Pat Martin of Seaside, OR passes on the following info:

Got a phone call this afternoon from the owner of KLDY/KBRD. According to his info. Here is what I found out:

(1) KBRD-680 is currently 250w operating from a 190 foot tower. They are going to be triplexed to KLDY-1280 in the near future. KLDY-1280 is using a 400 foot tower. After the triplexing (also with KGHO-920), KBRD will apply for 800w (That is the most power they can have without a directional antenna, because of KOMW-680-Omak WA and CBU-690)

(2) KGHO-920 is operating with 3000 watts days ND. He claims KGHO is not on at night as they do not have a directional system in place.

(3) KLDY-1280 is operating with 425 watts day and 225 watts nights ND. With the 400 foot tower, they cannot have the 1/.5 listed.

1340 KEWE CA, OROVILLE, ewc w/NOS format "KIWI AM 1340" IDs at 0530 EDT 5/24.

Eric Bueneman of St. Louis, MO. passes along the following information:

For only the second time in franchise history, a station other than KMOX-1120 will be carrying St. Louis Blues hockey games. And, for the first time, the Blues will be carried on FM in St. Louis. Local ABC affiliate KTRS-550 (formerly known as KSD and KUSA), a 5 kW full-time news/talk station, has snatched the rights to the National Hockey League's St. Louis Blues away from KMOX-1120. The Blues apparently didn't want to play second fiddle to KMOX's coverage of Major League Baseball's St. Louis Cardinals. The Blues games that had been pre-empted by KMOX were moved to KFNS-590 (Wood River, IL)/KFNS-FM 100.7 (Troy, MO) the past several seasons. KTRS' advantages are AM Stereo operations (in which KMOX recently dropped) and it's low frequency, allowing for better coverage for daytime games. However, there is one drawback to moving to KTRS; their night signal has a null to the east to protect WKRC Cincinnati, OH, thus leaving gaps in coverage in Illinois. KTRS has asked non-commercial WSIE-88.7 Edwardsville, IL to also carry the Blues games, to fill the coverage gaps in Illinois left by the KTRS null toward WKRC. This is apparently the first time that a non-commercial, educational radio station has been asked to carry the games of a major league sports franchise. WSIE has an effective radiated power of 50,000 watts horizontal/41,000 watts vertical, and is directional to protect KUMR-88.5 Rolla, MO and KJLU-88.9 Jefferson City, MO. Their format is jazz, with affiliation from Public Radio International. The only other station that had the Blues rights was KKOK-630 (now 97.1 FM), which held the rights during the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. The Blues will be the primary sports team aired on KTRS.

Pat Martin forwards some information from Tim Hall: Here are some format changes/additions I noted while traveling to and from Wyoming and South Dakota the last 2 weeks:

- 1550 KYTO-NV Reno, Liberty Works new age and cult talk (a pretty creepy station!)

While in Wyoming on Wednesday I heard an announcement on KLDI-1210 that "Cowboy Country is moving to AM 1210 tomorrow, June 1st." KOWB-1290 was running talk shows at that time.

Does anyone know if the KOWB calls have moved to 1210? (Neither station is commonly heard down here).

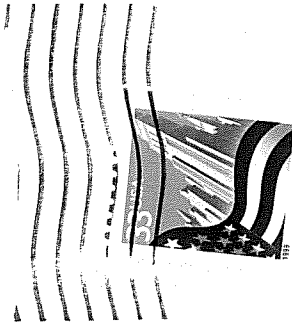

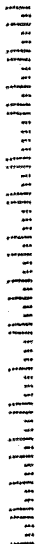
