



[1/19] Hello! This forum will probably appear before the anniversary issue, but since I've rejoined the IRCA after a hiatus of a few years, I'll go ahead and do a re-intro now. I first became a member in 1986, did a stint as editor of "Eastern DX Roundup", and let my membership lapse in early 1990, when the hobby was put on the back burner while attending the University of Missouri. Now, at age 24, I'm spinning my wheels while deciding if, in what, and where to pursue graduate studies. Since completing an A.B. in English in 1992, I've been working for the Tribune Publishing Company, the commercial printing division of the Columbia Daily Tribune, in an ironic turn of events -- I had moved to Columbia from Long Island to attend the MU School of Journalism, then changed majors to English, yet wound up in business anyway. So, at least for the moment, I make my living putting words to paper, just not in the way I had expected. I've witnessed a lot of changes in the mid-Missouri radio market in my six-and-a-half years here. At the moment, the finishing touches are being put on the new home of Zimmer Broadcasting's KCLR-FM, KCMQ-FM, and KTGR-AM. The 7,500-square foot facility at 3214 LeMone Industrial Drive in Columbia may mean that KTGR will, after about four years, once again be a stand-alone entity. Following a brief and unsuccessful format of oldies and big-band music in 1990, the station was shuttered until being purchased by Zimmer in 1994. Shortly thereafter, the 250-watt station began simulcasting KCMQ - "KIX-FM" - which had dropped its adult contemporary format after being purchased by Zimmer in early 1993, went all-Garth Brooks for about a month, then took up its present "Young Country" format. No word yet as to what KTGR's new format might be -- that is, assuming the rumors are true. KFRU-AM, the citv's 24-hour, 1 kW news-talk station, is one of the more stable in the market, having just celebrated 70 years of service. Down the road in St. Louis, KSD-AM has dropped its daytime format of CNN Headline News, and is now "Unforgettable 550," with a mix of oldies - the Carpenters, John Denver, the MacQuire Sisters, and, of course, Nat Cole - in stereo. It now carries Satellite Network News at the top of the hour, as well as St. Louis University Billikens' basketball games. 73s for now.

A very good point brought up is with only 79 stations moving to the expanded band, is it worth the expense to manufacture receivers capable of receiving the expanded band? At first it was estimated between 250 and 300 stations would be cleared out of the lower band. [1/25] Gerry Thomas' mention of my "Nuts & Volts" column in his recent EDXF managed to provoke

a WDXF out of me! DX in 1995 has been blah so far ... other than the WIBW test. I'm batting .000 on CPC tests. Hopefully TP DX will be returning here by the time you read this. I really enjoyed Ray Moore's recent loop article. I have a ferrite core and two-foot box loop in my shack, both products of Ralph Sanserino's craftsmanship. I direct comparison between the two, I note one further advantage of an air core loop that Ray didn't emphasize: an air core loop gives deeper and sharper nulls than a ferrite core loop. I can get nulls on some locals like XETRA-690 and KSDO-1130 than I simply can't get on the ferrite core loop. The air core loop requires more careful adjustment, as a minor change in its position can produce a big change in a null. The signal pick-up of the air core loop is also much better. However, I must admit that the space occupied by the tow-foot loop is obscene, and I shudder at how bulky a 35" loop must be. But if you want maximum performance, an air core loop is clearly the way to go. Having both loops lets me phase them together using the technique described by Mike Levintow in the 1970s, and this has proven to be a valuable tool in several situations (like knocking down KSDO-1130 enough last year to hear the KMBR test). I'm glad to see that Gerry Thomas is working on a phasing unit, and I understand another small manufacturer of SWLing gear has their own phasing unit under development. I'm installing a loaded vertical for 160 meters, and I'm curious how phasing it with one of my loops would work. My HO180 is at the NRC's Dave Schmidt for repairs, and my HO150 has been pressed into service alongside the R8. The R8 is my main receiver for split-channel DX, with the HQ150 (and HQ180) favored for domestic DX. I can't wait for the first stations to appear above 1600 kHz! However, I wonder how financially viable the new channels will be. Of course, with the prospect of direct satellite audio broadcasting - no fading or ORM, CD-quality audio - on the horizon, I wonder how financially viable ANY terrestrial audio broadcasting will be in a couple of decades. We may see a return to the "good old days" of wide open AM frequencies once the "birds" are up! Until then, let's enjoy our current opportunities. Good DX to all.



I would like to invite IRCA readers to tune above 1615 kHz to another world. There are few BC stations running kilowatts. However, there are a bunch of little peanut whistles calling for attention. These are called MedFERs - Medium frequency experimenters, limited to 0.1 watt input power, 3 meter or less length antenna by FCC Part 15 regulations. Since most operate BEACONS that are identified by Morse CW at about five (5) words per minute, identification is relatively easy. A BFO of some sort is needed. If one doesn't have a BFO in the monitor receiver, the LO of another BC receiver works quite well in this service. Just tune the usual BC radio to between 1150 to 1250 kHz and while listening somewhere in the 180 meter band, the LO will be heard. Adjusting orientation or distance to the monitoring receiver often controls the "injection" level! Most MedFER stations use identification "calls" of one to three letters. Typical East Coast stations are: IE 1631, SEA 1638, ABC 1644, CSV 1649, W 1659. Calls such as ARC123 are fishnet beacons in the Atlantic or Pacific ocean. MedFER stations are often heard at distances up to 1,000 or more miles! Good hunting.
