

Well, it looks as though another season is upon us. I sure hope that I have more time to DX this year than I did last year. The low sunspot numbers and the expanded BC band should provide some very good opportunities for excellent DX, On my way to work this morning, I was surprised to hear local WCOA-1370 recommending in its editorial that its listeners "tune to other AM stations, especially at night." The editorial writer, Don Priest, then went on to suggest some clear channel stations and some of the stronger LA stations audible here in Pensacola...really a nice plug for BCB DXing! I managed to get my hands on a Watkins-Johnson HF-1000 and expect to try it out on the BCB in the coming weeks; look for a review soon. I also have one of the new computer-based "Softwave" radios on order for an evaluation. My intention is to write a "Receiver Showdown--Round 2" comparing the HF-1000, Softwave, R-8, NRD-535D, and R-390A. I should have it done in a month or two. Speaking of equipment, I'm sorry but I've had to raise the price of the Quantum Loop by \$10 to \$155 (\$145 plus shipping for IRCA/NRC members). Right now I'm still waiting for cabinets that I ordered in July to arrive so I'm way behind in filling orders...please be patient. Finally, since writing the first "Receiver Showdown", I've had the opportunity to try the radios with loop antennas. All work well with the exception of the NRD-535D. Positioning of the loop well behind the radio is necessary because its digital display radiates RF in the MW range and severely interferes with reception. Oh year, a word of advice: Think twice before inventing something of commercial value—the legal stuff is driving me nuts! That's about it from here. 73's...GT.
