- 550 (CFJC) <u>BC</u>, Kamloops I have just confirmed via Okanagan Broadcasters that CFJC did indeed go silent back on Nov. 30th. They are now CKBZ-100.1 (B100). (DS-BC)
- 940 KCIN <u>UT</u>, Cedar City 12/17 1855 C&W tunes to 1859:53 legal ID by man, "Southern Utah's Country Tradition, KCIN Cedar City, Classic Kickin' Country 940," 1900 AP Network news. NO mention of KNNZ in the ID, and NO mention of FM. One DX'er received a verie from them in November verifing reception of KCIN-AM, and another received a verie about the same time, stating that the AM was still KNNZ, and that the FM was KCIN. The FCC database still shows the call as KNNZ. Don Kaskey clearly heard it as KCIN. Does anybody REALLY know what's going on? I'm counting it as KCIN, based on the legal ID, which very clearly stated and gives call, frequency, and location of AM. (JW-CO)
- 1070 KFTI <u>KS</u>, Wichita another "controversy" here. An area DX'er phoned the station in November and was told that the station had changed calls to KFTI, ex-KFDI. Others claim the station is still KFDI. Anybody REALLY know? I sent a report to the station which, of course, has not been answered. (JW-CO)
- 1570 (CKEG)  $\underline{BC}$ , Nanaimo 12/14 1900 left the air for good today. Now known as CHWF-106.9 "The Wolf," (DS-BC) + 12/14 fair with AOR music at 1750, ID for FM at 1756, more AOR music,
- + 12/14 fair with AOR music at 1750, ID for FM at 1756, more AOR music, then at 1800 dead air & within a couple minutes carrier cut. The end of an era. Station is now on FM only. (PM-OR)
- 580 KZMX <u>SD</u>, Hot Springs 12/10 1757 C&W music, legal ID at 1759:40 "Serving the Southern Black Hills since 1958.. (sung: "Dakota Real Country Muisc").. 580 AM KZMX, 96.7 FM Hot Springs, United States" and into ABC news. Fair. (JW-CO)
- 590 CFAR MB, Flin Flon 12/14 0942 updates in "CFAR 590 NHL hockey draft." (NPAB)
- 620 KMJC <u>CA</u>, Mt. Shasta City 12/15 2134 faded up over KDBZ with basketball between the Cougars and the Bears, mentions of Central Valley, which tipped me off; faded down but back at 2144 with ad for jewelers in Mt. Shasta City; on 29 watts night power? At times completely dominant on channel. No calls heard. New from Davis. (RT-CA)
- 630 KIDO <u>ID</u>, Boise 12/8 0100 weak in local KEWS splatter. News and weak ID. Not heard for a while. (GH-OR)
  - KCIS WA, Edmonds 12/20 1112-1125+ atop with local talk/discussion show including incoming telephone calls on local environmental concerns. Had ads & mentions of Bremerton, Edmonds, etc. Open line for calls was 396-2122. Lost to KPTT etal by 1127. (DKK-CA)

- 670 KIRN <u>CA</u>, Simi Valley 12/7 0000-0100 no ID given or interpreted but certainly the one with the middle eastern dialect and strange music. Sounded very Iranian. Rarely does any station get over the top of KIDO on 670. New log! (GH-OR)
- 700 WLW OH, Cincinnati 12/15 2158 ad for men's wear store, ID's as "Newsradio 700 WLW." (NP-AB)
- 720 KFIR OR, Sweet Home 12/19 1925 promo for news on KFIR, then spot promoting shopping locally and ID as "Better Country, KFIR." (NP-AB)
- 760 KTLK CO, Thornton 12/16 1000 on top of channel with good signal; string of PSA's, then slogans "Denver's Sports Leader KTLK" and "760 The Zone."

  Also mentions of Clear Channel Colorado. (RT-CA)
- 790 KSPD <u>ID</u>, Boise 12/16 0840 REL music, KSPD ID at 0842, fair/poor. Idaho #23. (AB-CA)
- 800 KPDQ <u>OR</u>, Portland strong 12/12 0600. On 12/11 0300 with ID and True Talk 800, with talk show. How PM heard KDFO, I don't know, I can't hear it here in daytime and at night I hear Portland strong. (GJ-CA)
- 860 KMVP <u>AZ</u>, Phoenix finally heard after two years of trying at 1000 on 12/10. A sports show ended, followed by short ID. It was about even with a talk station, probably KPAM or KTRB. (LG-MT)
- 880 KRVN <u>NE</u>, Lexington 12/18 0714 news, ID, stock market news, and sports. Fair/poor. (AB-CA)
- 899.9 KELP TX, Floydada 12/19 0849 with infomercial for mattress pad; USA news at 0900; then area agribusiness report, with heavy emphasis on cotton (cotton prices, spots for cotton growers and cotton seed, etc). Faded away at 0915.

  Not very strong but separable on LSB from the 900 group. Last heard as KKAP. (JW-CO)
- 930 KROE  $\underline{WY}$ , Sheridan 12/16 1830 ID by a woman "AM 930, KROE," then into song by Three Dog Night. (NP-AB)
- 960 KABL <u>CA</u>, Oakland 12/4 0030 fair to moderate signal mostly atop non-ID'ing Spanish speaker. Old time radio show and "960 Cable" ID. (GH-OR)
  - CFAC AB, Calgary 12/21 0201 under KABL with Sporting News Radio program and CFAC ID. Listened for awhile Kevin but didn't hear "The Juice" or "The Deuce." Sorry. (DKK-CA)
- 980 CJME <u>SK</u>, Regina heard at 0756 on 12/15 and 2255 on 12/17, with a continuous tape loop advising CKRM listeners to switch to 620. There were four tones between announcements, which should be easy to pick out by DX'ers who try for this one. (LG-MT)
- 990 KTKT <u>AZ</u>, Tucson was dominant at 0958 on 12/10 with ad for a local magazine, then ID as "KTKT, your information station." Strong signal, but rare. (LG-MT)
- 1019.63 KINF NM, Roswell 12/14 1930 noted here with Paul Harvey news, followed by a Rosemary Clooney song at 1935. Back on 1020 the next day. (JW-CO)
- 1030 KMAS <u>WA</u>, Shelton 12/20 1138 most likely the station with music steadily beneath a very strong KLLU. (DKK-CA)
- 1040 KLVP OR, Tigard 12/21 1039 relatively good signal with no CKST QRM with Contemporary Christian songs. CKST back on top by 1050. (DKK-CA)
- 1050 KORE <u>OR</u>, Springfield 12/6 0000 dominant in the jumble. Man gave ID and station address, then soon faded down. Weak. (GH-OR)
- 1090 KYCW <u>WA</u>, Seattle 12/20 1143 nicely atop with ID 1143 "Extreme Talk Radio" and KYCW and local ads. Has been a regular at this time lately. Where are KLWJ & KTNS? (DKK-CA)
- 1100 WTAM OH, Cleveland 12/15 2300 end of Cavaliers broadcast, then WTAM ID heard through KNZZ. (NP-AB)
- 1170 KCBQ  $\underline{CA}$ , San Diego was strong on the car radio at 1930 on 12/20 with ID during local news and traffic update. QRM from KLOK. (LG-MT)

- KLOK <u>CA</u>, San Jose was atop KBCQ at 1940 on 12/20, in Spanish, on the car radio with local talk show (man & woman hosts). The ID was "Radio Tricolor, la Mexicanisima." (LG-MT)
- 1190 ?KMYL? <u>AZ</u>, Tolleson was perhaps the station with an ID that sounded like KRDS, the old call, at 0758 on 12/12. Maybe KRDS is now an FM affiliate? (LG-MT)
  - WOWO IN, Fort Wayne 12/15 2106 great signal for over an hour, with Komets hockey, ad for Hoosier lottery, ID's as "Newstalk 1190 WoWo, WOWO, Fort Wayne." (NP-AB)
- 1220 KLVZ <u>CO</u>, Denver had a signal surge at 0800 on 12/14 and ID at 0801. I guess it boosts power then. (LG-MT)
  - CHSC  $\underline{ON}$ , St. Catherines 12/15 fair with oldies music and "12-20 CHSC" ID at 0300. (PM-OR)
  - CJRL ON, Kenora 12/16 0104 weather by a man, ID "...right here on 1220 CJRL,: into pop oldies. (NP-AB)
- 1270 KXBX <u>CA</u>, Lakeport 12/16 ID at 1300 "KXBX Lakeport" and "Home of Oakland Raiders football, AM 1270 KXBX." 500 watts. (GJ-CA)
  - KAJO <u>OR</u>, Grants pass 12/16 1145-1205 1145 religious program (Grace For Today), 1200 ID "KAJO Grants Pass," AP Network news, then weather 1203-1204. Spanish programming in background (no listing in NRC Log). (GJ-CA)
- 1290 KPAY <u>CA</u>, Chico 12/16 0900 snuck through with call ID during pause on KOUU, with KGVO-MT off. (LG-MT)
  - KOUU <u>ID</u>, Pocatello 12/16 ID'd with call and "The Country Cow" after a Christmas carol at 0900, with local KGVO off. (LG-MT)
- 1310 KZIP TX, Amarillo 12/17 2059 out of a Tejano song and into ID at 2059:40, some words not clear "Crosstown(?) Amarillo...the cities combine(?), Tejano 1310 KZIP, La Pura Onda," then more Tejano stuff. Fair, but soon faded. Listed as daytimer. (JW-CO)
- 1320 KCTC <u>CA</u>, Sacramento 12/8 0120 man said "You're listening to the greatest hits of the 40's, 50's and 60's on KCTC Sacramento," into NOS music. (GH-OR)
- 1330 KFH  $\underline{\text{KS}}$ , Wichita 12/15 fair on top with "Hot Talk 13-30 KFH" ID, then into Art Bell show at 0306. (PM-OR)
  - KMNN MN, Minneapolis 12/15 fair trading places with KFH with news, ID at 0310 "Newsradio, MNN." (PM-OR)
- 1360 KOHU <u>OR</u>, Hermiston 12/19 1913 "Nobody plays a better variety than 1360 KOHU." then into country music. (NP-AB)
- 1380 (KTKZ) CA, Sacramento 12/16 noted off 1040 until return 1147. (RT-CA)
  - KWJL <u>CA</u>, Lancaster 12/16 1052 Christmas music, then "The new K-Jewel 1380" slogan. Strong for a few minutes, but soon jumble took over. (RT-CA)
    - + 12/16 1144 "Music and memories station" slogan, into "White Christmas" by Perry Como. Good until KTKZ came on at 1146. (AB-CA)
  - KSRV <u>OR</u>, Ontario 12/16 1106 faded up over KRKO with "Treasure Valley Live," gave phone number, "Newstalk 1380 KSRV" ID, into call-in show on pets. New from Davis. (RT-CA)
    - + 12/20 1150 strongly atop with regional events, NYE happenings, etc. (DKK-CA)
  - KRKO <u>WA</u>, Everett 12/16 1100 religious sermons, top of hour call ID, into local news with mentions of new aircraft orders for Boeing. More sermons afterward, sponsored by First Presbyerian Church of Everett. Strong, on top of this time but soon lost to KSRV. (RT-CA)
- 1390 KBBO <u>WA</u>, Yakima 12/6 0100 legal ID and religious music. Choppy signal plowing through the static with a very faint KLGN in the background. Hammarlund on E/W wire. (GH-OR)
- 1400 KBRB NE, Ainsworth 12/18 1845 weather by a man, then local sports scores, funeral announcements, NE & SD news, ID "KBRB newstime 6 minutes from the hour of 6 o'clock." (NP-AB)

- 1410 KIIX <u>CO</u>, Fort Collins 12/19 1950 ID in a jumble as "Celebrity Sports Talk USA 1410 KIIX." (NP-AB)
- 1450 KGAM <u>CA</u>, Palm Springs 12/16 0930 960 watts, ID & mention of The Boomer on Mondays and weekdays, also Palm Springs golf giveaway. Nice signal but gone 0940. Sports station in background, no ID, ESPN Sports (NRC Log lists several sports station but no ESPN). (GJ-CA)
  - KTIP <u>CA</u>, Porterville 12/17 0233 with local ads atop. ID 0234. KEST was off for a few minutes. (DKK-CA)
- 1490 KCID <u>ID</u>, Caldwell 12/15 0233 with ID "Music of the 70's and 80's KCID." Haven't heard for a spell. (DKK-CA)
- 1510 KIRV <u>CA</u>, Fresno 12/16 1015 call ID heard under KGA, then into church choir type music; unneeded but first time heard in 2001. Usually KFNN gives KGA fits at sunrise but not today. (RT-CA)
- 1520 KSIB <u>IA</u>, Creston 12/14 0933 SW Iowa sports (high school) lineup; ads; 0940 "Trading Post" program, with address & phone per NRC AM Log. ID's as "Creston Radio." Fair, mixing with stations from all over the place: OK, MN, ND. CA and CHIH. (JW-CO)
- 1540 KASA AZ, Phoenix 12/20 0944 Christmas music in Spanish, male announcer with ad block(?), mention "Casa" several times. 1530-KFBK slop and co-freq KMPC QRM. AZ #29. (AB-CA)
  - KZMP TX, University Park 12/14 1850 ad cluster, slogan at 1855 "Esta es su estacion en el 101.7 FM y 1540 AM, Radio Tricolor, Mexicanisima" and into music; legal ID at 1901 "K???-FM and KZMP-AM Fort Worth-Dallas," then repeated in Spanish. NRC Log lists University Park as City of License. News followed, then more music, dedications, gal DJ, slogans, etc. Good in KXEL null. (JW-CO)
  - KXPA <u>WA</u>, Bellevue 12/20 atop in KMPC null 0204-0215+ with Spanish program.

    Began program on football (soccer) in Spanish at 0210. ID in English 0300.

    Also noted 12/20 1140-1200 in clear with a good signal in Spanish. (DKK-CA)
- 1560 WQEW New York 12/15 2258 Radio Disney programming, legal ID "AM 1560 WQEW New York City." (NP-AB)
- 1570 KCVR <u>CA</u>, Lodi 12/12 0955 talk in Spanish; 1000 "Noticias Radio Romantica" (headlines); 1001:50 legal ID "KCVR Lodi..." by man, then gal said "Quince Setenta AM, Radio Romantica," followed by vocal music. Only heard once before, on a DX test a few years ago. (JW-CO)
  - CKMW MB, Winkler 12/15 good with usual C&W music at 0305, "Country 15-70 CKMW" ID. Really odd to hear this with no QRM from CKEG. This looks like a dandy frequency now. At least until our local is built on 1570, if it is. (PM-OR)
    - + 12/20 0410 poor signal mixing with two Spanish stations (likely KCVR & XERF). C&W with nice clear "1570 CKMW" ID heard. New. (DS-BC)

#### HELP WITH UNID'S

1200 Glen Hansen's "KYA oldies" is KYAA Soquel, CA. They give a legal ID at top of the hour. KYA (now KOIT) was the dominant top 40 station in the San Francisco Bay Area in the 60's/early 70's. By using that slogan I suspect they are trying to snag listeners who remember KYA. (DG-CA)

- 1170 CBS station with a problem ran tape loop "CBS Radio Network Channel 32" at 2303 on 12/15. Heavy QRM from CBS affiliate KVOO. (LG-MT)
- 1380 12/16 1040 country music station with "The Station for today's hot new country" on top of channel, no local ads or calls heard. Soon faded away. (RT-CA)

- PQ, Ville-Marie. 12-15 fair. 17:42 with country and Christmas music. FF 710 CKVM talk. No calls noted. [JJR-WI]
- ON, Sudbury. 12-22 fair. Loud. 06:50 with country, calls. [JJR-WI] CIGM
- 800 CKDR ON, Dryden. 12-22 fair, steady. 07:47 with calls after Ad/Con song. Only 1kW. [JJR-WI]

- CBA NB, Moncton. 12-22 fair. No WTSO. 06:38 with very localized weather, 1070 Tcs. [JJR-WI]
- TN, Kingsport. 12-5 fair to good. 19:10 with "Power Talk for the Tri-1090 WHGG Cities" and calls. Is this a format change? Listed as religious. This logging thanks to a tip from **Bill Dvorak**. [TN-WI]

# Chamberlain, Maine DXpedition Report

December 7 - 9, 2001

I enjoyed a nice weekend DXpedition at the "DX Cottage" apartment on the rocky shore of Muscongus Bay overlooking the Atlantic. It began with a beautiful sunset and an even more spectacular sunrise, and ended with a light snow coating the rocks and antennas that made retrieving the wires more challenging. My interest, of course, was in mediumwaye DX, but it was fun listening to Russian domestics, African signals including Madagascar 5010, and some of the Pacific stations on shortwave too, as they were being chased by heralded DXers Jerry Berg of BADX, Dan Henderson (a re-acquaintance), and George Maroti (a new acquaintance). While I was the only mediumwaye DX representative, they dropped down to the broadcast band every once in awhile to check out strong signals from Morocco, England, Venezuela, and Mauritania-783 parallel 4845 shortwave. The following are my mediumwave log entries. I didn't bother with writing down details on the numerous signals received from Progreso/Reloj-Cuba, COPE/RNE/SER-Spain, and France Bleu, including just enough to get a feel for conditions. With mediocre transatlantic conditions at best, I concentrated my efforts on Latin American DX through the early morning hours, dominated by Venezuela as the south wire seemed to cut a path across Cuba. Panama and Nicaragua were received during local dawn, notably absent were Brazil and any serious transatlantic mediumwave DX. Some of the more interesting domestic signals wrap up the report, with WIOD dominating 610 at night and daytime signals from WLW, WPHT, and WPTX.

**THAILAND:** The military was told to explain why it wants to retain its broadcast frequencies and prevent them from being redistributed, said defence spokesman Lt-Gen Surapan Phumkaew. He said Defence Minister Chavalit Yongchaiyudh ordered the military to set out its reasons and submit them to the National Broadcast Committee and the National Telecommunications Committee.

The committees were neutral regulatory bodies charged with distributing frequencies and supervising radio and television businesses. The spokesman said Gen Chavalit ordered a panel be set up to find out why the military should keep the frequencies. The armed forces were given a month to convey their reasons.

- The military must be able to convince the public of the benefits to be had if it continues operating the frequencies, he said. The spokesman said the Defence Ministry would probably try to retain all 202 radio frequencies, including two television stations. Of these, three radio stations belong to the defence permanent secretary's office, 14 radio stations to the Supreme Command headquarters, 126 radio stations and television channels 5 and 7 to the army, 21 radio stations to the navy, and 36 radio stations to the air force. Lt-Gen Surapan said the military wanted to maintain the stations to safeguard national security and protect the public interest. He said the navy wanted to keep its frequencies to assist in its many duties at sea and he pointed out current frequencies were far from sufficient.
- This may sound intangible but maximising security benefits the public in ways which cannot be measured in monetary terms, Lt-Gen Surapan said.
- The military would be obliged to prove the frequencies were put to good use and open its books to public scrutiny, the spokesman said.

A ministry source said Gen Chavalit ordered the armed forces to report income generated from the management of frequencies.

Gen Chavalit said the media and academics exaggerated when they estimated the income amounted to hundreds of millions of baht. He said the income was much less and the basis for calculation might have been inaccurate.

The frequencies should not be viewed as the military's ``treasure trove", he said, and a public relations move would be initiated to show the military's dedication to using the frequencies to serve the public. Lt-Gen Surapan said the armed forces might return some of the frequencies to relevant committees but the details have yet to be fleshed out.

I went out to the transmitter site which is officially called Berlin- Koepenick, also known as Uhlenhorst but actually closer to Mahlsdorf-Sued. The 240 metres tall pipe mast (also carrying a FM antenna, in the past used on 93.1, until the eighties on 95.05/95.1 instead) is still there but the other MW antennas (two triangular systems) are gone. The outer fence is down, only the posts are still there, and some of the ancient light bulb lamps on the

following dead strip are meanwhile down, too. The inner fence is in a poor shape with many mends and open gates, in fact it is no problem to enter the station grounds if one dares. Demolition work is up there but at least the transmitter hall still exists, although now without transmitters. But the most interest finding was that Voice of Russia 603 no longer goes out from this dying site. Only 200 metres away from the antenna the signal was far too weak (the radio not even showed a full LCD bar) and I found a null roughly in north/south direction. Later I noted at Wittenau, about 15 km away in northern Berlin, a stronger signal and a north/south null, too, so it seems to be an educated guess that 603 now originates from Zehlendorf (the LW 177 / MW 693 site north of Berlin, officially called Oranienburg). This also fits to complaints about decreased reception quality VoRUS received. In central Berlin the signal is still quite good but indeed no longer a true powerhouse. **NORWAY:** The Board of state broadcaster NRK yesterday decided on heavy budget cuts for 2002 to bring the budget in balance. Some regional radio programmes will be merged, and all regional stations will have their budgets cut. To an international audience, the most shocking news is that R Norway International will be completely closed from Jan 1st. Transmission costs are said to run to 40 mill NOK annually. But NRK will have to negotiate with transmitter provider Norkring and also R Denmark to close at this time. Norkring have a contract for running the transmitters until 31/12-2003. R Denmark have a contract with NRK for leasing of transmission time for the same period. So here some instant negotiations

will have to be carried out! Radio Denmark lease airtime from Radio Norway, paying some 25 mill kroner annually.

The staff of 7 at R Norway International have been informed that the stn will not exist after Jan 1st, and have been transferred to a "job-bank" for employment elsewhere in the bc organisation. So it seems the decision to end the foreign service is definite. Veteran broadcaster Einar Lie will host the final programmes on New Years Eve.

The decision also affects the 1.2 MW MW transmitter at Kvitsoy Island (1314 kHz). This is also planned to be switched off on New Years Eve, alongside the four SW-txs at Kvitsoy and Sveio. The two sites employ a staff of 18 (13 at Kvitsoy, 5 at Sveio). At the remote Kvitsoy Isl, the stn is a very vital employer, and a closedown will have great impact on the community.

Time will show what will actually happen. It seems definite that R Norway International will close by New Year, but to meet contracts with Norkring/DR, it is possible that the txs will continue to be on air, but with only relay of some domestic programmes.
