1995 IRCA REGULAR ELECTIONS

--from Bill Hardy - IRCA President

Every two years the IRCA conducts Regular Elections to determine the President, Secretary-Treasurer and seven members of the Board of Directors. For the 1995 Regular Elections, nominations for the nine offices begin on December 1, 1994 and continue through January 15, 1995. Each IRCA member in good standing may nominate one person for President, one person for Secretary-Treasurer, and seven people for the Board of Directors. Once nominations close, the Election Committee Chairman (ECC) sends a list of those nominated to the Secretary-Treasurer who determines if those nominated are eligible (must be an IRCA member for at least one year). The candidates that are eligible will receive a letter from the ECC by February 1, 1995 indicating their nomination and listing all other eligible nominations for the same office. Candidates must indicate to the ECC by February 20, 1995 whether they intend to run for office and can submit a campaign statement at that time (candidates are not required to submit a campaign statement). The ECC will prepare and submit a ballot and campaign statements to the Publisher by March 1, 1995 for inclusion in an appropriate March 1995 "DX Monitor." The ballots must be received by the ECC by 0001, Mountain Local Time on May 1, 1995.

Beginning December 1, 1994, nominations are open for the positions of IRCA President, Secretary-Treasurer and the seven Board of Directors. Send all nominations to IRCA's ECC:

Greetings. I hope everyone had a great holiday season. DX at home has been pretty slow lately due to horrible electrical noise. But I did manage to make a DXpedition to the coast a few weeks ago, the results of which have been sent on to Pat. The highlight was a good opening to the Philippines (I heard more Filipinos in one hour than in my entire life up to that point.

Station changes and the like seem to be in short supply right now, but I have a few other things this time to make up for it.

TRANS-ATLANTIC

CZECHIA: VOA is planning to use Kosice 1521 for its broadcasts [Arctic]

FRANCE: France Inter is NSP on 162, 675, 1071, 1161 and 1350. The 2000-kW transmitter at Allouis on 162 kHz is off Tuesday 0003-0358. [BDXC]

GERMANY: RFE Holtkirchen has moved here, ex-720, will return to 720 in March 95 [Arctic] (also see the VOA list elsewhere in this column. bp)

Radio Volga, the station broadcasting to Russian military forces in former E. Germany, closed down at the end of July. The station used to transmit on 261 kHz, sharing the use of the transmitter with Radio Russia and Radioropa Info, a German commercial station based at Daun. The transmitter on 261 kHz continues to be on the air 0400-2100 but is now being used exclusively by Radioropa Info. [BDXC]

HUNGARY: Hungarian Radio has a new superpowered station on 1251 at Marcali, just south of the Balaton-lake. It is reported to have 1 MW 0430-0800, 1800-0015, 500kw 0800-1800, but reception in Sweden is rather weak for that power level [Arctic]

VOICE OF AMERICA

The following is a list of VOA medium wave broadcasts effective September 25, 1994 to March 25, 1995, and revised October 21, 1994. It was posted on the VOA's BBS, so it should be pretty accurate. Of special interest: the listing on 1147.5 are as posted by them, so they are officially admitting to using this split frequency. The list says they still broadcast via Thailand-1575, contrary to recent speculation among MW DXers. The Belize transmitter is still in operation, even though it's been reported for sale. Also the 1593 broadcasts are from Hozkirchen, rather than Langenberg. There seems to be a growing use by VOA of transmitters in former Soviet bloc countries, an interesting change in the post-cold war era. Hopefully, the site and language abbreviations are self-explanatory.

AM-azing AM

This is the title of a book recently published by a group of Norwegian DXers, which lists all the MW stations logged in Norway between 1945 and 1994. The book is 230 pages long with several sections by geographic area (Europe, N America, etc). Within each section there is a list by frequency with station name, site, country, freq, loggings by year, and first loggings. The log also has extensive footnotes on the stations, as well as photos, logos, etc. It sounds like a very ambitious effort. It can be provided either in printed form, or as an Excel file. Either version costs NOK 150- plus NOK

50- for postage etc outside Europe. This is somewhere in the vicinity of \$30US. You can order from DX Listeners Club, PO Box 7080, Vestheene, N-4602 Kristiansand, Norway. RIAS

[From HCJB DX Partyline, via HZDXL] One of the best known voices of the cold war fell silent at year's end when the Berlin radio station RIAS faded into history after nearly half a century of broadcasting to both sides of the once divided city of Berlin. At a party that lasted most of the afternoon at the station's offices, the mood swung from satisfaction to nostalgia. One of the goals for which RIAS had worked so long, German reunification, had been achieved. Everyone agreed that this was cause for joy, but many of the celebrators had never lived in a Berlin without RIAS and were not looking forward to the prospect. In many ways it was more than a radio station, said a producer, people grew up with it, it was a Berlin institution, everyone who heard it took strength from it.

RIAS was founded by the United States in 1946 when an occupied Berlin was divided into four sectors, each controlled by one of the allied powers: the US, Britain, France, and the Soviet Union. The initials stood for Radio in the American Sector. The East German authorities who engaged in a bitter campaign against the station, suggested that the initials referred to Revanchism (sic), Intervention, Anti-Bolshevism, and Sabatage. In addition to news broadcasts, RIAS broadcast several regular features that became staples on both sides of the wall: a children's program, literary reviews, a cabaret show, and a Berlin based soap opera were the most popular. As the Division of Berlin and Germany hardened, RIAS assumed an important political role - it became the main source of official information for the people in East Berlin and the rest of East Germany.

In 1953, when workers in East Berlin began a revolt, RIAS broadcast vivid reports from the streets, with gunshots audible in the background. The communist authorities later asserted that RIAS broadcasts had encouraged the uprising by stirring anti-government sentiment. Listening to the station was forbidden in East Germany and violators were given prison sentences for as long as 16 months.

East Germany also sought to disrupt the RIAS signal with jamming machines, one of which now stands in the lobby of the RIAS building. Despite these efforts, many East Germans listened secretly to RIAS. In the 1960's, after the Berlin wall went up, the station attracted a new generation of listeners by offering programs of popular music which was not widely available in the East. Young people could mail requests to a series of constantly changing addresses in East Berlin, forcing secret police agents to mount never-ending mail intercept operations. The station which never accepted advertising was run by Germans, although the board chairman was always an American. The American contrivance to the RIAS budget dropped steadily and stopped altogether a few years ago. RIAS is to be absorbed into a national network that will have twin bases in Berlin and Koin.

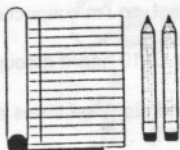

The WILY-1210-IL-TEST's cw came thru very nicely right at the outset of the program, but their "verie" consists only of a coverage map and biz card. 11/23 - I first heard the brand new & powerful WCKG-840-SC today at 1655, and held till their 1714 s/off, way o/WHAS. 11/25 - Thanksgiving Day sunset brought another one which didn't verify last year - WCPT-740-VA, and another try. Mon. 11/26 - things seemed Auroral, so I went to my favorite Aurora frequency, 1320, and sure enough, Jacksonville, FL was in there w/its latest set of call letters, WJGR "Jaguar Radio", all talk and verie is in already! Would that other stations would use them as a model. Sat. 12/3 - I heard mention of Giants Stadium, and so I held on to get a few items on WGHT-1500-NJ, u/WTOP/WFIF, not quite enough - yet - for a report. Then on 12/6, a real surprise, as I settled on 930 and found "Q-93" coming in and out w/WZNN and others. They are CJYQ-NF! Now, the early-morning stuff. On 11/10, with no more CJMS on 1280, I noted one station u/WADO-NY which turned out to be WWOK-IN, for a report, with NOS music and CNN five-minute news on the hour. Unneeded WENE-1430-NY seems to have gained strength from past years, and is often stronger than local WXKS and WJR. 12/1 - WCCO was noted in passing at 0103, probably the last time I'll ever hear them, as finally the new WCRN has started programming. They relay WROL-950-Boston some of the time, and carry far right speakers with nasty comments about those who disagree with them. I got tired of being insulted, so I tuned out and will send a report another day. That'll do it - Forward - March!
