Stan Weisbeck from Spokane stopped by for a welcome visit in late August. He explained that, although the Tropical Band is very broad, only certain frequencies have AM stations: 120 meters [2300-2500 kHz.], 90 meters [3200-3400], and 75 meters [3900-4000]. Assuming the BoD passes Pat Martin's proposal to edit a temporary Tropical Band column, it will be interesting to see what he and other members are hearing there. After a year off, I'm teaching accounting again this semester at the University of Montana, so my DXing and reporting time will be limited until January. I usually listen in the evenings around 2300 ELT, and at 0800 and 0900 four days a week. Signal strengths and atmospheric noise are still disappointing here compared to the last two seasons. The evening of 9/12 was auroral with a weak station underneath always-dominant KSL on 1160; I couldn't ID the language. All for now. Good DX and 73.

Speaking of KBCO, would one of our Boulder-area members please be so kind as to pay them a visit and teach them how to power-down their transmitter? Since they received a night authorization for 110 watts earlier this year, it's become a regular occurrence for them to forget to power-down after sunset. At least once a week I tune to 1190 to catch Chris Underwood's overnight show on WOWO and instead get KBCO. Patrick Martin: re your comments in the #32 and 33 DXM's about the Drake R8 and R8A, I agree -- I don't see now the new version could be that much of an improvement, which probably explains why it's only \$100 more than its predecessor. 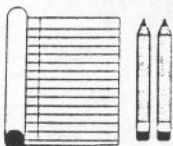
