

It's been several months since my last Forum. A good part of the
time was spent on overseas travel (England, Scotland, Ireland, 17 days in all) plus a four day trip to WA for the IRCA convention in the Aberdeen-Hoquiam area on Grays Harbor. I was the only Easterner (in fact the only one from the Atlantic side of the Rockies) to make the convention. I passed up NRC's convention because of the closeness timewise of the two conventions and of the closeness distancewise of last year's and this year's NRC convention venues. If the DX tests are back, this must be fall as summer is outta here. After a hot mid-June thru late July time frame spanning seven weeks, August has been pleasant. Maybe I should have hit the road in July, hi. The DX tests have come with a vengeance. I bagged the KA2XAU-1620 local-like (the station is 40 miles east of Harrisburg, PA and probably was 50 kw power. The only other test I got with acceptable signal was WBZY-1200 in western PA. The number of NSP pests has increased by an order of magnitude during the last ten years. Time for s/off. CUN28 or whenever. 73's and great DX.

Eric Bueneman (NOUIH), 631 Coachway Lane, Hazelwood, Missouri 63042-1347 314-839-9751, prepaid only. The tuning string snapped on my Realistic DX-200 on October 23, so I've switched to the Realistic DX-400 for my main BCB rig, and I've noted some improved results! I even have the homebrew antenna hooked up for SW, and the performance hasn't changed on the SW side. So, the DX-400 is performing double duty! The WPIE-1160 test came through with Morse Code and voice IDs on October 24, even with KSL, WJJD and WAMB battling for domination on the frequency. night, I managed to get some Morse Code from WBZY-1200, through WOPA in WOAI's null. The last DX I had in Daylight Savings Time this year was Radio Ya (YNLD-600) from Managua, Nicaragua with a promo in SS and popular music. Also on October 30, I managed to get enough program information to send a report to KELO-1320, the first time I've heard them since KSIV went full-time back in 1987. Follow-up is out to WHIO-1290, which topped the channel over KKAR and WIRL on October 30. stands 344. DXer Bill Alisauskas in Douglasville, GA has confirmed that WQXI-790 has added a folksy talk show (a la Ludlow Porch) in morning drive, with former WSB talker Hugh Jarrett. Some trivia buffs may remember that Jarrett was also one of the Jordanaires, Elvis Presley's backing vocal group. WPPI-1330 in Carrollton, GA has returned from a 10month silence imposed by the Internal Revenue Service, with an Oldies format (1950s, '60s and early '70s), where Bill A. is back on Saturday mornings (under the air name "Big Bill"). In Mid-America, WAIK-1590 in Galesburg, IL (south of the Quad Cities, west of Peoria) has adopted a Big Band format. WIWO-1580 South Bend, IN is no more, the station is now WHLY (Radio Hollywood) with a satellite-fed Adult Standards KSTL-690 has settled into an Urban Gospel format, having been purchased by Crawford Broadcasting Company, who also owns KJSL-630. KWL0-1330 Waterloo, IA has dropped its full-service AC format for Oldies, calling themselves "Oldies 1330". The big news is that WLIB-1190 New York, NY will finally go full-time. WOWO-1190 Fort Wayne, IN is expected to reduce nighttime power in order to accommodate WLIB. Power levels were not disclosed. WOWO's signal is weaker here than in Atlanta, GA where I lived for four years (1988-92). I can get CFSL, Weyburn, SK and a weak KFEZ Kansas City, MO in their null. I hope WLIB can be able to protect KEX Portland, OR! On the AM band, I can still get my Oldies fix from WHAS-840 Louisville, KY after Midnight.
