The BBC is trying to privatize its transmitting facilities, France has dropped an entire MW network (much to the excitement of European DXers), and Austria has or will return to MW. I also have various lists etc on hand, but I'll hold off on some until next time.

Note my new E-mail address. The old provider had a few problems, not unlike those of AOL.

#### **BBC TRANSMISSION SOLD**

(via Richard Buckby-UK, Jan 8, via WWDXC) The long awaited privatization of the BBC Transmitter networks seems to have finally taken place. According to today's "Daily Telegraph" the domestic network, which includes UHF TV, VHF/FM radio, and MW & LW sites, has gone to "The Castle Tower Corporation" a consortium which is based in Houston, Texas and operates 1.200 broadcast sites in the US and Caribbean. They are believed to be paying 210 million pounds for the network of 740 sites. The World Service sites will remain in the hands of its management via a buyout vehicle called "Merlin Communications International". The business is worth roughly 15 million pounds according to the London Daily Telegraph. Contracts are expected to be signed this month and the BBC will invest the proceeds from the domestic network in its proposed digital services. The proceeds from the World Service sell-off will go to the UK government.

Merlin Communications International, management and employee buyout team from the World Service's Program Delivery Service, is the preferred bidder for the World Service business. A consortium led by Houston, Texas-based Castle Tower Corporation, which operates more than 1,200 wireless and broadcast communication sites throughout the United States and the Caribbean, and including TeleDiffusion de France, is the preferred bidder for the Home Service business. No figures have been released by the Corporation as yet, but press estimate the value of the sale at somewhere above the book value of £210 million. The contract with the CTC Consortium is expected to be signed by the end of this month, with the signing of the

contract for the World Service business following as soon as practicable.

Proceeds from the Home Service sale will be used by the BBC to help finance its move into the digital age; proceeds from the World Service sale revert to the Government. Further details will be announced on the signing and completion of the contracts. Deputy director-general Bob Phillis, who has overseen the sale process, said: 'Our stated criteria were to select a preferred bidder in the best interests of the BBC, its license payers and its staff. This required us to evaluate the various financial, technical and qualitative factors. 'The Home Service management and employee buyout team made a very strong and professional bid, but this was an intensely competitive sale.'

Assets included in the Home Service sale are: A tenyear contract for transmission of BBC1 and BBC2 analog tv, BBC analog national, regional and local radio, DAB phase 1 and other services. Transmission HO at Warwick and most of the equipment there. Freeholds and leaseholds to 740 HST transmitter sites. including equipment. Site sharing agreement with NTL, the company which transmits commercial tv services. The benefit of contracts of employment with some 500 staff. Freeholds and leaseholds relating to property in Daventry, and at Brookman's Park in north London, Commercial contracts with third parties for other services. In the World Service deal, assets include: A ten-year contract for distribution of World Service radio; operation and maintenance of seven overseas sites (but not the sites themselves, which are being retained by the BBC/FCO). WS Program Delivery Service - the coordinator for delivering WS Radio to its audience (contracts with 67 staff plus access to the Bush House control room) - and World Service Transmission operations. Global Distribution System (a digital satellite system) and third party distribution contracts. Four UK sites, one FCO owned. Commercial contracts for hiring out transmission capacity in the UK and/or oversees.

#### 2 RADIO CAROLINES TO HIT THE AIR

[via DSWCI]... Rob Eden, former Caroline and Radio Northsea International disc-jockey sends us an e-mail, via Hans Nott [phonetic], that Radio Caroline may be coming back, starting with test transmissions any day from a location in Country Louth in Ireland, rather than from offshore waters.

The frequency is 864 kHz with a high-power transmitter formerly used by Radio Nova [a commercial radio station which operated from the Republic of Ireland during the 1980s]. Most of the finance will come from religious programmes, and the music shows are to be recorded in the UK.

In the meantime, Peter Moore, who was station manager for Caroline from 1987-1990, says he's signed a contract for leasing satellite airtime under the name Radio Caroline and that these broadcasts will also start soon from aboard the "Ross Revenge", the Caroline radio-ship temporarily anchored in Chatham harbour [in Kent, United Kingdom]. It's not known yet which transponder and when the transmissions will start. (Media Network/Radio Netherlands 6 Feb via BBCM)

#### TRANS ATLANTIC

AUSTRIA: The 1476 xr is back on the air again. As of 1/17 1830-1930 UTC, 7 different broadcasting groups will use the Vienna Bisamberg xr again, power is 600 kW. Transmitter may also used for foreign broadcasts in Serbian to Yugoslavia [WWDXC]

BELGIUM: BRTN 1512 will cease all GG, SS, & AA pgms 10/26/97. BRTN Monopoly will end later this year, paving the way for commercial MW/FM stations. [Arctic]

ESTONIA: Here is a list of medium wave transmitters in Estonia. This list was found on the web site operated by their counterpart to the FCC. The list also included a bunch of indecipherable technical info which I edited out (the explanatory text was printed in Estonian). All transmitters are apparently non directional.

FRANCE: all medium wave stations carrying France Inter (or Network A, as the WRTH calls it) are now silent. They have gone due to budget cuts voted by the French parliament. Listeners have been 0Dadvised to retune to FM. What's still unclear however is whether

the MW frequencies will come up0Dagain when major sporting events are on. These are normally carried on AM while the normal programme goes out on VHF/FM. If they are not reactivated on those days people will have to tune to 162 kHz LW, which is very poor in many areas, it suffers greatly from interference from east European stations and at times also from the so-called "Luxembourg effect". Well, we'll see what happens on January 25, when the French soccer season starts again. Another mystery is what will happen to the Lille transmitter on 1071, which at certain times carried "Radio Urgence" (the station for the homeless) in the north of the country. The worst part of it all is the closure of the Marseille transmitter on 675 (600 kW), as this was the only link many French nationals in North Africa kept with home. 162 is no good in Algeria or Tunisia whereas 675 was heard there almost like a local station. As usual in such cases, those who can afford it will buy satellite dishes. but the poorer part of the population won't. Also the government here keeps pestering us with the promotion the French language and culture in the world (and especially in the Mahgreb) and all they do is scrap a radio station that was the best instrument for that! The Nancy transmitter on 837 (Radio Bleue, Network B) was also silent on New Year's Day but it is back now with a greatly improved signal (both HF and audiowise). My guess is that the engineers have converted the 1350 transmitter to 837. It now covers my area (the Rhine valley) with a very good signal. The Sé lestat transmitter on 1278 (WRTH says Strasbourg, but it is actually Sé lestat) carries many regional opt-out programs, so Radio Bleue was at times not available to many of us. About two million people live in that area. Until last November 1278 was also used for the German programs of Radio France Internationale, but RFI have decided to broadcast these only via satellite and a couple of FM outlets and cable networks in Germany. However the time slot previously used for German (1800 to 1900 daily) is still used by RFI. A French program is now carried on 1278. The silly thing about it is that they have chosen to put the French program to Africa on that channel instead of the European version. RFI to Africa is now heard with very good signal strength in many parts of central Europe while the programs for Europe (only available on SW) are very difficult to receive due to the present conditions on SW. [Friess,

Radio France International observed on 675, on 2/9 at 1910, with a programme for Africa. This one was off the air again after 1930.[Bruelhart, MWC]

GERMANY: Voice of Russia relay via 1323 Wachenbrunn Germany: 0600-1000 & 1200-1600 English. 1000-1200 & 1600-2000 German. 2000-2100 Russian, 2100-2200 French, 2200-2300 Portuguese. Same schedule exc. Portuguese via 693 Berlin

Uhlenhorst (at estimated 5kW low power). [BDXC] WDR2-720 is now back to full power [Arctic]

MACEDONIA(?): 849 UNID is being hrd w/good/very good signal in Italy. Male & female announcers in Albanian/Macedonian (probably), with music and phone-in around 1635 hrs. At 1700 time check, news then kind of music contest (it sounds like radio concursico musico) until 1740. No identification noted but some telephone calls were from Tirana. Still there with good audio at 1850. [Buchanan, MWC] Unid Albanian/Macedonian station, at first logged on 849 and recently moved on 852, it's off the air since 27 January. [Buchanan, MWC]

NETHERLANDS: Since January 1st the Dutch station Talk Radio has occupied the 1395 channel replacing Jazz R which is now only available on cable in Holland. In its last few days Jazz R was advertising a survival kit; perhaps it would help those listeners who liked to hear it on MW. Talk Radio announces itself as 24 hr [Whitt, MWC] Radio 5 891 now signs off at 2130, 2200 Sat 2140 Sun [Arctic]

QATAR: Harris Corp has received an order for a 2000 kw xr to be installed at Al-Arish, no freq given [Harris press release]

TANZANIA: Radio One, previously FM only, is now also on 1440 [PlayDX]

UNITED KINGDOM: Radio Argus London was transmitting on 783 before Xmas and announcing a move to 1125. In actual fact they moved to 819 with an appallingly modulated transmitter. They plan to use 1125 and 819 so monitor these channels for rock music. [Whitt, MWC]

#### TRANS PACIFIC

HONG KONG: The BBC SW relay here has closed down for good, all antennas have been taken down and along with the xrs are being packed up for shipment to an as yet unknown location [WWDXC] The three commercial AM broadcasters in Osaka, Japan, announced February 7 that they will together set up a 300-watt relay transmitter in Kyoto to improve nighttime reception. The stations are JONR (1008), JOOR (1179), and JOUF (1314), all 50 kW. If approved as expected, the new relay station will start operation in April. The new frequencies were not announced today. [Ashimori, Hard Core DX]

NEW ZEALAND: V of the Mountains 1422 noted with a much improved signal, possible xr/ant upgrade. Sports Radio Hamilton has moved from 576 to 792. Counties Manukau R 936 began operation on 10/7,

making it the 24th station in the Auckland area.

Auckland Maori stn Ruia Mai 1179 operates
0700-0900 & 1830-2130 daily. The BBC relay on 990
has upgraded its xr and is now "10 times as powerful"
[DXC/NZDXT]
