A great turnout this week with reports from Shawn Axelrod, Larry Godwin, Harry Helms, Gary Jackson, and Nick Hall-Patch. Thanks guys for the support. With the strong solar storm on October 3rd, TP conditions died off a lot, but are slowly coming back. Most of the Northern TPs (Korea, Russia, etc) were gone, leaving some more Southerly TPs like Chinese and Filipinos. The last couple mornings 15th and 16th, Northern CX seem to be back on the rebound. Received a lice letter from Olle Alm-Sweden. He mentions of no knowledge of a Siberian Russian on 873 Khz, so it must be new. He has logged Vietnam on 1122.5 Khz of late, so maybe that is possible from the West Coast. He goes on to mention that the WRTH people are in Russia now getting info for the 95 WRTH. With DX from all three areas this week, let start with the reports.

TRANS-ATLANTIC DX ROUNDUP

- 1314 tNORWAY, Kvitsoy-First noted this season 9/20 0410 w/good het traces of man talking vy 0429. Het appeared each night until 9/25 when it showed as early as 0237 w/big het and poor signals mx and talk, mostly buried in splash. Only a het on 9/26 then not hrd again until 10/2 when it was mostly a het in spite of another of other hets (1602,1584,1422,1251, 1107, 1017,855,846,774,675,639, and 531) and audio traces on 1611 Khz. (NHP-BC)
- 1611 UNID, First noted as a het at 0330 9/25, when 1314 was the only other carrier. Then noted with man talking at weak signal 0324 10/2, language not IDed. Strangely, this was the most readable station during this TA opening, perhaps due to relative lack of splatter on the channel. Anyone other that the Vatican here? (NHP-BC) (Not than I know of. I have hrd that The Vatican has boosted power to 100KW of late.PM)

- 800 MEXICO, Cd. Juarez-XEROK "Radio Canon" with NA and ID at 1200 10/7. Station is AN but like most (if not all)XES plays NA around 0600 LT. (LG-MT)
- 820 MEXICO, Guadalajara with vocal NA, and clear ID as "XEBA La consentida" at 1201 10/10. Ment. 24 hrs. (LG-MT)
- 830 MEXICO, Zacatecas-XELK 10/1 0210-fair YL in SS talk,mentions of var. Mexican cities,then XELK ID o/u WCCO-New. (SA-MB)
- 870 MEXICO, UNID-weak but on top at 0259 10/11, with reasonably clear 5-letter ID that sounded like "XETFR or XETSR. Don't believe it was listed XETAR. Help! (LG-MT)

- 1130 tMEXICO, Nogales, Son. XEHN believed to be the one atop CKWX at 0243-0300 10/8. On the hour, gave 2 clear IDs as "Radio Fiesta" then s/off anmt with vocal NA. WRTH 94 lists XEHN with this slogan and gives s/off time as 0300 during DST. Also this station was reported in DXM w/s/off at 0258 on 8/14/87. Only problem is that the new IRCA Mexican log says "Radio Fiesta" is XECHG, so I'm confued. Anyone clarify? (LG-MT)

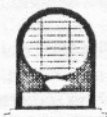

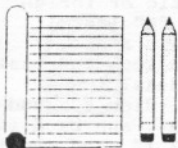

It's been entirely too long since I've contributed to my favorite section of The Monitor! We had a great summer, taking two vacations, the first of which took us again to Frederiksted, in the U.S. Virgin Islands, on St. Croix. The local Frederiksted station, WRRR-1290, presents a real challenge to anyone in continental US or Canada, as they have NEVER been heard there! They are NSP, and are on the Los Angeles Dodgers' Baseball Network, and also carry (ugh!) Rush Limbaugh. Other than these, they have catchy Island-style music. Even in a severe Aurora it is doubtful they'd make it to the States, for there are a couple Latin American stations that would likely kill any chance. I never tried night DXing there - there's just too many SSeS on every frequency! Our other vacation was to Marshalls Creek, PA, in the Pocono Mountains. I couldn't tune around the AM band there - just too many motors, fluorescent lights, gadgets, etc. to allow anything but local stations through. I did determine, however, that WPMR-960, Mt. Pocono, is silent. And on the way to the NRC Convention in Merrimack, NH, I learned another 960 station is also silent: WFGL, Fitchburg. We had a great time there, despite two false alarm fire sirens in the hotel during sleeping time. Fifty three attended. The next meeting I'll be able to attend is the annual blast at Ray and Arlene Arruda's "Lower Deck" in Acushnet, MA, on the Thursday before Thanksgiving Day, beginning at 12 noon. All DXers are invited. Well, my Hammarlund HQ-180 was creaking and groaning, and begging for an operation, so I took it with me to the NRC Convention, and turned it over to Dave Schmidt who has fixed it and by the time this hits print, it'll be back here in operation. I've been trying to DX with my GE Superadio 1, but it is terribly difficult to figure out what frequency you're on, either on AM or FM. I did so want to hear that mysterious DX Test from KA2XAU, but nary a peep on the Superadio. What a tremendous job J.P> Stephens has done, getting us off to a flying start on the new DX season! But how can one try for a Test at 0100, and then another on the same morning at 0500? You gotta choose one or the other. Our WOMR has received official permission to go to 92.1 with 6,000 watts. We have till 18 months from now to make the switch, and to raise about \$50,000 for the new 6kw transmitter. It'll be a tough fight, but - Forward - March!

314-839-9751 prepaid only. The DX season got underway with the reception of KA2XAU-1620 Richland, PA with code IDs, and voice IDs were done by male and female announcers! The signal was better on the Realistic DX-400 and homebrew antenna than on the Realistic DX-200 and Worcester Space Magnet 2. KA2XAU's signal was fir to poor, but clear (no one else is on 1620 now, but wait until the expanded band allocations are calculated, hi!) I taped part of the test, a report has been sent. Over the summer, KJSL-630 (ex-KXOK) took to the airwaves with a Christian Talk format in AM stereo (the fifth AM station to go stereo in the St. Louis market). The format is being promoted as "Talk Radio Hell Hates", and the slogan is "The Salt and Light of St. Louis". Their only competition is KSIV-1320, which has a similar format promoted as "Christian Information Radio". The only other Christian-formatted station in St. Louis broadcasting in stereo besides KJSL is an FMer, WCBW-104.9. Some of the programming on KJSL so far has taken a far right-wing emphasis,

some of the talkers, for example, have cut down the Roman Catholic Church (by contrast, KXEN-1010's Bible teachers cut down the Catholics all the time!) Most of it, however, takes less of a right-wing approach, its overall programming makes Rush Limbaugh look like a 90-pound weakling! KTVI channel 2 (which will be St. Louis' new Fox TV affiliate beginning in September of 1995) has expanded its list of stations simulcasting its 1700 CLT newscast. With WIBV-1260 as its flagship, the newscasts are simulcast on KYRO-1280, KSLQ-1250/104.5, KTUI-FM 100.9 and WSMI-FM 106.1. KSDK channel 5 simulcasts its 0530, 1700 and 1800 CLT newscasts, along with NBC-TV's "Today" and "Nightly News" on KSD-550 only. Locally, the Chicago Bears football games have gone to WINU-880, leaving KFNS-590 carrying just the Kansas City Chiefs. Speaking of WINU, Silvia the Little German Girl is back, returning "Silvia's International Show", a program of ethnic music, to the airwaves. Her show was last heard on WIBV-1260. KSTL-690 is carrying more of a variety format now, not just religious and Spanish programming. I've heard them with Urban Gospel and talk programs. My broadcasting days are beginning to wind to a close here, as I do "The Alternative Time Machine", a program of Modern Rock classics from the 1970s, '80s and early '90s, on KCFV-89.5 Fridays 2000-2400 CLT. After my eight-semester limit is met (in the summer of 1995), I will very likely hang my microphone up for good, due to lack of interest by commercial programmers. It all falls back to the lack of vision commercial broadcasters have for this medium, like I described in my last Forum. As for clubs, I have dropped membership in NRC, due to lack of funds. My NRC and ARRL memberships were due for renewal the same month, I didn't have the funds for both, so I chose ARRL over NRC because of ARRL's service to the Amateur Radio community. I believe that IRCA does a better job serving the DXer (especially here in Mid-America) than NRC. 73 and good DX from NOUIH.

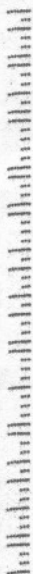
