 calls for a few days. Heard at 0259:50 6/20 ID "...KBGG Des Moines," into
 CNN news. I wonder why the change back? FCC messed up? (PM-OR)

550 KFYI AZ, Phoenix 6/22 2130 with news of the activation of EBS in Show Low and Mogollon Rim area in the face of the Rodeo and Chedeki fires. Best coverage in the Phoenix area. (KR-AZ)
 600 CJWW SK, Saskatoon 6/18 0113 fair on top of the channel with ID "Listen tomorrow morning for...on CJWW." (PM-OR)
 620 KTAR AZ, Phoenix 6/22 2145 with news of the fire on the Mogollon Rim and that the Diamondbacks baseball game was shifted to 860 AM KMVP to cover the emergency. (KR-AZ)
 680 KOMW WA, Omak 6/9 2358 was very strong at s/off with SSB. (LG-MT)
 690 CBKF1 SK, Gravelbourg fair on top of CBU with jazz at 0120 6/18, mention of CBC and French announcer. (PM-OR)
 730 (CJNW) BC, Vancouver continues to be off for several days (6/20 1330). Was told they are updating equipment and the site needed work. (PM-OR)
 750 KOAL UT, Price 6/1 0507 OK under KXL with mention of "News, talk, sports...Utah" into talk and mention of Phillips DVD ad. KXL was creaming most of it. Obviously. (DP-OR)
 900 CKBI SK, Prince Albert 6/18 0125 good on top with C&W music and "900 CKBI" ID's. (PM-OR)
 910 CKDQ AB, Drumheller 6/18 fair mixing with KKFx with C&W music and "Q 91" ID's at 0133. (PM-OR)
 940 CKGX SK, Yorkton 6/18 0140 very good with C&W music with "GX 940" ID. (PM-OR)

 KKEE OR, Astoria was back on this morning. Noted at 1100 6/21 with typical oldies, but station is indeed on reduced power. No doubt about that. I would guess they are on 250 watts. I guess the old 1937 1kw job finally quit. They have a late 40's 250 watt they used to use when they dropped power to 250 watts when I worked there in the 70's. The audio quality of

the 250 watts job was better and less splatter too. I phased KKEE out and left KMUZ-Gresham in the clear. That is harder to do when on 1kw. Hopefully they will stay on 250 watts for a while. Adjacent channels (1220-1240) are nice and clear. (PM-OR)

KWYZ WA, Everett 6/18 2125 fair off northern wire with usual Korean talk. (PM-OR)

CJNL BC, Merritt 6/18 2330 fair in jumble with hockey game and mentions on "N-L Radio." (PM-OR)

1240 KQEN OR, Roseburg 6/20 2312 good on top with spot for Roseburg mall. (PM-OR)

KGY WA, Olympia 6/7 0710 poor. First catch under local KEJO. ID'd as "You're listening to KGY..." then into a Garth Brooks song. Later, full station stats given. Meanwhile they played a wide variety of music. (DP-OR)

1250 KDJI AZ, Holbrook 6/22 2100 with EBS activation and announcement of evacuation of Show Low, Pinewood-Laketop, Heber, Overgaard, Forest Lakes, Pinetop, Linden and Aripine. Announced high power broadcasting at 5kw as allowed by the FCC during emergencies. (KR-AZ)

1270 KTFI ID, Twin Falls 6/17 0200 fair ID behind CHAT and KBZZ with mention of "Horizon Broadcasting Group." Not common here. (DP-OR)

1280 KFRN CA, Long Beach 6/17 0329 good. REL, music and occasional talk. "This is listener supported family radio...KFRN Long Beach, Los Angeles." Conditions seemed good going south this morning as I also picked up XEB, Mexico City. Both new from here. (DP-OR)

KAQQ WA, Spokane 6/20 2340 good on top with NOS format and bunch of local spots, many ID's as "12-80 KAQQ" and "The best songs and great memories are here on Spokane's 12-80 KAQQ." Ex-KUDY. (PM-OR)

1290 KGVO MT, Missoula 6/17 0730 not on the frequency long, but what I heard was quick and nice, "You're listening to the morning news express with Peter Christian, this is clear channel news radio 1290, KGVO" into news. (DP-OR)

1340 KWVR OR, Enterprise 6/21 2350 good on top with spot for county fair and KWVR ID's. (PM-OR)

1370 KWNC WA, Quincy 6/18 weak with KAST off at 2030 with local news item on area, mention of Moses Lake, local weather. Haven't heard them in a while. (PM-OR)

1400 KBCH OR, Lincoln City running a special Barry Manilow program at 1230 6/20 with spot break and mention of KBCH. (PM-OR)

KKTL WY, Casper was on top at 2300 on 6/20 with ID as "KKTL, a Clear Channel Station," then ABC news. (LG-MT)

1450 KVSL AZ, Show Low 6/22 2110 with EBS activation and announcement of evacuation of Show Low, Pinewood-Laketop, Heber, Overgaard, Forest Lakes, Pinetop, Linden and Aripine. Also announced the station would be on the air until the power failed or the station burned to the ground. Announced that the station was linked to AM'ers KDJI and KVWM also KZUA 92.1 Holbrook and KRFM 96.5 on FM. (KR-AZ)

1490 KCID ID, Caldwell 6/20 2327 good with spot for the Boise Factory Stores, Coldwater Creek, etc. (PM-OR)

KBKR OR, Baker snuck through with ID as "The talk of Eastern Oregon... 1450 and 1490" at 0900 on 6/4. (LG-MT)

?KYNR? WA, Toppenish was likely the one with ID's as "AM 1490" at 0900 on 6/5. Gave promo for Columbia River Intertribal Fish Commission in Puyallup and advised listeners to stay tuned for events on the Yakima Reservation. (LG-T)

KUGR WY, Green River 6/4 2259 dominated the frequency advising listeners to log onto KUGR.net. (LG-MT)

CJSN SK, Shaunavon had an excellent signal at 2300 on 6/17 with local weather. ID'd as "Country Music Radio CJSN" and began a religious program. (LG-MT)

1590 KQLO NV, Sun Valley was very readable in KLFE null at 2300 on 6/15, in Spanish, with ID as "Radio Universal." (LG-MT)

1610 TIS MT, Troy 6/8 0752 with advisory to call MT Fish, Wildlife and Parks in Kalispell. Also mentioned USDA Forest Service, Lincoln County Weed Dept. Cooperative, and Army Corps of engineers. I phoned Leslie Ferguson at Three Rivers Ranger Station (406-295-4693) to confirm contents of tape loop. Thanks to Nigel Pimblett and Gary Jackson for info on this new catch. (LG-MT)

DX WORLDWIDE – WEST / TROPICAL BAND DX

John Bryant sends in this report:

Several of us made a quick trip to Grayland for the UTC mornings of June 28, 29 and 30th. The first night was a sub-par version of typical mid-summer high sunspot DX session: Aussies at mostly threshold levels or below, plus a scattering of Pacific Islanders also at sub-par levels. The night was saved by a fine Expansion Band opening to Australia with three of the stations being heard well for long periods of time. The second night/morning (June 29) was characterized by a very unusual opening to Japan, much more characteristic of fall or spring conditions. From 1115 until bandfade at 1300, it was practically wall-to-wall Japanese. Even more extraordinary, practically all of them (except NHK-2) were carrying live commentary of the Turkey-Korea World Cup football match. All NHK-1 stations were running NHK's own commentary, while the commercial stations seemed to be running one of two sets of very excited announcers. The third night was a mixture of smatterings from around the Pacific Rim. A number of Japanese, NHK-1 and commercial both were carrying live commentary on the World Cup Final match, there were a goodly number of Aussies lurking about, as well. However, the most memorable catches of the DXpedition was a new (for me) station from the very hard to hear Philippines and several new Kiwi stations. We had up our usual three beverages (SW, W and NW) and I was using my Ten Tec HF-340 receiver. The loggings:

531 **NEW ZEALAND** 1XPL, Auckland (pres.) , Jun 28 1140 - Polynesian music program hosted by male announcer in a Poly. lang. Ads with a mixture of Poly. and EE words. Heard at good level. (Bryant-WA)
558 **JAPAN** JOCR Kobe , Jun 29 1130 - Noted in passing (fair to poor) with JJ talk. (Bryant-WA)
594 **JAPAN** JOAK NHK-1, Tokyo , Jun 28 1150 - Noted in passing with JJ talk by male. Part of a fifteen minute opening for high-powered Japanese in an otherwise DU morning. Jun 29 1132 - Noted at very good level with live coverage of Korea's Cup match (Bryant-WA)

693 **JAPAN** JOAB NHK-2 Tokyo , Jun 28 1148 - Heard with normal EE language lessons briefly at good level. Also noted on 29th at 1133. (Bryant-WA)
729 **JAPAN** JOCK NHK-1, Nagoya , Jun 28 1150 - Noted here briefly with a strong signal. JJ speech by male. (Bryant-WA)
792 **AUSTRALIA** 4RN Brisbane, pres. , Jun 29 1217 - Aussie-accented EE with news/sports/commentary. Fairly poor. (Bryant-WA)
828 **AUSTRALIA** 3GI, Sale , Jun 29 1222 - Noted in passing at fair level with Aussie-talk. (Bryant-WA)
828 **JAPAN** JOBB NHK-2 Osaka , Jun 29 1140 - Male + female JJ talk at 1140 and good level. (Bryant-WA)
891 **JAPAN** JOHK NHK-1 Sendai , Jun 29 1144 - NHK live coverage of Korea's Cup match. Fair to poor. (Bryant-WA)
909 **NEW ZEALAND** Southern Star, Napier , Jun 30 1215 - Presumed this with continuous Christian and Ch. Gospel music. Fanfare and possible bird calls noted at 1230. Fair level. (Bryant-WA)
