For WQO767-1640/1680, the PO address was also reported as PO Box 619428 and PO Drawer DFW, but P O Drawer 619428 was reported most frequently. Tom reports that only the WOO767 call is printed on the QSL card, with no mention of the WQA767 call reportedly heard by several DXers. Patrick notes that his reception of WQO767 on 1680 was the first reported to the station. Gary sends along information about the signer of his CalTrans TIS on 1620 kHz, that he reported back in November, and Patrick reported a month or two later. According to Gary's latest report, the signer is Shahram Shahriari, Senior Transportation Electrical Engineer, CalTrans District 12. This spelling is different from that in Gary's first report, and from that in Patrick's later report, so I guess DXers will have to make up their own mind. Gary mentioned that the information was hand printed on his prepared card. Thanks for trying to clear this up, Gary! Bob Pote notes that he has had a little more success coaxing veries out of stations by sending his follow-up reports to the General Manager. Per column policy, a large number of tips, particularly veries from stations which conducted DX Tests, were not included because essentially the same information was included in the February and March columns. I was the one who initially called it KXBA after hearing it that way during its dual-lds (old and not yet approved new) last fall. After reading in DXM that it was KXPA, I thought perhaps it was KXBA when I heard it but changed when KXPA became available. This concept appeared to be substantiated in DXM #34 when KXPA-1240 Pasadena was granted KBLV (sounded like a common ownership call swap since 1540 was KBLV before KXPA). Not so, according to the station. Meanwhile, KXPA was off this morning (4/21) and KNWX's harmonic was loud and clear in the car between University Place and home;

however, it was not audible on a home set. So much for car radios. KKBY-1450 has reversed its trend of being off more that it was on - but for what? On Saturday 4/19, it was noted for a half hour transmitting a CD which had stuck (til tune-out; not //FM). If you call KXPA, the receptionist answers

"KXPA/KKMO;" if you call KKMO you get three menu options - KKMO, KBRO and KNTB. Tom Jasinski, 419 North Raven Road, Shorewood, Illinois 60431-9640 I am sure most of you have heard about (or have actually heard) one or more of the four (yes 4) new Railway Station TIS's in the Chicago Call signs are all WPGE-863 and all operate on 1630 kHz. four have the characteristic Train Whistle sounds. A few have gotten out well and have been heard as far away as Manitoba! There has also been some confusion about where some are located. On Sunday, April 6th, I set out to find and record all of them. After 160 miles of stop and go driving I did manage to find all four! Here is where they are located: #1 - east side of Mokena, at US Rt 45 and I-80, at the Hickory Creek Metra RR station (1/2 mile south of the WLS transmitter site!). # 2 - Aurora/Naperville area at the RT59 Metra RR station. - south side of Schaumburg at the Springinsguth Road Metra RR station. #4 - Deerfield at the Lake Cook Road Metra RR station (south east side of Deerfield and north edge of Northbrook). There is no station in Buffalo Grove! Was able to see each transmitting antenna (about 8 ft long whip mounted on 20 foot high pole). Antennas are all located near the RR stations (from a few feet to about 200 feet away). I made a tape of each from RR station parking lot. All four stations have short recorded tape loops that mention future traffic informat scheduling for the commuter service. Each one covers approx. information scheduling for the commuter service. Each one covers approx. 10 mile diameter area with a decent signal on the car radio. Let's see if DX'ers can hear all four of them! (Tom, is the message different from each location or are they identical? I'm wondering since you said they have the same call--rce)

No indication of the exact source of this one. Another 1620 is on the air in Yonkers called "Pinpoint Radio" supposedly a Part 15 gimmick to bolster sales for stores. It gets out very well using a loaded CB whip and a CD player as a program source. It is way over power and marketed by a guy named Joseph Dweck from an office in Manhattan. Recently visited Las Vegas for the NAB convention. Heard KNXO "Casino Radio" on 1140 with a continuous ad loop for events at casinos and local businesses, very much like a TIS station. It has been awhile since I've sent along a forum and while I'm at it I'll send congrats to the IRCA for another fine year. DX has been slow-very slow but a couple of interesting items have crossed over from unheard to heard, hi. I've caught the Northeast Illinois railway TIS on 1630 doing battle with KXBT on several recent occasions beginning from Mid-March, call is WQBE-863 and has very distinctive pulse tone and train sounding hoots before announcements. (see Tom Jasinski's Forum report in this column also--rce) The Dallas airport TIS on 1640 has also made it here, call on 1640 is definitely WQA-767. Another TIS that has been heard here many times is WBJB-404 in the Staunton, VA area with many mentions of the Blue Ridge area and I-81 on 1620. These three seem to get out awfully well. One that I caught on 4/2 at 0600 was WDER-1320 Derry, NH on s/on with mentions of their program guide available. This was heard with near daylight conditions here just before the time change. Which brings me to a point that SRS and SSS skip have been narrowed to very slim openings just before and after these events due to so much QRM from way too many stations on the air full-time, that aside from these very brief transitional times near sunrise and sunset that DXing the regular 540-1600 part of the dial has become useless to nearly impossible. Didn't get a chance to listen for it, though. Just too much happening at once, not much of it good, I'm afraid. The good news here is that I managed to get back onto America On Line, and I'm still not sure what actually happened back in January. I was told then over the phone that someone had stolen my password, and thus my right to use AOL was taken away. A couple weeks later, I received a bill from AOL (for a book I had ordered) and they said it was because my credit card company wouldn't honor the charge, but that if I gave them the correct number, I could go back on line if I wished. I gave them the number for a different card, and for a month or so, I would try every so often to get on with no luck. In mid-April, I found the charge on my statement, made another attempt and got thru. course, I changed the password the same night. Since my experience in January, I have been told (and it was confirmed to me by a rep from Bell South, my local phone company and an ISP provider) that while some programs are being downloaded from AOL, CompuServ, and the other providers, your password is being downloaded the other direction, allowing the person who designed the program to help themselves to your account without you being aware of it. Two days before my "fun", I had downloaded a Ms. PacMan program, so who knows? I've also found out that there are programs that run like a dictionary looking for ordinary words being used as passwords, and mine was in a sense a normal word which I could also have used as a CB handle. My advice to all is to change your password on a regular basis and don't let it be like a normal word. like AOL and there is stuff it provides that I don't know that I could easily find elsewhere, so I didn't want to give it up. I did give CompuServ a free trial and dumped it within a week because I didn't like it. See you next month, hopefully with some DX.
