**1997 IRCA REGULAR ELECTIONS**

Every two years the IRCA conducts Regular Elections to determine the  
 President, Secretary-Treasurer and seven members of the Board of  
 Directors. For the 1997 Regular Elections, nominations for the nine  
 offices begin on December 1 1996 and continue through January 15 1997.  
 An IRCA member is only allowed one nomination for each office. Once  
 nominations close, the Election Committee Chairman (ECC) sends a list  
 of those nominated to the Secretary-Treasurer who determines if those  
 nominated are eligible (must be an IRCA member for at least one year).  
 The candidates that are eligible will receive a letter from the ECC by  
 February 1 1997 indicating their nomination and listing all other  
 eligible nominations for the same office. Candidates must indicate to  
 the ECC by February 20 1997 whether they intend to run for office and  
 can submit a campaign statement at that time (candidates are not  
 required to submit a campaign statement). The ECC will prepare and  
 submit a ballot and campaign statements to the Publisher by March 1  
 1997 for inclusion in an appropriate March 1997 "DX Monitor". Ballots  
 must be received by the ECC by 0001, Mountain Local Time on May 1 1997  
 Send your IRCA officer nominations to IRCA's Election Committee

Greetings! There is a little DX going on around here, as I am trying to listen while working. I have my "shack" set up in a corner of my office in the basement, so in the late afternoon and at sunset, I have been turning on the radio, and using a speaker, DXing. This isn't as easy as it sounds, because first, I am used to headphones, and second, whenever something interesting pops up, I have to stop working, run across the room to make notes and check the tape recorder! I think it might be worthwhile to invest in a set of those wireless headphones, which would eliminate one of those problems. But, I guess I never dreamed before that I would actually be able to work and DX at the same time, so I feel fortunate. I decided to buck the odds and try for the KAMA-750 test, and at least got a tentative report, despite the 50,000 watt blowtorch of WSB bearing down! Actually, the Quantum loop did allow a small null of them, which let me hear some possible tone and codes at 0203. I wasn't so luck on another local channel, 790, in trying for the CIGM test; nothing heard, even with a nice null on WQXI. Really, at my location about 30 miles from Atlanta, WSB is the only local that is easily heard at night. All the rest are weak and easily nulled; in fact, if I want to listen to WGST at night, I use their FM on 105.7, as 640 is lost at sunset to low power and Fidel's station. I still haven't received a Kiwa MW loop as of yet; still backordered by Grove. I called them and there still are delays at the factory; looks like the demand is great for this loop. I have always liked using air-core loops, and although the Quantum is doing a good job, I still want to have the other type of loop around. The Quantum is a good traveler, and I always take it with me almost anywhere I go. My old 4-foot NRC loop is still around, but despite much effort, I just cannot get it to work properly; plus I really do not have the space for this monstrosity in my office! I hope to get up to my in-law's who live in a rural area close to Lake Chatuge near Hayesville, NC for a beverage session sometime this DX season. I haven't done this in a couple of years, so I think it would be fun. I also would like to make a trip up to the N GA mountains for a bandscan from GA's loftiest peak, Brasstown Bald, but this will depend on my work schedule, which shows no sign of a let-up anytime soon (but I'm not complaining, either). Good DX to all. 73.

KSD-550 has been sold by EZ Communications to the consortium led by Tim Dorsey and cable operator Charter Communications, who also own WIBV-1260, for \$13 million. The plan is to move the local talkers (Bill Wilkerson, Wendy Wiese, John Carney, Kevin Horrigan, Jim Holder and Dianna Proffitt) from 1260 to the much better 550 signal on Dec. 23. Some of the syndicated shows, including Dr. Laura and possible Art Bell, will wind up on 1260. EZ Communications will hold on to KFNS-590 and FM sisters KSD-FM 93.7, KYKY-98.1 and KEZK-102.5. The sale of KSD-550 has already received FCC approval. Zimmer Broadcasting Company has sold WKBQ-1380/104.1 and WKKX-106.5 to Emmis Broadcasting for \$42.5 million. Emmis also owns KSHE-94.7. No changes are planned for the stations except for moving the morning team of Steve Shannon and D.C.Chymes from WKBQ to KSHE. This deal is now awaiting FCC approval. Zimmer will hold on to its broadcast properties in Missouri and southern Illinois, and plans to expand its MVP Cellular retail chain. KMOX-1120 is now using KMOV-TV channel 4's radar system to keep track of oncoming storms; the two stations must have reached an agreement. Whether it may be a sign Westinghouse is interested in buying KMOV-TV is unknown. Channel 4, as a CBS affiliate, is the last remaining major network affiliate in the St. Louis market to broadcast in mono. I'm now back in a broadcast booth for the first time since August of 1995, getting a tryout as a part-time engineer and announcer for WGNU-920. I've been working every other Saturday from 1800 to 2400 (sometimes later) CLT since early October. WGNU's studios are really a time warp...the Harris board is from the 1960s, the turntables are probably from the late 1970s, the cart machines from the 1980s, and the compact disc players from the early 1990s. The station is located in the Senate Hotel on Union Boulevard, just north of Forest Park in St. Louis' Central West End.
