Thank you for your report of reception of AM 550 KSD St. Louis, Missouri on December 5, 1993. Please accept my apology for the long delay in our confirmation.

KSD has been on the air since February 14, 1922. It currently transmits 5000 watts non-directional daytime, and 5000 watts through a four-tower directional antenna system at night. The major lobe is to the west with minor lobes to the north and south.

KSD uses an all solid state 5000 watt Broadcast Electronics transmitter and has been transmitting in C-QUAM AM stereo since 1983.

It will be time for some follow ups soon. As usual the upper frequencies have been good this season. With 1500 feet of wire running east, that is 2+ wavelengths, it works quite well. I managed to hear the WLLS-1600 DX test. Only the code made it through. Per the verie from the CE they were only running 506 watts! From Western Kentucky to the West Coast - they must have a good TX site! I am really looking forward to the other 1590-1600 tests coming up in next few weeks. I hope CX are good. I also logged the KSSU Sacramento College station on 1620 Khz. Per the verie they only run 2 watts! That is my lowest power licensed station QSL. I am also looking forward to the expanded band stations. They should give DXers a lot of new catches. It also doesn't look like the frequencies should be too crowded. 
