I would like to propose that IRCA accept payment of dues via Paypal for an additional \$1 to cover the costs associated with using Paypal. Payments can be made to the ircamember@ircaonline.org address by going thru Paypal at <http://www.paypal.com> - in other words, dues of \$10/yr would be \$11 if paid using Paypal - this method allows for payment by electronic funds transfer from a checking account OR payment via MasterCard, Visa, Discover or American Express (NOT American Express Corporate cards, tho). Dues paid using conventional means (i.e. postal mail to the PO box) would remain the same. 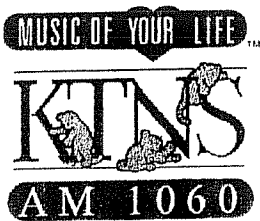

DX Tests

PLEASE NOTE: Even if you don't hear a test, be sure to contact the station, and thank them for going to the trouble to run a test! Please remember, what's listed as being on, say, Monday morning "may" be what you think of as Sunday night! (Test times are in the station's LOCAL time.)

Friday, November 8, 2002 - KTNS-1060, Oakhurst, CA - tested from 9:00-10:00pm PST (12-1am EST).

KTNS, formerly on 1090 kHz, had tested in the past on that frequency, with little positive feedback from DXers - most reported QRM from a strong Mexican or KAAY on that frequency. On 1060 kHz, however, the story was different; I had lots and lots of reports of reception of the test - and GM Larry Gamble was VERY happy with the results, and had a great time running the test!



Those hearing the test who reported it to me include Phil Bytheway (whom I understand was on the air during the test!) of Seattle, WA, Bruce Bacon in Boise, ID, Bob Karchevski of Sunnyvale, CA, Tim Hall in Chula Vista, CA, Stan Weisbeck in Spokane, WA, Mike Sanburn in Bellflower, CA, Robert Wien of San Jose, CA, Don Kaskey in San Francisco, CA, Pete Taylor of Tacoma, WA, Patrick Martin in Seaside, OR, Dennis Gibson of Santa Barbara, CA, and Fred Eatock in Cupertino, CA. Most people mentioned that while the voice signal from the test wasn't always that strong, the Morse cut thru any QRM and was well received! There were many comments on strong QRM from stations such as KKDS (UT), KDUS (AZ), and CKMX and mentions of auroral conditions - KTCT on 1050 was also a pain for some, as was KDRK for Stan in WA and KYCW for Pete in WA. But everyone mentioned how well the Morse IDs came thru!

However, on the flip side, the test wasn't heard by most DXers anywhere east of CA. For instance, Greg Myers in Clearwater, FL and Gerry Bishop in Niceville, FL both mentioned they were unable to hear the test, as were Patrick Griffith in Westminster, CO, Paul LaFreniere in Grand Marais, MN, Craig Barnes in Golden, CO, Larry Russell in Flushing, MI (near Detroit), Steve Francis in Alcoa, TN, Les Rayburn in Helena, AL (near Birmingham), Tom Jasinski in Shorewood, IL, or Bill Dvorak in Madison, WI. Bruce Winkelman in Tulsa, OK heard WLNO in New Orleans instead, and the same was true here in Lafayette, LA, although KOFY in Tyler, TX was loudly heard with SS - RC Watts in Louisville, KY mentioned this was what he heard as well.

Sunday, December 1, 2002 - WLCR-1470, Louisville, KY (COL Shepherdsville, KY) Another DX test will be held at this time to make up for the test held October 21. Time is scheduled for 3:00 - 4:00 am EST, with 750 watts from 2:45 - 3:15 am. Reception reports may be sent to:

- 1030 KMAS WA, Shelton 11/11 0100 legal ID and ad for Ameridebt. Good signal, way over the top of KTWO which usually dominates 1030. (GH-OR)

- 1060 KDUS AZ, Tempe 11/9 0100 ID slipped through during final minute of KTNS test with code ID. (PT-WA)

- 1170 KFAQ OK, Tulsa 11/9 0219 good to poor. Decent strength a first but weakened considerably the next few hours. Many ID's, ads, promo for their new website etc. KLOK and KPUG interfering. (DP-OR)
- 1200 WOAI TX, San Antonio 11/7 0200 Art Bell show into network news, fair signal with plenty of splatter from local KEX-1190. (GH-OR)
- 1230 KOY AZ, Phoenix 11/2 0733 dominant under local KYPA with ID "Arizona's original station K-O-Y" into "Muskrat Love" by Captain and Tennille. (MS-CA)
- KZZR OR, Burns 11/7 0120 man said "All day long your home of country, KZZR Burns," country music. Very weak and mixing with unID's. (GH-OR)
- 1280 CHQB BC, Powell River 11/9 0459 at the top of the hour with KIT interfering, heard "...from the national news room of Broadcast News...this is Coast Radio." No ID heard. (DP-OR)
- 1290 KGVO MT, Missoula 11/4 0000 man gave legal ID into CBS news. Weak. (GH-OR)
- 1310 CHLW AB, St. Paul 11/12 0030 momentarily on top of the jumble with C&W music and legal ID, suddenly overtaken by a strong KEIN. (GH-OR)
- 1320 KXRO WA, Aberdeen 11/11 0659 OK at times. "The Harbor's New Country, Kix 95.3." (KXXX-FM). (DP-OR) (I'm having a difficult time thinking of KXRO as a country station!—NJ)
- 1350 KTDD CA, San Bernardino 11/14 2020 ID as "The Toad," C&W, ad for Brandin' Iron. (BN-CO)
- 1400 KBCH OR, Lincoln City 11/8 0828 fair in temporary quiet. Simple ID by female. KLCK-Goldendale best of the bunch tonight. (DP-OR)
- 1480 KYOS CA, Merced 11/8 0913 this one kind of threw me. Heard "Merced County's newstalk KBKY." This is apparently their FM 94.1. I believe several stations in the KYOS family changed hands not too long ago. (DP-OR)
- KBMS WA, Vancouver 11/8 0908 fair with "The Sky Show," charismatic Black preacher going to town. I thought it was cool and haven't heard anything like it for a while. Music heard also. (DP-OR)
- 1610 WPST912 CA, location unknown strong 11/10 0500-0600 Caltrans Highway Advisory Radio giving weather conditions for Interstate 15 (I-15 runs from LA to Las Vegas. Exact location unknown, must be in mountains, giving snowy conditions. Heard in Hanford, CA. (GJ-CA)
- 1620 KOZN NE, Bellevue 11/13 "The Zone," ESPN, 1600 ID. (BN-CO)

- 780 (KNOM) AK, Nome 10/26 0400 DX test not heard, only KKOH and WBBM. (MS-CA)
- 1060 KTNS CA, Oakhurst noted in early on 11/8 2305 with NOS at fair level. Good ID 11/9 0000. Very generous with the tones (slow enough even for me to read) at about 0003. Seemed to be KDUS under (it faded at 0000). No CKMX so it must be auroral tonight. Most QRM from KYCW-1090. Don't talk to me about IBOC white noise when I get this much garbage from something 3 channels (and six miles) away. (PT-WA)
- +11/9 very good with MYL music and frequent voice and Morse code ID's, topping S9+ from 0000-0102, dominant most of the time. (PM-OR)
- +11/9 0000-0100 DX test barely heard here at all, buried under KKDS most of the time. (FA-ID)

- +11/9 0000+ DX test heard at huge level here on this rainy night with some fading and KNX-1070 slop. Numerous code ID's caught on tape. Heard phone calls from DX'ers extraordinaire Phil Bytheway, Time Hall and Bruce Bacon. Lots of NOS tunes caught on tape. The great thing is I could hear the station before and after the test. Have them verified from previous test on 1090 with 250 watts. Sent new report. Hope everybody logged this one. (MS-CA)
 - +11/9 I listened sporadically for test 0000-0100, and only heard the 0100 conclusion of the test with code ID and voice "This is KTNS, 1060. This concludes ... test." The signal was weak in Cupertino, CA and was frequently dominated by other stations on the channel. and by splatter from my local KTCT-1050. The voice portion of the test was heard during a fade in the other station signals. (FE-CA)
 - +DX test was mixing it up nicely with KKDS and KDUS into southern Idaho. Many slow code ID's. Announced a phone number so I gave 'em a call. Seemed to have a better signal this way when they were on 1090. (BB-ID)
- (KTNS)+11/9 test tried for and not heard, only strong KDUS over/under KLMO. (CB-CO)

1100 11/11 1047 Spanish Radio Unica with fair power, but never heard ID. Ads in Spanish for the Air National Guard and Bank of America. Tijuana mentioned also. Maybe KAFY Bakersfield? (DP-OR)

Mark's comments:

On Saturday, 9 NOV, the South Shore version of a "DX Clams" get-together in Plymouth and Duxbury, MA was well attended. The following DXers enjoyed lunch at Wood's Seafood Restaurant on the Plymouth pier: Nick Hall-Patch (VE7DXR) (all the way from BC, Canada!), Chris Black (N1ICP), Vern Brownell (W1VB), Ray Arruda (KB1EVX), Mark Connelly (WA1ION), Marc DeLorenzo, and father-son team Allan Dunn (K1UCY) and John Dunn (N1VPU).

I'd scoped out the Duxbury Beach site on the way down and found the gate locked. So when the group left the restaurant at 2:15 p.m., we headed over to the alternate Duxbury DXpedition site at nearby Powder Point instead. A couple of the DXers went home but there were at least half a dozen of us at the Powder Point site. Boston Area DXer / NRC member Paul McDonough joined us. I set my car up with the rooftop broadband loop phased against active whip, since there wasn't much room for running out wires.

DX highlights: Strong mid-latitude Transatlantics started with Saudi Arabia-1521 good at 3 p.m. EST (2000 UTC). The DX was still rolling along when I left at 8 p.m. Spain and North Africa, not surprisingly, packed the loudest signals per watt of transmitter power. Some of the better catches included the Irish station on 981, quite strong, and Turkey-1062, not strong but recognizable as Middle Eastern music. France-1467 and Saudi Arabia-1521 pushed the S-meter to S9+40, stations such as Mauritania-783, Morocco-1044, and France-1206 weren't far behind. Bigger Boston locals (590, 680, 850, 1030, 1510) run about S9+50 and the NYC skip stations are about S9+40, so that shows how loud some of the foreign DX was at this superb coastal site. Nick Hall-Patch left for his quarters at Woods Hole Oceanographic as Saudi-1521 was reducing WWKB to a barely-discernable background het. I told him that the channel sounded like that up in "Newfie" most nights.

The Latin Americans were not too impressive, though I did manage to pull a nice Radio Ideal (Venezuela) ID through WBBR-1130. Bits of Brazil were in the melange on 760 but it was the TA's that were stealing the show. When I got home a bit after 9 p.m. (0200 UTC), the band seemed more auroral: Colombia was slugging WJR-760 and Mauritania-783 appeared to be the only loud TA.

Nick Hall-Patch set up his computerized signal strength recorder (the modern version of Gordon Nelson's Rustrak pen chart recorder) at Woods Hole (Falmouth, MA). It wouldn't surprise me if he publishes a nice article comparing east coast and west coast transoceanic propagation.

Thanks for the loggings. That's all for this issue. 73, Brandon.

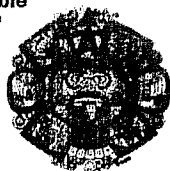
