

Karl V. Jeter, 1890 Abinger Lane, Lawrenceville, Georgia 30243 I am pleased to report we have a new addition to our family: Aaron Lee Jeter was born on 11-18 and weighed in at 7 lb 8 oz. Mom and the little one are doing well, but we all could use a little more sleep! Fortunately, my long DX career has prepared me for the getting up in the middle of the night, hi. Unfortunately, my nocturnal efforts at hearing DX tests have not been too successful lately. Only tentatives for the KEAS-1590 Eastland, TX and KDDD-800 Dumas, TX heard lately. I am also very pleased to report I have added a new Canadian province to the logbook--British Columbia! I was fortunate enough to hear CKWX-1130 briefly on the morning of 10/15 at 0733; I was in total disbelief at first, and listened to the tape over and over before I decided to send them a tentative report; a verie was received on 11/25, so this ranks right at the top of my best all-time catches. I had just heard KAAB-1130 at 0730 that same morning, and it was when reviewing the tape of that catch that I first detected the brief moment that CKWX came in, very clearly. So it is nice to know that with a little luck, in these days of crowded DX conditions, transcontinental DX is possible! While in St. Louis this past summer, my dad, while cleaning the basement, came across my original DX machine, a Realistic DX-120 (no, not a DX-150, a  $\overline{DX}$ -120)that I purchased on a close-out in 1971. I was amazed that he had it squirreled away down there, as I had given it to my brother in the mid-70's after I bought the HQ-150 that I still use. So I brought it home, dusted it off, fired it up and it still works, although it is hardly the DX machine that the HQ-150 or the ATS-803A are, but I will keep it for sentimental value. This was my first general-coverage receiver; I started DXing during high school in 1969 when we lived in Conover, NC with a RCA AM/FM portable (which I also still have). [12/3] I agree. The expanded band looks great. I just wonder how long it will be until we see the first stations move. Here in Oregon, the band is pretty much open too, especially to the East. With the 1500' Beverage, the frequencies should be great. The dial looks this way here: 1610 KHZ will probably get KFVR-Crescent City or KECN-Blackfoot during the day. 1620-KRIZ-Renton. 1630-KTMT-Phoeniz, OR. 1640-KPHP-Portland. 1650-maybe KNRO-Redding or KSOS-Brigham City during the day. 1660-KRCX-Roseville or KWYF-Dishman. 1670-Nothing during the day, and at night the channel should be completely open. 1680-KPOZ-Seattle. 1690-KFRE-Fresno (Why they want to move, I don't know) and 1700-KCPL-Olympia, WA. Of course, all of these stations may not move. Just because there is a CP, it doesn't mean much in these days. It will be interesting anyway. DX on the upper part of the band has been great of late. I was lucky to catch the WLLS test and then I got an ID from WWRL-NY!!! An ID popped in and I caught it on tape, so off went a taped report. I'm keeping my fingers crossed on that one. I recently received what I think is a QSL from The People's Broadcasting Station at Hohhut-Inner Mongolia-675 KHZ. It is hard to tell as the letter is handwritten in an unusual Chinese dialect. I was able to get a basic interpretation from a university professor and I have also sent a copy of the letter off to Radio Beijing for Other QSLs of late: WPAM217-1620 KHZ- Houston, Texas from the Lyondell Petrochemical Co. Yes, they are running only 10 watts! That is 1900+ miles fro a 10-watter to go. That is my best TIS verie. My lowest power one is KSSU-1620 KHZ - Sacramento, with only 2 watts.
