WOR-710, and they came on at 0645. WABC-860 (now 880-WCBS) and WJZ-760 didn't come on till 0730! But on 1350 (now 1380) two semi-local stations to Brooklyn, where I lived until 1975 came on at 0600: WAWZ-1350 in Zarephath, NJ (now an FM station) and WEHC, Emory, VA, which usually was the louder. WEHC was hardly a semi-local, but they could be heard every morning, topping WAWZ. The four Brooklyn stations on 1400 (now 1430) eventually merged into one station, after having many an argument among themselves as to what hours each could be on. But this didn't solve the problem completely, as I am told the four owners of the merged station continued to battle one another till it was sold to the Newark Evening News. In those days I DXed with a seven tube Stewart-Warner house radio, and eventually built up to another seven tuber, a Crosley, but more powerful than the Stewart-Warner. Then I was able to buy a great 23 tube EH Scott receiver when I got my first job, and what a receiver that was! Without a crystal, it could separate out the Luxembourg station, then on 1441, from the 1440 stations! It brought in two 50-watt graveyarders on the West Coast among other goodies. Those were the good ol' days - but, DXing is still exciting to this old goat! Forward - March!

WFLP airs ECHL Erie PANTHERS games while KTCK carries Texas A&M and "Sports Byline USA." Per the *Dallas Morning News*, the KTCK program director's wife chose the new call letters over KOOK—good choice, since they would then be airing old Billings MUSTANGS games, hi...Speaking of "Sports Byline," some stations can be ID'd by the sports shows they carry and their phone numbers. Ron Barr's show uses (800) 878-PLAY, while Business Radio Network's American Sports Radio Network answers (800) MYR-ADIO, and the renamed One-On-One Sports Entertainment Network has (800) 777-2907...The NBA Radio Network is back, earlier than expected. Usually the league-run network, distributed by Dick Brescia Associates (they also handle "When Radio Was") begins its season with the All-Star Game. This year, however, it premiered in January. Announcers are Joe McConnell and Bob Lanier, with Glenn Ordway and Tom Hannemann by the benches... CBS Hispanic Radio Network promoted *futbol americano* and *beisbol* in a big way last year. Besides weekly play-by-play for both sports, Spanish network stations during baseball season carried "Meet the All-Stars" before the All-Star Game, and "Meet the Teams" before World Series Games One, Three and Six. Announcers were Jaime Jarrin, Gustavo Lopez-Moreno, Billy Berroa and Edgar Perrea. Berroa also did CBS's "Latin Legends of Baseball." For football, CBS had "The Road to The Super Bowl" with Armando Quintero and Rene Giraldo in December. All this was available on the ASCI satellite, transponder 18, downlink (listen-in) frequency 41.950 mHz.

## Transportation

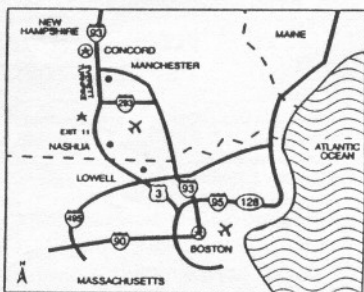
