AZERBAIJAN: The FS of Azerbaijan State Radio is broadcast on Pirsaat 1296 (and Gäncä 6110) at 0315-0400, 1100-1600, 1700-1900 in the following languages: 0315-0400 Azerbaijani ("Güney Azärbaycan"); 1100-1200 Persian, 1200-1300 Turkish, 1300-1330 German, 1330-1400 French, 1400-1600 Azerbaijani ("Güney Azärbaycan"); 1700-1800 Arabic, 1800-1830 English, 1830-1900 Russian. At 1600-1700 these freqs relay Relay RL in Azerbaijani. (Azerbaijan State R via Mauno Ritola via Bernd Trutenau, BC-DX 2. 1. 2002)

BELARUS: Bel aruskaj e Radyj o has changed the schedule for the 2nd Program on 873/1008/ 1026/1197: 0500-2200, Sat/Sun 0600-2200. The daytime relays of R.Mayak from Russia were replaced by own prgrs and relays of the 1st Program. Mayak is now relayed only Mon -Fri 2100-2200, Sat 1800-2200, Sun 1900-2200. (Bernd Trutenau, mwdx)

ESTONIA: The Laitse transm itting station, housing the transm itters formerly used on 5925 SW, and 612/1035 MW, was officially closed down on July 01, 1998. Reports that these transm itters are used again by commercial stations (or might be in the future) thus seem improbable. The operating costs would be very high and listeners throug hout the country have meanwhile become quite used to FM broadcasts. The only possible future of the Laitse facility m ight be as a mobile phone relay station. (van Delft, DXW indow)

I BELAND: 252 Atlantic 252 has dropped its dance music format and now carri es sample loops of the TeamTalk 252 all sports format that is expected to be launched on 25 February (see http://www.teamtalk.com). (Olle Alm, Arctic)

ISBAEL (**PALESTINE**): 675 Palestinian Broadcasting Headquarters Destroyed. Israeli troops have destroyed the broadcast centre and main transmitting mast of the Palestinian Broadcasting Corporation (PBC) in Ramallah. Following heavy overnight bombing of the radio and TV studios, bulldozers were brought in on Thursday to raze what remained of the building to the ground. The main 225 meter high broadcasting antenna was blown up. An Israeli army spokesman said the station and other Palestinian media had been inciting

violence against Israel, a claim rejected by Palestinian officials. Transmissions on 675 have been silenced. (© Radio Netherlands M edia Network, 13 December 2001)

Steve W asked about the Palestine mast Having been there and seen them, and then seen the toppling on TV late last night I can confirm it is the 700 feet tall mast used on 675 that went down. (Given the dreadful staying / guying on it I am only amazed it lasted so long!) Before the big mast went up, there was a T antenna used about 4 miles away - that may still exist and might be brought in. There was a 10kW rig there, in a 'sort of sh ed' structure. (Paul Rusling via M W C e-mail news 14.12.2001)

GERMANY. Today we discovered that the programming of M egaradio has changed. New jingles are in use now and quite professional news are broadcast on the hour. Also the music selection has changed, away from tracks which can be heard everywhere, at least that's the first impression. Looks like the programming is now produced by Antenne Bayern at Munich, especially since I have an impression that there are minor changes in the studio audio with a slightly decreased audio level. Also the homepage http://www.megaradio.net



is now up, although not fully operational yet. This page also shows a new spelling "M egaradio", replacing the previous "M EGA-Radio". For nighttime reception the homepage recommends Burg 1575 for AUF MITTELWELLE GEHT WAS! whole Germany, a bit early since this frequency is still to be boosted to 500 kW, at

present only 10 kW are in use (Kai Ludwig, Germany, 1/17, DXLD)

NEW -- MEGA Radio Hirschlanden (Stuttgart Germany) on 738. The MEGA Radio company from Munich Bavaria [seemingly a joint venture of Anglo -Dutch financial funds], which hoards mediumwave frequencies in many states of Germany, appeared here in Germany some three years ago. As of today January 16th, MEGA Radio joined the air from Stuttgart Hirschlanden transmitter site on 738. Station started on Wed Jan 16th, at 16.26:30 UT. Program consists of music like the usual "Youth Radios" format on FM band, but very few advertisements in between could be observed yet. \\program is heard in Germany on M W channels Woebbelin 576. Braunschweig 630. [Berlin] Oranienburg 693. Dresden 1431 and Luxembourg 1440, Burg 1575. Not yet on air: Greifswald 1017. Location: Deutsche Telekom Sender (Stuttgart) Hirschlanden, 738, with 5 kw registered by the local LfK Stuttgart authority and at ITU Génève, Switzerland band plan. Dominant station on this channel at this location is usually Radio Nacional de España RNE-1 Barcelona with 600 Kw from Spain. At same transmitter location Deutsche Telekom (ex DBP Deutsche Bundespost) is running 10 Kw on behalf of AFN - American Forces Network - Stuttgart (Program from Heidelberg studio) on 1143. AFN Hirschlanden station is on the air since 1963. In 1945 -1963 AFN used ex -Reichspost M W , SW & FM site at Muehlacker, now public broadcaster SWR (ex-SWF) Baden -Baden Stuttgart, (Wolfgang Büschel, Germany, DXLD)

LATVIA: The last mediumwave outlet of Latvijas Radio, Riga (Ulbroka) on 945 (150 kW) was closed on the 1 January 2002. (Bernd Trutenau, Hard Core DX)

LITHUANIA : Baltijos Bangu Radijas (Radio Baltic Waves) is planning to leave the present transmitter site in a suburb of Vilnius (612 /100kW) for a new location in southeastern Lithuania late 2003. The new transmitter will operate on 630 /200kW daytime and 612 /100kW nighttime. BBR broadcasts in Belarusian for ethnic Belarusians in Lithuania and listeners in Belarus. (Bernd Trutenau. Hard-Core DX)

LUXEMBURC: From 1/1 China Radio International is relayed by RTL on 1440, apparently using 1200 k W. Programs are 1900 French, 2000 German and 2100 English. The programs are downlinked in Luxembourg City. (Joe Levder, A -DX Dec 31 via BC -DX 5, 1, 2002) Full evening schedule: Until 1800 M ega-Radio. 1800–1815 RTL-Radio in German. 1815– 1900 three religious prograin Ge. at 1815 from an unid. producer. at 1830 from the Swiss "Missionswerk Freundesdienst", at 1845 from the German "Missionswerk Werner

Heuckelbach". 1900-2200 CRI. The gaps after each CRI bc (as well -known they are of 57 m ins duration only) were filled with WRN promos, advertising the WRN satellite sces, inviting listeners to write to Beijing. "and do not forget to mention that you heard them on 1440 AM." At 2200 again a RTL annt ("you heard within a cooperation a progr of World R Network"), and yes, they still give it to us: The close-down annt, using as bed the track of the James Last orchestra dedicated to R Luxembourg, and the anthem of Luxembourg. A relic of the old days, simply cult. (Kai Ludwig -D, BC-DX Jan 1)

NETHEBLANDS: Longwave Project Delta Blow. The chances of a longwave station beaming programs from The Netherlands into the UK receded when the Dutch M inistry of Transport and Communications decided not to extend the license of Delta 171, which ran out at midnight on 31 Dec 2001. Delta 171 wanted to construct two 412 meter masts on an artificial platform in the North Sea, and the plan was to broadcast an easy listening format in English branded as '171- the Lounge'. One of the conditions of being given a license was that the station had to be on the air before 1 Jan 2002. Delta 171 hoped to get an extension to the license, but a court in Rotterdam has ruled that such an extension is not advisable. A M inistry spokesman said that it's unlikely that a new license will be issued, as the law has been changed in the meantime, and it's no longer possible to construct such high masts off the coast. So far, there has been no official reaction from Delta 171. (© Radio Netherlands M edia Network, 31 December 2001)



The latest casualty of the Dutch government's dithering over the reallocation of broadcast frequencies is Q The Beat, which has abandoned its transmissions on 1224. That frequency is now silent. The station has been campaigning to get a national FM terrestrial frequency allocation, but without success. It is

urging its listeners to continue to give their support, which it says is 'massive', and hopes to be allocated an FM license in 2002. (© Radio Netherlands M edia Network, 13 December 2001)

NORWAY: Although the external service programs of NRK ceased from 1 January, there are no changes in the transmission hours of 1314. AUSTEALIA : An item in The Sydney Morning Herald and on ABC news today (29 Jan 02), states that NTL the company huge multinational company which, as part of its concern, operates the transm itters formany radio and TV stations in Australia (including ALL ABC txers) is in deep financial difficulties. Apparently the share price has dropped from US\$90 about 2 yrs back to 44 CENTS now! and they are about \$1000 million dollars in debt. IT went on to say that this com ing Friday, there will be debters meeting to try and restructure which will involve a "debt for equity" deal. SO ABC transmitters will have a new owner, it seem s. These txers used to run in -house by the ABC, but as part of a massive restructure years back this was transferred to the Dept of Communications, then a special "Transmitter Authority" was set up to do the job. About 2 years ago, the Howard Govt. sold them off to NTL, stating that their size and stability meant they had the resources to keep the ABC on - air indefinitely. (Jem Cullem , ARDXC)

C H I N A: Voice of the Strait heard 9 Dec on 666 several times during the local evening. According to the Nagoya DX Circle, this frequency replaces 846, and in Fuzhou the Huayi Broadcasting Corporation (they run occasional IDs in English which say 'Corporation' rather than 'Company') has moved from 666 to 783. I can only hear Huayi on shortwave at this location. (Al an Davies, Bali, 17.12.2001)

Noted 2230 on Dec 20 a presumed NEW, high -powered CNR1 station on 1134. ID's in CC and EE ("China National Radio"), parallel with the other CNR1 stations like 1377, 1359, 981 etc. but even stronger (S9+5 on a non -amplified K9AY). (Bj arne M jelde, HCDX 21. 12. 2001) Available information says that this is a US made 1200 kW transmitter. (OA/Arctic)

RUSSIA : 765 R Khabarovsk silent. (VoRussia "DX Club" 26.12.2001)

SAMOA: Plans for closer cooperation between the governments of Samoa and American Samoa have received a setback. One of the elements of the plan, designed to improve coordination between the two states in times of crisis and natural disaster, was to allow Samoa's Radio 2AP to operate in the territory of American Samoa. But the US Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has refused to grant a license to 2AP. The Governor of American Samoa, Tauese Sunia, told an inter-goverment meeting that the FCC refused the license because 2AP is a "foreign-owned radio station." Office space had already been reserved for 2AP in Tafuna, and Director Kika Stowers said that they were ready to move equipment in. Despite the setback, both countries remain committed to closer cooperation, and say that 2AP will continue to play a role in disaster awareness for both countries. TIMES TO LISTEN FOR BCB DX (adapted for IRCA by IIh - 1996)

Reception during the daylight hours is possible over relatively short distances only, but during the winter months daytime reception can take place over surprisingly long distance. May daytime only stations can be logged in the hour or two preceding sunset. And you sometimes find otherwise inaudible semilocal stations on top of the regular stations during unusual daytime reception periods.

The most fruitful distant reception times, however, are those from just before sunset to just after sunrise; that is, when all or most of the path between transmitter and the receiver is in darkness. Stations east of your DX location fade in near sunset before many stations to your west are audible. Sim ilarly, at sunrise, after stations from the east have faded out, there us still a possibility for DX from the west.

The sunset skip period is particularly useful to DXers in the eastern part of North America, because stations in time zones farther west become audible after local day timers have signed off. W estern DXers have an advantage in being able to pick up many eastern sign -ons in the mornings.

"Sunset" sign-off times for daytime stations are actually assigned by the FCC so that sign-off on the 15th day of the month is at local sunset (to the nearest 15 m inutes). During the last half of the month in the fall, and the first half of the month in the spring then, a daytime station may broadcast later than the actual sunset. These are the best time in the month to listen for SSS (sunset) DX. The season of the year also plays an important role in noise levels and directional openings. The noise at medium wave frequencies is much stronger during summer, primarily from electrical storm s. This makes the late fall and winter months best for DX. But some reception paths are only possible or are much better during the summer months. So, if you can bear with the static, there often are outstanding DX openings during the summer (for example, South Africa from the East coast, and Austral a sia from the W est coast). Best reception from Australia and New Zeal and throughout North America seems to be during the months of February and March, with a secondary peak during the fall. Asia is best heard during the fall, with some reception possible during the spring. Deep South America reception is favored in the summer. A summary of the most usual seasonal openings is listed below; some of these are quite rare, others more common. Lack of a listing does not necessarily exclude its possibility, of course.
