550 CKPG BC, Prince George 1/28 0906 after hearing CBK completely dominating 540 -no X-Bach as usual-- I tuned to 550 for the top of hour ID's; a jumble, but mentions of a one day teacher walkout in BC shhheduled (not skeduled), weather temps in BC, and a clear CKPG ID at 0900 means a completely new one heard! Next morning, Bakersfield dominant. (RT-CA)

1150 CKBL BC, Kelowna 1/19 0040 country music and "Bullet" ID weak. (GH-OR)

- 162 **FRANCE**, Allouis 2/4 0101 man speaking FF. Very poor (MS-AB)
- 819 **UNID**, 2/4 0209 woman in unk. language. (MS-AB)
- 1035 **UNID**, 2/4. 0216, man talking but too faint to get lang. (MS-AB)
- 253 **ENGLAND**, 2/4 0122. Phone in talk show called "Talk Sport" by Joe Holland, through the subjects discussed seemed to cover everything except sports. At 0200 station ID'd as "Talk network with news and sports on the hour every hour. Then into news read by a woman. This is probably the Talk Radio Network out of

England. Unfortunately there's 13 stations listed, but probably Droitwich as it's listed as being 500 KW. This is the best signal of the season. New for me. (MS-AB)

- 1098 **UNID**, 2/4 0217. Faint mx hrd at first, then woman talking in an unk language. Then into Big Band mx. (MS-AB)
- 1089 **UNID**, 2/4 0128 man and woman talking in unk. language. Sounded mid eastern. (MS-AB)
- 1143 **UNID**, 2/4 0133 Faint orch. mx hrd here. (MS-AB)
- 1179 **UNID**, 2/4 0134 man talking in unk. language. (MS-AB)
- 1197 **UNID**, 2/4 0134. Two men talking in unk. language and then into mx. (MS-AB)
- 1206 **UNID**, 2/4 0138 Faint mx here, but too much 1210-CKWA slop to make out any details. (MS-AB)
- 1314 **NORWAY**, Kvitsoy 2/4 0049 with NN talk and into "Puff the Magic Dragon" record. Good signal at times. So it is still on which is great news here. (MS-AB)
- 1422 **UNID** 2/4 Faint audio 0051. Prob. Germany. (MS-AB)

Mike also mentions there were carriers on 189 (Prob Iceland), 702, 711, 756, 765, 792, 801, 837, 864, 963, 1107, 1116, 1125, 1134, 1148, 1152, 1179, 1206, 1215, 1269, 1305, 1323, 1332, 1377, 1404, 1422, 1449, 1458, 1494, and 1512.

### PAN-AMERICAN DX ROUNDUP

- MEXICO, Sabinas, Coah. XEBX 1/27 1304 Here with local noticias from Coahuilla.

  Used "B-X" as reference to station. Also noted Mexican NA at 1306, beneath B-X.

  The best candidate for this second station may be XEGS in Guasave, Sinaloa on the uppper West Coast. (JB-OK)
- 630 **MEXICO**, Monterrey, NL, XEFB 1/29 1130. XEFB runs a beautiful Romantica program in the hours before dawn, for those Romantica fans in the Deep Southwest. Especially nice this date 1100-1200. (JB-OK)
- MEXICO, Mexico DF, XEN 1/29 0403. ID by female ancr caught in recording at 0400 in KGGF phase null. The "N" was clearly pronounced as English. The second subdominant SS here appears to be XERG in Monterrey, but XEN is usually stronger. (JB-OK)
- MEXICO, Fresnillo, Zac. XEMA 1/30 0300. Finally hrd a full ID on this station which I now know that I have heard mixing with XEN and XERG for most of the last two seasons in the phase null of the near-local pest KGGF Coffeeville KS. Their most common form of ID, though is "690 kilocycles en AH EM-may, EM-may, AH, La Modre de Todas!" (The mother of us all) Their over-night and pre-dawn programming is a mixed bag of SS pops from SS "covers" of the 50s EE rock tunes through romantica to nortena hits, mostly with short ID's as above. Their formal ID states their (somewhat new) power as 50,000 watts twice. (JB-OK)
- MEXICO, Monterrey, NL XERG 1/31 1200. The 1200 "sign on" period on 690 is a real circus here in the phase null of KGGF. All-night talk station XEN < Mexico DF plays a choral version of the NA followed by about a 90 second canned, XEMA Fresnillo, Zac, plays an inst. version of the NA anthem and XERG (1200-0700) Monterrey NL also currently plays an inst. version of the anthem before signing on with call letters and slogans as "La R-G" and "La Deportiva". These three stations have been noted mixing in the early evening hours as well. All three have put in fair to very good signals here at times. Hard to believe that these three powerful stations exist on a single frequency in such a small area. (JB-OK)</p>
- 730 **MEXICO**, Mexico DF XEX 1/26 1232. Noted here with good level running a mixed popular mx show with multiple IDs as "La EK-kees". (JB-OK)
  - MEXICO, Mexicali, BCN XEMVS 1/29 1210. Followed this in a partial phase null on WBAP from 1210 until 1350, 30 minutes after local dawn here. As noted other mornings, a pre-dawn program is romantica music hosted by a female ancr. During most of the program, music is only interruped occasionally by a brief mention of the program name as "Romantica". Finally, an audible legal ID at

1231 and others at 1255 and 1326. There was only one ad string during the entire 100 minutes. Tough copy all the way, but I finally nailed this one with the help of several of the Corazon DX crowd. (JB-OK) (John, this was my favorite station to listen to when I was in Rancho Mirage a couple years back. They came in great on the car radio all day in the Coachella Valley. A great Romantica station. I recorded a few tapes of them. PM)

- 830 **MEXICO**, Piedras Negras, Coah. XEIK 1/26 1235. Very good in phase null of WCCO with multiple mentions of "La Nortenita" slogan. I also noted a second SS signal beneath XEIK. (JB-OK)
- t870 **MEXICO**, Irapuato, Gjto XEAMO. 1/26 1230 Believe that this is the station present in the WWL phase null several recent pre-dawns. The station runs almost continuous commentarios as it peaks around 1230. Believe I've hrd "AMO" or "Amor" and did hear "en Irapuato" several times during the reception 1/31. Also, multiple mentions of nearby Jalisco station. Fair to poor. (JB-OK)
- MEXICO, Chihuahua, Chih. XEHES, 1/25 1155. Currently the almost-dominant in the phase null of WHO at local dawn. Regularly runs one hour or longer programs from Radio Trans-Mundial programs close with the RTM office address in Miami repeated twice and a short inst. segue. On this date, the program closed at 1203 and XEHES gave a full ID, followed by the "Radio Luz" slogan. Some mornings, there is no ID between the close of RTM programming and resumption of local programming. (JB-OK)

After many years DXing with the R2000, the R8 is an absolute revelation. What a wonderful radio. Its my first radio with pass band tuning, sync, notch, and assorted bells and whistles. What amazes me so much is the clear reception using USB and LSB ECSS. I am looking forward to some great loggings with the R8. Also interesting is that in terms of raw sensitivity, the R8 and the R2000 are running pretty much neck and neck. Its the variable bandwidth options and image rejection that really sets the R8 apart from the '2000.

Conversations on the mail list got me interested in finding a timer that I could use for absentia DXing. I was able to find the suggested Intermatic DT17 from Home Depot. The DT17 is capable of tripping 98 on/off cycles. Thanks to the mail listers for the great tip. Problem was that the instruction sheet was completely in Spanish! I was able to find the Intermatic web site and download a set of instructions fairly easily. Much cheaper than taking Spanish lessons, hi. By the way I have noticed no RFI from the timer unit.

Speaking of RFI, my shack does not have a computer in it, to keep the noise to a minimum.....yet I really wanted to DX while working on the computer. I snooped around a little and was able to find an Advent 900 Mhz transmitter and remote headphones. Plugging the transmitter unit into the aux out jack of the R8, I am now able to DX using the

headphones while plugging away on the computer - with no RFI. Use the keywords "Advent Wireless" to find them on the 'net.

Verifications came in for the KTNS and KJAY tests in short order. Thanks to Patrick Martin for getting the KJAY veri letter and QSL back so quickly. And thanks again to Lynn for setting them up. I have audio clips for both tests, if you'd like to hear either or both, send me an email, and I can attach them to the reply.

# **ABBREVIATIONS**

Others have been developed as unique to the listening hobby. Do not, however, use them in reception reports as most radio personnel will not understand them.
