A great turnout this week again and alot of TA DX!!! I received a phone call from Nick Hall-Patch on 11/26 at 3:00 PM (PST) 2300 UTC that the carrier of NORWAY was coming in! Yes, in daylight the carrier was there. Infact at about 2330 there was even a little audio. Then by 0000 UTC a carrier and audio picked up here on 972 Khz in GERMAN! It was still daylight (4 PM local PST). At 0004 I thought I caught an ID "NDR". For several nights this week many TA carriers were heard. 11/26 was probably the best DX ever, as HLAZ-1566-South Korea was in way past Sunrise. Infact there was audio in until 11:45 AM (PST) and I finally lost the carrier at 12:10 PM (PST)! I have never heard a TP in that long from Oregon. Then the evening on 11/25 (0500 UTC-11/26), along with TA carriers was a Russian with the Interval signal on 576 KHz. Not a 100% sure if it was a TA or not, but I suspect a TP. Thanks for the call, Nick. There also is a report this week from Shawn Axelrod on his TA conditions, where he logged 4 new countries! There are also reports from Art Peterson, Gary Jackson, Jack Woods, and Larry Godwin, so away we go.

This week's column offers a variety of DX from Raymond S. Moore, Karl D. Forth. Randy Stewart and Bill Townshend. Thank you, gentlemen, for your reports. It's always good to get a report with *Trans-Pacific* DX - note the efforts by Ray! No other information this time besides these DX reports, so here we go:

TRANS-PACIFIC DX (Raymond S. Moore-Key Largo, FL)

- 738 TAHITI/AUSTRALIA Papeete and 2NA, Grafton assumed ones here daily. Sometimes only one stn, other times pronounced 1.5 Hz SAH. 10/22 1131-1136 m then mx w/w vocalist. 10/25 1124-1136 m talking, 1137 mx. Bearing 245-deg. Which fits both stn's. The Tahiti SW outlets have not been audible here.
- AUSTRALIA 3LO Melbourne assumed the one here almost daily w/world & nat'l nx at 1100. Pgmming before and after the nx is usually a sporting event or a telephone call-in show. No ID hrd but definite OZ accent and DF bearings consistently 240-deg., right on for Melbourne. Earlier on 10/8 taped m ancr saying "from Melbourne, Australia" but did not get context. Always seems to be in deep fade at ToH when they have a brief mx'al interlude and announcement.
- 846 KIRIBATI assumed stn here w/weak audio 10/30 1112-1134 w/voices and mx. Four bearings averaged 278-deg. On other occasions (6/28, 9/26) bearings have been 249-deg. (2RN Canberra). Often both stn's come in and produce a 3-4 Hz SAH.
- MARSHALL ISLANDS WSZO Majuro assumed 1111-1131 10/28, 1121-1133 10/29 w/heavy beat bass stringed (?) Inst, sometimes w/soft-voiced w vocal. Also noted 10/9 w/w talking softly, possibly in EE. Heard almost daily at threshold level. Easily recognized w/DF loop as is 40-deg. North of usual TP signals. The average of 16 DF bearings over the past 2 months is 284-deg., exactly on for Majuro. A 2nd stn bearing 235-deg. (New Zealand) sometimes causes a 1.5 Hz SAH but has never produced audio.
- 1575 unID TP The strange stn I hrd last season (suspected Thailand) reappeared last month as a weak carrier. Best yet on 10/26 1128-1132 w/strong carrier. As last year, no null obtainable. Last season got weak audio on 11/26 and 2/10. Have high hopes for this winter. A new Australian is scheduled to come on here but should be easily recognized w/DF.

TRANS-ATLANTIC DX (R. Stewart-MO)

- 855 t SPAIN Murcia? RNE 0303 11/13 gd carrier, snatches of SS talk by m. Has been one of the consistently strongest TA carriers this season.
- 1134 unID TA carrier 0347 10/30 possible bits of audio here, possibly mx, briefly w/pr-fr carrier.
- 1314 t NORWAY Kvitsoy NRK 0315-0401 10/30 on an evening producing TA hets nearly every 9 kHz I was still shocked to find a LOUD carrier here w/occ crystal-clear audio: 2 men in presumed Norwegian presenting various pop songs (Kenny & Dolly "Islands in theStream", a pop treatment of O Sole Mio, etc). Needless to say, it faded at ToH, so no definate ID. Sent tent. Taped report -- I'll let R. Norway decide if it was them, hi.
- 1521 SAUDI ARABIA Duba BSKSA 0319-0400+ first (and so far only) good audio from them in more than a year -- AA vocal by m, AA talk. Fr-pr in 1520 splatter; loud het on 1520 at peaks.

"......Especialy on 10/30, I was getting fairly decent BFO-detectable carriers (in addition to the above) on 585, 621, 639, 666, 684, 711, 737, 774, 846, 873, 891, 954, 1017, 1179, 1206 (hetting 1205), 1215, 1296......." Randy Stewart

PAN-AMERICANA DX

- 532 TURKS & CAICOS RV Cristiana 0258 11/12 and 0323 11/15 after spending several days on their original 535 they're back down here again. Why'd they bother to move?? (Stewart-MO) (Probably trouble w/Grenada QRM, but now I'd suspect the het in their vicinity to actually be more of a nuisance, at least to Grenada. Ed)
- 535 TURKS & CAICOS RVC 0203 11/4 I too noted them here instead of 532 w/SS contemp Christian mx & SS ID. As noted above, by 11/12 they were back on 532. (Stewart-MO)
- 740 unID 0411 10/14 fr-gd w/ "Nicaragua de Noche" mentioned several times, then Michael Jackson's "Beat It" used as a mx theme. Faded out but later heard ranchera mx 0458. (Forth-IL)
- 765 unID LA Never see this stn mentioned but has been here for years. AN except off Sun mornings. Even heard back in Mass. Gd sig here but haven't spent much time ID'ing it. Bearing indicates Guatemala or northern El Salvador or Honduras. (Moore-FL) (Ray, I occ heard this on the beverages back at my Byron Road site in northern Pittsburgh but was never able to pull any extended audio, let alone an ID. Results were published in the Monitor then. Ed)
- 780 <u>CUBA</u> Las Mercedes CMKO 2304 10/24 martial song, gd o/WBBM, possibly Aucx. (Townshend-DC)
- 839 <u>CUBA CMBQ La Fe</u>, Isla de la Juventud believed the R. Enciclopedia stn heard throughout the day on this freq. Popular instru & light classical mx w/short anmts betw selections. (Moore-FL)
- 1080 TURKS & CAICOS 2302 10/25 gospel pgm, gd o/KDKA. (Townshend-DC)
- 1130 unID 0109 10/21 fairly consistent signal but u/WISN w/"Le Mexicana" ID and vocal mx, hrd for next 30-min. Or so but no other ID heard. (Forth-IL)
- 1162 unID LA SS stn noted 0105 10/6 w/"R. Tiempo" ID. WRTH lists HRGF here which fits my DF bearings but slogan doesn't match. (Moore-FL)
- 1560 MEXICO XEFAJ Mexico City noted 1055 10/28 w/"R, Consentida" ID, (Moore-FL)

[11/16] I am sure all of you have thought about what an electronic version of "DX Monitor" would look like, perhaps some of you got a chance to see how the DX columns would look via e-mail in the recent three week experiment using Phil Bytheway's "AM-DX Newsflash" e-mail bulletin. Some of you might be shocked as to costs of receiving such a bulletin. Let's say you already have a computer (If not, plan on spending a few thousand to set yourself up.). Join one of the on-line computer services, most charge \$9.95 per month. One year would cost you \$119.40. You will be lucky if the service offers a local phone number for you to use. If you are in a small community, or live in a remote area, you will have to pay long distance phone charges, say 13 cents per minute. The "AM-DX Newsflash" takes about 5 minutes to log on, download, log off. If you pay phone charges, that's an additional 65 cents per week, or \$33.80 per year. Not counting the cost of paper, you are spending roughly \$153 a year to receive a small DX newsletter. Gee, one would think \$25 a year for a printed "DX Monitor" is a great value! That's just my opinion, you of course would use the on-line service for other things, too. Perhaps others have a different opinion? 73, John.

Hello Everybody. Now that Ralph has made the suggestion about having the DX monitor go "On-line" I felt a few observations would be in order. First of all I would certainly support any such plan for the IRCA. This should be a supplement to the regular bulletin and as time went by and more people got involved in computers and in being On-line it could evolve into a more important arm of the club. On-line bulletins which are an example of this are: "Jihad" which is available only On-line, requires that for a DXer to receive the bulletin he must contribute to it. A very simple concept and it works. To my knowledge it has no Hard Copy counterpart although those involved with it are well known in DX circles and their names appear regularly in regular bulletins put out by the various DX clubs. The second example which is more the type of On-line bulletin IRCA should be looking at is the fine one put out by the Michigan Area Radio Enthusiasts (MARE). This bulletin is entirely On-line and is put out by some of the MARE members on a rotation basis and serves as an adjunct to the regular printed bulletin. Those members who have computers and are "On-line" automatically are entitled to receive the bulletin which during the DX season is weekly. Needless to say it serves as a way to get out information in a very timely manner. It is easy enough to print out such a bulletin if you want a permanent record of some of the items contained therein. However, even the information in electronic bulletins gets old rapidly! That's the nature of the DXing Hobby. Many people are not interested in computers. But, they are very active DXers. They should NOT be made to feel they are "second class members" just because they don't have a computer or if they do have one they do not wish to be On-line! There is such a thing as expense, folks. Not all of us can afford to do all these things! However, having an "On-line" bulletin or newsletter would be an excellent way to improve the club's way of communicating to its members and for the editors to exchange information when practical. Not all editors want to have computers that are On-line either I would guess. There is no harm is bringing electronic communications into the club as long as it is not some sort of mandatory or status thing. As DXers and a club members we should all have equal position and respect! I would think having such an On-line bulletin would attract new membership too. Let me add a few things about being "Online". For a DX club to be associated with an On-line service such as CompuServe, America On-line, or Prodigy is really quite unnecessary. Those services are fine for those that want a structured and guided tour of all the marvels available in "Cyberspace". Those horrible AOL ads you see on TV about all these nerds "tearing through the Internet" make me cringe! That is not what it's all about! The Internet, and all its facets, are about COMMUNICATIONS! Not an electronic version of American Gladiators! For a DX club, and for any average person, a dial-up account with a local Internet provider (ISP) is by far the better way to go. Cheaper too, most ISP's have a flat rate with NO EXTRA CHARGES to contend with including phone surcharges. Putting a club bulletin on a regular schedule is basically just using "E-Mail" with multiple recipients. Or a "Listserver subscription" plan could be set up. None of this entails a big expense for a club or individual. Many ISPs also have arrangements for setting up a "Home Page" on the Internet's "WWW" (World Wide Web) and in the case of the one I belong to (Interlink Hawaii) there is no extra charge as long as it is not commercial in nature. There are certainly better ways to do things than to get tied up with the expensive On-line services! There are even "Freenets available in some areas as well as ones available through educational organizations. Some colleges and educational institutions provide Internet access to the public at very low rates. Our WDXF Editor has suggested the use of having an electronic Bulletin Board (BBS) and that is another consideration worthy of thought. Who knows, perhaps a combination of several methods might meet out requirements. I would like to suggest that the President and BOD set up a special committee to look into the matter and come up with some ideas as to how the club could best serve the membership "electronically". This committee should have a few members with computers, some that are on line, as some members that do not have computers as well. The year 2000 is getting closer and closer.
