Greetings. It looks like the season is well under way. I had several good Asian openings in September, plus a few DUs logged in October. See Pat's column for details.

In case anyone is planning a trip to London, the BBC plans to open Broadcast House to visitors next year. A visitor center is being built in the basement of the art-deco building on Oxford Street, and the BBC estimates more than 200,000 visitors a year will pass through. The cost including a 40 minute guided tour will be in the range of £3,35-4,95.

A couple of new Tropical Band lists with similar sounding names have recently been published. The Tropical Band List is a 66 page listing, issued every 3 months, sorted by country and frequency. It has over 1400 entries of stations in the tropical bands and costs US\$20 to North America for 4 editions from Willi H. Passman Media Consulting, Oberhausner Str. 100. S-45476 Mülheim-Ruhr, Germany. The Danish SW Club (DSWCI) has also published its annual Tropical Bands List, which can be obtained for 10 IRCs by air from DSWCI. Bent Nielson, EGEKROGEN 14, DK 3500, Vaerloese, Denmark.

The club is now experimenting with increasing its coverage to 4000 kHz or so. I'll be listing a few items in the 1600-4000 kHz range in this and future columns. Now on to the listings.

Tourist Radio Australia will soon have a new station on 1620 Khz called Radio 2AM Sydney. It will transmit from the 2KY Site at Homebush Bay. This organization is now on air with 2ZW Wollongong 1314 and 2 Double H Newcastle at 1341

INDIA: AIR's regional station in Gangtok has been hrd in Sri Lanka 1400-1600 on 3390 with Delhi national nx at 1530. This is in the former Kingdom of Sikkim, which became part of India several years ago [Media Network]

JAPAN: STV Radio 1440 in Sapporo is upgrading its AM network. Asahikawa 1197 & Muroran 1440 are now 3 kw, Hakodate moved from 1197 to 639 with 5kw, Obihiro from 1530 to 1071 with 5kw, Ku shiro from 918 to 882 with 3 kw, Ahashiri from 936 to 909 with 3kw (Arcticl

KOREA, SOUTH: KBS has English news 1400-1415 on KBS Radio One [Arctic]

NEW ZEALAND: BBC World Service relay in Auckland is rumored to be returning on 990. The R Liberty network began operations April 2 from Auckland 1386, Hamilton 576, Wellington 1233. Christchurch 1323, and Chatham Islands (probably FM), it operates 1800-1200 with its own pgms and then relays VOA Europe. Public service noncommercial has received a budget cut from NZ\$28 to 19 million, and the future of the National Radio and Concert FM networks is being discussed. The 40 commercial RNZ stations will soon be sold to private organizations R Rhema plans to add Queenstown 1251. Kaitaia 549. Whangarel 900, and Blenheim 585 in early 1996. and to move New Plymouth from 774 to 540 [NZDXT]

PAKISTAN: Azad Kashmir Radio hrd w/ s/off 1810 on 3664 5 [Media Network]

PAPUA NEW GUINEA: Radio North Solomons in having a studio built on the Island of Buku. A new 10kw xr will be installed in Rabual for 3325, but is not expected on for some time. [Arctic]

PHILIPPINES: DWCM Dagupan noted in Lapland on 1161.3, also DYVR Roxas City on 1377.5 [NZDXT]

SRI LANKA: TWR broadcasts on 882 with 400 kw and a DA aimed north. The transmitters are located in Puttalam on the NW coast and operated as a joint venture between TWR and SLBC. They BC in various Indian languages 1330-1700 & 2230-0130. V/s is D.R. Halliday, South Asia Freq Coordinator [Arctic]

TAIWAN: ICRT-576 relays RFI English daily 1400-1500 [Arctic]

VIETNAM: Voice of the People of Ho Chi Minh City noted on 655 in Australia IDXAI

WALLIS & FUTUNA: A NZ DXer had his Frenchspeaking wife call the RFO station at Mata-Utu, which confirmed that the AM on 1188 is still active with 2kw 1730-0900. The signal is beamed to the south, but apparently hasn't been hrd by Aust/NZ Dxers lately. Reception reports are welcome in English or French (NZDXT)

WESTERN SAMOA: 2AP-747 opens at 0457, not 0300 as stated in WRTH [NZDXT]

ALBANIA: Regional stations include Rrogozhina 648. Pogradec 693, Kelcyro 864, Korka 963, Puke 972, Kukos 990, Fler 1260, Girokaster 1305. Shkodra 1323 [Arctic] (This tip is a good example of why spell checkers aren't very useful when typing columns like this one, hl. bp)

CZECHIA: Radio Echo 1071/1233/1584 closed down 7/31 for economic reasons. Radio Free Europe moved its studios from Munich to Prague on June 3, and reduced its broadcasts from 900 to 724 hours per week [Arctic]

ETHIOPIA: Radio Fana is using 1083 [Arctic]

GERMANY: 531 MDR is now Burg now 20kw; 783 MDR is now Leipzig 100 kw; AFN 1107 was stated to close in August 1995 [Arctic]

HUNGARY: Solt-540 & Marcall-1251 have reduced power and are no longer on at night [Arctic]

ICELAND: Rikisutvarpid plans to install a new 500 kw LW xr at Sandur (NW Iceland) this year on 180 or 207 [Arctic]

NETHERLANDS: AM News 1395 will start in October from a ship anchored near Almere. There will be no 500kw as previously announced but they hope to reach 100kw (Arctic)

NORTHERN IRELAND: Townland R; Cookstown. noted on since around April 20 with COuntry music, IDs as TLR 828 [Arctic]

POLAND: The Gabin local council has renewed protests against the reconstruction of the 646 meter LW antenna which collapsed a couple of years ago [Arctic]




