All proposals passed. However, Proposal 16.2.1 was withdrawn by Bill Hardy on March 3, after it had been approved by the Board, and Proposal 16.2.2 was superceded by Proposal 16.2.5.

IRCA members approved Proposal 16.2.5 in the recent elections, and it is now part of the club Bylaws. Reid Wheeler requested the amendment to clarify that members may nominate themselves for club office if eligible, and that a member who has nominated himself or herself will be automatically considered to have accepted the nomination. Larry Godwin found some grammatical errors in Proposal 16.2.2, and the Board quickly approved the changes before the proposal reached the ballot.

The Computer Backup Committee will consist of approximately three members, who will receive backup disks of any important club documents as needed, usually once or twice per year. This will include the IRCA Almanac articles and databases, the IRCA Mexican Log, the membership list, and any other documents which would cause serious problems for IRCA if the originals are lost. This committee will act as "insurance" for IRCA's investments of time and effort in club projects. Ironically, one of the committee's first actions will be to receive all the databases I have been maintaining for the IRCA Almanac and the Mexican Log, as I leave IRCA and the DX hobby completely when my membership ends on 9/15/95.

Congratulations to Phil Bytheway on his election as IRCA President. Phil takes over on 9/15/95 at 12:01am Mountain time. However, please begin submitting all club proposals to Phil right away. If there is an urgent matter he will turn it over to me. Phil also plans to conduct the business meeting at the Boise convention. I won't know until the last minute whether or not I will be attending Boise. Frank plans an excellent convention and I hope many of you will be there.

I apologize for withdrawing my offer to edit DX Monitor, but when Nancy requested a divorce so she could remarry, I lost all interest in radio hobbies. Now my life is filled with being a single parent to Billy and Melanie, a rewarding challenge leaving no time for anything else. — Bill.

Greetings. I wanted to correct a misprint in my last forum. The price for a single Highway Radio Guide should read \$12.99 (twelve ninety-nine.) I think they used to be a lot less, so go figure. The book generally doesn't include stations under 1 kw. Good news - this year I got to log KUSA-1660, the station from the N.A.B. Convention in Las Vegas NV. The signal was strong enough to pick it up on my Sony Walkman! On April 6th I noted them testing with pulse. By Friday, April 7th, they were playing hit music like "No Reply" by Genesis and the "Miami Vice" theme. On Saturday, April 8th, they had briefly switched format to Country & Western. Made a report and caught some on tape so maybe a verie is possible. Another sort-of upper band logging I made in April is KCEB-1610, the low power station from Cerritos College in Norwalk CA that I've been listening to for the past 20 years has moved here as of this semester (ex-1560, 550, 830.) They move up and down the dial almost as much as I do DXing on cold winter mornings, hi. 

Several others were heard and verified like WZEP-1460-FL and CHEF-1450-Quebec, that I never dreamed would make it. I have been very happy with the Drake R8 in the ECSS mode. I know the above two tests would never have been heard without the ECSS mode. I was glad to hear that Phil Bytheway now has an R8. It will be interesting to hear what Phil picks up with his R8. Yes, the Noise Blanker works very well. It cuts out some noises I don't even know that was there, as the blanker remove the noise before I would notice it. I am pleased to see that Larry Godwin is picking up more TP stuff. Missoula must be a pretty good location for all around DX. Recently ex-IRCA member Guy Atkins-Bonney Lake WA sent his Lowe 225-Europa receiver down to me to compare it with the R8. It is a great little unit, but it is missing several important feature like Passband tuning and a Notch Filter. Later I will be doing a review on the unit. I hope to get the time this Summer to install another beverage antenna // to the Eastern beverage I am using. The wire is all ready out there. All I have to do is line it up a foot or two across from the other wire for phasing. It should be interesting. I will let you know the outcome. The KUSA-1660-Las Vegas test has sure been strong here. I even could get bits and pieces during one afternoon. When they were testing in Chicago (WUSA), it was logged here almost as strong. When the expanded band starts getting used, it should be interesting. I think many of the stations will be pests. Good DX to all. Boise in 95. 73s. Patrick

[4/23] Greetings! Chuck Boehnke mentioned an interesting idea to include tropical-band coverage in the DXM. Personally I'd like to see IRCA continue to specialize in the BCB. This is the kind of proposal that could be entertained by the BoD if someone would care to submit it. If the Board should approve it, the Constitution would have to be amended, which would require the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the IRCA membership. Tim Kridel, I've noted KBCO-1190 strong here lately, too. No wonder, as it evidently hasn't been powering-down at sunset. My DX-related programs, like Art Peterson's Great Circle Bearings and the classic PC Globe, are working faster since my 286/12 computer died. I salvaged the hard disk and had a local technician install it on a 386-DX-25 motherboard. Now I can locate distances and bearings in a flash. For example, I quickly calculated the latitudes of four interesting stations I often note with greatly decreased signal strength during auroral conditions. These affected stations are located to the south of me! Missoula's latitude is 46.5N; the stations are KBOI-670-Boise (43.25N), KSL-1160-Salt Lake City (40.46N), KOA-850-Denver (39.44N), and KFBK-1530-Sacramento (38.51N). Prior to last season, I thought auroras affected only stations to the DXer's north. During April, I stabilized my Sanserino air-core box loop with four feet of flexible solid lead "string." It only cost \$1.60. Dxers can find this material at sporting goods stores. Summer is fast approaching and I'm looking forward to the Boise convention. Good DX to everyone in the meantime, and 73.

Better for SW but seldom listen to that anymore except for China now and then. May use it for Marconi Day listening. KYW-1060 almost disappeared the evening of March 18. Over strong was "New Orleans' new Stereo 1060 AM", WLNO. Christian MX, USA NX. I like old time radio programs and recently found RADIO YESTERYEAR, Box C, Sandy Hook, CT 06482. Large selection. Good sampler cassette. Some unusual items south as Tokyo Rose and Axis Sally broadcasts. Tried for the R. Vision Christiana-533 and WWOL-780 DX Tests. Dozed off and didn't hear either. I was devastated. Did manage to hear WTMT-620 and the elusive WCGW-770. Was given an ancient American Electric magneto wall phone and now have it up in the commo shack. Anyone wants to call I am 2 short rings and 1 long. Also put up my Marconi poster from Italy (RAI). If not for him - no hobby! At least that's what Col. DX thinks. See ya. (second report) Thought I'd heard weak CID's from KFDF-1580 back during the March DX test and made a tentative report. No joy so listened again April 15. Didn't hear it. Tried the freq. early in the evening (about 2215 EDT 4/14) and heard "Radio Hollywood-MHYL". Never did hear the location. During the KFDF test I did hear CBJ Chicoutimi, PQ. Semiclassical music. Radio Canada ID at 0300. A big 50 but way NE of Montreal on the Saguenay. Almost 1000 miles from here, so a fair catch for me and by bare bones outfit. A&E cable network had "Marconi: Whisper in the Air" on its 4/19 Biograpby. Col. DX enjoyed it very much and got it on tape. I've been sending out a few of IRCA's "Broadcast Band DXing" leaflets, along with "DX Tests" by Harry Helms (page 42, 1/95 PopComm). I don't know if it does any good. Certainly no extra verifications from it.

Add my name to the list of DXers that pulled in the NAB's "RUSA" on 1660 kHz. I just happened to be awake at the right time on April 18, their last night on the air, around midnight ELT. I immediately called Las Vegas, and spoke to an engineer named Matthew, who told me all about their installation. They were running 10 kilowatts into one tower of a 6 tower directional array once used by a now abandoned local station. He remarked that I was the most distant listener to call, and that the best up to that point was in Alabama (possibly Lynn Hollerman?) I happily went back to bed, and when I woke up at about 0450 ELT, I tried 1660 again, and just caught "KUSA" signing off. This proved two things to me: The AM band must be more incredibly clogged than I can imagine. It was so easy to log Las Vegas, which is exceptionally rare here, on a clear channel; and the potential for truly wonderful loggings during band expansion is probably beyond my imagination. Also, another new DX catch came my way by surprise. WWKB, Buffalo, NY usually dominates 1520 kHz here, until daytimer WTHE, Mineola, NY signs on and eventually takes over the channel. Lately, I have noticed WGAM, Greenfield, MA signing on at 0615 ELT and overpowering WWKB for at least half an hour with "the songs of the 40s, 50s and 60s". I can also hear them during the day in WTHE's null. Has WGAM upgraded their facilities, or have I simply not noticed them? Finally, I've been working with Patrick Martin to ID a modern rock pirate he heard for an hour or so before local sunrise Eastern time on April 18 on 1620 kHz. Any ideas out there on active East Coast pirates? Good listening, and happy trails. Karl.



Gary received his verie for two stations operated by the Oregon State University Extension Service on 1610 kHz, one from Cottage Grove and the other from Coos Bay, Oregon. He mentioned that they also sent him a one-hour tape of their broadcasts! His verie on 1660 kHz is the first one issued for a DBIOC signal at 100 watts from Cincinnati, Ohio from USA Digital Radio. The IL was originally formed in 1887, split in 1888, and reformed in 1911. At one time it stretched from Havana to Montreal. The PCL was founded in 1903, used to have a 200-plus-game schedule, once extended from Honolulu to Indianapolis, and tried to go major league in the 1950's until the DODGERS and GIANTS moved west. The AA, not to be confused with the major league AA of the 19th century, was founded in 1902 but was absorbed in 1963 by the other Triple-A leagues; with the major league expansion of 1969 it re-emerged.

That's right, two more Infinty football outlets (e.g., New York JETS and 660 WFAN, Philadelphia EAGLES and 94.1 WYSP—think of the Howard Stern tie-ins, hi)...

# ICI RADIO CANADA

To listeners for the CBC French language services the title will be a familiar slogan. Translated into English the slogan means Here Is Radio Canada. However, after the week of February 27 many loyal CBC listeners may be asking themselves where Here is going to be. That was the week that saw a new Federal budget come down hard on all area of the government and CBC was no exception. A resignation of the CBC's President will also help shape the future of the corporation for many years to come. Add to this two Federal government commissions reviewing all aspects of the CBC and you soon realize the scope of changes that are on the way at the CBC. In fact the title of this article may well reflect what is ocurring at the CBC, a shrinking in size.

The CBC's president Tony Manera has resigned for what was called "personal reasons". After a couple of days these reasons became much clearer. It seems that Mr. Manera's reasons were that he did not wish to be the head of a ship that was sinking fast. The federal budget that was brought down that week saw the CBC facing a 4% cut to its budget. This would amount to about \$44,000,000.00 from its \$1,100,000,000.00 budget. Yes you read those numbers correctly, the CBC receives over one Billion dollars a year in tax paver money to maintain its various operations. This is on top of the money it makes from commercial revenue on the three television networks. Many Canadians are now looking at the CBC as a drain on the Federal budget. This coupled with astrong feeling by all Canadians that we are being too heavily taxed make the CBC a likely target of further budget restraints.

Tony Manera claimed that he "would not have the stomach" to implement not only these cuts in revenue to the corporation, but the additional cuts that are scheduled to take place over the next three years. In reality the cuts that the CBC will be facing will amount not to the \$44-million dollars but a cut of \$360-million dollars. These far larger cuts are based on previously announced cuts that are to be implemented by 1997/98. These larger cuts are based on a \$180-million dollar short fall forecasted for each of the next three budget years.

At present the CBC has a staff of about 9,100 working in all of its various networks. If funding is to be cut over the next three years by as much as 25 per cent many of these jobs will disappear. The present \$180-million dollar funding shortfall for this year, that was forecast before the present budget was brought down, would have meant a reduction of up to 1,000 staff positions. These cuts were expected to be incremental rather than a massive restructuring being under taken at this time. This however may have to change. Many staff remember all too well the cuts a few years ago, that saw several television stations such as the one in Windsor ON shut down on very short notice.

Facing such large cuts as well as losing its president in one week was not the end of the jolts to befall the CBC this week. In order to insure that these cuts are implemented by a yet to be named new president, the government set up two commissions to look into the CBC. For those of you not familiar with the CBC in its entirety there are several sections to the corporation:

The English Language Radio Network

The Stereo Radio Network (also in English on FM)

The French Language Radio Network (Radio Canada)

The English Language Television Network

The French Language Television Network

Radio Canada International (the Shortwave Service)

CBC Northern Services

NewsWorld (cable news service simular to CNN in the USA)

As you can see Radio Canada International or RCI has been returned to the CBC from Foreign Affairs at a cost of \$15-million per year. RCI was removed from the CBC several years ago by the previous Conservative government. The Liberals now in power have seen fit to return RCI to its old home. This additional burden will be added to the CBC's cuurent budget. The CBC will seemingly have to find this \$15-million in its already shrinking budget to keep RCI on the air. The CBC presently supplies all of RCI programming except for one program and that may go.

The first commission looking into the CBC, headed by John Godfrey, is already in place. The commission is looking into the operations of the CBC. Their job will be to recommend how the CBC can cut back costs in order to survive in the years to come. The commission is looking at

all aspects of the operations at the CBC from its structure, to the operations and distribution of its various services. To give you an idea of how far the commission is going, have a look at how the CBC delivers its Television services. It seems that CBC spends about \$100,000,000 per year to transmit its television signals to all of Canada. This includes electric bills, tower construction etc. The head of the commission asks why would they spend that many dollars a year when about 75% of Canadians now receive their television services on cable fed lines. Why the commission wants to know should the CBC spend millions of dollars to transmit signals, when they are only serving 25% of the viewing audience?

As you see the first commission's report will no doubt have a major impact on how and what the CBC will be doing as we approach the 21st century. The second commission will look into the very heart of the CBC. This group will examine the Mandate of the CBC. The commission has yet to be formed but as it progresses through its hearings and reviews, they will examine why and if the CBC should exist. The CBC as we know it may be transformed into a new service much different from what we now have. The major impact will most likely fall on the Television and Shortwave services. The latter may disappear altogether. RCl was supposed to disappear several years ago, but then Prime Minister Brian Mulroney, in an off the cuff statement said he would not let the Shortwave service disappear as rumoured. "Rumoured" is an interesting word as his own government had already killed the Shortwave service on paper. The Prime Minister's statement sent the bureaucrats scrambling to save the service and the Prime Minister's face.

As Television is the biggest drag on the CBC's finances the mandate and the way it delivers service will be closely examined. You can count on seeing big changes in the Television services both English and French. These services were to quote the Minister responsible for the CBC, Heritage Minister Michel Dupuy, "...the same structure as they had in the one-channel universe... and now in the 300-channel universe". We have gone from rabbit ears to satellites and the CBC seems to have fallen behind to many Canadians. There are calls to disband the CBC and sell it off to the highest bidders. These may seem like a radical points of view, but at a cost of over \$1.1-billion next year, the CBC will be forced to change and come into line with the current financial and technological times. The Federal government is cutting costs in all areas and the CBC will not be able to escape these cuts.

The CBC may evolve into a more National Service and all local programming many disappear from the airwaves. This National Service would try to tie Canada together (the original idea of why the CBC was formed). The CBC will become to Canada in the 21st century what the railway was in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The CBC will tie Canada together by delivering services that Canadians want and inform all regions about each other's concerns and hopes. This service may become a digital service, satellite fed to Canadians, replacing the present system of transmitters and rebroadcasting stations that go from sea to sea to sea in Canada today. If the CBC does not start taking a hard look at the future the corporation may find itself without the funding it needs to establish a more modern service that will meet the needs of Canadians in the 21st century. This lack of fore sight, as well as an attitude of what was good enough in 1960 is good enough in 1995 may well kill the CBC faster than government budget cuts.

With all of this gloom and doom, one can well imagine that employees at the CBC are on pins and needles wondering what will happen. One CBC employee in Winnipeg summed up his feelings in one word: "confused". Another employee said that this was the worst budget in three years of bad budgets for the CBC. If there are to be cuts of between 25 and 33 per cent to staffing levels as the CBC "right sizes", the next three years will be rocky ones for all staff at the CBC. At present many staff including well known on- air personalities are working on a contract basis. Many of these contracts are due in the next 24 months. You can rest assured that many of these contacts will not be renewed or salary cuts will have to be taken if they are renewed.

As you can see these are rough times at the CBC, and things are probably going to get rougher over the next two or three years. A new or revised mandate coupled with massive changes in services and the way they are delivered, will radically change the CBC as we know it today. With suggestions from selling off all or parts of the CBC, to putting commercials on the commercial free radio services combined with rapid technological change, the CBC will change before the turn of the century. For those of you who are loyal listeners to the CBC your programming and the way you receive the signals from the CBC may soon be changed permanently. In some cases, in particular the Shortwave service, you may see services disappear altogether. As the man once said stay tuned for further updates as they are available. The dead air you are about to hear may not be a test of the service but a real emergency. Unfortunately you may have to tune in another frequency for instructions on what to do.
