The **Australian Broadcasting Authority** "is an independent federal statutory authority responsible for the regulation of free-to-air, radio and television, Pay TV, digital broadcasting and internet content in Australia". The site has links to finding radio and TV stations in an area, radio planning, the *Broadcasting Services Act* and other legislation, and Australian Content, including a review of the Australian Content standard in 2001. "Guidelines for the implementation of day/night switching-AM radio" is more interesting than it sounds— it even covers what percentage of a local population can be exposed to more than a certain level of radiation from the transmitter. There's too much to mention here; check it out for yourself at <http://www.aba.gov.au/>.

Zona Latina "is the site for media and marketing in Latin America." There's a section devoted to radio, heavily comprised of links to stations throughout Central and South America, the Caribbean and Mexico. Regional and national networks are noted here. There are also links to other sites covering information of interest to the listener or observer of the radio scene "south of the border", as well as Spanish and Portuguese language stations and networks in the USA.  Just a quick note to let everyone know that EDXF is still in business and open for your Forum reports. We have been having a lot of rain here lately and I think that when I finally get a chance to mow the back yard, I will be needing a combine to do it. One of the problems of moving a lot is having to start DX logs over a lot and it makes it hard sometimes to want to keep at it. After all, who wants to go from 900+ heard to zero again. My solution was to create an overall log which just lists each station heard once but in the order heard. It now has 8 columns (one for each location) and each column gets a mark when I hear the station at that location. Each location has its own separate log but this gives me an easy way to see how many different places I have or have not heard a station. I finally got caught up with adding in Indianapolis and I found there are only 30 stations out of 1793 stations I have heard in all 8 spots. There are 25 stations which have only been heard here (out of an Indy log of 150 heard) which was surprising. Half are Indiana stations (3 Indy, of which one is a TIS), but the others spread out: Ark, Wisc., W.Va, Ky, Ohio, Texas, Iowa. Some are X-banders, but most aren't. The next project will be to isolate the ones heard in 7 places but not here because those will become a target list for this summer and fall. The most interesting stations in the list were the ones I hadn't heard since I lived in Gary back in 1966-1974. Out of the 8 locations, two are active logs: Indy and Echo, Dale County, Indiana where my mother-in-law lives. Inactive but with the potential of new additions are Gary, Indiana and Kalamazoo, Mich - the last one is a place where I still have relatives and I will be back there in July for a reunion. The Gary log has listings for logs made in four different decades so I definitely want to swing thru there sometime and add some more stations. That shouldn't be too hard as I think that X-banders in three different states should be a "gimmee" there in the daytime. Gotta run. 73.
