The call letter index gives call, frequency, city and state. The city index (listed by state, then city) gives frequency, call, day and night power. There is even a guide to the Spanish alphabet and numbers.

The log has been completely updated from the 1990 edition and carefully cross-checked by IRCA members in Mexico and the U.S. This is an indispensible reference for anyone who hears Mexican radio stations.

A little more on QSLing. A few months ago I logged a goodie, KSDT-1320-Hemet, CA. They run 550 watts day and 300 watts at night. They are also directional away from me. I am mostly a foreign DXer. but I do go after Domestics at times. I especially like the low powered Southern Californians. They are generally hard to hear and are only received during strong AU conditions. Many peak in signal after LSS into the early evenings. I have logged KVOY-1340-Mohave, KTYM-1460-Inglewood, KTSJ-1220-Pomona, and many others through the years. Since most are small stations, it can be hard to obtain the QSL from them. Once you do, it is really nice though. Well, I didn't hear from KSDT and I called them. The CE is the Engineer for a SS network and is quite busy. I didn't get him the first time, but recently I did catch him working at the station. Apparently KSDT does not get out well, and he was quite surprised when my report was received. He has promised to reply and is also the CE for KXSP-1590-Oxnard, which also I need a OSL from. Couldn't even find a new phone number or address for KXSP, so the phone call was really helpful, not only getting KSDT QSL'd and now KXSP. So QSLing takes a lot of work, but most of the time it still pays off. On OSLing, all you have to do is look at Ernie Cooper. He doesn't give up easily and his 4400+ QSLs must look great! I do use prepared QSL cards when nothing else works, so it is just a simple call change. I don't have a lot of prepared cards. Some DXers will not use them. I would rather not either, but sometimes you are lucky to get that back! Sometimes, I will wait a few years and relog the station and try to get a letter verie. Many times that works too. If not I still have the prepared card. Good DX to all. 73s Patrick

[2/23] Greetings! I got a nice letter from Muriel Murtagh at CHTN (which I have yet to hear), saying the all-night phone number for Good Time Oldies is 800-563-3003. I figure if I ever hear that number on 720, it's evidence I've logged my first Maritime. I've adopted a new policy that has boosted my "heard" totals: I'm now counting some stations without knowing their locations. Here I refer to simulcasts on a single frequency. I heard a new (for me) Cuban "Radio Progreso" outlet on 640 and the WRTH lists two stations there. I doubt they ever ID individually. I'm counting it as "Cuba-640-location unknown." Another is "Japan-1521" where the WRTH lists five I kw. NHK-2 stations, which transmit in parallel. Another is "Canada-BC-900" where I heard a simulcast of CBU-690; there are three 40 w. LPRT's listed. I had already counted was XEW-900-Mexico City (100 kw.), but the WRTH lists XEWB, a relay in Veracruz, on the same frequency with 50 kw. As of today's writing, I've heard 799 from Missoula, and the last 100 took about 11 months. I just figured out one reason I have yet to hear KGFX-1480-Sidney, MT, one of my hold-outs from this state: the NRC Log says it's silent. It pays to read the fine print! Oh well, by trying to hear it, I've logged some other nice catches on that frequency. Nice going, J.D., on KFQD. All I know for now. 73 and good DX.

[2/19] Bravo to Karl Zuk for his remarks about Ralph Sanserino and the publishing situation in the 2/17 Monitor! Karl nicely encapsulated my feelings. Moreover, a lot of the comments and suggestions for improving the Monitor, while well-intentioned, have frankly been preposterous. Improving the layout and printing quality of the bulletin takes MONEY. It might be interesting to take a copy of the Monitor (or DX News, for that matter) to a couple of local printing shops and ask for their quotes on two or three hundred copies; I think a lot of you would be shocked at how much a "low tech" bulletin like the Monitor costs. Add in the cost of improvements such as electronic page layout (like DX News uses), better paper, etc. and you'll soon understand the impracticality of much of what you've read about improving the bulletin in recent weeks. Things like Web page sites are also expensive. The real issue seems to be not whether an on-line version of the Monitor is an acceptable substitute for a print version, but whether an on-line version is an acceptable substitute for no Monitor at all. Ralph has been trying to quit for over two years, and his

suggestion for an on-line version in the 10/21/95 Monitor sounds very much like a man who's looking for some relief from the terrific burden of single-handedly doing the bulletin. And I think Phil Bytheway's remarks in the 12/2/95 bulletin weren't a joke. I sure as heck don't have the time to publish the bulletin, but I'm not opposed to an on-line version if that's the only way to keep IRCA alive. If you are opposed to an on-line Monitor, but haven't volunteered to take over for Ralph, then what's your solution to the publishing dilemma? On a DX-related note, I've had the JPS ANC-4 noise phaser in use here with a new Quantum Loop for a couple of weeks, and am amazed as how well the ANC-4 can zap tough electrical noise. If you have a severe local noise problem, you need to give the ANC-4 a serious look! 73



This is my first letter to the Forum since I joined the club last year. I really enjoy reading the DX Monitor each week, and I sure hope the club keeps the bulletin as I don't think I would spend the extra money for a computer and all the other accessories, etc. That said, let me move on--I've had a pretty productive DX season here. I've only gotten back into the DX hobby in June of 1995 and I have logged almost 400 stations now. When I first started out I thought I would be lucky just to cover every frequency, now I have 8 and 9 stations on some frequencies. Also, I have heard from all but 3 Canadian provinces, 32 states and the Caribbean and South America. This certainly is an interesting hobby and I have met some nice people in it. I can remember hearing KSL regularly from Markham, Ill., where I used to live, in the evenings when WJJD would sign off. I also heard KFI, Los Angeles, on frequent nights. Regarding verifications, I've been sending out tapes lately. It's a little more expensive but I seem to have better results. There certainly are a lot of stamp collectors out there—Good Listening. RCP-IN. (Welcome to the EDXF, Robert. While you were listening in Markham, I was over in Gary, Indiana twisting the dials—rce)

I recently visited the west coast of Florida for a week and heard a few interesting catches. On 530: KNN1706 at Fort Myers-Southwest Florida International Airport, with message by male. Gets out very well. The National Wildlife Preserve on Sanibel Island had an interesting duet of TIS stations. Start on 1610 and listen to a brief welcome message, then re-tune to 530 for a nearly endless message/tour of the park. 530 was much stronger than 1610, but had very muddy audio with a man and woman trading off. Also heard: 940 R. Reloj, Cuba, was off frequency to about 938 creating 24 hour a day havoc with Miami's WINZ - both very strong, the het whistle creating a mid-band marker. R. Reloj disappeared 2-17 and did not return. 1660 WJDM was an easy catch every night. 1180 R. Taino-Cuba very strong with Spanish/English bilingual shows. Still very lacking new American pop records. I heard cuts from the Eagles" "Hotel California" many times, just like last year. The new addition was a Barry Manilow Does Big Band disc, also played over and over along with many local Cuban acts. My hometown local WCBS-880 was usually in for ten minutes, then gone for ten minutes every night and much easier to catch late at night when the Venezuelan and Cuban stations cleared off the frequency. ZNS-1 1540 Bahamas was a strong signal from sunset to sunrise along with 1110 WBT and 870 WWL. Tune in between WWL and WCBS to catch some great satellite delay during the CBS net news on the hour! Also 790 South Miami is now WAXY-I remember it as Top 40 WFUN years ago. AM radio can certainly be renamed the Spanish Band in western Florida. Cubans and Latin and South American stations always dominant, especially at night. Does anyone have experience DXing at Key West? 73 KZ.
