



Only call letter IDs I heard were at the top of the hour and some legal IDs included "Radio Aahs"' e.g., "This is WJDM, 1660...Radio Aahs." There are local breaks during the syndicated program, especially at 7 or 8 minutes before the hour when a local weather forcast is given, at the end of which the frequency 1660 is announced but not the call letters (at least in the forcasts that I heard) Rather, the IDs at the end of the weather forcasts mention 1660 AM and Radio Aahs, e.g., "That's the forcast from the station playing great music for great kids at 1660 AM, this is Radio Aahs." All IDs are followed by a short jingle. (HL-LA) ********** SPECIAL INTEREST 1670 KTRK MD+ Ft. Meade 2/7 2128-0003 sign off. Playing Rock music, Iron Butterfly, Rolling Stones, other Rock. Good signal but very fadey in & out.. ID as "ABS 1670". Last half hour was very poor reception. Said: "If you live 60 miles from Alexandria, Va, you are DX" and asked for reports. Address: ABS-Room 340, 601 North Fairfax St. Alexandria, VA 22314. I noted them saying this was an "Equipment Test". (WW-MA) UN-IDEN: 1010 WHIN TN Gallitin. The 1994 NRC Log listed them as Religious, but they may have switched to Adult Stnds. High Point is part of the Greenboro/High Point/Winston-Salem metropolitan area, the third largest in NC (after Charlotte and Raleigh/Durham) (EB-MO) TIS: Noted "new" temporary TIS on I-75 South. Location is 1610 ????? FL two miles North of the Venice exit. Two weeks ago, tanker truck hit a bridge. The resulting "inferno" MELTED the bridge, thus closing the Southbound lanes of I-75. IRCA Mexican Log, 3rd Edition, Now Available!

After months of preparation, IRCA has published the 1994 edition of the IRCA Mexican Log. The log lists all AM stations in Mexico by frequency, giving call letters, state, city, day power, night power, slogans, schedule in UTC/GMT, formats, networks, and notes. Stations that have changed frequency since 1990 are cross-referenced on the old frequency.

The call letter index gives call, frequency, city and state. The city index (listed by state, then city) gives frequency, call, day and night power. There is even a guide to the Spanish alphabet and numbers.

The log has been completely updated from the 1990 edition and carefully cross-checked by IRCA members in Mexico and the U.S. This is an indispensible reference for anyone who hears Mexican radio stations.

The power listed is 1KW. Hope to get a reply on that one. Nice to hear Bruce Portzer bought a Drake R8A. Hope he does well with it. I sure have been happy with my R8. Dan Sys recently commented on how poor OSLing is these days. Yes, it is really hard to get a QSL out of a lot of stations. It took about 2 years to finally get one from CFNL-590-Ft Nelson, B.C., after logging them around the Christmas of 93. The manager never answered me after making several calls and he hold me that he would reply. They are a NOR-NET station and their CE is in Edmonton most of the time, but the reports are mostly forwarded to him. After making more phone calls I ran him down in Edmonton. He said that he would answer, which he never did. In fact. I finally received my verie from the 3rd CE in the two year period! Canadian stations used to be excellent OSLers. I am now waiting for my CKMK-1240-Mackenzie, BC verie from CKPG. I wonder how long this one will take? It has been out 2-3 months so far. I could write pages on what I have gone through to get that QSL as most DXers that QSL could do. Again that question comes up "Is it worth it?" I still say YES!!! After getting over 2300+ OSLs in the past 31 years, it is really nice to look through the bunch, as many stations I will never hear again and it is nice to have something from them. Most of the time, I don't think of all the \$\$\$ I have spent, as most hobbies take \$\$\$. I get probably less than 50% return on first reports, but with the followups, phone calls, etc. it probably gets up in the 85-90% rate, but it is hard to obtain that. 

[2/9] it's been another interesting DX season so far, and it's not over yet. TAs have unfortunately not been plentiful since around Christmas, just a few weak hets from the big Spaniards and the Saudi giant on 1521. I did get good audio from Norway-1314 back in October, sent a taped report to NRK but have heard nothing back (sigh). Speaking of European stations, I've never heard a bloody word from Vatican Radio after a taped report and a follow-up for reception of 1611 back in December 1994 ... anybody got a tip for verifying them? WJDM-1660 has been a regular here -- noted last night (2/8) running Radio Aahs childrens' programming. Finally logged CBF-690 -- verie letter back in a week. Report out also to CKWX-1130 (thanks to Frank Merrill's tip in CDXR in DXM 1/27). Karl Zuk's review of the Sony AM Stereo Walkman (SRF-42, \$30) in Monitoring Times inspired me to go out and buy one. I had no prior experience with C-QUAM stereo (or AMAX-certified radios), and it certainly has been interesting. Early conclusions: the radio itself is cute, with fair sensitivity (especially when inductively coupled to my box loop!); audio quality is quite good out of the little mini-phone jack when using good hi-fi headphones or patching it into a component stereo. Two complaints: the slide rule dial is of necessity so tiny that it's hard to tune; and I thought AMAX-certified radios were supposed to have steep 10-kHzx notch filters. Despite the "AMAX" logo emblazoned on the case, the SRF-42 (this of course under nighttime skywave conditions when there are signals on every frequency). But the audio is nicely wide-band (especially noticeable compared to the severely rolled-off highs on my Yaesu FRG-100) with good stereo separation, and many stations sound virtually as good as FM (depending of course on the sort of audio processing they use even with the new NRSC standards, it sounds like many AM stations are still rolling off their highs around 6-8 kHz). As for C-QUAM itself: it's fine for local groundwave reception, but the wandering "platformmotion" and phase-shifting merry-go-round produced by skywave is enough to give me motion sickness!
