Welcome to the 1995-96 IRCA DX contests! This year we have one domestic contest, and one foreign contest (made from suggestions from IRCA members). Hopefully a lot of people will be motivated to DX and to enter into the fun of the contests. There is no fee to enter IRCA Contests. Each contest will have a prize of \$5 towards the IRCA Bookstore - Almanac, updaters, Mexican Log, etc. This season the contests will be:

#### DOMESTIC

Log 10 stations from each state or province. Scoring: #1=1 point, #2=2 points, #3=3 points, #4=4 points, etc., with #10 being worth 10 points. BONUS: 5 points for each "I" "R" "C" or "A" appearing in the calls letters. For example, KIOA would earn 10 bonus points (5 points for the "I" and 5 points for the "A"). KAAA would earn 15 bonus points. The first "C" in a Canadian call is excluded. During the contest period an entry can be replaced with one of a higher value.

#### **FOREIGN**

The object of this contest is to log as many foreign countries as possible. #1 from each country will be worth 5 points, with each subsequent station from that country worth one point. The purpose is to log many different countries, not massive numbers of stations from any one particular country. Stations within the continental U.S. and Canada will not be eligible. Stations in Alaska, Hawaii, Mexico & Cuba will count as foreign. For this contest, Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, etc. are each considered a country.

#### BASIC INFORMATION

- 1. All contests began October 1, 1995 and will end May 31, 1996.
- 2. There is no entry fee for any contest.
- 3. You may choose to enter just one contest, or both.
- Any IRCA member may enter the contests until December 31, 1995. You may begin counting loggings from the first day of the month you enter.
- 5. You need not register beforehand, as your first entry will be considered your registration.
- 6. Each entrant can win only one contest, the one where they receive the most points.
- Stations may be any AM broadcast station, 530 to 1610 kHz, licensed by their country's government. They may be "first time" loggings or stations you have heard before.
- To count a U.S. station, you must hear the call letters. To count a Canadian or foreign station, you must hear the call letters, or hear a recognized slogan plus location.
- Stations that change call letters during the contest may be counted only once. Stations that change frequency may be counted on each frequency heard.
- 10. Your report of stations heard in any particular month must be postmarked by the 5th day of the following month. For example, a station heard on Oct. 3 must be submitted by Nov. 5 to be eligible. Dec. 5 would be too late.
- 11. When you send your entry include the following: frequency, call, city & state, and date & time of ID. The time you use can be your choice (Eastern, Central, Mountain, Pacific, UTC/GMT, etc.) but be sure to indicate what time you are using for your entry.

SPECIAL INTEREST ON, Toronto Info from J.D. & the internet: Starting 11/12 and lasting for "a few days" CBL-740 and CJBC-860 will be operating at 15kw rather than full power of 50kw. The reason for this is that work is being done on the common antenna system . Another message from a different person said that he heard on CBL that they would be "OFF" late nights from 11/18 to 11/24 due to transmitter work being done. No idea if that would effect CJBC or not. (The above may be outdated by the time you read this, but as a broadcast engineer, I know that plans sometimes get moved back or changed, so you might want to watch these two frequencies for the next several weeks-ed)

This is my first report to DXM. This is a bit different as I know the operator of this FCC Part 15 community radio station. It is very low power (Part 15 at 100 milliwatts into a 9-foot vertical) but does serve the community well within 1 mile. It is useable out to 5 miles. There is no voice ID but music is played (CD player on repeat) and there may be community announcements (via endless tape player). The is Morse Code identification, MB, for Mount Baker, WA by frequency shift of the 'carrier' 80 Hz higher. ID may be determined by zero-beating the carrier and listening for the Morse ID, MB. If one zero-beats the ID then inverse ID will be heard, AV or ETV depending on your 'ear'. This carrier frequency shift does not affect the music quality. Frequency of the carrier is by "frequency synthesizer" at 1610 KHz. MB is located 32 miles east of Bellingham WA and 15 miles south of the Canadian border. QSL and get verification of same from Jim Ericson, POB 5262, Glacier WA 98244-5262, 1-360-599-1095. Many of these Part 15 stations are operated as beacons. This is the first that I know of that operates as a very local community radio station. My 1650 KHz, G4, beacon has been heard up and down the west coast and in Wyoming. 1/10th of a watt with a well designed legal antenna can do marvelously well. 73 [according to Jim, MB broadcasts 24 hrs, 7 days a week unless the local temps get below 20F and his xmitter goes into oscillation - ed]

## An Introduction to Broadcast Band DXing
