Calling all BCB DXers...

It's that time of year again! DX season is fast approaching, and DX tests are being planned. W hat is a DX test, you ask? From the IRCA web page (courtesy of **JD Stephens**):

"A DX test is a special transm ission aired by a station for the specific purpose of giving DXers a chance to bg their station - som ething that in many cases may be very difficult or im possible to do under norm alcircum stances.

DX tests must be aired during what the FCC calls "experimental hours", which is between m idnight and 6 am local time at the station. Also, most DX tests are scheduled for M onday m ornings, because traditionally M onday m ornings have been a time form any stations to do routine m aintenance on their transmitters. This is good for the station, because m any of them will work in a DX test during their norm al testing/m aintenance. This is good for the DXer, because the band is less congested at this time - thus increasing in m any instances the DXers' chances of hearing a station.

DX tests program s are as varied as the stations them selves. Most will include Morse code identifications and test tones (two things that really "cut through" the interference better than voice or music), and many will include some specialmusic which will really "stick out" as something out of the ordinary. Examples of this are: March music, polkas, TV & movie them es, or Christmasmusic played at an odd time of the year (such as in October).

There are som e DX tests which are scheduled on Saturday or Sunday m ornings, and, at the request of the stations, on other m ornings. But, m ost are usually scheduled for M onday, Saturday or Sunday m ornings."

If you'd like to receive a weekly sum mary of DX tests, sponsored by RCA (International Radio Club of Am erica) and NRC (National Radio Club), please let me know, via e-m ail, at ircam em ber@ ircaonline.org or gm hollem an@ earthlink.net. For starters, I'll plan on using the list of e-m ail addresses from last DX season to send out the Sum mary. If you got the weekly sum mary last year and your address hasn't changed, rest assured that I'll be sending it to you again this season! 3. Secretary/Treasurer's report

M em bership - Currently, we have 215 m em bers (10 of which are m em bers due to bulletin exchange - som e are active). 56 m em bers get both HDXM and SDXM ; 78 get jist SDXM (8 of these are bulletin exchange), and 80 get jist HDXM (2 are bulletin exchanges). When I took over in 8/2001, we had 195 m em bers, with 50 m em bers getting both HDXM and SDXM , 73 getting jist SDXM , and 72 getting jist HDXM. (RCA dues also increased effective 9/2001, but this did not seem to affect m em bership adversely. While a large reason for the increase in m em bership can be attributed to the AMDX New sflash's ending publication 8/21/01 - m any, m any people that were joining m entioned they heard about RCA thru it - others said they were rejining IRCA after an absence, heard thru M onitoring Times, or found RCA thru a web search.

Treasury - As far as our treasury goes, we have a positive balance. I think you can tell from our membership numbers that we're not exactly making money like crazy, but we're not doing too bad, either. Even with the recent postage increase, it doesn't appear that we'll need to increase dues to make up the amount - but really, I think it's too soon to tell, especially since in the summer we have few issues to publish and most of our members decide to send in their renew als then, regardless of when they are set to expire. We are currently paid up for a year in advance (from June) for our web site/dom ain name. About the only other costs the treasury has is rental of the PO box from the post office and reim bursem ent of club expenses as they are defined - and there haven t been too m any of these thus far. If there are other expenses Ineed to pay, by all means, let me know !!

I recently m oved the w ebsite to < http://www.ircaonline.org> (www.ircaonline.com goes to the sam e place) - this is our own dom ain -no ads on it, unless, of course, we request them . The 'M em bers Only" section of the site is open for business - every IRCA m em ber has a username e and a password (details on how to get these if you dont already have them should be in the nextDXM), but there snot a bt in the 'M em bers Only" area as yet - just the New M ember Packet and a link to subm it your logs to a DXM editor. Ifm looking for suggestions as to what more to put there. Our mailing list, [IRCA], is currently at Topica.com and is ad free, with the exception of som e ads for Topica sown products.

Also, in moving the site, Iputa link redirecting people from our old site on Geocities (which will probably become a pay site as Yahoo! takes over more and starts charging for more stuff that used to be free!). Evidently, the Geocities site will not allow automatic redirects, and you need to manually go to the new website thru the link provided on the page.

One of the first to notice our new site was GACW (Argentine Group of CW), who asked us to join their "Cyber Club" - this is a free service and included a membership certification (.jpg file). I explained to them several times that $\mathbb{R}CA$ smain interest is AM DX, and I think there is a bit of a language barrier, but they seem interested in having som e American DX friends. I have put a link to their site on the $\mathbb{R}CA$ site, for those interested. And as always, I would like suggestions from members on what else they d like on the website!

7.CPC

Currently, thanks to the hard work of an IRCAer who wishes to rem ain nam eless, we have 5 DX tests planned, another also in the planning stages but with no firm date decided, and several requests for tests outstanding. I myself have written, e-m ailed, or called several stations, especially those that have tested in the past, and asked if they would be interested in doing a DX test - how ever, the results haven t been all that good. At least I got a response, which was usually along the lines of "Ill pass this on to XXXX, who does the program ming forus" or "Didntwe just DO a DX test?", instead of nothing but silence! Iam hoping to again this year to send out rem inders for DX tests via em ail and new sgroup posts, as well as the website, and I currently have on the website a listing of the results of last season's DX tests; to summarize, there were 10 DX tests last season, arranged by IRCA, NRC, or an independent individual. By far the W JNT-1180 Pearl, M S test received the m ost responses; how ever, KJAY-1430 Sacram ento, CA and KTNS-1090 Oakhurst, CA were also well-listened for. Hopefully, we will have more tests this season and a large response from all of them ! Publisher's Report Rich Toebe <u>richtoebe@jps.net</u>

W hen I first researched the possibility of publishing in Davis in m id-2001, there were two factors that needed to be addressed. One, was the fact that publishing duties were scattered in several places, and the pace of the publishing process led to the hard copy issue being

distributed long past the time when the e-m ailed version was put into the hands of m embers; the other issue was how to stream line the process so that I wouldn't be unduly burdened with the work if I were to consolidate editing and printing in one location. After consulting with Phil, Ralph and Eric, and coming up with a work breakdown plan, I came up with a process that met with the approval of the Board of Directors and almost all of the editors involved with the magazine. So, the plan went ahead— I would become editor-in-chief, I would become editor-inchief, I would become ethe SDXM chief and convert the HDXM to text form at and e-m ail the soft version; he creates the PDF version now as well. Phil is also my backup in case of emergency although that has t been necessary yet.

How did we do? The results are in...

1) We've increased the frequency of publishing HDXM from 21 issues a year to 35, an increase of 50%, while holding costs within the dues structure established before I commenced printing. Lynn tells me that revenues are sufficient to cover costs (at this point) even with the 3c increase in dom estic postage, which means a nom inal increase in costs of \$1.05 a year for each member that receives the printed version. Printing costs have held steady, but recently the cost of envelopes went up slightly, working out to about 10.5c per member for 35 issues, for a total of \$1.16 in added cost. For HDXM, we planned on printing a total of 640 pages (30.16 pagers and 5.32 pagers); we actually printed 660 pages (4.12 pagers, 22.16 pagers, 1.20 pager, 2.24 pagers, a 28 pager, 4.32 pagers and a 36 pager).

2) We increased the number of e-m ailed issues from 35 to 40. Because we do 35 HDXM s and 40 SDXM s, 5 of the HDXM s are 'com bined" versions of the SDXM s. Those who receive the SDXM s are aware of issues such as #35A and #35B; these are integrated into the 'com bined" HDXM, #35. By blending issues into one, approximately 4 pages of space (and printing costs) are saved because we don't duplicate lists of contributors, m astheads, colum n heads, etc. But it also m eans that I really com pose 45 issues a year (30 SDXM /HDXM s which are identical, 10 SDXM only issues and 5 issues which com bine the 10 SDXM s).

3) The printed version is delivered to the m en bership before the next e-m ailed issue goes out. This was key for me; that no one receiving the printed magazine is at a significant disadvantage relative to e-m ail delivery. The difference within the USA is now less than a w eek (for som e only a couple of days if Itm able to get the print run into the m ail stream before 6 pm Thursday evening)

4) The "bok" of the publication has been in proved for better readability and introduced a more liberal usage of graphics and photos. The first pictures didn t come out very well in the photocopying process (it is not compatible with pixels created digitally) but Ive learned how to compensate for that to a certain degree. Compare the convention photos used in the last issue to my earliest attempts and note the difference.

5) Phil Bythew ay and Nick Hall-Patch worked together to add a PDF version for those who receive DX Monitor by email: while receiving the issue on Wednesdays before publication date means hot news travels quickly, the text-only version leaves out graphics and pictures that are available in the printed form. Storing the PDF, and making it available for download, means that those who cannot or will not receive the PDF form aren't forced to receive it. Having the PDF means that the email version is exactly like the printed form, and we can offer color. This qualitative in provement was done without raising SDXM dues.

6) No more labels and tape around the edges of DXM ; after factoring the time it took to put tape and labels on vs. printing addresses directly on envelopes and stuffing them , and then com paring relative costs, it was a "no brainer". The cost is slightly higher per issue to use the envelopes, but we have no tape residue, the issues come protected from m angling by the postal equipm ent- I have not had a single com plaint during m y tenure as publisher that an issue was received in dam aged condition- and we gain part of the back page for editorial content. Probably I received m ore favorable comments on the mailing of bulletins in envelopes than anything else that was accom plished.

7) Phil and I have held to the publication schedule almost perfectly. # 35 (# 35B) was delayed two weeks because of my vacation and the Convention. There were a handful of issues that went out a day late, because I couldn't get to the printer early enough on those Thursdays and the week when my PC was infected by Klez, which delayed SDXM until I was sure I wouldn't infect Phils PC; otherwise the DX M onitors, HDXM and SDXM went out like clockwork. I've received comments from people on "how fast DX M onitor gets here" now.

There's still room for improvement.. Id like to see the paper issues go to color printing one day; and I foresee the HDXM being with us for some time to come despite the ease of e-m ail delivery.

In the Business Report, the cost of dues came up; what's a fair am ount to charge? Is affordability an issue? We lost some foreign mem bers who took HDXM because of the high cost of postage, and I did put out feelers to set up a satellite mailing location in Canada (analysis showed that the benefit didn t justify the effort) but my feeling is that in this day and age when a soft drink costs over \$1, the dues we charge is a very reasonable am ount to pay for hom e delivery of 35 issues of the DX M onitor. We offer a cut rate for SDXM because no postage is involved, but com mercial publications are offering electronic versions of their publications at a much higher percentage of the nom inal mailed paper type. The dues shouldnt simply cover the cost of production of the magazine, but should allow for some developm ent of the club such as outreach to new mem bers, and com pensating for wear and tear on equipm entuged.

W e are all volunteers, but we need to offer a clear incentive to be an active part of the club. Form on the Ive advertised for a new Sports editor, but get no response except for some help in com piling station lists by a few m embers, notably Art Blair. Ireally don thave the time to publish and be a column editor too. Som eone else needs to step up to the plate.

I also urge the Board of Directors put together a plan to have publishing transition reasonably smoothly if I should have to give up the post. A plan should avoid what happened last year, where it actually looked like the hard copy DXM would go away until the Board approved my proposal to publish. A prudent Risk M anagement plan would have a backup strategy already in place as a stopgap until a new perm an entpublisher is found.

It proud of what we've accomplished, and that I could help make this happen... and I couldn't do this alone. W ithout the great support of all of the column editors, Phil's efforts on SDXM and Lynn Hollerm an making sure that I get the funds on time to pay for it, this project wouldn't be possible. All of them deserve to take a bow for making this volunteer operation run so smoothly. Thanks (in the rough order in which they appear in DXM) to Lee Freshwater, Nancy and John Johnson, Patrick Martin, Brandon Jordan, Nick Hall-Patch, Reid W heeler, Rick Evans, Steve How e, PhilBythew ay, Bruce Portzer and Eric Buenem an, to Lynn, to my wife N ina, who sometimes helps me by getting the masters to the print shop or by stuffing envelopes, and to the support of the columns by all of you who submit material. Sometimes a person is too close to the trees, as the saying goes. Im ade a new EW E antenna a couple years ago after I lost my old one to an electric fence. I could no longer reach the term ination point. I did not notice at the time my Eastern leg was 16 feet and my W estern one was only 10 feet. I would bok at right at it and w onder w hy I could not get the sam e nulls. As m any years as I have been building antennas, I should have caught that, but it takes some one elses input to bring things out. After I got back from the convention, and you are always ready to go after that DX. A convention does that to a person. I went out in the backyard to look at both of the EW Es. The main one was 10X80X16. I thought it was closer to 15X75X15. I stood there and said, "Those vertical sections are not the same height! Now ay!" Iw ent and check the aprox. length and wow, was the one in front was short! A couple days later when I got the time I found another higher branch to raise the leg up. W hat a difference! Im ean a difference!!! M y nulls and lobes and pretty m uch back to where they used to be with m y old EW E. There are slight differences in the two, but they are close. The old one m ay have ran 5-10 degrees m one to the SW and was 10 feet longer. Iget KSW B-840 to the South at S9+ 36 DB. The old EWE was about S9+39 DB daytime, but at least I am close. I have slightly moved the vertical sections around a bit and even slight changes do affect the pattern, much like a 2 tow er directional array at a radio station. I also think the new ground system is much better now too. I have added a lot of 5 foot copper piping in the past several months tied together by bare # 12 solid copper wiring. The whole thing is buried with just a couple pieces of wire coming out of the ground for connection on both ends of the EW Es. With DU DX the last few nights, it looks like itm ightbe a decent season. Good DX to all. 73s,
