The city index (listed by state, then city) includes frequency, call and day/night power. 

The next AM in the list was #12 rated Sunny 1320, KCTC with a 3.2/3.9 Summer/Spring; Talk 650 KSTE was #15 with 1.7/1.6 although Tom Leykis quadrupled their 18+ female audience; KGO-810 was #16 with 1.6/1.4; KNBR-680 was tied with a local Spanish language FM, La Zeta 92.1 at 18th place with 1.0/1.4 and in 20th position was Hot Talk 11-40 KHTK with 0.9/0.5. KSTE and KHTK are chipping away at KFBK's audience, however, and so they dropped one hour of afternoon news, 3-4 pm, are replaced it by lengthening the 1-3 pm talk show hosted by local financial whiz Tom Sullivan. An article about the new TIS on 790 in Pittsburg appeared in the Contra Costa Times last Sunday. To paraphrase, "WPEI, 790 on the AM dial" was established by the cities of Antioch and Pittsburg and the Dow Chemical Co. as "East County emergency radio".
